This year our special contribution on December 8 will be used to make some much needed improvements in our auditorium. Last Sunday one of our elders, Faber Cauthen, announced this decision to overwhelming acceptance and support. The early church had no buildings of its own. Biblical authority for buildings comes from the command to meet, which necessitates a place. What kind of place is a matter of expediency. No doubt, the part of wisdom would say that a church would do well to avoid encumbering itself with a building that prevents it from doing little more than making building payments. However, for too long the brethren met in "cracker-box" buildings on the "wrong side of the tracks." Our buildings say something about us to the communities in which we exist. It seems to me that, within responsible reason, we should provide buildings in keeping with who we are, what we are trying to accomplish, and what our abilities are. The West Erwin church has very little construction debt, and with our special contribution we can refurbish our auditorium without additional debt. Then our 1986 budget, which will be about \$500,000. can be used to accomplish the work to which God has called us. Be generous on December 8!

How Often Do You Read Your Bible?


Prisoner-of-war Howard Rutledge, dying from starvation, thankful for a "bowl of sewer greens," found that "my hunger for spiritual food soon outdid my hunger for a steak," (Christianity Today). "Now I wanted to know about that part of me that will never die... I had completely neglected the spiritual dimension of my life. Now I wanted to talk about God and Christ and the church, but in solitary confinement there was no minister, no Sunday school teacher, no Bible, no hymnbook, no community of believers to guide and sustain me."

"I tried desperately to recall snatches of scriptures, sermons, hymns. I had not seen the importance of memorizing verses from the Bible or learning gospel songs. Now, when I needed them, it was too late!"

"Just to think about one memorized verse could have made a whole day bearable. One portion of a verse I did remember was 'Thy word I hid in my heart.' How often I wished I had really worked to hide God's word in my heart...All this talk of Scripture and hymns may seem boring to some, but it was the way we conquered our enemy and overcame the power of death around us."



Dear Brethren:

There can be no doubt that winter is just around the corner in our country. Yesterday morning we had our first snow, and even though it did not stay on the ground, this is the beginning of our cold season.

The past several weeks were filled with work-manual and spiritual. According to the season, our garden and yard had to be cleaned and brought into order for the winter. Our church building also had to be cleaned and prepared for our coming Gospel meeting (November 5-10).

Neuss, a town of nearly 200,000 inhabitants, located near Dusseldorf in the Ruhr-Valley (Germany's industrial center with millions of people), celebrated its 2000 year foundation last year (it was founded by the same imperor as was Augsburg). The church there is made up of about 40 members, of which most of them come from out of town as far as 50 miles. Each night of the meeting (Oct.23-27) they were present, and the number of visitors (non-members) climbed from 11 to 15 during the week.

On Monday, October 28, I left Neuss by train (I had stayed in the home of the preacher and his wife; Manfred and Sigi Schulz) to go back home. It was a most beautiful train ride, which went along the Rhine river down to Bavaria, where I arrived six hours later. ...

The next day I had to travel to Munich where my second Gospel meeting started that night (October 30 -November 3). Munich, the capitol of Bayaria (southern Germany) is a town where I grew up and where I first came in contact with the Lord's church. It is a town of nearly two million inhabitants and lies about 40 miles southeast of Augsburg. The churches in Munich and Augsburg work together very closely, which also was shown by the fact that on the last night of the meeting 29 brothers and sisters from Augsburg came to Munich to support this effort with their presence. Clyde Antwine and his wife Gwen have been the missionaries there for the past seven years. There is a special bond of love between the members of these two congregations, and to me it is always a great pleasure to visit them and preach for them. My mother (she is 75 years old) is a faithful member of that congregation. Each night we not only had visitors from Augsburg, but also quests from Munich. Several of them showed great interest and promised to come back to the regular services. Please pray for all of those who have heard the Gospel - in Neuss and in Munich.

During October several new Bible classes for teenagers and young men have been installed in our congregation. This was necessary because several of our young people are so eager to learn God's word even better... This spiritual growth makes me very happy and strengthens my faith. Several of our brethren and I will take turns in teaching.

Tomorrow, our Fall Gospel meeting with Jim Springer from Bremen will start and all of us are looking forward to this great event.

To each one of you we send our heartiest greetings and best wishes. May God watch over you and keep you in His grace.





MARRIAGE AND THE MOVIES

My fifth meeting with the Calvert City, Kentucky church was most enjoyable. Ralph and Dorothy Steury, who have worked with this church for twentyyears, are most gracious people and it was de-"-htful to be with them again. One of blessings which comes from returning to West Kentucky, where I have preached in more than sixty meetings over the past thirty years, is the opportunity to see so many people I have known through the years. Many came from a number of churches and it was good.

My thanks to Jim Usrey and Jack Paul for teaching my classes while I was away and to Wes Price for preaching. Good reports were received on the work of each one.

This Sunday we will continue our studies in Paul's letter to the Romans. We will be studying Romans 4, an Illustration of Justification By Faith, Sunday morning, and Romans 5:1-10, The Meaning of Salvation, Sunday evening. Why not read these passages before Sunday?

"Seek first the kingdom of God" Matthew 6:33

Is It Well With You? . . . Is It Well With The Child?

When the Shunammite woman came to Elisha for help, the prophet sent his servant, Gehazi, to meet her with the questions: "Is it well with you?" and, "Is it well with the child?" When applied to one's spiritual life, these are big questions; important questions; questions with eternal consequences! What about you and your children? How are you doing? Is it well with you? In Colossians 2-3, Paul presents at least five principles which will assure you that all is well, and when your children see these qualities in you, they are likely to imitate you and all will be well with them too. What are these principles?

- 1. "As therefore ye received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in him" (2:6) - The Christian has received Jesus as Lord -- that's not optional, but what a Christian has done. Now he is to live under the rule of Christ. Are you?
- 2. "And in him ye are made full, who is the head of all" (2:10). We are to be dominated by Christ - body, mind, and spirit. Are you?
- "Putting off the body of flesh" (2:11). -We are to be renewed in the spirit of our minds (Ephesians 4:23) as we become more and more what the new man in Christ is to be. Are you?
- 4. "Increases with the increase of God" (2:19). We are to be growing spiritually. Are you?
- 5. "Set your affection on things above" (3:2).
 We are to be thinking of heaven. Are you?

Is it well with you? Is it well with the child?

I SAW THE JONQUILS BEND

They are genuine, friendly, inviting. They telegraph by rays of love -- "I care." And we all respond. Our burdens are melted, our cast-down spirits are revived, and our heads are erect again. We blossom and we give our best-we've been warmed by the love of something bigger than ourselves. Needs were met -- and the warmth of another -- both of heaven and earth --drew high the heart. Someone cared -- someone warmed -- and the fields were pretty again. So be it.

The Greatest Commandment

Man's responsibility to God and fellowman is summarized in the word LOVE. "Love God and your neighbor," was the teaching of Jesus (Matthew 22:37-39). Love is the greatest thing in the world, and to be loved brings a sense of security, peace, and self-esteem. But love has its demand. Think again about what Jesus said: "If you love me, keep my commandments" (John 14: 15). Look again at Paul's description of love in I Corinthians 13: "Love is patient...kind... not jealous...does not boast...is not proud...is not rude...not self-seeking...not touchy...it keeps no record of wrongs...takes no pleasure in other people's sin but delights in the truth ...knows no limit to its endurance, no end to its trust...always expects the best...endures all things." * What a demand! When you love somebody you stop thinking so much of self and start thinking of them. Like Jesus, you become selfless. Love does not make demands of others, but places demands on self! As Barclay observes, "Any love which drags a person down is a false love. Any love which coarsens instead of refining the character, any love which necessitates deceit, any love which weakens the moral fiber, any love from which a person emerges a worse person, is not love." Think about it.



"Accept one another" --Romans 15:7

How can people who come from different backgrounds, who live on different social levels, who have different educational attainments, who have different likes and dislikes, and who are different ages, ever be expected or ever hope to get along with each other? Let us accept another where he is, and as he is. Second, let us seek to change. It is not enough to say, "Well, that's the way I am, and you will have to accept me as I am!" Do not expect others to always acquiesce to you. Change! Be more lovable and likeable. Be "conformed into the image "of Christ (Romans 8:29). A. A. Arnold said in my presence many times, "If we stay close to the Lord, we will never be very far from each other." Acceptance and change. That's it! Christians can get along.

When we face a choice in life we often stand at a "continental divide." And our whole future depends upon the decision we make. The matter may not seem so important at the time, but a choice between right and wrong is always important.

When Lot chose to live near the city of Sodom he made a fatal choice. He lost Abraham's good influence. He met with many personal temptations, and he put his family in a wicked environment. He gained financially - but he lost his family.

Choices are important. When facing them we should seek God's direction — and be willing to accept it. It isn't enough to determine what immediate rewards may come. We must try to see the ultimate end of the choice. Putting ourselves or our families in an environment of dangerous temptations is a poor choice.

Dear Brethren:

Finally, after having patiently waited for three and a half months, our new van arrived. On July 12th, the Fiat dealer informed me, that the bus was here and that I could pick it up. We all were so excited about this news. Unfortunately, Christel and I had planned for months to take our summer vacation, which started on July 13. So, we were not able to pick up the bus, but left it at the dealer's place until our return.

The same week-end we returned, I eagerly went to the dealer to pick up the van, and on Sunday the whole congregation was able to see the new bus and marvel at it. We all rejoice over this wonderful and necessary tool for our church work and express once more our heartfelt gratitude and our deep appreciation to those donators, w have made it possible for us to buy this van.

As already mentioned, Christel and I took advantage of the "quiet" month of July and went on a two week vacation. Again, we went to Zermatt, Switzerland, where we were so close to the many mountains rising above 12,000 feet of elevation, which especially Christel loves so much to climb. We rented a small room in a private home (up on the fifth floor in the attic) with the possibility to cook for ourselves (this is the cheatest way to make vacation in Switzerland; we never could afford a hotel room). 

In Defense Of Truth

The Pharisees of Jesus' day were the Keepers of Orthodoxy. They knew The Law, loved The Law, and kept The Law--at least the parts that appealed to them. So strict were they in keeping The Law that they even tithed "mint and dill and cumin" but neglected the "weighteir provisions of The Law: justice and mercy and faithfulness." Jesus told them, "These are the things you should have done without neglecting the others," (Matthew 22:23). Keeping The Law must be accompanied by a proper attitude toward The Law and toward people or one becomes, like the Pharisee, a blind guide, who strains out a gnat and swallows a camel, (Matthew 22:24). The point is this: we must stand for Truth and contend earnestly for the faith, (Jude 3) but we negate our defense of Truth if in the name of Truth we distort facts, assault character, accept hearsay, and, in short, fail to love by demonstrating "justice and mercy and faithfulness." Let it be remembered that the Pharisees crucified Jesus in the defense of Truth, at least their brand of Truth. Love for God's Truth demands that we hate every false way, but we never in the name of Truth hate people for whom Christ died. "And the Lord's bond-servant must not be quarrelsome, but be kind to all...patient...with gentleness correcting those who are in opposition," (2 Timothy 2:24-25).

Change Begins Within

Years ago the Barber's Supply Association held a convention. As a publicity stunt, they went into the ghetto section of the city and found the worst drunk, the most unpromising man they could find. He was unshaven, emaciated, sad. He was taken to a hotel, given a bath, a shave, a haircut, a new suit, overcoat, shoes, and even a pocket watch and chain. When they finished, he was a marvelous example of the barber's art. The story appeared in the daily papers. A local businessman was impressed. He told the man he would give him a job and back him and make a successful man of him. He was told to report to work at 8 o'clock the next day. The hour came and went and the man didn't show. So the businessman went to look for him. He went back where they had discovered this man. There he was, sleeping on some newspapers in an alley, drunk, new clothes gone, barefooted, unshaven.

The moral to that story ought to be lain: it is never enough to clean a man up on the outside. You'll never make anything of him until there is a change in the inside — in his heart. Jesus said, "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, sexual immorality, theft, false testimony, slander. These are what make a man 'unclean'" (Matthew 15:19-20).

The New Testament is very plain about this matter of the heart. If you want a changed life you must be changed from within. Jesus said to Nicodemus, "You must be born again." That is, change the whole direction of your life. We begin to live when Christ begins to live in us. Our lives are not just improved or altered a little bit. It requires more than just new resolutions or an outside paint job. The change is so radical that a man is called "a new creature."

You don't have to remain the way you are. Change your attitude and you change your life, and your attitudes are change when you yield your life to Jesus Christ begin to follow Him.







The Church Is The Body Of Christ

It is wonderfully significant that God refers to the church as the body of Christ (Ephesians 1:20-21) and that He organized the body in local congregations with elders, deacons, evangelists, teachers, and the other members. Membership in the body is not like joining a social club or having one's name on a membership role, but is a <u>function</u>. Like a body, the church functions when each individual part is working properly. Church membership is not a "spectator sport" but active <u>involvement</u> as a member of Christ's body.

Therefore, to be an <u>elder</u>, while honorable, is not an honorary position, but a work, the work of a shepherd--leading, feeding, protecting (Acts 20:8).

One is appointed a <u>deacon</u>, not because he has been a member of the congregation for a long time or because he is a "good old boy," but because he will "kick up the dust" in faithful service.

The same is true of evangelists, teachers, and other members. We do not all have the same function (Romans 12:4), but we all have our function. God has ordained that the church, the body of Christ, will grow with "the proper working of each individual part." Inactivity or uninvolvement is inconsistent with what the body is.



The Church And Cultism

Last Wednesday evening Harold Taylor spoke to our combined classes on a movement among churches of Christ called "Crossroadsism" Harold spoke out of his personal experience as he cited the positive and negative aspects of this movement. Three things came to my mind in regard to what establishes a movement as a cult and why cultism in any form should be avoided.

- 1. Cultism is established upon exclusive pride. Like the proud Pharisees of Jesus' day who felt they were the spiritually elite and the Gnostics of the second century (seeds of which were present in the first century) who believed they had reached a spiritual plateau of special knowledge, modern cults are snobbish, proud, and hold those who have not attained similar "spiritual levels" in contempt. This attitude clearly violates Romans 14 and 15.
- 2. Cultism separates believers rather than seeking to unite them. The unity of the "in" group is established upon a human standard of opinion while Biblical unity is based upon respect for the authority of Scripture and for the "platform" of religious unity stated by Paul in Ephesians 4:1-6 and not on some humanly defined attainment. This attitude violates I Corinth-

ians 1:10, Jesus' prayer for unity in John 17, and the general teaching of the New Testament.

3. Cultism holds the local church under its elders (the New Testament pattern) and believing parent-child relationships in contempt leading to alienation within churches and families. This attitude violates every passage of Scripture pertaining to local churches and family life.

Admittedly, we have a lot of work to do in the church today. But working within the framework of the local congregation and the family until every man is presented perfect in Christ is the better approach and cultism in never the answer.





......Guest Editorial

Angry, scudding clouds are darkening the sky. The wind has risen and the first drops of rain have begun pelting my window. At short intervals lightning pierces the darkness and thunder rolls across the heavens. Another summer storm is in the making.

The whine of an airliner competes with the crashing sounds of the storm. As it struggles upward the roar of its jet engines seems to challenge the forces of nature. In a few moments the plane will break through the clouds into bright sunshine. There, high above the earth, passengers will look down on serene, brilliantly white clouds that will offset the blue that stretches away into infinity. No longer menacing, the fleecy clouds will appear altogether lovely.

Meantime, as the roar of the engines grows fainter, I remain earthbound. The sky grows darker, rain is falling in torrents, gusts of wind are rattling the windows, and flashes of lightning threaten my composure; the thunder is deafening.

When David was oppressed and fearful he cried, "Oh that I had wings like a dove! Then would I fly away, and be at rest. Lo, then would I wander off, I would lodge in the wilderness.I would haste me to a shelter from the stormy wind and tempest" (Psalm 55:6-8). But this was not to be. Nor can it be now. We cannot of ourselves avoid the storms of life. We must weather every storm, no matter its severity. But storms, by God's grace, have a way of ending. And afterward one may look for the sunshine of God's goodness. After darkness comes the light of God's mercy: "Unto you that fear my name shall the sun of righteousness arise with healing in its wings" (Mal. 4:2).

The rain has begun to slacken. Soon the sun's rays will shine through the clouds and the joy-ful chorus of the birds again will be heard. They are under God's tender care. He shelters them, feeds them, and knows when even the low-liest one falls to earth. We have this assurance: "Fear not therefore: ye are of more value than many sparrows" (Matt. 10:31).







ATTITUDES

One of the most interesting things about man is his attitude. He has attitudes pertaining to all areas of his life—his job, his family and friends, his associates, the world, and the church. His attitudes determine the kind of employer/employee he will be, how he feels toward his family and friends, his responses to his associates, his view of the world, and his value to the local church.

When one has a good attitude about life he is happier and does a better job in whatever he is involved. On the other hand, a poor attitude causes one to be unhappy and keeps him from doing his best. A person with a positive attitude and average ability will do a better job than one with a superior ability and a sorry attitude.

Wouldn't it be wonderful if each of us would decide to build good attitudes: to love; to serve; to think the best about others; to put aside complaining, fault finding, and indifference; to do our best; to be fully involved in serving Christ with joy and gladness? If we enthusiastically involve ourselves in doing what we can for Him, it will make a difference!

THE CHRISTIAN ON THE JOB

In a recent issue of Christian Psychology for Today, Nancy Brown and Jeanne Ryan suggested seven characteristics of Christians who take their faith with them to work. These traits bring glory to God because the Christian employee becomes a valuable part of the business and a living testimony to the power of God to free man from the selfish, petty ways of the world.

Here are the seven qualities with the scriptures suggested by Brown and Ryan:

- 1. Loyalty to the company: "A true friend is always loyal... "Proverbs 17:17.
- 2. An attitude of service: "If someone forces you to go one mile, go with him two miles" Matthew 5:41.
- 3. Reliability and conscientiousness following through until the job is done: "Do you see the man skilled in his work? He will serve before kings..." Proverbs 22:29.
- 4. Punctuality and wise use of time on the job: "Do not love sleep or you will grow poor; stay awake and you will have food to spare" Proverbs 10:13.
- 5. Willingness to learn from constructive criticism: "He who listens to a life-giving rebuke will be at home among the wise" Proverbs 15:31.
- 6. A good sense of humor a positive attitude: "A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones" Proverbs 17:22.
- 7. An unwillingness to participate in office gossip: "A gossip betrays a confidence but a trustworthy man keeps a secret" Proverbs 11:13.

We should try to incorporate these qualities into our work habits.

Remember, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men..." Colossians 3:23.

ROLLING BOULDERS

A few years ago, I was privileged to attend a seminar on alcohol and drug abuse. One of my most vivid memories is an illustration used by one of the psychiatrists who spoke to us. He said an alcoholic trying to rehabilitate himself was like a person attempting to push a boulder bigger than himself up a steep hill. No matter how much effort he put out or how far he pushed the boulder, there would come a time when he could not control it and it would roll back on top of him.

I recently discovered that this bit of wisdom did not start with this psychiatrist, but with the wise man, Solomon.

"...he who rolls a stone, it will come back on him." (Proverbs 26:27b).

This is a graphic picture of many people. There are many who are bearing a burden bigger than they can bear. To some, it is a burden of guilt. They are haunted by past sins and try to rid themselves of regret and self-loathing. Despite all of their own efforts, the guilt comes back stronger than before. Others find fear, anger, resentment or other emotions as their burden. Much suffering, mental, physical, and spiritual, comes from pushing the boulder up the hill.

When we try to roll the boulder, we are already defeated. There is no way spiritual problems can be solved by human efforts alone. When we try this we are like the disciples who tried to row their boat out of the threatening storm. When all our strength is gone, and all seems hopeless, then we call on the Lord. (Mark 4:35-41).

God is our Source and Strength. "For the Lord God is a Sun and Shield... No good thing does He withhold from those who walk uprightly." (Ps.84:11). Peter enjoins us to cast ALL our cares on Him, for He cares for us.

There is another source of help, often neglected. We should be able to turn our brothers and sisters in God's family for help. Those who are strong are urged to bear the burdens of the weak, (Romans 15:1, Galatians 6:2). The weak of the church should look to the strong for help. The strong of the church should be prepared and able to bear the burdens of the weak.

To the burdened, you can find hope. There is much, much help for you. Your boulder of burden may be large, but you do not have to push it alone.

The Crossroads of the World

On Friday two of our elders and their wives, Fred and Sara Powell and Ray and Dell Lott, and our Associate Minister, Wes Price, left for New York City to visit the work we support in Manhatten. New York City is the crossroads of the world because people from literally every continent visit there each year. We are thankful that we have the opportunity to be involved for Christ in this strategic center of world culture.

I have been convinced through the years that the mission points we support should be visited regularly. This is the only way we can have first-hand knowledge of the work and a visit by the supporting churches gives encouragement to the workers in the field that can come in no other way.

Several months ago our elders decided that at a time mutually convenient the Powells, the Lotts, and Wes should visit New York. While they are there, they will worship with the Manhatten church and on Sunday evening Wes will preach. We will look forward to their return and a report on the work we support at the crossroads of the world.

The Local Church

The revival of evangelism begins at the local level.

Many are deserting the church today. Many are screaming, "Jesus Yes, the church, no;" moralists are declaring that established religion is passe and out of touch with the contemporary needs of our time; some brethren are pleading for a restructured church. Thank God, Jesus stood by His church in these words, "...the gates of hades shall not prevail against it," (Matt. 16:18).

While many are knocking the church-we must build it! The place to begin is at the local level. The local church is the best thing to which a person can give his life. We must join partnership with Christ in building a congregation of God.

The local church is the gathered people of God. (I Cor. 1:2) By their own volition saints are to associate themselves together for worship, fellowship, proclamation, and ministry to the unfortunate. All Christianity gravitates to the local church. We can never love the church universal until we love it local (Acts 14:23; Phil. 1:1; I Pet. 5:1-3).

The local church is to be a dynamic force for God in a sin-ridden world. Within a new climate of love, fellowship, and unity, renewed people are to bless God, others and their own lives. The local base is a lighthouse to illuminate the path of the lost (Isa. 2:4); it is a hospital for broken and sinful men (Lk.19:10); it is a rehabilitation center for those made invalid by iniquity (Acts 20:32); it is an intensive-care unit for those fighting for their lives (Rom. 15:1-2); and it is a <u>fraternity house</u> for those seeking an incendiary fellowship (Acts 4:32). The church: our life; our love; our all. No wonder Jesus threw his protective wings over her: "The gates of hades shall not prevail against it."

While many criticize her, some despise her and others have abandoned her—I want to stand by her. I owe her my life and my love. While it would be a place of distinction to serve as the head of a school, an editor of a paper, or president of a board—I would rather be a local preacher. It's the greatest place to serve in all the world. If I had a thousand lives to live, I would want to be a local preacher in every one of them. I had rather be a speaker in the house of God than a speaker in the house of representatives; I had rather be a foot—soldier of the cross than Commander—in—Chief of all our U.S. forces.

I am standing by the church because I want to stand with Jesus.

Does The Truth Hurt?

There is an old adage which states, "The truth hurts." What does it mean? Does it mean that He who said, "I am the Truth," hurts? Or that the truth that makes men free hurts? Or that any and all truth hurts? No! When one says, "The truth hurts," he has in mind that someone is shown he is thinking, talking, or acting in a way contrary to truth and is convinced he is wrong, then the truth hurts. But should it? I think not, except as we become sorry for misbehavior, for only when we are convinced of our error by truth can we change, overcome, and grow. Knowing truth in any area of life is helpful, not hurtful.

On the other hand, there is something that never helps and always hurts and that something is the lie! It may hurt the reputation of the person who is the object of the lie, but it hurts the character and the spiritual life of the one who tells the lie much more. Sometimes the lie comes from unsuspecting places -- an elder in the church, a preacher, a church member -- people who are supposed to resemble Christ! "But I thought it was true!" is no excuse for the lie. Check your source; investigate before you speak. Often the lie is malicious-a deliberate effort to (continued on page 2)

Doing A Great Work

Under the skillful direction of Nehemiah, the crumbled walls of Jerusalem were rebuilt following the Babylonian captivity. There were so many obstacles, so many reasons for failure, so much opposition even from those who should have been friends!

But Nehemiah succeeded. He succeeded because he was "doing a great work"--work God wanted done (6:3), because he followed the Law of God (8:8), because the people were united in the work (8:1; 4:6), because the people generously supported the work (7:70; 10:32; 12:47), because he was confident God would help (4:14,20), because he refused to listen to ridicule from those who wanted him to fail (2:19), and because he refused to compromise (6:2,3). Nehemiah's attitude was, "Why should the work stop while I leave it to come down to you" (6:3); "Why should I stoop to your level of littleness, pettiness, slander, and self-centeredness." Nehemiah knew he was right and went ahead. He was above them, on the wall, building. They were on the plain of Ono, seeking to tear down. I know what Nehemiah accomplished. But what ever happened to his enemies?


Congratulations

Striking When The Iron Is Hot

Through the centuries religious leaders have engaged in discussion and created controversy in trying to determine the proper date upon which to celebrate Easter. The rule was adopted in the 7th century, in the Western world, that the celebration was to occur on the Sunday following the 14th day of the calendar moon which comes on, or after, the vernal equinox which was fixed for March 21. The word "Easter" comes from the Anglo-Saxon word Eastre or Estera, a Teutonic goddess to whom sacrifice was made in April, and the term was transferred to one Sunday in the year when the resurrection of Christ was to be celebrated.

Observations:

- There is no trace of an Easter celebration in the New Testament.
- 2. The word Easter is of pagan origin.
- 3. The controversy over the date to observe Easter could have been avoided altogether if religious leaders had been content to remain with Scripture and observe only what God authorized.
- 4. How much simpler to remember the death and resurrection of our Lord upon each first day of the week as did the early disciples (Acts 20:7).
- 5. However, when people in general and the religious community in particular, are thinking in terms of the resurrection of Christ, the cornerstone of the Christian religion, should we not capitalize upon their thinking and teach what the Bible says in regard to this event of all events?

"Worship the Lord your God and serve him only." (Matt.4:10).





He is author of four tracts: "Pardon Refused," "The Misunderstood Church," "The Royal Priesthood," and "Merge for Missions." Brother Malone is now in his eleventh year of teaching at Harding University. He has taught in two of the schools of preaching among churches of Christ: Bear Valley in Denver and Preston Road in Dallas.

With his brother, David, he has co-authored the book, Drawn To Christ which portrays the life and work of his father, Joe Malone.

We look forward to our meeting. Brother Malone is Associate Professor of Bible at Harding University and pulpit minister for the Highway church of Christ just north of Searcy.

A Good Deed

Late in the ministry of Jesus, he was in the home of Simon the leper when a woman came with an alabaster jar filled with a costly ointment. She broke the jar and poured the ointment over Jesus and was promptly criticized for waste by some of the bystanders. However, Jesus came to the woman's defense declaring that she had prepared him for his burial, she had done what she could, and, that her action was "a good deed" (Mark 14:1-9).

Why was her gift "a good deed?"

- 1. It was good in its motive, for her motive was that "she loved much" (Luke 7:47, a parallel passage). Great love prompts great deeds.
- 2. It was good in that it was personal. She gave not by proxy, but was personally involved. It was not a "church deed" or a "group deed" but a personal gift.
- 3. It was good in that it resulted from <u>sacrifice</u>. It represented about one year's wage and she gave in the only way acceptable "as prospered." She did "what she could" and no one can do more than that (14:8).
- 4. It was good in that it was <u>courageous</u>. She risked and received ridicule, but she gave anyway.
- 5. It was good in that it was timely. She prepared Jesus for his burial (14:8). Opportunities must always be grasped when they present themselves, not a moment early...or late.



Obviously, the Jerusalem church did not find favor because it taught that all men are brethren in error, or that everyone is at liberty to accept as truth whatever he believes to be truth, or that sincere people will find God even though they seek Him in different ways. To the contrary! The early church presented Christ as the only way to God, the gospel as the only message, and personal commitment to the truth as the only solution for man's obligation from God.

Speaking the truth in love, the early church reached across every boundary—national, intellectual, social, economic—to lead men to the Savior. The members loved, taught, and welcomed folks as the church found "favor with all the people." They were friendly! We want to be like that church in what it taught, where it stood, and how it accepted people. And we are! When people come to West Erwin they see the truth in action in what we teach and practice. They also see acceptance and friendliness.

Prescription For Caring

Some people's needs are as obvious as a tear; others live lives of quiet desperation. Abraham Maslow, a psychologist, mapped out five broad categories of needs that help us think about others.

- 1. Physiological needs All of us need food, clothing, housing and rest. (Does anyone you know of lack any of these?)
- 2. Safety needs We like an orderly world, the familiar, the routine. We need a job, a bank account, insurance that provides security and protection. (When folks lose those, they hurt.)
- 3. Love needs Maslow divided this need into two parts the need for love and affection from other individuals(husband and wife, parents and children, friends) and the need to belong to a larger group (a church, club, bible study, ethnic group). (Do you know anyone who is a "shutout?")
- 4. Esteem needs People need to achieve, to feel adequate, have prestige, recognition, attention, importance and to feel appreciated. (Can you give this to anyone today?)
- 5. Need for self-actualization We want to realize our capabilities and reach our potential. (Can you help someone take a step toward fulfillment?)

When you have singled out specific people who touch your life and the kinds of needs they might have, then think of ways to show you care. Here are a few:

Reach out and touch someone by telephone.

Send an appropriate card or write a letter.

Take a few moments to visit someone who needs you.

Invite someone to your home or take someone out to lunch or dinner.
