PROCRASTINATION

When a Bible reader begins to think about procrastination, the first character that comes to his mind is Felix. He is a classic example of one putting off the most important thing until he thought he would have a convenient season. Felix was not an ordinary man. He held a high position and could have wielded a great influence for good. He had an influence, because all of us have, but his was bad. To begin with, he was an unlovely character. He was quite a conniver. He listened to the gospel preached by Paul but secretly hoped to receive a bribe for his release. Felix heard Paul politely several times, but never with a desire to become a Christian. On one occasion Paul got a little hard with his preaching when he "reasoned of righteousness, self-control, and judgement." This lesson terrified Felix but no visible results occured except that he trembled. When he learned what the Lord wanted him to do. he became terrified and instead of yielding to God he allowed procrastination to take over. This was probably the supreme opportunity of his life and he threw it away. He started waiting for the "convenient tomorrow" that never has and never will come. Practically all of our failures come through procrastination. It is so easy to postpone today's duties till tomorrow, and that is what so many of us do. Few of us are aware of just how deceptive procrastination is. The procrastinator depends upon an uncertain future.

Some think that procrastination is a third choice, but it is not. Indecisive procrastination is decisive. We either do Christ's will or we do not. There is no middle ground on which to walk. We do not have three choices of doing the Lord's will. There is no scriptural basis for postponing the most important thing of life. Many of us are under the delusion that we will do what we know we should when the time is right. The time for doing the Lord's will is right now. There are more things than we are aware of that must be done now or never. There is such a thing as waiting too late. Some have waited too late to visit their physician. Some have waited too late to start training their children. Some churches have waited too late to start training men to serve the church as elders. They have waited too late to use their opportunities and the Lord gave them to others who would use them. There are members of the church that have stayed away from Bible school too long and lost their desire to attend. Others have waited too late to start back to worship. They became calloused to spiritual obligations. The most dangerous thing one can become is a procrastinator. We fear modernism. communism and other destructive forces working among us. but brethren let us not overlook probably the most deadly foe of all procrastination. It will claim millions of souls.



IS YOUR HEART BURNING?

During a time of discouragement Jeremiah said, "...I will not make mention of him, nor speak anymore in his name. But his word was in mine heart as a burning fire shut up in my bones, and I was weary with forbearing, and I could not stay." Jer. 20:9.

Jeremiah was interested in souls but was seeing little response and he became discouraged. He never lost his compassion for those who faced impending punishment. He was possessed with one of the rarest Christian virtues, a passion for souls. He lived before the Christian era, but he had a virtue that every Christian ought to have, and must have to be Christlike. A Christian that is out of sympathy with the lost is unlike Christ in that respect.

Jeremiah did not intend to pursue his work any further because he was belittled and chided, but he had something in his heart that would not let him keep quiet; and that which would not allow him to be silent was the Word of God. It burned in him as a fire shut up in his bones.

The Christian who has no passion for the lost is revealing that something is lacking in his heart. Some of us say we cannot teach or talk to the lost and we are probably telling the truth. If the right thing is put in the heart, and that is the Word of God, brethren, we are going to start talking. We are going to see very little visible results until some of the members begin doing some of the talking. Preaching is important, but the church that depends on the preacher to do all the talking or is concerned only with him having the Word in his heart will soon be a church in name only.

In the New Testament we are impressed over and over by the fact that Christians, both men and women, were urged to learn the Word of God and teach others. Timothy went to Ephesus to teach but he was instructed to teach others so that they could be teachers too. What he had learned, he was to commit to faithful men so they could teach others also.

The Church that is depending on its preacher to do all the personal work or house to house teaching is not patterned after the one Jesus established. Every member of the church ought to be concerned about the lost and show it by trying to be soul-winners himself. Here are some things that will help each Christian to see that he has a responsibility in this work. First, he must be convicted that a divine commission was committed to him. See Matthew 28:20 and I Timothy 3:15. Second, by a consciousness of a debt owed to humanity. See Romans 1:14 and Jude3. We are debtors to man and trustees of the gospel. Third, by a hearty persuasion of the truth of the message. If the gospel is true, men cannot be saved without it. Furthermore if it is true, it reveals both the love and terror of God. Fourth, by sacrificing for (continued inside)

RISING TO HIGHER THINGS

Most of us have been pointed to the higher things of life. We have all been encouraged to "Hitch your wagon to a star." We have sung, "Lord plant my feet on higher ground." Often in our prayers we ask the Lord to lead us to higher and nobler service.

Before school age we point our children to school. In the primary we point them to high school and from high school to college. We believe that the more they learn and apply, the better qualified they will be to serve God and their fellowman. We call this going higher.

Christians need to learn this important lesson too. The more we learn of God's Word and the better applied, the higher we go spiritually. It may sound paradoxical, but the way up in Christianity is down. One reason some Christians do not rise higher is because they will not go low enough to go higher. Jesus taught the apostles that the greatest in the Kingdom would not be those who sat on his right or left hand, but those who served the most faithfully. "And whosoever will be chief among you, let him be your minister (bondservant)."

Imagine the surprise of those who desired to be the greatest, being taught a lesson by their Master that they were not too good to wash one another's feet. He girded himself and showed them how. And he added, "If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them."

The church member that sings the loudest and prays the longest is not necessarily the one going higher. Jesus taught in the beautitudes that the poor in spirit, they that mourn, the meek, merciful, pure and peacemakers would be blessed. No blessing was promised to the proud and idle. We usually think of one going higher who increases his bank account, adds acres to his farm, gets more public recognition, but this is not God's way of going higher.

The apostles were promised that they would be elevated, but it was through service. The service was preaching, teaching and rendering aid to the poor. Any church or Christian that desires to go higher must never lose sight of the things that lead upward. The church that concentrates on and prepares for the work the Lord taught and then does it will go higher both in the sight of God and of men. The community will not respect a church that only meets for worship anymore than it will any human institution. But the church that strives to win souls, that is interested in the poor will be looked upon with favor. Did this not occur in Jerusalem?

In order to rise to higher things we have to think we can and desire to do it. We will never rise above our thinking and planning. We will not rise higher by just being against something, although we must be against sin in every form, but we are going to have (continued inside)

SOME SIGNS OF A TRUE DISCIPLE

A disciple is a learner. As we use the word, in most instances, we are referring to a follower of Christ. One must certainly be a learner of Christ before he can become his follower.

There are many good reasons why all men should be true disciples of Christ. One becoming his disciple, is following the greatest character that ever blessed the world. A true disciple of Christ gets more out of life (and gives more too) than any other course he could pursue. Any other way of life except true discipleship is only transitory. True discipleship culminates in everlasting life in heaven. Let us notice some evidences of a true disciple.

First, he is known by the teaching he holds. Timothy was told to. "Take heed unto thyself, and unto the doctrine; continue in them: for in doing this thou shalt save thyself, and them that hear thee." I Tim. 4:16. True disciples of Christ shun the doctrines of men (Matt. 15:9) and declare only the doctrine of Christ (Gal. 1:6-8). One seeking for verses to substantiate his belief has not submitted himself to the teaching of Christ. Perverting verses to make them sound like he believes is not true discipleship. To be a follower of Christ one has to put the teaching of Christ before his own feelings, desires and any human instruction.

Second, a true disciple is known by the spirit he manifests. Christ

was faithful to all of his Father's Will. He was humble meek, and gentle. He had an obedient spirit, a self-denying spirit, a forgiving spirit and a courageous spirit. To be a follower of Christ we must possess these same characteristics.

Third, a true disciple is known by the manner of love he manifests. Secret orders and civic clubs have badges or insignias by which they are known. This is also true of a genuine disciple of Christ. He does not wear a peculiar kind of dress, a clerical cloak, a ribbon or a metal badge. He wears a beautiful spotless robe of love. Jesus said in John 13:35. "By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples if ye love one another." One void of love is no more a true disciple than one who is void of faith. "Now abides faith, hope and love and the greatest of these is love." Christianity is a life of love. A life motivated by love. A life void of love is an empty hull. God is love. Christ was sent through love, His love brought salvation to the lost and the Christian's love must be from the whole heart and unfeigned.

Fourth, a true disciple is known by the fruit he bears. A barren life in no way depicts Christlikeness. A non-furitbearing person has no right to claim discipleship of Christ. The fate of fruitless diciples is described in John 15:6. The fruit of a spirit is described in Gal.5:22-23. Can each of us say, I am a true disciple of Christ?D.B.

IT PAYS TO GIVE! Truly it is "more blessed to give than to receive" and the one who gives is the one much more blessed. Some are prone to make light of this, to say it is wrong, and they fail deeply to appreciate the true meaning because they lack the experience of giving. Until one has learned to give with pleasure, with cheer and with some sacrifice, he has not prepared himself to receive the "blessing."

Sacrificial giving is made up of two components: First, LOVE. To give on any other basis isn't sacrificial. Forced giving, pressure giving, or any other kind, except because of love is not sacrificial or pleasing. Second, PAIN. To give of one's surplus only is not sacrificial, but to give with some pain, to deny one's self in order to give, plays a part in sacrificial giving. Some give 25% to 35% of their income on this basis.

IT PAYS, SPIRITUALLY TO GIVE: When loving giving is accomplished there wells up within one's life a sense of deep satisfaction in having a part in God's work. IT PAYS TO GIVE to Christ's cause in a material way for Christ promises to give "full measure, pressed down" to those who give. Some say, "I can't afford to give," but the very reverse is true. We can't afford not to give for God prospers a giver. Trust the Lord and He will not fail you. Let us lay up treasures in heaven by giving more to the Lord now.

CHOICES WE HAVE TO MAKE

Live is filled with choices. Every responsible person has to make choices. We often hear some say they just cannot decide, but in reality they have already made a choice because they have already made up their mind not to make a decision. Often men say, "well I just cannot decide to become a Christian." They feel as if they had made no choice, but they have; they have decided not as yet to become a Christian.

Choices are important because they decide our happiness, our finances, and our destiny. We often say that we did not have the opportunity that others had and this may be true, but had you ever thought that maybe many opportunities came that were not used wisely. Some say that they never had the opportunity for a good job and this may be true because their choice was not to prepare for it. Many are where they are materially, physically (not meaning age) and spiritually because of choices. Some have chosen not to work (much), not to save, not to educate themselves, and not to serve. Many would deny this because they are not aware that their choices have made such a difference in their lives.

Many Christians choose not to be spiritual. All of us could be spiritual if we would only decide that we want to be. Men do not become spiritual not reading the Bible, not praying, not worshipping, and not serving others. Spirituality is something that is developed. It is something that has to be bought. It is bought with time, effort, and sacrifice. Anytime any Christian decides that he wants to do more and become better, all he has to do is just to put forth a greater effort. This is the snag on which many hang. They choose not to pay the price.

To hear some talk you would think that God did not want them to improve themselves, and that He is against them and is hindering them. They talk about having only one talent, some say they have only one talent, some say they have none, and since they have only one, why go to the trouble of using just one. The one talent man had the same opportunity as the two and five talent men. He made a different choice. He decided not to put his to use and they decided to put theirs to use. God gave to each what he was capable of using and He gave to each the power to choose whether or not he would use what he was given.

Those who are physically able, make choices every time edifying services are conducted by the church. Those who choose wisely become more spiritual and those who do not, slip a little farther away from God's purpose for them. Each one makes a choice of the amount of income he will give. Those who choose to give liberally enlarge their spiritual hearts and those who give little, deprive themselves of rich blessings. The opportunity is equal, but the desire is not. Each one is what he is spiritually because of the choices he has made.

GO FORWARD

"And the Lord said unto Moses, wherefore criest thou unto me? Speak unto the children of Israel, that they go forward." Ex. 14:15.

This language was addressed to the Israelites who were about to launch out into a new experience of crossing the Red Sea and for them, going into unexplored territory. They were where they were because they had followed God's leader, Moses. They were encouraged not to be afraid because they would see the salvation (deliverance) of the Lord. They received the promise that God would fight for them and they were told to hold their peace. To achieve their ultimate goal they had to go forward. If they had stood still the results would have been disastrous. The Lord parted the waters of the Sea and they walked across on dry ground. When their enemies tried to follow they were destroyed because it was not God's will that their enemies should go with them into the wilderness.

Things went well with the Israelites as long as they remembered the Lord's words "go forward," but when their faith weakened and they stood in doubt they encountered serious trouble. Their dissatisfaction with conditions caused them to murmur, complain and wish for the departed land of servitude. Their wish was not granted and they suffered for their complainings. Their sufferings were of the very worst kind, they fell in the wilderness and never reached the land of promise. They had dull ears, stubborn wills and evil hearts of unbelief. How different it would have been if they had always remembered the words of God through Moses "go forward."

The West Erwin church has gone forward, we have crossed the sea of an outmoded building, into facilities that enable us to better teach and glorify the great name of the true God. We have not moved into the wilderness of satisfaction thinking that we have completed our journey. THE DEPARTED

I saw a cartoon the other day that depicted a preacher preaching to a mere handful of members scattered throughout the auditorium. He began his lesson by saying, "Today I want to speak concerning our departed... Some have departed to the lake, others to the golf course, others to visit, etc.,etc..."

Being a preacher for several years, I have felt the same way and at times acted the same way till I learned that it did no good to speak to the "departed" who were not present. Some good can come from admonishing the faithful not to depart, but rebuking the present because of the absent is unfair to those who have come to worship and hear something of real need to them.

In Heb. 10:24-25, the writer says to, "consider one another to provoke unto love and good works." He continues by saying in verse 25, the latter part, "but exhorting one another; and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching." The writer is saying here that the provoking unto love and good works and exhorting should be done before the assembly is held. To wait until the assembly is held is to waste time on the "departed" because they are not present.

This simply means that Christians must be personal workers, which does not always mean knocking on doors, week-days as well as on Sunday. Many times through the week we see those who have become unfaithful and it is our obligation to encourage them to become faithful and even rebuke or shame them when it is in order. This includes not only the preacher and elders, certainly they have an obligation to discharge, but so do all Christians. See Gal. 6:1-2 and James 5:19-20. If you are spiritual you are taught to restore one who has been overtaken in a fault. Gal. 6:1 does not mean just to mention it to some one else and tell him how much you regret it, but the Lord says, "restore such a one in the spirit of meekness; considering thyself, lest thou also be tempted."

It is necessary for some to be away from home occasionally and this article is not directed to them. It is true that some are gone so much that they are almost useless so far as work and dependability are concerned. These are in the minority for which we are thankful. We have many who feel an obligation to the Lord and His church and they regret it when they are unavoidably hindered. There are some things all of us will have to depart from if we expect to be eternally saved. They are:

- 1. Psa. 34:14, "Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace and pursue it."
- 2. II Tim. 2:19, "Let every one that nameth the name of Christ depart from iniquity."



ADULTS IN BIBLE STUDY

Do adult (in age) Christians need to be regular in Bible Classes? The devil really gained a great advantage when he led religious folks to swallow the lie that children ought to be sent to Bible school. I'm not denying that children ought to have much Bible teaching: it's the idea that it does not matter too much whether the grownups go to Bible classes or not that is so destructive. In most churches of our Lord the most pitiable section of our spiritual development is the indifference of so many adults to the Bible study program. They are against Bible classes: they just feel it immaterial whether they attend regularly. study their lesson, or take an active part. Brethren (adults) this ought not to be. It would be just as sensible to say it does not matter whether adults eat regularly and plentifully if they are to continue doing hard work. Only the idle, sickly adult feels no need for regular nourishing meals. The same is true in the Lord's kingdom. I challenge you to find a hard working adult in the church who looks with indifference on Bible study. in classes or out. They know they must have it to continue to have spiritual strength for their tasks ahead. If you don't seem to be able to do much for the Lord, the chances are you are in great need of a regular, rich diet of God's Word. Did you ever stop to consider that most of the gospel is directed to the mature in age: only now and then does it speak to children or even young folks directly. I say this with sadness, but we have far too many adults who are indifferent about Bible study, even on Lord's day morning. Won't you consider these truths seriously and determine as an adult to insure health and strength so ... Wilbur C. Hill you can do much work for the Master?

WORKERS TOGETHER

"We then, as workers together with him, beseech you also that ye receive not the grace of God in vain." II Cor. 6:1.

Salvation came to mankind through men who worked together with God. The apostles, who were Christ's ambassadors, preached the gospel of Christ faithfully and their hearers were exhorted not to receive the grace of God in vain. If they regarded the preaching of the apostles lightly and passed it by heedlessly, they received God's grace in vain because it did not accomplish its intended purpose. For any institution, whether it be a home, business, or the Lord's church, to be successful it must be organized or have co-laborers. Each must be faithful to his appointed duties.

Jesus planned years in advance for the establishment of His church. He selected and equipped twelve apostles and sent them out to tell others about the approaching kingdom (the church) before it was established. He selected seventy others and equipped them for the work of readying people for his kingdom. They were all workers together for God.

When the church was established, the apostles soon set the church in order by ordaining elders in every city, and these likewise were workers together with God. The work of the Lord's church has always been a joint effort. The assignments were according to the abili-

ties of the workers. All did not do the same work, but all worked together to the same end of saving souls.

It is the Lord's will that every member be a worker. None were saved from their sins just to be spectators or visitors. Christians are not ornaments they are workers.

In most congregations the greater portion of the members have no earthly idea of how much planning and work goes into the program of work being done. Some come to worship in a building that is ready at all times for use. The ones who attend Bible classes walk in and sit down with no idea of either the time or money spent to have the room prepared and neither are they conscious of the time the teacher has spent in preparing for the lesson. All of this is not done by any one, but by many. It takes much time, effort and money to carry on the Lord's work. The next time you come to worship or attend a class, pause a moment and think of the planning and cost of having such services. Then while you are thinking, another thing to think about is just how much of your time and money helped make this possible.

Few of us ever think of the time and effort spent in selecting men to serve the Lord's Supper to the congregation. Letters are written each week, telephone calls are made and person to person contacts are made after we gather for worship.

DEPENDABILITY

So many of us are so changeable and vacillating today that the word dependability hardly makes a dent on our heart. We find so much restlessness and dissatisfaction characterizing so many till it is almost impossible to find a dependable person when it comes to the work of the Lord. A promise to do a thing does not mean that it will be done. There is a mental reservation that it will be done provided that nothing comes along that we had rather do.

Undependableness is not found in religion alone, but it is in practically every walk of life. One's word today does not mean that it will be kept. When a promise is made, we only hope the promisor will keep it.

In the business world employers are finding it harder and harder to find stable, dependable employees. Employees are finding it harder to find employers who will keep their word. When the hand of either is called, he replies, "well you just misunderstood me, I meant something else." Under his breath he knows he is lying and that he did not intend to keep his word if he could get around it.

This is a sad state of affairs, when we cannot depend upon each other, but it is sadder still when Christians cannot be depended upon to keep their word with either God or man. Many have walked down the aisle with the promise in their hearts that if the Lord would for-

give their sins, through the blood of Christ, that they would be faithful to the very end. Since that time they have almost or altogether forsaken the Lord. If the work of the Lord depended on them, there would be little, if any, done. If the Bible school work depended on them, there would never be another Bible class. If all did as they do, seldom if ever, would the Lord's Supper be observed. There would seldom be a Sunday evening or Wednesday evening service. If each Christian was as undependable as they, there would not be enough money given to buy song books. Was this what they promised the Lord when they were forgiven? Was this what they had in mind when they requested to be baptized into Christ? Surely not, because no faithful preacher or Bible class teacher ever taught such a thing.

Some people are impetuous and emotional. But this can be overcome if one will study God's Word and examine his life in the light of it, while at the same time he is seeking to do better. If his ultimate goal is to become stable or dependable, he can do so by becoming rooted and grounded in the truth. Arguing the loudest that we have the truth is not the best way to impress our friends. Undependability speaks louder than our claims. The best argument that any Christian can make is a good faithful demonstration of the life and teaching of Jesus, our pattern. D.B.

There are some who think the whole of pure and undefiled religion is just to keep themselves unspotted from the world. But, if that is all one ever did, who would provide for the needs of the unspectors.

fortunate? John said that when we see a brother in need and shut up our heart of compassion against him, how dwelleth the love of Christ in us?

The example of the Samaritan in Luke's record shows that we are to do good whether we know the person or not when such an opportunity presents itself. Jesus told the lawyer that the Samaritan proved to be his neighbor, he commended him and told the lawyer to go, and do thou likewise. Christians must divide their worldly goods with others, but there are other things that must be divided too.

We are taught in Galatians 1.that when one is overtaken in a fault to restore him. That is a good work too. James says if one errs from the truth and is converted that the one who converts the sinner from the error of his way has saved a soul from death and has hidden a multitude of sins. There is no doubt but what restoring a fallen brother is a greater work than dividing our worldly goods with him. And too, the fallen brethren are about as common as the destitute in this world's goods. None of us would have to look very far to find an erring brother. Why not do good by trying to restore him to his first love? Then there are some discouraged and downhearted ones among us, why not do good to them by encouraging them, by showing Christian love to them.

LOVEST THOU ME MORE THAN THESE?

Whether Jesus had reference to Peter's profession of fishing or to the other disciples when he asked the above question makes no difference so far as the following thoughts are concerned. So far as it is known, no one knows exactly to which the Lord referred. Some of the best scholars take both views.

The main thought is that if Peter loved either his profession or the other disciples more than he did the Lord, he would not have been qualified to do the great work the Lord wanted him to do. The work he wanted him to do was to feed his lambs and sheep. This account is found in John 21:15-17.

We may be living in one of the most difficult times, when it comes to faithful service, since the church began. We read and hear much about persecutions, trials, and martyrs in the first two or three centuries of Christianity. Our hearts almost bleed when we read of the suffering of those who dared to be faithful in the face of such torture. It hardly seems possible that some would be so inhuman as to inflict such punishment upon those who were serving the Lord. But, when we think of those who died, just losing their bodies, we are glad they remained faithful to the Lord, so their souls were saved eternally.

The guiding influence behind all the suffering and death of the early saints was Satan. No doubt he would do the same today if the law allowed, but we had some forefathers who were thoughtful and thankful enough to draw up a constitution to allow us freedom of worship. Now Satan is no longer permitted to take us and torture us bodily through his emissaries, so he uses other approaches. These approaches are more deadly than that of persecution, because they destroy the soul. Satan's work is to separate us from the Lord. It matters not how it is done. One way of separating us from God, to Satan, is as good as another.

Lethargy is just as dangerous and damnable as was the denial of Jesus, the Christ before their tormentors rather than to suffer the punishment. One does not have to deny that Jesus is the Son of God to be lost. One can love a life of ease and unconcern and be as displeasing to God as the most avowed skeptic. The Lord and His Cause must be loved by us more than anything else in life.

The man who expends all of his energy for materialism loves the Lord less than he does that. The pleasure seekers who slights the Lord's work and the worship and spends more time and money on pleasure than he does on the Lord, loves the Lord less than he loves his pleasure. The one who never (and there are many) opens his Bible loves other things more or he would study. The man who will sacrifice and spend all his money for things he really does not need and gives stintingly to (continued inside)

FOR PARENTS ONLY

This article is in behalf of our children. It is in interest of the souls of those that have been intrusted into our care, those whose lives are suppose to be guided by us. I am not appealing to those of us who have waited too late, but to those of us who still have them in our homes and whose lives can still be influenced to do God's Will.

We are told that a child's behaviour pattern is set by the time he is seven or maybe younger. If this is true, and no doubt it is. then these years are most important in the lives of these children. Parents do not have any time to waste. We cannot let a day go by without putting some of God's Word into the innocent and precious hearts of these little ones. No parents should ever let an opportunity go by to have them taught by others. This means that they should be in Bible class and Worship every time these are conducted. Children learn something every time they are in attendance. This is true from infancy through adolescence on into manhood. The greatest impact that can be made on the lives of our children is by us. Right in your own homes. This is not taking anything away from the church either. The church has a responsibility, but so do we as parents. Our children spend more time with us than they do in classes and worship assemblies. We cannot neglect them all the week and expect the teachers to instill righteousness in their hearts in one, two, or three hours a week, or maybe less time than that, depending on how often they attend. Our children learn more from us, as parents, than they do from their teachers. We would like to blame those who teach, but we need to take an introspective look into our homes and the time we spend in guiding them spiritually. Our children see our actions, hear our words and they know exactly what we think of the Lord and His church.

Often the remark is made that the church is losing about half of the children between high school and graduation from college. They are lost to the church, but the church that carries on a good teaching program has not lost them, THEY WERE LOST BY THEIR PARENTS.

Would you keep your children out of school as you do out of Bible classes? Would you allow your children to go to school as unprepared as you do to Bible classes? Few, if any parents, would allow it. While we are feeding, clothing, and educating our children do not forget they have never-dying souls. We are responsible for our children as long as they are in our homes.

WHAT KIND OF A FOOL HAD YOU RATHER BE?

There are many kinds of fools in the Bible. There is the daring fool that says there is not God. There is the fool that builds his life upon the sand. Then there is the fool that trusted in riches. The fool that is right in his own eyes, and the fool that makes a mock at sin. Paul said "we are fools for Christ's sake," 1 Cor. 4:10, and then added, "ye are wise in Christ." This is said in irony. Some of the Corinthians boasted of their wisdom and highly esteemed themselves. But they were not willing to condescend to the level of those who had preached the gospel to them. Paul and others had been made a spectacle to the world or put on exhibition for sport like criminals were before execution. This is a case of the pupils knowing more than the teacher before they had become well acquainted with the subject. Some of the Corinthians really felt sorry for such ignorant men as Paul, Apollas and Cephas. So Paul resorted to irony or satire in I Cor. 4 to teach them a much needed lesson.

Some are considered fools for Christ's sake today, Some of the world's fools are:

- 1. Those who believe the Bible to be a revelation from God. Some claim to believe it with a great deal of deletion. The stories of creation, the flood, virgin birth of Christ, Jonah and the whale, the resurrection and hell, must all be deleted along with some other things.
- 2. Some consider those fools who believe God's plan for man's salvation. Open ridicule is made of one who believes and takes at face value the answer given to the question of "What must I do to be saved?" The idea of a penitent believer being baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of his sins and receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit is narrow-mindedness of the worst sort. The very idea of going the same hour of the night to be baptized is fanaticism.
- 3. Some of the members of the church feel sorry for those who believe they should increase their Bible knowledge and are faithful to attend Bible school. They sympathize with those of us who enjoy worshipping more than once a week. To them it is foolish to "run up to the building two or three times a week." They are not aware that there would be no church services to attend if all did as they do, attend only occasionally.

The world calls us fools because we sacrifice a little for Christ; but someone has said, "I'd rather be called a fool for being a Christian than to be a fool by not being one.

It is true that we are interested in a larger number, but we are interested in training all to be more Christlike so they will be fitted for heaven when they die. If we were interested only in numbers to brag about, we would put on some shows and entertainment or put on a banquet. These always draw more than a Bible class. If you are approached about attending a Bible class, consider it a compliment because some one loves you and they are interested in your soul.

There are a good many elderly people who would like to have you visit them and if you will take the time to make their hearts glad I will furnish you with names to visit. Some of the elderly members feel unloved and unwanted, but they are not. It is more neglect on our part than anything else. It would be a great work if some of the couples or women or just anyone who can would visit them and cheer their hearts. It would cheer our hearts too. Contrary to the belief of many they would be glad to see someone other than the preacher. Try visiting them once or twice a month. It will pay rich dividends.



"ALL THE CHURCH CARES ABOUT IS MONEY!"

Have you ever heard that statement? If you are associated with a dead and do-nothing church then perhaps you haven't. But if the congregation you worship with sends missionaries, houses orphans, feeds the hungry, and clothes the needy, then somebody occasionally complains: "All the church cares about is money."

If the charge is true, it puts the church in bad company. The one indictment that can be consistently brought against every sordid segment of society is: "All they care about is money."

All the liquor industry cares about is money. That is a true statement, despite the fact that it is seldom said. Liquor interests have no regard for a man's femily. They don't care about accidents and mangled bodies caused by drinking. They do not care about "skid row" and the human lives left shattered.

All the tobacco companies care about is money. I know for sure they don't have much feeling for a breath of good clean air in a jetliner cabin. They don't care about stained fingers, lips, lungs, or perhaps even the cancer to which they may have contributed. They don't care about wasted budgets.

All the movie industry cares about is money. Not morals, not integrity nor human dignity - just money. And before this list begins to sound like a medieval diatribe, let me hasten to add that far too much of the respected establishment - industry, businessmen, salesmen of all kinds - apparently care only about money. At least if one would judge by the cut-throat economic habits of our time.

Now what about the church? The church cares about the lost and dying. The church cares about the sick and underprivileged, and discouraged. The church cares about the home and the community, about immorality and lawlessness.

The church must not care much about money because it gives away every penny it can get its hands on to advance the Kingdom of God. Here's the only interest the church has in money: it's a form of energy, a kind of fuel which can be used to bless people spiritually.

The kind of man who says, "All the church cares about is money," is telling you more about himself than about the church. The church has absolutely no terminal interest in money whatsoever.

The church merely wants to assist the brethren by translating the root of all kinds of evil, which the brethren can't take with them, into treasures which moth and rust cannot destroy.

If you ever again hear anybody else make the statement, you'll be prepared to set them straight,

YOU MAKE THE DECISION

"And it shall come to pass, that whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved."Acts 2:21.
"For whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."
Rom. 10:13.

The decision to be saved from past sins and live a faithful Christian life is one that belongs to us and not the Lord. The Lord has done every possible thing that justice allows a free moral agent in order for him to be saved. idea of begging God to save us or prevailing upon Him to save us "if it be thy will" is not in harmony with divine instruction. God made it possible for all men to be saved and we make the decision ourself. The definition of decision is. "to make up one's mind, to determine, to settle, to conclude." It implies firmness which is the ability to stay with what one decides.

Decision is one of the most distinguishable marks between the weak and strong. The strong make right decisions based upon the Bible and stay with them, as best they can, and the weak make decisions but seldom live by the best ones.

We hear some talk as if God would make the decision for them as to whether or not they became Christians. The Father in heaven wills that all men be saved. We are the ones who make the decision to believe, trust, and obey His Word. If the decision depended upon God alone, none would be lost. But unitl we have make the decision to

be saved, or to do the Lord's Will, we have made the decision not to be saved. Jesus said he "stands at the door and knocks," and we have to decide to let him in or keep Him out.

The greatest and wisest decision of all is to become a member of the Lord's church, and be faithful to the Lord's trust. All others pale into insignificance when this one is thought through and carried out. It is the decision of the Christian as to whether he puts the Kingdom of God and His righteousness first, second, or last. He has the divine prerogative to do that now, but he will not have the choice of his eternal abode. Before one decides how well or how poorly he serves the Lord in His church, he ought to sit down and think the matter through. There are two things that must be given our most serious consideration. The first is, the cost and joy of going to heaven. The second is, the cost and horror of going to hell.

You, my brethren, under normal circumstances, make the decision about attending Bible School and studying in your home. You make the decision about the amount you give. You also make the decision of teaching to the best of your ability, ministering to the needs of others, worshipping when you can, etc. Jesus asked, "Why call ye me, Lord, Lord, and do not the things which I say?"

THE BIBLE SCHOOL TEACHER

We as teachers need to recognize that students learn from every experience. He may learn what you want him to learn or he may not. His experiences in a situation may be quite different from what was intended. Now a teacher cannot give the student the experience. that he must undergo himself! This fact is the reason why teaching in modern concepts is described as a mature person assisting a leas mature person to reach a greater degree of maturity in any particular field. Every student is teaching himself, but with the guidance of the teacher. The empty, soon forgotten, rituals of forced memorization of material is similar to coercing someone to eat. The teacher should help the student to

see things accurately and clearly. so that they are accepted, remembered and used. A student that is led to see the material in his "mind's eye" will remember it more easily, for it has become a part of his direct experience. The more meaning he can see in it. the better it is remembered and the more it may be utilized in new situations. This we need: To learn to use Bible learning in every day living.

To help yourself, answer the following questions: What do I need to know about perception to help my students to observe more carefully? What do I need to know about ways to make learning more meaningful? How may I teach to insure that the students will make use of what they learn? T.A.J.

STEADFAST FOR OURSELF AND VACILLATING FOR THE LORD

If there is anything any more fickle than a man it is two men. He loves you today and hates you tomorrow, even though you are the same both days. He is your friend today and foe tomorrow. He is your protector today and destroyer tomorrow. Faithful today and unfaithful tomorrow. This has ever been the history of man whose heart is not firmly fixed on the way of the Lord.

One time at Lystra the Lord healed a cripple through Paul, an apostle. The Lyconians said, "The gods are come down to us in the likeness of men, Acts 14:11. They called Barnabas "Jupiter" and Paul "Mercurius." They brought oxen and garlands unto the gates and would have done sacrifice with the people, but Paul and Barnabas restrained them. Later Jews came from Antioch and Iconium and turned the Lystrians away from Paul and Barnabas and they gave their consent to have Paul stoned to death.

Why this sudden change of mind? Had Paul said or done something to cause them to change so suddenly? There had been no change in Paul, but those vacillating people had changed. This is seen quite often in the work of the Lord. Some obey the gospel and you would think they would love and revere the Lord the rest of their lives. They declare more vehemently than did Peter; that he would never deny the Lord, and they do not last much longer in service to the Lord and His church

than did he during the crucial hour. Restore him and he starts out again and you know from his conversation and presence that this is the time for him to get set and stay put, but he is off again in a short time.

Why does this happen to so many people? Do they not know what steadfastness means? Sure they do. because they can define words. They know that steadfast means, "firmly established or fixed, unchanging, not fickle or wavering." If they did not know that, how could they operate a business or stay employed? There are several reasons why church members vacillate or waver in mind and action, when they do not in other things. Probably the main reason is that they are really not converted to Christ. Their love is shallow. They are emotional only and emotionalism untaught or unguided is likely to go in any direction. The next reason is that they are more materially minded than spiritual. They can see only the present. They know that the body has to be fed. clothed and housed, but they are not aware that the soul is more valuable than the body. The third reason is that they can neglect the Lord and His church without any signs of present outward punishment. If God punished his children publicly or privately as parents do their children, there would be better behavious in the Family of God. No Christian will(continued inside)

PAUL'S GOAL AS A TEACHER

The goal of education is to lead children from one level of maturity to another. We all seem to know how a teenager should act, how a sixth grader should act, etc. We tell our children to act their age. In the above thoughts physical maturity is not the primary idea, but is is not excluded. One educator has said that there are five criteria required in analyzing the quality of maturity attained by a child: (1) a satisfactory fulfillment of one's capacities, (2) an adequate, balanced self-concept based upon selfinsight, (3) an ability to meet reality without developing crippling emotional and mental conflicts. (4) the ability to love beyond onesself, and (5) adjustment to and creative participation in one's environment.

What is the goal of the Bible school instruction given at the church building? As the public school teachers realize that there is more to education than knowing the facts. we as teachers in the Bible schools of the church need to realize that the facts of the Bible are to be known not as an end in themselves. but as a means to an end. Are we systematically leading the children from one level of spiritual maturity to another? Do we have any objective means of determining the spiritual maturity that a particular age level should be expected to achieve? Perhaps, a spiritual meaning may be placed with

value on the above five criteria. We have heard time and time again that what the church needs is maturity in its members and leadership. Have we not contributed to this lack of maturity many times because the training that was given in the Bible school situation lacked maturity as a goal. Overstreet has said that education is "... encouraging the immature to become mature." A mature Christian has a trained disciplined mind, knows Bible facts, has the feeling for others and has the sense of responsibility that he needs for the fullest Christian life. A goal of maturity thus serves both the individual and the church, for the mature Christian can at once live a full satisfying personal life and be a competent citizen in the Kingdom of God.

Never has maturity been more needed. Probably no age has ever been so demanding in terms of human relations, in terms of knowledge and understanding, and in terms of values. Maturity is crucial for our survival, as individuals and a nation.

I am either too busy or too tired. How many times have we heard these words when it comes to church work or church related meetings. Some get too tired to attend Wednesday evening, too tired to get up and attend Bible study on Lord's Day morning, too tired to attend Lord's Day evening, etc. But how many members did you ever hear of being too tired for a social function. Yes, it is true they are tired, but they go most every time, do they not?

It is true that some get tired and sick from over work or too much going, but the point is that some Christians make a greater effort to go to a social function than they do to go to worship and attend to church work. Some even feel left out when they are not invited to a social function, but they seldom, if ever, complain if they are left out of the work of the church. Why do you suppose this happens? Why do you suppose a Christian will make a greater effort to go to a function of some kind on Tuesday or Thursday evenings and will make less effort to study and worship on Wednesday? Why do you suppose one will arise early on every day of the week and go to his job or business and will not make the same effort on Lord's Day morning? If it is rest that one needs, why not get the rest Saturday morning or some other week day morning?

In answer to turning down a social get-to-gether, one says he does not want to insult the one who has

invited him as it might appear that he did not like him if he refused. Another says he would lose his job if he slept or rested on week day mornings. Has it ever occured to you, brethren, that God has invited you to Bible study and worship and that He too can be insulted? Or have you ever thought about losing your soul which is much more important than any job, as important as they may be to our existence and happiness.

If you should delve into the answers to why people slight the Lord's work and worship and feel badly about entertaining the idea of not accepting every possible invitation to other functions, you might be surprised. There are many people who are as badly deceived as was Simon Peter about denying the Lord. They over estimate their faith, love, and devotion. They are just not as interested as they think they are and their glaring inconsistencies prove it.

People are busy and they are tired. But if they are too busy and too tired for the Lord, it seems that they would be too busy for other things that are less important. Those who were too busy to accept the King's invitation to the marriage of His Son were destroyed (Matt. 22:2-7). One day, and it may be soon, we are going to lay down all present activities and die, and none of us will be too busy or too tired to do it. Neither will we be too busy to stand(continued inside)

WHY I COME TO ASSEMBLE WITH THE SAINTS

We all know that it is our duty to attend worship regularly and can give chapter and verse for it (Heb. 10:25). We all know that we are suppose to receive a blessing from the worship. WILL THEY GO ALL THE WAY?

A meeting of unusual interest is being conducted in Dallas this week. The meeting is being conducted by representatives of several well-known denominations. The purpose of this meeting is to try fear that if they get closer to the to work out a plan for those denominations. representing about twenty-four million people. to merge. For a number of years each denomination has been teaching a different doctrine, practicing different items of worship, and governed by a different form of government. Evidently the leaders see the folly of division and believe that more can be accomplished united (or in union) than in division. Not knowing the motive behind all of this I am not in position to say just what prompted such meeting and why those churches want to be together. All through the years they have considered one another brethren (with the exception of the Disciples of Christ maybe, the y use to claim to be different, but not any more) even though they did not believe and practice the same things. They all taught or do now, that some of the commandments of the Lord are non-essential and that one church is as good as another. They have held many things in common, but one of the representatives said on a newscast Monday that he believed they would have a harder time selling it to their members than to each other.

This article is not intended to be critical but thought provoking

and instructive. Those same leaders have done a good job through the years on selling their members on error and keeping back some of the truth from them. Do they now truth it will be harder to sell the people on it? Or do they fear getting too close to family sentiment for some to leave their former teaching, or just what is it?

The men conducting the Dallas meeting are going in the right direction if they will go all the way. If they will do away with all of their creeds, feelings, and family sentiment, unscriptural names and practices and go all the way back to the Bible and Bible only, they will have accomplished what should have been done long. long, ago. A different church for those with a different taste has no scriptural basis. The Bible is our only guide (2 Tim. 3:16-17), God our only Father. Jesus Christ our only Saviour and Mediator and the Holy Spirit the only life in the word to create us anew in the image of God.

LET'S BE CREATIVE

A word frequently seen in the description of successful men and women is "Creative." "He has a creative mind." My conception of "to create," and "creation" has always been colored by the fact that God is the creator and man is the Creature. We are here as a result of God's creation. Webster's dictionary has these meanings: Create (1) to bring into being; to cause to exist. (2) Hence: a. To invest with a new form. office, or character; to constitute. b. To produce, form, or bring to pass, by influence over others; as to create a favorable opinion. (3) To produce as a work of thought or imigination, esp. a work of art. Creative (1) Having the power or quality of creating. (2) Productive. In a recent class discussion this question was brought up. 'What will happan to the written word of God if godless scholars continue to translate and edit it?" I don't know ... but, I do know that God will protect His word. The world experienced a period described as the dark ages because scholarship ceased. The reformation and restoration of learning. especially Bible knowledge, has brought about our modern standard of living. The point of this article is this: We need to be creative. We need to create in the minds of our youth that Biblical scholarship must never be left in the hands of the unbelievers. We need to create a desire in the hearts of young men and women the desire to produce new and fresh songs and hymns that will move and inspire us and our children as much as the hymns of the past few centuries. We need to create in our minds the desire to sing the praises of God. One method of determining the spiritual fervor of a congregation is to listen as it sings the gospel songs and hymns. We need to create a situation where the congregation is not tied to the hymnbook and the songs found therein. If a man wrote a masterpiece of hymn music, he would have a hard time getting it sung in the average congregation for two reasons, we are tied to the old and familiar and to that whitin the song book. Creativeness in this field of the work of the church has been stifled for the want of expression. One step in remeding the situation would be to encourage every member of the congregation to learn to some degree to read music. Then to have a period frequently where newer songs could be learned. It would help a great deal if every member of the congregation would sing with more vigor and vitality, especially those who sit in the back of the auditorium. ... be filled with the Spirit, addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with all your heart, always and for everything giving thanks in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ to God the Father. Eph. 5:19 (RSV) T.A.J.

PRIDE WHICH ERECTS ITSELF AGAINST GOD AND MAN:

The following thoughts are some that I have adapted from a word study by Mr. William Barclay. The words being studied are words that contain these ideas: Wanton insolence, one who acts with wanton insolence, and to treat with wanton insolence. The basic idea in all is "The pride which erects itself against God and man alike." One has said that the root meaning is violent over-stepping of the mark, the insolence of triumph, and the pride of life that tramples underfoot the laws of God and man. The basic evil is that when this 'pride' enters into a man's heart that man forgets that he is a creature and that God is the Creator. It is the sin whereby a man forgets his humanity and makes himself equal with God.

Here is what some of the Greeks thought about the sin we are discussing. Plato has it: When opinion conquers, and by the help of reason, leads us to the best, the conquering principle is called 'temperance' but when desire, which is devoid of reason, rules in us, and drags us to pleasure, that power of misrule is called 'insolent pride.' Aristotle describes this sin with these ideas: Speaking with deliberate attempt to insult and to give offence... that deliberate way of slighting a man, which is bound to beget anger... it is wanton insolence done simply for the pleasure it gives to see somebody suffer. The source of the pleasure found in

insolent action is the feeling that in injuring others we are claiming an exceptional superiority to them. It is easy to see that to the Greeks this was the cruelest of all sins. Let us now turn to the Bible and see how inspiration guided men to use these awful words. In Acts 27:10,21 it is used simply of the disaster which will follow a sea voyage taken against the advice of Paul. In another case one of the Scribes complains that Jesus has treated the scribes with insolence in his denunciation of them (Luke 11:45) This type of pride is spoken of as one of the characteristic sins of the pagan world (Rom. 1:30). One of these words is used by Paul to describe his own conduct toward the Church in the days when he was a persecutor (I Tim. 1:13). Twice another one of these words is used of the treatment which Paul received at the hands of his persecutors on his missionary journeys (Acts 14:5; I Thess. 2:2). In the list of his sufferings in II Cor. 12:10. Paul includes the things he suffered from 'wanton insolence.' Jesus uses the word of the treatment which he himself knew he would suffer at Jerusalem (Luke 18:32).In Matt. 22:6 the conduct of the men who ill-treated and killed the messengers of the king who brought the king's invitation to the feast illustrates most fully the actions of this sin.

This article is not addressed to you who have to be begged, petted and pampered before you will attend the services of the church and still are absent as often as you are present. This isn't for those who only give the church their excuses and grumble the most while doing the least.

Our vocabulary isn't large enough to tell those who can be depended upon at all times how very much we appreciate you. It matters not how many meetings the elders may call within a week, we know you will be present. The weather nor any amount or kind of company are ever able to cause you to treat lightly your responsibility. Whatever attractions or distractions the world may

offer, we know they will not cause you to forsake the Lord. You make whatever sacrifice is necessary. You have no more time than the unfaithful members do, but somehow you manage to find time to fully serve the Lord.

Whenever a good program is put before the church, no one even wonders what your response will be or whether you can be counted on to see it through. When you accept an assignment, it is a foregone conclusion you will see it through. You don't flirt with sin or see how worldly you can become without completely apostatizing.

We appreciate you even more because you demand no special attention or praise for your service and you do not consider that being regular and faithful to God is a grievous burden or a great feat of valor. You are a good example to our younger members and an inspiration to all of us. You make the work of an elder or preacher much lighter. Thank you for being the kind of person you are. A CHANNEL OF BLESSINGS THAT HAS BEEN DAMMED

One of the many things that was once fairly common but which has now been given up by most every one in this modern age, is the family prayer circle. This great channel of blessings has been dammed up by the varied lives of the members of the family and the entrance of television into the living room. Much can be said for the family that sets a time where all the members of the family must be together and then with the father taking the lead engage in worship to God. The great influence of one's faith on another's would only be one blessing among many. We hear about families that are torn by quarreling children and husbands and wives that do not trust each other. Can you imagine a family that meets together daily to talk to God and read the scriptures that allows petty jealousies and childish differences to long remain? The church today is in dire need of families who will take the time to worship daily in the home. It is the father's place to initiate such action and to use his authority and position as head of the house to see that it continues in the proper spirit. We sing of the Faith of our Fathers while we never realize that to do us any good that Faith of our Fathers must be kindled in our own heart. As a seed planted, begins life as a small entity, grows by means of food and light, so faith must be planted in the heart by a reading of God's Word. It must be fed and exercised and then it will grow to be like that great Faith of our Fathers which many of us seem to have idolized. The great faith and Bible knowledge of past generations in the church is something to be proud of. Let us not neglect the present generation by lack of family worship and religious training in the home which can be strengthened in the Bible class room. Let's break that Dam.

CHALLENGED

Last week the senior and junior high classes on Sunday evening heard a tape recording of Stanley Shipp's talk given at the Glenwood church recently. Brother Shipp held the teenagers' rapt attention for one hour in which time he challenged them concerning their lives as Christians. Some of the ideas that he set forth were these:

Our nation will be invaded and taken over by a powerful force, the youth of today. Are you preparing for your part in this take over? Control of self is not the responsibility of the adults alone, but we must learn early in our lives to control our emotions and activities. God uses us as powerful force for good if we will but ask Him in prayer and allow Him the freedom in our lives that He wishes.

We need dedication which will be manifested in the following ways: More prayer, more Bible reading, more personal evangelism, and a personal commitment that I as a young person will sometime in my life go to a field where the church is weak and will spend some time there building it up.

Brother Shipp challenged the young people to read the New Testament through in 30 days. About 14 of our young people committed themselves to the task. They will have to average 9 chapters a day but this is no herculean task. Just think of the Bible knowledge that would be gained the rest of the year if each one of us would sit down and repeatedly read our New Testament through. Each time we would reread it, it would become more familiar and meaningful. This coupled with earnest and fervent prayer could make the West Erwin church grow in such a way that growth will be seen not only in numbers but in the spirituality of the members and the magnitude of the work being done to the glory of the Lord.

Brother Shipp mentioned one other thing that I wish to repeat here. We hear a great deal about the campaigns and cottage meeting work that is being done over the nation. He reports that the majority of this work is being done by the youth of the church, college age down through the teenagers. Would it not be wonderful if the more mature in the Lord would take the lead and give direction and guidance to the enthusiasm of the young. Pray that these young people may have long lives in the service of the Master. May they never lose their self control and their dedication to the Master.

RANDOM THOUGHTS FROM BROTHER BROOKSHIRE

THE SIN OF PRESUMPTION

Psa. 19:13, "Keep back thy servant also from presumptuous sins; let them not have dominion over me: then shall I be upright, and I shall be innocent from the great transgression."

The sin of presumption is probably the most common sin committed by religious people. It is the basis of denominationalism. Take presumption out of denominationalism and you would have Christianity and nothing more.

The word presumption means, to take for granted; to suppose on reasonable grounds; to form confident or arrogant opinions, or daring.

The Christian life is not one of presumption but of faith. We walk by faith. Christians accept what the Bible reveals and take nothing for granted. Christians are not forerunners, but followers. God's ways are not our ways, His thoughts are not our thoughts. Things that are highly esteemed by us may be despicable in God's sight.

God has said much about presumption. To keep us from the practice of it He has given scripture showing the consequences of taking matters into our own hands.

God has always been intolerant of presumption and it is stated plainly in Num. 15:30 what the outcome will be to those who practice it. Here is what God says, "But the soul that doeth ought presumptuously, whether he be born in the land, or a stranger, the same reproacheth the Lord, and that soul shall be cut off from among the people." From this verse none were excused. Native and stranger were treated alike, they were both cut off | from among the people. Concerning a presumptuous prophet the Lord said in Deut. 18:20, "But the prophet, which shall presume to speak a word in my name which I have not commanded him to speak, or shall speak in the name of other Gods, even that prophet shall die." In order to please the Lord a prophet had to speak what God commanded. He was not allowed to take any liberty and speak his own mind or opinion because he knew nothing of the mind or will of God except what God had revealed to him. So it is today, men know nothing about the Will of God except what he reads in the Scriptures. Peter speaks of the daring kind that speak against authority in 2 Pet. 2:10. "Presumptuous (daring ASV) are they, self-willed, they are not afraid to speak evil of dignities. "The most daring person is one who will speak against the Word of Almighty God.

David knew that wilful, intentional or deliberate sins would cut one off from the grace of God. He also knew that presumptuous teachers are tyrants who try to bring one, who should be a servant of God, a servant unto himself. David is praying that the Lord would keep back, withhold or restrain him altogether from committing this (continued inside)

LONGSUFFERING

The words in the New Testament that are translated as 'longsuffering' and 'to suffer long' are characteristically Biblical words. They do not occur in other writings of ancient Greek literature at all, and only very seldom in later Greek. They are essentially Christian words, for as we shall see, they describe a Christian virtue which to the Greek was no virtue at all. These words have two uses.

1. They describe the 'steadfast spirit which will never give in.' It is that spirit of 'patience' and faith which will ultimately inherit the promise. It was because Abraham patiently endured, that he in the end received the promise (Heb.6:15). 'Patience' is a virtue that the Christian must have as he waits for the Day of the Lord, and he may learn it from the 'patience' of the farmer as he waits for the crop, and from the 'patience' of the prophets who never gave up their hope in God (James 5:7-10). The Christian must have this 'longsuffering' which can endure delay and bear suffering and never give in.

2. They describe the 'attitude that a man should have toward his fellow-men.' This is the typical New Testament use of the words. Longsuffering has been described as the spirit which could take revenge if it liked, but utterly refuses to do so. It is the spirit which will never retaliate. Now this is the very opposite of Greek

virtue. The great Greek virtue was the refusal to tolerate any insult or injury. To the Greek the big man was the man who went all out for vengeance, much like the offended 'cowboy' in the western movies. But to the Christian the big man is the man who, even when he can, refuses to take vengeance. (a) This patience with men is the characteristic of the 'Christian leader.' It is that very quality which Paul claims to be the proof of real apostleship (II Cor.6: 6; compare I Tim.1:16; II Tim.3:10). No one can ever lead and guide and direct in a Christian manner without this Longsuffering. (b) It is the characteristic of the 'preacher' (Tit. 2:2). Without it the preacher would be driven to pessimistic despair and to that irritability which wrecks preaching. (c) It ought to be the characteristic of 'every Christian.' It is included in the fruit of the Spirit(Gal.5:22) Without it men cannot walk worthily of their Christian calling (Eph.4:2: Col.3:12). It must be exercised toward all men (I Thess.5:14). It is one of the great characteristics of Love (I Cor. 13:4). There can be no such thing as a Christian fellowship without 'longsuffering.' And the reason for that is just this -- long suffering is the great

characteristic of God. (Rom.2:4:

LONGSUFFERING (continued from back) It is that very longsuffering which is responsible for man's salvation (II Pet.3:9.15). If God had been a man, he would long ago have taken his hand and wiped out the world. but in his 'patience' he bears with the sins, the follies and the disobedience of men.

The great obligation which rests on the Christian is just this -- he must be as patient with his fellowmen as God has been with him.

TRUE RELIGION

The basic meaning which lies behind true religion is "the right attitude to God and to the holiness, the majesty and the love of God." This can be reduced further by using the word righteousness. The question now comes, "What is the right attitude?"

- 1. True religion or godliness, comes through the divine power of Jesus Christ (II Pet. 1:3). Without the vision of Jesus, without the help of Jesus, without the presence of Jesus, true religion is impossible. I Tim. 3:16 speaks, about the 'mystery of godliness.' In New Testament times a mystery was a divine secret, unintelligible to the outsider, but open and precious to the true worshipper. So Jesus brought to men the secret of true religion. In Him men both see God and learn how to worship God.
- 2. But although true religion is the gift of the power of Jesus Christ, it is none the less something which a man must struggle and battle to attain. We must train ourselves to religion (I Tim. 4:7). We must follow after religion (I Tim. 6:11).
- 3. This gift and this struggle combined bring three things. (a) Godliness brings trouble. The man who will live for Christ must expect to receive persecution (II Tim. 3:12). To be different from the world, to have a different set of standards and a different set of aims, is always a perilous thing. It is not peace but glory that Christ offers us. (b) Godliness or true religion brings power. It was holiness and power combined that the Jerusalem crowds saw in Peter and John (Acts 3:12). Christ never sends a man a task without also sending him the power to do it. In these times, the Christian alone has the power to stand four-square against the assaults of all evil. (c) Godliness brings God. For the true worshipper of God, the way is ever open to God (John 9:31). In every time of trial the Christian has continual access to and contact with the power of the Eternal.
- 4. Godliness is the origin of all true doctrine and of all true thinking (I Tim. 6:3; Tit. 1:1). One of the great neglected truths of the Christian life is that one's insight and understanding of God and His ways are morally conditioned. God can only tell a man what that man is capable of receiving and understanding. The closer a man lives to God, the more God can say to him. To learn about God we must first of all obey God. It may well be true that the man who says that he cannot under stand the Way of Life does not want to understand it, and may even be afraid to understand it.
- 5. True religion does not separate a man from his fellow men. To his godliness, as an essential part of it, he must add brotherly love(II Pet. 1:6,7). True religion looks both to God and to man. There is a religion which separates a man from his fellow men. (continued inside)

It may make him decide to leave the life of the world for the life of contemplation and meditation and prayer. But prayer and contemplation and meditation, great and essential as they are, are imperfect and even unchristian, if they do not result in ACTION. The Christian does not live with God to avoid his fellow men, but rather to be able better to solve the problem of living together.

6. True religion is not limited to the worship and services of the church. True religion begins at home. Those who would be real servants of Christ and of his Church must remember that the first duty of religion is to their own household (I Tim. 5:4).

There can never be a church of Christ which is not founded on the Christian Home; and the most important religious work is not the work that is done in public, but the work that is done in the privacy of the home, and amidst what ought to be the circle of those most dear. True religion, like charity, must begin at home, even if it is also true that it cannot stay there but must go out to the wider sphere of the church and of the world.

There is nothing like regular class attendance by the students to build the teacher's morale. When a teacher can see progress in learning and understanding in a child, it gives her confidence in what she is doing and of course as a result does a better job continually. On the other hand, when the children's attendance is spasmodic, little or no progress can be detected, so the teacher is constantly wondering whether or not she is doing her job. Parents, we owe it to our children and to their teachers to see that our class attendance is regular. Incidentally, regular attendance will help in every age group, adults as well as teenagers and the younger age groups.

One way to have good attendance is to keep up the interest in class seven days a week. The only way I know how this can be done is for the parents to know what the students are studying and to discuss these subjects frequently with their children. It will be surprising how much more visible progress each child who is thus exercised will manifest. The goal of the whole Bible class effort is to present Bible facts and principles in such a way that they may become a powerful influence to each individual, molding his life to conform more and more into the image of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

A statement made me marvel recently. "People are more interested in being religious than in being righteous." Religion and righteousness should go hand in hand. Perhaps this is why James added "pure" to religion when he offered religion as righteous. "Pure religion" is righteous.

But again - our lesson. A sister said, "My religion would not allow me divorcing him." But her "religion" did not prompt her to be a sweet wife and work at having a good marriage. She had religion but not righteousness.

And this is primarily our trouble. We have "religion" enough to want our name on some church roll. We will go to much trouble to get our "letter" somewhere, but we have not righteousness to be responsible and dedicated.

We have enough "religion" to argue who is right, but not enough "righteousness" to teach cottage meetings and save a soul.

We have enough "religion" to know giving is a part of duty, but not enough "righteousness" to give liberally, regularly, and lovingly. We know enough about religion" to attend once a week, but not enough "righteousness" to attend every service.

Perhaps our trouble is "religion" Jesus said, "hunger and thrist for righteousness," not religion. Perhaps we have "religion" but not "righteousness." We offer God "re-(continued on next page)

THE POOR IN SPIRIT

"Blessed are the POOR IN SPIRIT." In the sermon on the Mount, Jesus blessed various states of mind and gave a result for each. The poor in spirit are a class of people who are destitute spiritually. They have nothing of and by themselves. Thus, they look for help. Because they look for help, they shall find it... "theirs is the kingdom of heaven." Jesus said in Matt. 6:33, Seek and ye shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you. Then he gives the admonition to seek the kingdom and the righteousness of God.

Let us live lives that openly manifest the riches of Christ, in order that others may see our spiritual prosperity, realize their destitution, and seek to over come it.

WILLIAM TELL - SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

In the sermon of Jesus recorded in Matt. 5-7, Jesus made this statement: But seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness ... We. as followers of Him, have the responsibility of seeking to be governed by the will of God and to follow, to the best of our understanding, that which is right in this life. Some people have the idea that they have the right as Christians to come as close to sinning as they can, if they think they can avoid the act itself. For example. many people would never think of using the Lord's name in vain, yet they think it acceptable to use the "softened form" of the name. as the dictionary puts it, i.e. gosh, gee, golly, etc. Some would never think of "getting drunk" but the occasional "social drink" does not receive a second thought. Christians abhor the thought of adultery or fornication being committed, but some cannot see that dancing is an act introducing and leading to adulterous ideas. But we must not condemn dancing and let other actions of a similar nature of young people go unnoticed. It is just as wrong to sit in parked cars in front of the house or on a seldom traveled road and see how much each can stimulate the other's sexual desires. This is done by many young people today and seems to be one of the most popular activities of dating. I think that most of the young people here at West Erwin have enough wisdom to avoid such situa-

tions, but the warning is always timely.

The Law of Moses has in it some principles of righteousness that never pass away. We ought to read the books of Exodus and Leviticus and notice what points are said to be righteous and what is unrighteous. We can learn lessons seldom taught today that need to be expressed. With such a parade of almost nakedness on T.V., movies, and the public and private swimming places, we should re-read such passages as Leviticus 18 and 19:17. With these passages, apply the statement of Jesus in Matt. 5:28, But I say unto you, that everyone that looketh on a woman to lust after her hath committed adultery with her already in his heart.

Let us, as parents and teachers of young people, learn the principles of righteousness taught in God's Word and teach them to our children. We live in a wicked and adulterous generation. It will take a lot of strength to overcome this world, but the trying of our faith produces steadfastness, and steadfastness, when allowed to work, makes us to be perfect and entire, lacking in nothing. cf.James 1:2,3. Not restraining our youth from activities that have potential dangers connected with them might be compared to William Tell who tried to shoot an apple off his son's head. He wanted to come close, not to kill. His shot fell low. Let us flee from evil as far as we can. T.J.

WE ARE DOING BETTER

Few, if any, of us did our best last year but in some ways we did better than we have ever done. One way we improved was in our giving. Our regular weekly contributions surpassed \$1,500 and our building fund contribution averaged \$400.00 a week, making a total of more than \$1.900 a week. That is the most this church has ever contributed in a twelve month period. That averaged out to about \$4.00 per member counting the shutins and children. Now that we have learned that we can give and not lose anything we will probably give more this year.

Our attendance has been exceptionally good, except for holiday week-ends, and this is reflected more in the evening attendance than any where else. Some are now at tending the evening services that never attended before. They lacked the interest and energy it took to get up and get ready to attend. Now that they have started to attend they see what they have missed and they enjoy being present. They are not likely to quit because they are receiving some strength. There are still a few who do not either give or attend because they do not know the joy of doing it. but the ones who have learned it are happy and Satan would now have quite a time talking them out of it or putting enough stumbling blocks in their

way to keep them at home or encourage them to go somewhere else.

We still have a lot of work to do on our Bible school work, but we are improving in this area too. We do not have adequate space to do a good job of teaching, some classes had to merge, and we have classes in about every nook and corner.but we have not done badly even under these circumstances. We could have done much better and it is expected that we will when we get in our new building. It is this writer's hope that some do not die before the new building is completed because they have been neglectful during this waiting period. AUDITORIUM MANNERS

The back seats should be left for those who come late, and those who have small children who might disturb. Others should sit close to the front.

When small children disturb, they should be taken from the auditorium then returned after being subdued.

Be sure to share your song-book with those who may be nearby who do not have a book, so that all may worship God in song.

Don't make a bale of hav of yourself at the end of the seat and make people climb over you in order to find a place to sit. It may be inconvenient to go to the center of the seat, but it is the polite thing to do!

As you enter the auditorium, leave your boisterous laughter, joking, and talking on the outside. Prepare yourself to worship God by a period of quiet before the first song.

Children are just children, but should be taught not to run and play in the building either before or after the services.

If someone should be late and enter after services have started. don't turn and stare.

Don't use the last song to put on your coat; don't start out of the building during the last prayer.

Don't stand in the doorway or on the steps in order to carry on a conversation.

AND HE RESTRAINED THEM NOT . . .

While reading in the book of First Samuel the other day I was impressed by the fact that God told Eli that his son would be punished and that his house or family would be brought to destruction because he restrained not his wicked sons. It seems that Eli had the "modern"philosophy of just talking to his children and expecting them to heed the admonition. He told them, 'Why do ye such things? for I hear of your evil dealings from all this people. Nay, my sons; for it is no good report that I hear; ye make Jehovah's people to transgress..." I Sam.2:23,24. The point I wish to emphasize here is that as long

as a child is a minor and in his father's house, the father is responsible for his action. father should be in a place of control over the lives of his children. He should see to it that they attend worship and study period provided for them. He should to it that they learn to study to Bible for themselves in private study. He should see to it that their morals are what they should be. 
