

OPPORTUNITIES AND OPPOSITION

In the spring of 57 A.D., the apostle Paul wrote to the Lord's church in Corinth, and among other things, said "a great door for effective work has been opened to me, and there are many who oppose me," I Cor. 16:9 NIV. One would not have to delve very deeply into Paul's life to discover that what he wrote was so true. He entered boldly so many doors of great opportunity, but there

was always the opposition!

How like today! Never before have there been so many great and open doors of opportunity opened to the church. Space fails me to do much more than touch the "hem of the garment" of doors ajar for God's people today, but let me share with you just a few: (1) In mass media...radio, television, and the printed page. Even now our brethren are feverishly working toward building a WORLD CHRISTIAN BROADCASTING CORPORATION at Anchor Point, Alaska, through which the message of Christ can be transmitted to millions of people in Asia and Eastern Europe. And Star Publications has just printed a book entitled, "Introducing The Church of Christ," which is NOW ready for mass direct mailing. All that is needed are visionary Christians to "walk through the doors." (2) It appears that China might be "opening up" to the gospel...let us pray so and determine to take it there! (3) Recent recognition of the church in Poland through the benevolent efforts of God's people in the U.S.A. is surely God's providential hand at work! (4)Great progress is being made in India in bringing the gospel to the teeming millions of that country! (5) Central and South America are fertile fields. THESE ARE ALL GREAT DOORS of opportunity open to us. But, as in Paul's day, there are adversaries and opposition. Nothing comes easy.

But more especially, we can personally "walk through" the open doors of opportunity that abound right in our own communities. How many people could you reach with the gospel IF YOU REALLY TRIED? Sure, there will be opposition...but so what? There al-

ways has been!

I really believe that every Christian must honestly examine himself or herself, and ask the incisive question, "HOW CAN I BEST SERVE MY LORD? WHAT ARE MY TALENTS AND ABILITIES? HOW CAN I BEST USE THEM TO HIS GLORY? WHAT WOULD HE HAVE ME TO DO?" In

I thought, already a confirmed materialist, "take some of my precious treasure and throw it away into that obscure concept called the church treasury?"

Recklessly, I considered giving a nickel at first, but when the collection plate was passed I gave a penny. My dad had said, "I'll return to you whatever you decide to give to the Lord. So don't worry about losing your money." But his promise seemed less real to me than the cold silver I had in my pocket.

After church my dad asked, "Well, how much did you give?" With burning face I told him I gave a penny. Few times in my life have I ever been so ashamed as I was under his stare that day. He said softly, "you ought to be ashamed." He reached into his pocket and gave me a nickel (a return of 500%). At which point none of the money I had meant anything to me anymore. I would rather have had the approval () my father that day than all the wealth in the world.

So, when the collection tray comes around I always try to give so that I would not be ashamed to face my earthly or my heavenly Father.

From the Preacher's Desk

We are very grateful to everyone who came to express their love dappreciation for us. Also we appreciate a number who called to express regrets that they would not be able to attend the reception. There were a number who worked to make the occasion a success and to each of them we would like for them to know that we are very grateful.

We were glad to receive a telegram from Perry and Laree Hall which read, "Congratulations for 14 years of faithful service and a wonderful example. God bless you. Love." This was very thoughtful of the Halls and our prayers continue to be with them as they plan to make their move to Tyler to work with you. We feel unworthy of all the kind words which have been said to us. The recent tribute in the bulletin from the elders is deeply appreciated.

We regret that we will not be here when Goebel Music preaches in the meeting which is scheduled for October 4 through October 8. I have known Goebel for many years. I first met him when I was preaching for the Broadway church in Lubbock and he was the director of the Bible Chair at Texas Tech. He has had a distinguished career as a gospel preacher. All of us have the privilege of being "workers together with the Lord, "(2 Cor. 6:1).



Editorial:

"... If anyone has insight let him calculate the number of the beast, for it is man's number. His number is 666" (Rev. 13:18)

Troubled by "666"

It's amazing how people can compile "data" to support their fantasies. One of these involves the number "666." Mentioned only in Rev. 13:18, "666" was the arch enemy of the early Christians.

But today some have found many places that the number appears, and they've concluded that this means the world is about to end. In the book, When Money Fails...the "666 System" is Here, Dr. Mary Relfe noted these uses of "666" today:

World Bank Code Number is "666"

Shoes made in European Common Market have stamped inside the label "666"

Tanks built by Chrysler have on their side "666"

Arab owned vehicles in Jerusalem have license plates with prefix "666" (So they can quickly identify Arabs in the event of a war.)

Overseas telephone operator number from Israel is "666"

And the list goes on and on . . .

Dr. Relfe noted that each generation seems to have a candidate for "Mr. 666." Among those were the Caesars, the Popes, Hitler, etc. She concluded:

"After giving much time to studying the scriptural qualifications, characteristics, and prerequisites, my present assessment is that President Anwar Sadat of Egypt is either history's nearest prototype or the real 'Mr. 666'."

Sometimes people can get so caught up in a study that their minds run wild. What was the importance of "666" in Rev. 13:18, and what does it mean? Three observations:

- 1. Six was an Evil Number. Homer Hailey "... to the Jews the number six was an omen or symbol of dread and doom, so when tripled—666—it represented the completeness of doom and failure."
- 2. Who Received This Message About "666"? It was the suffering NT church. What was the purpose in telling them about Awar Sadat who'd live almost 2,000 years later? "666" was telling them about the terrible trouble they would have probably from either the Emperor or the Roman Empire as a whole.
- 3. **Do Not Get Upset.** No one knows for sure about "666." No matter how many times you can find it on ships, car tags, etc., it does not signal the end. God is still in control and in Jesus there is victory. Do not let speculators upset you.

In a recent telephone conversation with Neil Gallagher, our missionary in Rhode Island, he was very complimentary of West Erwin's "new" preacher, Perry Hall. When brother Hall was preaching in Arlington, brother Gallagher was act inted with him and his work. We are very grateful to Neil for sending us a copy of his dissertation which Neil wrote in order to receive the Ph D. degree from Brown University. Neil's dissertation is entitled, "The Concept of Blame." We do appreciate his sharing with us this excellent material.

This Sunday morning our topic will be "The Christian Attitude Toward Marriage." This is a continuation of our series of sermons on attitudes. As most of you know it has been my practice to preach a sermon on marriage every vear in September. I began this custom on our tenth wedding anniversary. On this September 15 we will observe our forty fifth wedding anniversary. The only time I have missed preaching

on marriage in September was in 1979 when I was in the hospital awaiting heart surgery. With the growing rate of marriage ending in divorce and with the continued decline of respect for God's Word in its teaching concerning marriage and the home, we surely need to be reminded of our responsibilities in making marriage a success. I have often told couples for whom I have performed marriages that I hoped that their marriages would be just as happy as ours has been. I have also said many times that any marriage will be successful if both partners will have a genuine love for each other and a love for the Lord. The love for one another is more than an emotion, although our emotions are certainly involved. It is the love described in I Corinthians 13: "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. " (New International Version). We should also have a love for God which will lead us to worship Him and serve Him. This formula for success in marriage is so simple yet so important. We are glad to have the opportunity to preach once more on this topic.






FROM THE ELDERS

From the Preacher's Desk

George H. Stephenson

Iam a regular subscriber to the weekly Whitesboro News Record which tells of the news of Whitesboro and our home town of Collinsville and other small towns in western Grayson County. I was interested in a news item which apr ired in the paper last week telling about the offer for sale of the First Christian Church building in Whitesboro. There was a picture of the building along with the article which told how no one now meets in the building. The church has continually declined in membership until now there are no members left.

The First Christian Church building now for sale was a lovely stone edifice and the finest church building in Whitesboro when it was erected in 1906. This church grew out of the Restoration movement of the nineteenth century. Instrumental music in worship and other innovations came into the church and it became known as the First Christian Church. For some time there was no congregation left in Whitesboro of those who opposed the innovations of the Christian Church. Years later a small group began to meet and once again there was a New Testament church meeting in the town of Whitesboro. Today there is a thriving congregation in the town which is growing in spite of many handicaps of the past. The Christian church died. It had no distinctive plea. It departed from its Biblical teaching and preaching.

The church must ever maintain doctrinal purity if it is to survive. The bulletin from the church in Mineola has an interesting article which appeared in the Gospel Advocate in May of 1968. It was submitted by Alan E. Highers and records a conversation between two pioneer preachers, Jesse P. Sewell and J. W. McGarvey.

"The following incident in the life of brother J. W. McGarvey was told by brother Jesse P. Sewell. Although it happened more than sixty years ago these words of warning from the grand old man are very timely. Brother Sewell said:

"In January, 1902 or 1903, I was preaching for the Pearl and Bryan Streets Church in Dallas. Brother McGarvey, an old man at the time, was invited to speak at Central Christian Church in Dallas. We had three men in the Pearl and Bryan Streets Church who had graduated from the College of the Bible in Lexington, under brother McGarvey, and they were great admirers of him. They suggested that we invite brother Mc-Garvey to preach at Pearl and Bryan that night. We did so. I was just a boy of

twenty four or twenty five then. I was sitting beside this great old man on the front seat waiting for the service to begin. As we sat there talking, brother McGarvey said to me, 'Brother Sewell, I want to say something to you, if you'll accept it in the spirit in which I mean it. ' Itold him I'd appreciate anything he had to say to me. He said about these words, 'You are on the right road, and whatever you do, don't let anybody persuade you that you can successfully combat error by following it and going along with it. I have tried. I believed at the start that was the only way to do it. I've never held membership in a congregation that uses instrumental music. I have, however, accepted invitations to preach without distinction between Churches that used it and Churches that didn't. I've gone along with their papers and magazines and things of that sort. During all these years I have taught the truth as the New Testament teaches it to every young preacher who has passed through College of the Bible. Yet, I do not know of more than six of these young men who are preaching the truth today! He said, 'It won't work.'"

Brother Highers concluded, "That experience has been an inspiration to me all the days of my life since. It has helped me, when I was ever tempted to turn aside and go along with error, to remember the warning of this great old man."



The Lord has placed the responsibility of taking the gospel to the world upon His disciples. The church is the "pillar and ground" - or support of the truth, (I Timothy 3:15). Therefore, it is good to know about various efforts to preach and i ich the gospel throughout the world. We were glad to hear the interesting and inspirational account of activities in the Caribbean islands presented by Don Starks on last Sunday night. We are thankful for his enthusiasm and dedication to the work of the Lord. We are thankful for the fact that the church here and some individuals have had some small part in assisting in the campaigns conducted by brother Starks.

I hope that you took time to read the splendid reports distributed in our classes last Sunday from Rudolf Rischer and Kieth Mitchell. We are thankful for them and for Neil Gallagher in Rhode Island and Gaylin Anderson in Colorado. There will be souls in heaven because of the support you give to the mission efforts of these

men and others.

For sometime the West Erwin church has been making a monthly contribution toward preaching the gospel on radio and television in Mexico. This special effort, sponsored by the Highland church in Abilene, known as the Harvest Campaign, is meeting with much success. In the past two and one half years thousands have been reached and 173 baptisms have been reported. When the campaign began, 23 radio stations carried the gospel to listeners throughout the country. In 1980 the powerful RASA network was added and today the gospel is being preached over 60 radio stations. In addition, a new television program was begun on stations in three cities. An important part of the Harvest Campaign is follow up by local Christians and special gospel meetings in cities where programs are being aired. To date, 15 meetings have been held, many attended by hundreds of people each night. Except for two of these campaigns, all have been conducted by native Christians. They have had the assistance of Texas Christians who worked side by side with their Mexican brethren knocking on doors and distributing materials to teach the lost. Juan Monroy of Spain was the speaker in three campaigns. Truly, the field is "white unto harvest" in Mexico.

May the Lord bless all of our efforts to preach the gospel in Tyler and in other parts of the world.

When a Christian Is Not a Christian

Not everyone that saith unto me Lord, Lord shall enter into the Kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven Matt. 7:21.

While talking with one of our elders a few days ago, I was very interested in the educational situation of the nineteen thirties. He was a teacher and superintendent for many years in north central Texas. He is educated and qualified as a teacher but no one thinks of him as such. He has been in the construction business for so many years that his early experience no longer identifies him.

Another close personal friend of ours who is also an elder in the church was trained and thoroughly experienced as a test pilot in the second world war. Now for many long years he has been a public relations director for a utilities company. He seldom flies any more and when he does it is not up front on the left. He is never identified with his former training and experience.

When a farmer doesn't farm anymore and a teacher doesn't teach any longer, the first vocational connection is completely broken. Now, when a Christian is no longer attending the worship services and observing the Lord's Supper... and when he has grown away from daily prayers and regular Bible study, he can't be what he once was in relationship to the Lord. This is the unfortunate situation with too many of our brothers and sisters. James demands in chapter one of his general epistle that we be doers of the Word and not hearers only. If I am not as close to the Lord as I have been in times past, I know exactly who is responsible. The Savior has not moved away from me. We must never allow the toils and cares of the day to dull our hearing and dim our vision of salvation ... bought with the precious blood of Jesus and received in simple obedience to His will.

KILLING WITH KINDNESS

Once upon a time there was a certain father who wished to teach his son the game of tennis. The father was rather good at the game so he had to "play down" to his son so the lad would not get discouraged and give up the effort in the early stages. In fact, the father loved his son so much and was to anxious to please him and contribute to his constant euphoria that he always gave him the easy shots. He never hit the ball to his backhand, never gave him a fast serve, never smashed the ball at the net, always kept the ball coming easily to the forehand.

Then one day the son thought he had learned enough tennis to take on someone other than his dad. He challenged a friend on the ladder at the local country club and got beaten badly in straight sets, 6-0, 6-0, 6-0. All his opponent had to do was to serve it hard and keep hitting it to his backhand. When the massacre was over the friend remarked, "Man, I don't know who taught you to play tennis but he never did give you any hard shots." Of course, when the son saw his father again his first question was, 'Hey Dad, why no hard shots?"

That's the question a lot of young people are asking their parents these days: "Why no hard shots?" Translated, this means, why did you coddle and baby me as I was growing up? Why did you allow me to get away with so much mischief? Why didn't you give me more direction and discipline? Why didn't you counsel me to take more courses in school that would prepare me for the hard jobs in the world after school?

C. S. Lewis has well said that most people when they shop around for a Deity don't really want a "Father in Heaven. "What they want is a grandfather in heaven! That is, they do not want a God whose love expresses itself in discipline. They want an old, senile individual who will say, reflecting the hedonism and sensualism of our time, "Oh well, just let the kiddies play."



Rudolf Rischer reported an average of 15 visitors a night with 96 on one night! Two ladies, mother and 20 year old daughter were baptized the last night. The mother formerly was a school teacher of religion and the daughter a nurse. We thank the Lord for every effort that is made to teach His Word!

AGING - EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS

It comes as a severe shock to many people to be told, "Aging is your concern, too." Once after I had made this statement a man in his twenties responded, "You've got to be kidding! I'm only twenty-five, and I have a long way to go before I reach sixty-five." Some people pass off the subject lightheartedly by saying, "Well, I don't plan to get old." Others say, "I'll worry about that when the time comes."

In one way or another each of us fits into the aging scene. Aging is your business, first of all, because no one is immune to it. Aging begins at birth, not sixty-five. Try to imagine what would happen if every person on earth were afflicted with leukemia. Can you envision the impact this would have on medical research, on the mass media and the national interest? Charles Coleman alerts us to being thoughtful about our future when he says, "Each day in the United States over 3,000 persons cross the invisible barrier of age 65 and by custom and law are forced into retirement.

Secondly, aging involves you because it poses not only a personal, but also an interpersonal challenge. You are bound to have dealings with older people, such as parents, grandparents, aunts, uncles, business associates and friends. Twenty-three million Americans are sixty-five and older. These people represent eleven percent of the population and are the fastest growing minority group in the nation. What is more, every living person will one day be a member of this minority group.

In the third place, aging is of vital importance to you since your future happiness and usefulness depends upon how well you make adjustments to growing older. The degree to which you succeed in making adjustments as you grow older will be determined by the attitudes you form while you are younger. Goethe has said, "He is the happiest man who can see the connection between the end and the beginning of his life." The dynamic concept of aging is stated forcefullin in Ecclesiastes 12:1-8, "Remember your Creator in the days of your youth, before the days of trouble come and the years approach when you will say, 'I find no pleasure in them' Remember him before the spirit returns to God who gave it."

"Their idols are like scarecrows in a cucumber field, and they cannot speak, they have to be carried, for they cannot walk" (Jeremiah 10:5).

Is Your God A Burden?

Is your God a burden or a burden-bearer? In speaking of the idols which were so common in his day, Jeremiah says, "They have to be carried, for they cannot walk." A helpless god! How pathetic. Worse than that, he has to be carried around like a scarecrow. He's just a burden to be borne.

There are many people today whose God is a burden to them. He is just one more responsibility to be added. He is just one more obligation. They worship—even though they hate the thought. They give—even though it pains them. They keep commands—even though they had just as soon take castor oil. Their God is plainly a burden to them. Wanting the cheapest religion possible, they never ask how much they can do, but how little. They offer the second-best and then declare as those in the days of Malachi, "Behold, what a weariness is it" (Malachi 1:13). Yes sir, their God has to be carried... and it makes them dog tired.

But there are others who find God a burden-bearer rather than a burden to bear. As Halford Luccock has observed, their religion is not, "on top are the everlasting demands," but "underneath are the everlasting arms." Their God is one upon whom they can cast all of their burdens and He will sustain them (Ps. 55:22). They have discovered that God is able to "give them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy, for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness" (Isa. 62:3). They have given themselves wholly to Christ and found him to be not a hard taskmaster, but an "unspeakable gift." They have learned by experience that His yoke is easy and His burden is light (Matt. 11:28-30). And with joy they draw water out of the wells of salvation (Isa. 12:3).

Say, brother, does your God have to be carried, or does He carry you?





SERMONS FOR SUNDAY, JUNE 21, 1981

By George H. Stephenson

A. M. Our Father In Heaven
P. M. Impressions From Our Visit in the
Caribbean

The following article is taken from "Questions And Answers" in the Gospel Advocate by brother Guy N. Woods. Brother Woods is known throughout the brotherhood for his ability as a preacher and for his knowledge of God's Word. He loves the church and loves the truth. GHS

"Dear brother Woods, will you please explain I Corinthians 11:34 which says: 'If any man hunger, let him eat at home?'"

Among the many departures which characterized the Corinthian church when Paul penned this epistle was the improper observance of the Lord's Supper. Its original design had largely been lost sight of; the emblems no longer signified in full what the Lord intended; and to the bread (representative of his body), and the fruit of the vine (which portrayed his shed blood) they had added other items of food and had turned the Memorial Supper into a common and ordinary meal. Such disorder had robbed the table of its meaning, and evidenced the fact that those who were thus participating were without spiritual discernment (Verses 20-34).

Paul sought to correct this unseemly abuse of the divine service by (a) directing attention to the excesses which were theirs (verses 20, 21) by (b) reminding them that the usual and common place to eat food is at home and not in the assembly (verse 22), and by (c) showing that their actions resulted from a gross misunderstanding of the purpose of the Supper itself (verses 25, 26). And, there was another aspect of the matter which required the apostle's attention. The church in Corinth was composed of both rich and poor; some were able to bring more food than others in consequences of which those who were well supplied greedily ate theirs, refusing to "tarry" for the less fortunate, leaving some full and others empty. Their sins were many; they had corrupted the Lord's Supper; a state of gross disunity prevailed; covetousness and greediness were manifest; spiritual stupor possessed them and some of them were so far gone into this worldly, materialistic state that they were 'asleep," and thus immune to spiritual impulses.

The querist adds, "We have a room in the back of our auditorium which is used for a Sunday School room; also have a stove and refrigerator in it and serve meals at times.

I don't think we should serve meals in the church building."

It is a misuse of Paul's statement in I Corinthians 11:34, to apply it to meals in the church building. (1) We have seen that it was penned to correct an abuse of the Lord's Supper - the mingling of a common meal with the Supper itself. It is improper exegesis to lift a statement from its context and apply it in a sense not intended by the sacred writer. (a) To oppose the eating of a meal in the building with this statement is to give it an unwarranted extension which would make it wrang to eat in a restaurant, on a picnic table in the park, or in somebody else's house! In none of these instances would one be eating "at home." It must be obvious that such was not the intent of the Spirit in I Corinthians 11:34. (b) The saints of the apostolic age, and this included the apostle who penned these words, often worshipped in the houses of members where meals were served and of which Paul doubtless partook. (Romans 16:5; I Corinthians 16:19.) Obviously, his teaching and practice in this matter are not in conflict. (2) There is no indication in the New Testament that any church of the first century ever owned a church building! Poverty, persecution, frequent expulsion from the land made such inadvisable if not impossible. A church building is an expedient; we may not properly apply to the building the divine rules governing the church (assembly).

Few people who are today living have preached the gospel longer or in more places than I; it has often been my privilege and pleasure to eat with the saints in church buildings throughout the land; from such practice I have never observed any departure; on the contrary, it is my observation that those congregations which engage in these "love feasts" (Jude 12, American Standard Version), often exhibit a warmer, closer bond of fellowship for each other. It is right and it ought to be more often practiced.

ITEMS WORTH NOTING

(This article appeared in the University Church of Christ bulletin in Abilene.)

Four television programs identified in the Clean Up TV campaign as being objectionable have been cancelled or removed from most stations, according to the April newsletter from the campaign.

The cancelled shows are "Charlie's Angels," "The Dating Game," "Three's a Crowd" and "The Newlywed Game."

The newsletter notes that the campaign "has never attempted to have these or any other programs taken off the air, and would have preferred to see them improve their moral content," but adds that "we are thankful that the true feelings of the public about such material is beginning to be heard."

Among other important developments that have taken place during recent months, according to the newsletter, are:

- The program, "Number 96," which aired for the first time several weeks ago and was considered by many to be one of the most morally offensive programs ever presented on public television, was cancelled after completing only six episodes.
- The ratings for three of the other four shows identified as objectionable in the initial stages of the campaign have gone down considerably.

Those four shows are "Soap,"
"Saturday Night Live," "Three's
Company" and "Dallas." Of
those, "Dallas" remains first
in the ratings, the newsletter
says, but "numbers of viewers
have commented about the apparent decrease in the amount of
morally offensive material being presented."

"Three's Company" has gone from fourth in the ratings a few weeks ago to 11th place for the week ending March 15, and the other two objectionable programs were not listed in the top 20 in the ratings, according to the newsletter.

The boycott still is continuing for products manufactured by General Foods and American Home Products.

Let's Call Bible Sins By Bible Names

People do not have "affairs." They commit adultery.

People do not 'live together" before marriage - or "swing." They commit fornication.

People do not have "gay" lives. They commit homosexual acts.

In Revelation 2:20, God indicts the church at Thyatira saying, "But I have this against you... you allow that woman, Jezebel to teach that sex sin is not a serious matter."

In the same way, God indicts America...including Chr. Lians in America. How many times - at workshops, in Christian homes, on Christian campuses - one hears Christians (ignorantly) capitulate to the sins of the world by using the beat-around-the-bush words of the world.

And when we use the words of the world we, too, "teach that sex sin is not a serious matter." What, after all, is so serious about "having an affair?" An "affair" - a sin? Come now!! It not only sounds innocent, it sounds attractive. "Having an affair" - carefree, flamboyant and romantic.

But God calls it <u>adultery</u>. And adultery is God's name for the sin of sexually using another's mate.

"Living together" sounds innocent enough, and "swinging" sounds inviting. "Swinging" is cool and classy; the swingers have their act together; the non-swingers are out-of-date and stodgy.

But God calls it <u>fornication</u> and fornication is God's ne pe for the <u>sin</u> of sexually using anyone.

Who wouldn't want to be 'gay?" Preachers and elders and deacons talk worriedly about the 'gay movement' and 'gay rights" - not realizing they help 'gays" just by calling them 'gay." God calls it homosexuality. And homosexuality is God's name for the sin of sexually using another of the same sex.

Let's call popular sins by God's names. That's not only true to Scripture, but helps slap sense into people. When they hear that <u>adultery</u>, <u>fornication</u> and <u>homosexuality</u> are <u>sins</u>, they'll see they're caught up in something that ravages. And the only way they'll hear God's names for popular sins is for Christians to scuttle the habit (even at home) of echoing the words "affair," "swinging" and "gay."

We're fooling ourselves.

We're failing the pitiful people caught up in these sins.


May the roses keep blooming in Tyle

From the Preacher's Desk

It has been my happy privilege to know some of the great men in the church of today. Among the number is Burton Coffman of Houston. Recently Burton and his wife, Thelma, observed their fiftieth wedding anniversary. Another couple, who were married at the same time the mans were married, Maurice and Alma Hudgens, observed their fiftieth wedding anniversary together with the Coffmans. I know that this was a delightful and wonderful occasion for both couples whom I have known for many years. I regret that Alice and I could not go to Houston for the happy occasion.

I doubt if there is another couple in the brotherhood today who has done more for the advancement of the cause of Christ than the Coffmans. Brother Coffman's dynamic leadership has helped to strengthen every church he has served as minister. He began his ministry with the Tenth and Austin Streets church in Wichita Falls as an associate minister with L. S. White. I was privileged to preach for this same church from 1945 to 1953. During that time, the

church built a new building and became the Tenth and Broad Streets church of Christ. The Coffmans were loved there and came for a number of meetings during those years. Other churches brother Coffman served included churches in Lawton, Oklahoma; Sherman, Texas; Central in Houston; Washington, D. C.; and Manhattan in New York City. We are thankful for the great work being done today by the Manhattan church where Kieth Mitchell serves as the pulpit minister and brother Rutledge, father of our Jan Knight, is one of the elders. The Coffmans went to New York at a crucial time in the history of the Manhattan church and helped it to have a building and a foundation for the work it is doing today.

Thelma Coffman, affectionately known as "Sissy" has been a wonderful co-worker with Burton. I knew her parents in Arlington. Her father served as an elder in the church where I did my first work as "located preacher." Her mother was an aunt of our Alma Faye Price. Where Is Your Brother?

"Where is Abel your brother?" (Genesis 4:9).

Here in the field a struggle had taken place. There was blood on the ground. A murder had been committed...the first murder. And behind it lay the story of two brothers.

Cain had become upset with his younger brother Abel. But, as so often is true, anger did not end with itself. It led from sin to sin. Cain devised a plan by which he would punish his brother. "Abel, "he called out. Let us go out to the field." And unsuspectingly, Abel went along. Once they were in the field Cain rose up and killed his brother.

But murder did not end the matter. A short time afterward the Lord asked Cain, "Where is Abel your brother?" And Cain replied, "I do not know; am I my brother's keeper?"

Cain became the first in a long line of folks who have disclaimed social responsibility. You know the philosophy. It's expressed in a variety of ways: "A man has to look out for himself...don't bug me...do your own thing...that's none of my business, etc."

But like it or not, responsibility rests upon each of us with regard to everyone with whom we are brought into contact. God has made each of us in His own image. We are bound together in a common society. How sad it is that this great truth has escaped many of us. In the words of the poet:

How many souls of strongest powers
To selfish solitude consigned,
Have whiled in idleness their hours,
Nor nobly sought to serve mankind!

Where is your brother? What is he doing? How is he getting along? What does he need? These questions constantly stare the Christian in the face.

If everyone who professes to care about the poor would become the friend of one poor person, the war on poverty in the United States could be won.

If everyone who professes to be a Christian would become the friend of one sinner, countless thousands would press into the kingdom of God.

If everyone who professes to be a Christian would love his brother in Christ, what a fellowship the church would be!

Listen! It's the voice of God. He's asking, "Where is your brother?"

JOHN GIPSON Little Rock, Arkansas DO WE NEED FARMERS?

(The following article is lifted from a report by Robert Shank in the "Restoration Leadership Ministry Monthly Report." Robert Shank is a former Baptist who is doing a great work in contacting various denominational preachers and acquainting them with our plea for New Testament Christianity. Brother Shank is the author of several books including "Life in The Son" written when he was a Baptist. The book refutes the doctrine of "once saved, always saved." We found the following comments interesting and very relevant. GHS)

March "came in like a lamb" and went out the same way, and except for one welcome rain, it was dry all the way in our part of the country. The weather has been delightful with many beautiful days . . . but what we need is rain! Too much pretty weather at the wrong time of year can be a disaster for an agricultural area, and for the nation and the world. No matter how far removed many people may be from agricultural pursuits, we are all totally dependent on what is produced from the soil.

Driving through Texas last month, I listened for a time to a telephone "talk show" on a local radio station. A woman called to complain about how much news is devoted to farm problems. "Farmers, farmers," she said, "I get so tired of hearing about farmers and their problems. I think we ought to shut down the farms and ship all the farmers out of the country and be done with all the problems." The talk show host was "flabbergasted" at such a suggestion and asked Dumb Dora what she would do for food if the farms all went out of operation. "Well, I get all my food at the Safeway store," she said, "so who needs farmers?" Can you believe it?

There are a lot of people around the country these days asking, "Who needs churches? Who needs preachers? Who needs grandpa's religion? Why not let's just all have our own do-your-ownthing religion and forget about all the religious trappings handed down to us from the Dark Ages?" Sounds great to a lot of religious "Dumb Dora's" who hardly know the difference between the Bible and Farmers' Almanac — and feel no need to find out. And there are indeed some religious accretions from the Dark Ages (and more recent times) that should very well be forgotten. But despite the religious trappings and accretions that have accumulated through the centuries, "the faith once delivered to the saints" has come down to our generation, preserved and defined in the Holy Scriptures, which in our day, as in the days of Timothy and Paul, "are able to give you the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus" (2 Tim. 3:15 NASB). This is still the "religion" our late twentieth century "moderns" need. Sin, the human predicament, God's answer in Jesus Christ His Son, the good news of the gospel, and the forgiveness of sins

and promise of eternal life in the everlasting kingdom of God — these and all other great truths rooted in the being and character of God are as true today as they ever have been and will continue to be so forever.

"I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ," wrote Paul, "for it is the power of God unto salvation to every combo believes" (Rom. 1:16). And the pospel of Christ is still the power of God for salvation for all who truly believe today, nineteen centuries after Paul. But as in Paul's day, "how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? and how shall they hear without a preacher? and how shall they preach except they be sent?" (Rom. 10:14, 15).

Who needs churches? Who needs preachers? Who needs old time religion? The whole human family in this "modern" world. The world needs first-century Christianity in this twentieth century, and faithful preachers of the everlasting gospel, and compassionate churches faithful to the mission assigned by our Lord to his churches.

It was thrilling to see the large number present for worship Sunday. We have a fine spirit prevailing at West Erwin. Of course, we had many visitors Sunday and it was a time many people "go to church" for the only time in the year. However, I have never felt that it was the time to scold people, but rather a time to do my best to preach the unsearchable riches of Christ in the hope that it will encourage all who attend to want to do the Lord's will.

Last Sunday we rejoiced that Christ was raised from the dead, but this we should do every Lord's day. Our faith and our hope are built upon the reality of Christ's resurrection. Paul expressed it in these words: "But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen: and if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain, "(I Corinthians 15:13,14). The resurrection of Jesus is the basis of our belief in our own resurrection. "For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him," (I Thessalonians 4:14). On each first day of the week Christians meet to break bread in memory of Christ's

What Happened To The Pot Plants?

A congregation moved into a new building with gleeful delight and some degree of pride over the elegant material surroundings in which they would worship. Someone supplied two beautiful five-foot plants to adorn the front of the new auditorium.

Some months following the opening service in the new building, to the dismay of some of the elders and building committee, the plants disappeared. Said elders and said building committee sounded the alarm. The congregation was bombarded with announcements. Men were deputized to seek the whereabouts of that which was lost. Apologies were made to the donors of the decorative plants. For two months, the missing pot plants became the conversation piece of the church at worship and at home. The search was intensified, and the announcements and pleadings seemed unending.

Prodigal sons are away from the worship, and the Bible declares that they are lost. Each soul missing here today is more valuable than the whole world - and, yet, we have not heard one announcement nor have we seen anxious concern about Mary Smith, John Brown, or Sam Jones, whose eternal welfare may hang on our concern. If we had put forward 1/10 the energy in locating the lost souls of this flock that we have the lost pot plants, surely angels in heaven would rejoice!"

Is this not true in so many areas? With 4 billion people on the earth with 70 million more born each year than die, how can we be so deeply concerned over such minor details as stained glass windows, color of curtains, interior decorations, or wall-to-wall carpet?

In Dallas several years ago, before the Sunday morning services began in a large church, the preacher and some members came to the front steps of the commodious building just in time to see a man fall prostrate with his hands stretched out toward the pulpit. They stood there and watched him die. Suppose this man, seeking for something which the world did not give him, had heard only an intense and frenzied plea for lost pot plants!




MISPLACED ITEMS

COMMENT:

THE ORCHARD

For almost fifty years my grandfather toiled to improve the ground around the house he and my grandmother built. He turned raw wilderness into cultivated beauty.

On the southeast third of the land lay the plot we always called "the orchard." Granddaddy seeded and grafted the nine pecan trees there. He started them in buckets, transplanted them in neat rows in the orchard, and replaced them with other homegrown trees if blight or disease or drought destroyed them during the years.

For all those years Granddaddy fenced and pruned and watered and sprayed that pecan patch. In his part of West Texas nothing grew by accident.

Since shortly before my grandfather's death, I have owned and cared for this treasured parcel of land. A few weeks ago I loaded my tools and drove south to work in the badly neglected orchard. It had not been mowed in a year. Prickly pear cactus was beginning to appear in spots; mesquite shoots stuck up in more than a dozen places; and mesquite trees the size of my arm had to be cut out all around the fences.

In less than six years the land my grandfather had kept curried and clean had reverted to wilderness. In another two or three years it would have been as rank and wild as any unkempt pasture in the county.

As I hand-sawed the offending mesquites along the fencerows and marvelled at how quickly they had sprung up, I reflected on how swiftly our hearts and souls also revert to wickedness and wildness if we relax our spiritual vigilance for even a short time. How many Sundays do you have to skip church before sleeping in becomes a way of life? How many cigarettes do you have to smoke before the habit is firmly entrenched again?

Today the orchard lies freshly mowed, newly pruned, with all the undergrowth cleared again. It looks almost like my grandfather had been at work on it once more. I must take care that my heart looks as good, lest the mesquite of immorality and the cactus of carnality take root and choke my soul.





Back in 1937 various religious denominations in Fort Worth conducted a "union meeting" in the Will Rogers Memorial Coliseum. Gypsy Smith, a popular evangelist of that time, did the preaching in the meeting. I was preaching for the chain Arlington at that time. My wife and I decided to attend the meeting one night to hear the famous "Gypsy." Thousands of people were present on the night we attended.

At the beginning of Gypsy Smith's speaking he said, "We are having great co-operation from the various churches in Fort Worth with the exception of one little group who go around with a Bible in one hand and a hymn book in another. This little group reminds me of a puppy dog barking at the moon. The dog barks, but the moon keeps on shining. This little group may bark, but like the moon we will keep on shining."

It was obvious that Gypsy Smith referred to churches of Christ as being the "little group" who did not co-operate in the meeting, for the churches of Christ in Fort Worth had publicized the reasons why we were not co-operating in the union meeting. I felt and still feel that it was

a wonderful compliment to be referred to as people with "a Bible in one hand and a hymn book in another!" It would seem to me that those with a Bible should be the ones compared to the shining of the moon - or in reality to the shining of the sun. The psalmist declared, "The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple," (Psalm 19:130). Again the psalmist said, "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path," (Psalm 119:105).

Thope that we may always be known as a people who have Bibles in our hands, but more important, that we have God's Word in our hearts. Many of our day look upon the Bible simply as a work of man filled with some good but also filled with many myths and superstitions. In our Sunday evening services we have been attempting to emphasize the greatness and the authority of the Bible. We have spoken concerning the wonders of the Word and concerning its inspiration. On this coming Sunday evening our subject will be, "Fulfilled Predictions of the Bible."

When Ira North comes to preach in the cooperative meeting of churches of Christ in Harvey Hall we know he will be here with a Bible in his hand. We will want to hear God's Word and we also want to sing praises to God. Will you do your part to make this effort to preach the Word a great success?

FADING FUNDAMENTALS

There is a tendency in the church today to neglect the fundamentals of the faith. Perhaps it is because we have allowed this age of "intellectual-emphasis" to convince us that the fundamentals are so elementary and "old hat" that people are bored with them and that we must continually be presenting something "new and different" to maintain interest. Or perhaps we are over-reacting to an imagined unbalanced preaching of yesteryear.

Whatever the reason, it is my considered judgment that the present decline in the proclamation of fundamental doctrine is a cause for profound concern. By our failure to proclaim basic truths, forcefully and definitively, it will be so easy for a generation to arise that knows not the Lord nor His Way. Do you remember Judges 2:10?

Apostacy (i.e., a "falling away" from the faith) is always a real possibility or there would not have been so many warnings placed in the New Testament: such as Matthew 24: 4-5, 11; Acts 20: 29-30; I Timothy 4:1ff; II Timothy 2:16-18; 4: 1-4; II Peter 2:1ff; and I John 4:1ff. Obviously, God does not want us to leave "the way" in view of what He placed in His book. Remember II Timothy 3:16-17!

Too many gospel preachers have almost ceased declaring some of the primary tenets of "the faith," ignoring subjects which once were often taught. For example, fewer and fewer sermons are being heard concerning God's terms of pardon, and the one church! As a result, many members of the church really don't understand the difference between denominationalism and New Testament Christianity! We are slowly but surely allowing "Excellency of speech" and human wisdom to supplant the "old Jerusalem message." See I Corinthians 2:1-5. So much of the preaching being done in the church today could be repeated in most any denominational pulpit in the country without causing a ripple.

FADING FUNDAMENTALS! It is a serious matter and deeply troubles me. The ongoing of the cause of truth and right is at stake! The future of the church of our precious Lord is in the balance! We had better heed the exhortation to "contend earnestly for faith which was once for all delivered unto the saints" and get back to bold preaching of distinctive truth! Read Jude 3, Acts 4:29; and II Timothy 4:2.

George Bailey used to say, "Sitting in a church house no more makes you a Christian than sitting in a hen house makes you a hen." It is a fact incontestable that everybody who comes to meeting does not come for the same purpose. Elton Trueblood has called going to church the "greatest spectator sport in America." The pulpit sometimes is even referred to as "the stage." It seems timely then to ask the question, "Why did you go?" This multiple purpose that drives men is not strange to the 20th century; it occurred even in the lifetime of the Lord. One time when he went into a synagogue with other worshippers, they had a diverse reaction. The testimony of the scriptures is, "They were watching Jesus closely to see if he would heal on the sabbath, for they wanted to find something which they could use as a charge against him. " (Mark 3:2) They came not to worship but to watch!

Super critics can always find in the assembly of the people of God something of which they may make a capital case, and something they can use to justify their own littleness of spirit and being. There aren't very many perfect song leaders; flawless preachers haven't been born; prayer leaders sometimes stumble over words; announcements have a way of growing longer and longer. It is easy to find something to criticize - for man has so many imperfections it is impossible for him to hide them all.

However, if a person comes to worship he will more than likely obtain the very thing that brought him there - namely, knowing he has been in the presence of God. Jesus made a promise that "where two or three are gathered together" in His name, He would be there. If a person has come to worship the Lord, more than likely in his sacred quest he shall find satisfaction. Analyze your own life; ask yourself the question, "Have I come to worship or watch?" 

Once again it is spring! This is truly a wonderful time of the year and surely there is no more beautiful place during this season than Tyler. There will be hundreds and even thousands of visitors to Tyler during the next two eeks to enjoy the beauty of the Azalea Trails.

The beauties and wonders of the spring time always remind me of the creative power of God. How could anyone see these wonders of nature and deny the existence of God? It is said that a biology professor held in his hand a brown seed and said, "I know the composition of this seed. I know how much carbon and hydrogen and nitrogen are in it. I can make a seed with the same proportions, but when I plant my seed nothing happens. When I plant this seed made by God, life and fruit will be the result. The difference is that I made one seed and God made the other."

Concerning the life which is found in seed, years ago William Jennings Bryan spoke concerning some grains of wheat which had been left in an Egyptian tomb for more than three thousand years. Concerning these grains of wheat Mr.

Bryan said, "As I looked at them, this thought came to me: If one of these grains of wheat had been planted on the bank of the River Nile the year after it grew and all of its lineal descendants planted and replanted from that day until now, its progeny would be sufficient to feed the teeming millions of the earth today. If the invisible germ of life of the grain of wheat can pass unimpaired through three thousand resurrections, I shall not doubt that my soul has the power to clothe itself with a new body suited to its new existence when this earthly frame has crumbled into dust."

As we see the awakening of nature in spring time I hope that we may also have a rededication and renewal of our spiritual lives. May this be a time of spiritual revival. The time will soon be here for the great campaign for Christ conducted by the churches of Christ in Tyler. Remember April 12 through April 16 is a very special time for the Christians of Tyler. We look forward to having Ira North as our evangelist and Bill Blackstone of Abilene as our song leader. The article by Ira North in this week's Visitor is typical of his stand for righteousness and truth. We know he will have simple but inspirational lessons from God's Word.

THE DIVORCE EXPLOSION

"From the Beginning It Was Not So"

By Ira North

Recently we heard a trial judge here in Nashville refer to the increase in the breakup of American homes as the "divorce explosion." We think this is not an exaggeration but, unfortunately, an accurate assessment, a phenomenon we are seeing in our day and age. We are now told that half of all marriages will end in the tragedy and heartache of divorce. And unfortunately, we see more of the heartache in the church of our Lord. There are few families among us who have not been touched with this tragedy by either a son or daughter or uncle or aunt or niece or nephew or cousin who has divorced.

Once war is declared and the shooting has started, there is so little that can be done to save the marriage.

Part of the explanation for the "divorce explosion" may be found in the changing times. This may explain part of the reason, but of course it does not justify it. There was a time when our society was rural, and now it is largely urban. There was a time when a son worked alongside his father, and the daughters worked in the home from sunup to sundown by their mother. The grandparents were nearby, and the family unit was strong and close. Today most mothers work outside the home, and the father, sometimes, does not even see the child from sunup to sundown, and often very little after that. Our society is mobile, and the restraining and encouraging influences of neighbors who care and relatives nearby is often not present.

What can we do, and what is the answer? We believe there are three things that we can do to help ameliorate this sad condition.

- 1. Let us continue to preach and teach with great love and yet with great force and conviction on the dignity and sanctity and permanence of Christian marriage. We would like to see every member of the church be able to quote Matthew 19:9 from his youth up. Teaching and preaching is needed now as never before.
- 2. Let us help to lower the expectation among our young people. Our grandmothers were taught that when they married they would have it rough and tough. It would mean working from dawn until dusk and there would be children who would need to be fed and clothed and educated. Sacrifices and deprivations would be many and hardships would come swiftly and forcibly.

And so our grandmothers married, and it was rough and tough, and there were sacrifices and deprivations and hardships. So what, they expected it and were able to cope with it and face it. Today so many of our young people think all their problems will be over when they get married. They have the romantic concept that you have arrived when you meet the prince charming and marry him. Life is going to be a bed of roses and a continual honeymoon. When they face the reality that building a home requires blood, sweat, toil, tears, patience, prayer, sacrifice, forgiving, and above all staunch (continued next column)



and strong character, they are so often disillusioned and ready to run to the lawyer's office. As preachers and teachers and parents, we can help lower the pectation and help prepare them for reality.

3. A third thing we can do is to put more and more emphasis on the prevention of the breakup of the home. We need to make bad marriages good and make good marriages better. New films are now available by two Bible professors at Abilene Christian University, Brother Carl Brecheen and Brother Paul Faulkner. These men have been lecturing for a number of years and conducting seminars on family life. It is their goal in their series of lessons to h bad marriages become good and to help good marriages to become better marriages. We are happy to see this new series of lessons and are glad to note in our brotherhood more and more emphasis on prevention of divorce. We believe people will do better and better when they are taught better. We know that often an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure and that many families, if they had received help earlier, might have stayed together. When a couple goes to see the lawyer and the matter is taken to court, it then (continued next page)

DOES IT MAKE A DIFFERENCE?

"Now the man out of whom the devils were departed besought him that he might be with him: but Jesus sent him away, saying, Return to thine own house, and show how great things God hath done unto thee. And he went his way, and published throughout the whole city how great things Jesus had done unto him. And it came to pass, that, when Jesus was returned, the people gladly received him: for they were all waiting for him."

THE CONFRONTATION OF JESUS in the life of this man made an immediate and effective change. He was made into a disciple and a witness of what had been done for him. The result of that transformation prepared an entire citizenry to change its' mind about Jesus.

Clyde Reid in "The Empty Pulpit" reveals a report from the New York Times that leads him to observe that preaching is ineffective in bringing about change in the lives of hearers. He then says, "If it makes no difference to be a Christian, then why go to church?" The question is a very vital one with reference to our day.

We live in a country known as "Christian" and in a day that sees religious affiliation at its all time high. We also find ourselves in an atmosphere of frustration and upheavel. The crime rate soars higher and higher; young people are restless and rioting; the streets of our cities are virtually unsafe at night. What is wrong with all of these "Christian" people?

The answer is evident on every hand. The churches and pulpits are filled with unchanged people. The man in the pew has never felt the real experience of conversion. We find our "going to church" as another mundane affair of life. The sadness of this is reflected in the fact that the service usually strengthens that attitude.

The problem will remain an ever present one, only to increase with age, if we don't begin demanding a change (genuine fruits of repentance) in our converts. We have been so taken up with the visions of multitudes filling our commodious buildings that we have forgotten the command of the Lord. "Repent or perish." Christianity, if it is to remain CHRISTianity, must make a noticeable difference in the lives of its adherents. It has become too much the rule and not the exception that the marriage to Christ in baptism is annuled in a few days by a lack of repentance. We, therefore, find ourselves continually trying to reunite

CONGREGATIONAL PRIDE?

Not long ago I heard a young lady talking about the congregation where she worshipped. She loved the elders, enjoyed hearing the preacher, and bragged on the Bible classes. She closed this "testimonial" by saying, "There's just no place like it anywhere!"

At first I felt that she was too much in love with her home congregation and that she ought to realize that there were good congregations of the saints in many places. And then I had some second thoughts.

What's wrong with Christians loving the congregation where they live and worship? What is wrong with our being a little proud of our program of work and the joy we have in the worship there? There are all too many Christians that never say a good word about their home church, never feel any close attachment to the church. It is referred to as "they" and not "we."

When a student goes to college and is proud of the school, he usually does better work. It's his school; he supports it, he fights for it, he talks it up.

It's wonderful to see a man who is working for a firm that he is not ashamed of. He can say with pride that he is a part of that honorable organization.

We joke about grandparents talking about their wonderful grandchildren, but isn't it nice? And don't you like to hear a wife brag on her husband instead of criticizing him?

It may be that we have heard sermons condemning congregational rivalry so much that we have felt that it would be wrong to talk up our own congregation. It seems to me that in the letters to the seven churches of Asia that the Lord applealed to their sense of congregational pride by speaking of the things they had done well and urging them to do better.

We must put Christ at the center of our heart and of all we do, but remember that the congregation is loved by Him and sustained by Him. When Israel fought the Midianites, their cry was, "For Gideon and the Lord." Gideon as the Lord's servant and instrument was loved and honored too.



From the Preacher's Desk

George H. Stephenson

It is always encouraging to have Kieth Mitchell with us. We were glad that he could be here Sunday and now we look forward to another guest speaker on this coming Sunday. Neil Gallagher who preaches for the church in East rovidence, Rhode Island is scheduled to be here and preach for us. I am very glad that you will have the opportunity to meet him and to hear him speak.

I first met brother Gallagher a number of years ago while I was preaching for the Southside church in Fort Worth. At that time he had recently been converted from the Catholic church. He spoke for us in Fort Worth on several occasions. We were impressed with his ability and sincerity. Neil is now preaching in his native state of Rhode Island. He was reared as a Catholic and trained for a time to become a priest and to enter a Franciscan Monastery. He served in the peace corps in North Thailand for a time. While there he came in contact with American missionaries of the church of Christ. In 1965 he was baptized by Bob Davidson.

Brother Gallagher continued his education following his conversion and returned to the United States. He received the M.A. degree from ACU and also from TCU. He later received his Ph.D. from Brown University in Providence, Rhode Island. In 1966 he was elected to "Outstanding Young Men of America."

Neil Gallagher is a prolific writer, having written for major religious journals. He is nationally known for his fight against pornography. His book, "How to Stop the Porno Plague," has gained national attention. Neil is now in his seventh year as the preacher for the church in East Providence. The church has grown from 25 to 70 with most of its membership consisting of former Catholics. There is a great need for financial assistance at this time for the church to continue to grow and become a source of strength in the Northeast.

Brother Gallagher has the co-operation and support of a lovely wife and family. In a letter to our elders he states, "As you can see the church has nearly tripled, but I believe that number could have been much greater with adequate funding. We've had the plans drawn up for months for an aggressive outreach program, including: radio evangelism, Bible correspondence courses, direct-mail evangelism, and a tract ministry. We've got brothers and sisters who are committed: they regularly and boldly share Christ with non-Christian friends and they regularly bring the same to church."

THE WIFE BEATER

No Time For God

There appears to be three major classifications of men.

- (1) Those who trust God at all times;
- (2) Those who trust God when times are bad;
- (3) Those who have no time for God at all.

It is a mortal tragedy of the human spirit to allow muchane affairs to occupy the totality of our interests. Absorption in ventures, contracts, investments, finance, and securities can be a healthy sign of ambition. Yet for many, it is a crisis. A spiritual one!

The Lord warned that wealth has the potential of choking out our spiritual life... "the deceitfulness of riches, choke the word, and he becometh unfruitful" (Matt. 13:22). For some, money is too great a temptation. The pursuit of it becomes a godless obsession. In time, there is no room for God or His Will.

There was a man that had lived a greedy, avaricious life. He had added stocks to stocks, bonds to bonds, gold to gold, silver to silver, houses to houses, and lands to land. At the age of sixty-five, he lay upon his bed dying with his face turned toward the wall. He was heard to say as he lay there: "Time for money, but no time for God." The sister said to friends who had rathered in the room, "Brother is not rational." At that, the brother turned over in bed and said: "Don't say that I am not rational. My mind is clearer than it ever has been. You know that I've had time for everything but God. I've hated the church, cursed preachers, stabbed my conscience, quenched the spirit, hardened my heart, and now I'm dying without God." Three days later the man died. Some of his last words were these: "Time for everything, but no time for God."

Our Lord loves us. He is our refuge - our protection. He tries to save us from ourselves. Like a neon sign, the warning looms up from Holy Writ: "Take heed, and beware of covetousness." He continues by assuring us that a man's life is not measured in the abundance of material things. The wise apostle wrote: "Charge them that are rich in this world, that they be not highminded, nor trust in uncertain riches, but



TO SPEAK SUNDAY

Kieth Mitchell, Director of the International Mission of churches of Christ in New York City and minister of the Manhattan church of Christ, will be our guest speaker Sunday morning at 10:30. The West Erwin congregation has had fellowship with Kieth in his work at the mission since its beginning in 1972.

The work of Kieth and other workers has been very successful. The Lord has blessed their efforts. A total of 830 students from among leadership level, foreign born students have been enrolled in daily English Bible study during the past two years. The current term enrollment is more than 150 for daily English Bible study - and that in spite of extremely cold weather. Work at the mission has been directly responsible for the conversion of 169 persons from 5 continents and 28 nations during the past nine years. In the past six years, the mission has helped in the planting and nurturing of a Chinese church, a Spanish church, and two Korean churches in New York City. Great plans are underway for future expansion of the work.

In addition to brother Kieth's work at the mission, he is engaged in a very fruitful ministry with the Manhattan church of Christ. He was recently made an elder in this good church. The Manhattan church continues to have a steady growth in spite of the large numbers of members who are in New York for short periods of time. From 1976 - 78 the church roll grew from 75 to 150 and from 1978 to 1980 the roll grew from 150 to 300. Seventeen different national citizenships are represented in this church's membership.

It will be a pleasure to have this great man with us Sunday. He has unusual ability and his splendid talents have been effectually used in helping to spread the gospel of Christ. He is a man of great faith and is a most energetic worker.

E. T. C. A. NEWS

Are you still asking, "What is E.T.C.A.?" Many people are still not aware that E.T.C.A. is the short way to say East Texas Christian Academy.

We hope you are asking about the progress of E.T.C.A. If you are, you'd probably want to know that our enrollment increased by 350% this year. Last school year we had fourteen students, and this year we have sixty-five. In addition, our staff more than doubled; from two certified teachers and one aide, we have increased to four certified teachers, four pre-school teachers and four aides.

E.T.C.A.'s curriculum is the same as that of T.I.S.D. Our children participate in Chapel, and have daily Bible lessons in the classroom. One mother told us, "How wonderful it is to have a child come home from school talking about Jesus."





DIVORCE IS NOT THE ANSWER

Sociologists attribute the popularity of country and western music to its ability to address itself in honest terms to human loneliness. A couple of lines from a current tune confirms this analysis. The singer soulfully complains,

"Our marriage was a failure

But our divorce ain't workin' either."

Divorce is a popular way of coping with marital adjustment difficulites. An appalling number of young people enter marriage with the attitude, "If it doesn't work out we can always get a divorce." Such an attitude not only contradicts Scripture, but it also creates more problems than most people imagine.

Divorce does not end the involvement two people have with one another. Most divorces are preceded with a great deal of spiteful controversy ranging all the way from periodic shouting matches to physical violence. The idea that these hostile confrontations end with the divorce degree is a myth. There are disagreements over alimony, visitation rights, property settlements, charge accounts, and other matters. Divorce not only produces discord, but it brings loneliness, loss of self-respect, a sense of failure and many other social problems as well. That's why some divorced persons work hard at reconciliation even in cases that involve alcoholism, drug addiction or adultery.

Obviously, the Lord had our welfare in mind when He planned for the marriage relationship to be permanent - Genesis 2:24 and Matthew 19:1-6. When He declared that only the innocent party in a marriage broken by fornication can scripturally remarry - Matthew 19:9, He had no intention of cramping our life style. On the contrary the God who made us knows what life style is best for us. Marriage for life was ordained in the Garden of Eden, not in the mind of some 19th Century Puritanical preacher. God put boundaries on His marriage laws because He knew that we could not go beyond them without getting hurt.

Every marriage has adjustment problems.

These problems are trying in many cases.

Our singing Sunday was excellent. Only the Lord can properly judge the real worth of our worship in song and that's as it should be since we are to sing praises to Him.

Permit me a suggestion or two about our song service. We have a difficult time in our auditorium because of the acoustics. From any given seat, a person can only hear those who are seated close around him who are singing. The immediate result is that you think you are singing too loud, so you soften your own volume. The final result when all tend to do the same thing, that is soften their volume, is that the vitality begins to disappear from the singing. Now don't misunderstand, I'm not equating volume with vitality. But it will help the quality of the worship in song if every one will open up and sing from the bottom of their hearts. Don't worry about thinking that you are being heard above everyone else. Just go ahead and sing.

Another thing that sometimes complicates the singing is that it is difficult for the leader to hear the audience singing. It is important for you to listen to him and watch him so that all will be singing together and on the same pitch. It will improve our worship in song if you will give some thought to these suggestions. Of course, they are not to overshadow the spiritual directions to sing with the spirit and understanding, making melody in your heart to the Lord.

NO-NO'S, YO-YO'S, BLOW-BLOW'S, AND GO-GO'S

Robert Schuller, Nationally known religious writer and lecturer, described four types of people he has encountered in his experiences. These categories certainly exist among college students and church members as well as in any avenue of life. Jesus described the same traits in the Parable of the Sower, Matt. 13:3-12.

The first category that Schuller described was the No-No. Regardless of the proposal, the No-No is against it. The plan is defeated before a single ounce of energy can be exerted in trying to accomplish it. The No-No is characterized by the soil along the wayside. Seed which falls there has no chance of bearing fruit nor does the No-No.

Schuller next described a person he called the Yo-Yo. Like the child's toy, this person is up and down, filled with energy and enthusiasm one day and overwhelmed with depression and discouragement the next. The Yo-Yo is the unstable man driven like a wave of the sea, James 1:6-8. Comparable to the seed that fell on stoney ground, the Yo-Yo lacks depth and consistency. Difficulties come and destroy good intentions. Unlike Paul who learned to be content regardless of external circumstances, Philippians 4:11, the Yo-Yo is unable to maintain stability during the day-in and day-out struggles of life.

The Blow-Blow is the third category of people that Schuller discussed. This person talks big and plans big but he never carries through with his boasts. Too many thorns choke out his plans. His excuses are many but his fruit production is nil. He says and does not, Matthew 21:30. Perhaps the Blow-Blow fails to count the cost, Luke 14:28-33, or he lacked the self-discipline that his goals required. His intentions are good but he bears no fruit. His life is frustrating and unfulfilled rather than victorious and abundant, John 10:20.

Schuller's fourth grouping is the Go-Go. James describes such persons as those who show their faith by their actions. They do not have to boast about their faith as the Blow-Blow does - they demonstrate it, James 2:18. They are the fertile soil that brings forth thirty, sixty, and a hundred fold. They enjoy the abundant life by becoming living sacrifices, dedicated to the service of the Creator and their fellow-man.

The obvious question each person should ask is, "Which category do I belong in? Am I a No-No, a Yo-Yo, a Blow-Blow, or a Go-Go?" By their fruits you shall know them, Matthew 7:16.

THE FOUR STAGES OF LOVE



This is a time for all of us to be thankful that fifty two Americans held as hostages for such a long time have finally been set free. Many prayers have been offered here at West Erwin along with the many thousands of prayers throughout the nation on behalf of these men and we en and their families. Now we give thanks that at last they are coming home.

It is wonderful to be free. How wonderful the former hostages must feel to know that they have freedom once more. Those who are in Christ have been set free from the bondage of sin. How true are the words of Jesus in John 8:34! "Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin." We have all known individuals who were slaves to alcohol or drugs or some other evil. They can be set free through Christ. There is freedom in believing and obeying the truth. "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free," (John 8:32).

As we give thanks for the release of hostages, we also should pause to ask God's blessings

to be upon our new president, vice president, and others who will assist them in the administration of our government. The Bible teaches us to pray "for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty," (I Timothy 2:2). We are greatly blessed in living in a country in which we may freely worship according to God's Word and have the opportunity to teach the gospel of Christ. We pray that this privilege may belong to our children and grandchildren and those who continue to live in this "land of the free and home of the brave."

I wish that all of you could have heard the great sermons which were preached at the "Fort Worth Lectures" last week. Many of the difficult passages of Scripture were discussed by men who spent many hours in diligent preparation. The last night was a fitting climax to the series of studies when sermons were delivered by Hugo McCord of Oklahoma City and Tom Holland of Nashville, Tennessee. Following a study of difficult passages during the week, brother Holland closed the series in a masterful way telling of the beauty of God's Word and how it is adequate to meet all of our spiritual needs. It is good for preachers to hear other preachers and I am thankful for the opportunity I had to hear the lectures in Fort Worth.

SACRIFICIAL GIVING

"For with such sacrifices God is well pleased," so said Paul in Hebrews 13:16. Sacrifices are as old as Adam, so it has always been an integral part of man's life. God Himself has always decided what He would accept and how much. When man does differently, then God refuses the sacrifice. Cain is a classic example. Nadab and Abihu learned the lesson the hard way to their everlasting shame.

Modern man feels his giving is left entirely up to him. If he chooses to give, that's fine, but if he chooses not to give, he feels that's fine too. This lie, like all lies, is fostered by Satan. God still demands sacrifice. The entire tenor of the New Testament is acceptance based on sacrifice. Without sacrifice from the heart it just isn't acceptable.

Our giving like all service is based on sacrifice. What does it really cost you to give? So many give out of their abundance - they never miss it. No sacrifice is involved. Some give out of what's left over, so no sacrifice is involved either. Others give begrudgingly. Some give to be seen of men while others give complainingly, miserably, covetously or sparingly. Yet, some give out of deep motivation based upon conviction. Every contribution is based on prayer and sacrifice. Each time they increase their giving it is the result of planned, purposeful searching to do the will of God. They give enough until it is truly a sacrifice. In spite of the sacrifice it is given lovingly, cheerfully and generously. And "with such sacrifices God is well pleased."

Giving is an art. It can be warm and rewarding. It can be a measure of our love, a test of our faith and the occasion of spiritual growth. People who love to give are people who are loved. They are loved of God and loved by God's people. Our lives are enriched by their example, and we are encouraged to do more ourselves. Giving is so godlike. No one can appreciate God until he appreciates God's generosity and is compelled to follow God's example. Sacrificial givers are so beautiful, they always want to do more and are never satisfied to coast, wait or refuse a needy cause. Thank God for such brethren! And finally, brethren, giving can be learned.



Many in our congregation have had colds and flu and this has hindered our attendance. I am sorry that many were not here on Sunday to hear the presentation of the 1981 budget by Ray Lott. The budget is substantially larger than any vious budget, however the congregation contributed more than this amount in 1980 when special contributions are included. The budget should be a challenge to each of us to do our part in helping the church reach the goals we have set for the year.

I am thankful for all of the efforts of the West Erwin church to preach the gospel. Paul commended the Thessalonian church for "sounding out the word," (I Thes. 1:8). The West Erwin church should be commended also for its part in "sounding out the word" in many parts of the world. A recent report from the Highland Street church in Abilene states that plans are underway to establish the church in Acapulco, Mexico. This is probably the largest city on the North American continent where there is no church of Christ. Responses have come from radio broadcasts in Acapulco which indicate there are prospects for being taught the truth. Aroher Lopez, Mexican native and graduate of the Sunset School of Preaching in Lubbock will be working to help establish the church in Acapulco.

Preaching the gospel over the radio in Mexico has met with much success. Filipe Martinez, preacher for Herald of Truth radio programs in Mexico, states, "The radio program has helped the church of Christ to become well known in Mexico. Much of the growth of the New Testament church is a direct result of the radio program. There are now about 12,000 Christians and 400 congregations in Mexico, and the Lord opens new opportunities for further growth every day." I am thankful that the West Erwin congregation is making a monthly contribution toward preaching the gospel in Mexico.

We rejoice when we read of many being led to the Lord in various mission efforts. However, we know that efforts do not always meet with results we would like. Don Deffenbaugh in "Four State Gospel News" makes this interesting observation:

"Generally when one turns to a column like this he expects to find glowing reports of all the work that is done. It was interesting to me the other day to be reading in the Firm Foundation dated August 18, 1936, the report of a brother Horace A. Holt. His report is as follows, 'I closed a

In Romans, the apostle Paul both began and ended that magnificent letter with pronouncments concerning the obedience of faith:

Even Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we received grace and apostleship, unto obedience of faith among all nations for his name's sake, (Romans 1:5).

By the scriptures... is made known unto all nations unto the obedience of faith... the gospel and preaching of Jesus Christ, (Romans 16:26).

Nothing in all of the Roman letter is of any more importance than these FIRST/LAST deployments of this remarkable phrase.

The first of these references is the first mention of faith in the whole Roman letter, and faith's being mentioned along with obedience is extremely significant. Paul was about to write the most important document on the subject of faith that the world would ever see, in which, of necessity, there would be written some of those things which even an apostle would consider "hard to be understood," (2 Peter 3:16); therefore it was a matter of gracious discernment upon Paul's part that, in the very beginning of the letter, he should make it clear that throughout Romans "faith" should always be read "obedient faith." Paul never for a moment considered "faith alone" as efficacious in the procurement of salvation; because, as noted here, his apostolical commission was designed and Paul received it in order to produce "the obedience of faith." In all of Paul's writings, "faith" always and without exception means Not Faith Only, but an Obedient Faith. No other kind of faith ever saved anybody.

These same words (faith and obedience) conjoined by apostolical authority likewise stand in the final paragraph of the letter where they are mentioned in the final doxology; thus they form the archway through which one enters the portal and through which one departs this magnificent cathedral of sacred Christian literature.

This a mazing expression, "obedience of faith," standing there in the final lines of Romans, as it does also in the very first paragraph, is the KEY to Romans. Together, these two dramatic placements of this eloquent expression, like two great arches at opposite as of some magnificent boulevard, make it impossible to misunderstand Paul's many references to salvation "by faith," "through faith," etc. in this New Testament letter. It was always and without exception of obedient faith that he wrote.

Without a single exception, in all of the great passages where the apostle spoke of "faith apart from works," or "faith apart from the works of the Law of Moses," or "faith without circumcision," etc., the purpose of his words was not to question IF obedience was required, but to determine WHAT obedience was required of men who sought to be saved. Paul made this principle to be the underlying foundation of everything taught in Romans; and he did it by the double placement of these words, like two mighty pillars the Jachin and Boaz in the porch of Temple of Solomon, so that all who enter the study of Romans might more readily discern what is taught.

Therefore, Paul never wrote anything that nullified Jesus' declaration that, "He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved."



THAT'S THE WAY SIN WORKS

There was an interesting article by Dalton Key in the December issue of Four State Gospel News on "sin." In it he quoted an article from James Ramey on "The Last Taboo." The article was published by SEICUS (Sex Information & Education Council of the U.S.) In it Ramey says, that "incest is a matter of 'personal morality' and the present laws against it are 'overly harsh'." He then observes that some "sex researchers" say that "in certain situations it can actually be beneficial!"

Key concluded, "First, we get tolerant of adultery and 'open marriage'. Next come homosexuality and 'gay rights'. And now we are being bombarded by the blight of incest! Who would have believed the time would come when our nation would even consider condoning incest?"

Consider:

- 1. Sin Is Always Deceitful (Heb. 3:13). It covers up its real intent. It moves us step by step away from God and His will for our lives. Sometimes it appeals to "experts" who will tell us that what God says is wrong is not really so bad.
- 2. Sin Becomes Progressively Worse. Jesus warned, "Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold." (Matt. 24:12). Little by little wickedness replaces righteousness. This way it can move a long way, but always with short steps.
- 3. Sin's End Is Disguised. Moses chose not to enjoy the "pleasures of sin" (Heb.11:25) because he knew they were temporary. The end of sin is death, but it always comes packaged as something good. Beware of the way sin works!
