




Old Year, New Year

The West Erwin church is truly remarkable in many ways. One of these ways is the generosity of our people in the grace of giving. Earlier this year we had a special contribution to perform some needed repairs on and remodeling of our building. The total cost was to be about \$75,000. We gave \$98,400! And it was a "churchwide" contribution—those with much gave out of their abundance and those with little gave from what they had. It was a wonderful outpouring of love! Through the year our special contributions exceeded \$100,000. In addition, we gave about \$8,500 a week toward a budget of \$9,600. With the difference between our construction costs and the special contribution, we nearly met that budget. Including the special contribution we averaged nearly \$11,000 on a weekly basis. As we approach the year end, we are aware of the fact that some of our people will want to make an additional contribution to the Lord's work, a year-end tradition of West Erwin. Know that our "God is able to make all grace abound to you, that always having all sufficiency in everything, you may have an abundance for every good deed," and He "will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness." 



Rediscovering Holy Ground

When Moses approached the burning bush in the wilderness of Sinai, the Lord said, "Put off your shoes from your feet, for he place on which you are standing is noly ground" (Exodus 3:5). When man is confronted by God it is a holy moment, holy ground. Some of those moments include our initial response to the gospel, our meeting with fellow Christians for worship, and periods of renewal and rededication. But those moments can become so ordinary, so commonplace, so far removed from the hustle and bustle of life. We need to rediscover holy ground!

(1) When we became Christians, the old self died, was buried with Christ in the water of baptism, and we rose to walk a new life (Romans 6:1-6). That response to Christ was as complete and final as death and as glorious as a resurrection. In it we met the demand of Christ: "He that loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me" (Matthew 10:37); "let him

deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me" (Luke 9:23); count the cost (Luke 14:28); "Put off the old man,...be renewed in the spirit of your mind,... put on the new man" (Ephesians 4:22-24). Did we forget? No half-hearted commitment, no nomimal Christianity, no convenience without conviction! Jesus sent thoughtless, irresponsible enthusiasts away empty. We need to rediscover holy ground!

(2) When we meet as the church for worship, we are not paying our dues, fulfilling a tradition, or salving our conscience. We are communing with God through Christ and encouraging one another. With our whole heart we sing joyfully, pray fervently, study diligently, give generously, and remember gratefully as we partake of the Supper. It's a meeting with God. We never approach it casually or absent ourselves willfully from it. We need to rediscover holy ground!

(3) Finally, there is the need in all of our lives for private moments of meditation, study, prayer, renewal and rededication. Without those times our spiritual lives will be dwarfed. We must have them as we effectively live in the community as "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:16). These are times to reflect upon who we are and why we are. They are strengthening times and growing times. We need to rediscover holy ground.

Times with God are special times. Don't neglect them. Don't ignore them. Don't forsake them. They are holy ground.

Television

During the next few weeks we will have three television specials of THE SEARCH. On Saturday, November 29, at 7:00 p.m. we will have our Thanksgiving Special--The lying of Thanks, which was taped on the lake in The Woods where we live. On Saturday, December 20, at 7:00 p.m. we will have our year-end special, Joy To The World, which will be taped during our Sunday evening worship on December 7. Then on Wednesday evening, December 24, we will have a special presentation during what usually is news time on Channel 7, 10:00 p.m. This program will be taped on Friday, December 19, at my home and will be entitled, If It's A Happy Time, Why Am I Sad? It is interesting that we have been invited by the television station program director to fill the 10:00 p.m. Christmas Eve time, and the cost for both December programs will be only slightly higher than would be one program normally. Speaking

of costs, note these facts. Television is expensive. The time, the production, the editing, the promotion--it's all expensive. Our television budget for 1987 will be about \$1,000 per week, including fiftytwo Sunday programs and five prime-time specials. That's \$52,000 a year. But, let's break that down. According to the television station we have about 15,000 viewers on Sunday and 50,000 viewers of our Specials. That's a total of over one million (1,030,000) per year at a cost of \$19.80 per year per person, or 38 cents per person per week! Then there are the letters we receive, the questions we answer, the further studies we conduct and the people who are baptized. That is what makes it worthwhile. And, from a stewardship standpoint, we can't afford not to do it. Be praying! Be watching! Be inviting! The Lord will give the increase.

Effective Or Efficient

"Efficient," as used here, means "doing with perfection what doesn't need to be done." "Effective" means "performing imperfectly, but accomplishing what needs to be done." Are we effective or efficient? A very efficient father planned a family day in which he scheduled what each member of the family would do every hour of the day. In the midst of the father's meticulous plans his little boy ran up and said, "Hey Dad, are we having any fun?" The father might have been efficient, but he wasn't very effective. In the work of the local church we must be careful that we are effective, not just efficient. The work of the church is the salvation of the lost. To this end we are to preach the gospel, perform acts of benevolence, and edify the body. Various programs may help us fulfill our work, but our work is not the programs. We may be very efficient in our programs, but fail to be effective in our work. When a program becomes an end in itself, and we lose sight of the work, it is time to reevaluate the program. The success of no program is worth the failure of the work. So all of us--preachers, elders, deacons, teachers, committee chairmen, visitation leaders, Brother's Keeper leaders--must keep our eyes on what we are trying to accomplish, what our work is. Otherwise, the program becomes a "sacred cow" and we find ourselves spending our energies in defending the "sacred cow." Then we may be efficient, but not effective.





2,000 years Augsburg

A spiritual feast of a special kind as well as a great success was our Annual Men's Lectureship, which took place in Dinkelscherben, near Augsburg September 22-26.

We, the brethren from Augsburg, had the responsibility for the organization as well as for the whole program of this lectureship. Together with Englebert Worle, one of our most faithful and capable brothers, I worked out the whole program and assigned the various lectures and Bible classes to different preachers and teachers of the attending countries (Switzerland, Austria and Germany). Many letters had to be written since the beginning of the year. Many telephone calls had to be made to persuade speakers to help us, and countless prayers were offered in behalf of this lectureship and its outcome.

For the eighth time successively the lectureship was held in the youth hostel in Dinkelscherben, which has a capactiv of 88 people. Throughout the past years, 70-75 brethren were attending. This year, however, to our big surprise, 92 attended.

Our main topic was "Christian Freedom." Some of the themes for the daily lectures included: "Christ - the beginning of freedom," "Freedom and responsibility," "Freedom in the spirit," Freedom or slavery," "Misuse of freedom," and "The goal of freedom."

During the past several weeks, the American congregation, which meets in our church building (I preach for them every second Sunday, which I enjoy very much) had 4 baptisms, which brings the total number of baptisms for this year up to five (our German congregation had 4 baptisms so far during this year). We rejoice over these nine souls, which the Lord has added to the two congregations in Augsburg!

There was not a single week-end in September, where we did not have visitors to stay in our home. September is still a month of travelling, and many people take advantage of the beautiful weather, which we usually enjoy in the fall.

Several of our members were severly ill lately, some still are. One is Englebert Worle, who has heart problems. ... Please, pray for our sick members.

In September, Kornelia Vost, who was baptized this year, gave birth to a girl. We all rejoice over this, since this is the first child being born to one of our members in a long time. Her husband, who is not a member of the church, causes her problems wherever he can. Please pray on her behalf also.

I do not like to talk about money, and usually I do not mention it at all, but today I would like to bring to your attention what a severe problem the constant devaluation of the Dollar had become for us (over 30% in one year). Since the German congregation cannot make up for this loss, our personal income as well as our working fund is being decreased every month by one



Hot Horseshoes

A proud young fellow walked into the village blacksmith shop just after the smithy had tossed a red-hot horseshoe on the ground to cool. Noticing it lying there, the young man bent down and picked it up...only to drop it in haste.

"Kind of hot, isn't it, son?" asked the blacksmith.

"No, not hot," said the fellow, hiding his burned fingers. "It just doesn't take me long to look at a horseshoe."

I've done that—made a mistake and then been too proud to admit it. I've handed some hot horseshoes and burned my fingers, but then harbored my hurt to myself rather than confess it. After all, if your burn your fingers, you look kind of vulnerable and perhaps weak. And who wants folks to see behind our masks of competency and self-sufficiency and righteousness?

When we handle hot horseshoes, how much better to simply say, "I was wrong. I admit it." Confess your sins to one another." (James 5:16).

Pride is a cruel taskmaster. It prevents us from being ourselves. It hinders us from relating to others. It robs us of the liberating joy of cleanness in God's sight.

Next time we handle hot horseshoes let's be willing to allow the Lord to wash away our pride and to admit our wounds and flaws and weaknesses to one another and to God. Healing follows confession and prayer (James 5:16).


The Middle School will have their devotional October 12. The Carruths and Whitleys will be helping that night. Remember to encourage all to come who are in this age group.





My Creed

The word "Creed" comes from a Latin term "credo" which means simply, "I believe." What one believes is his creed. It's not bad, then, to have a creed, or even a crued that is written down. However, a problem arises when a man's creed, either oral or written, differs from the Scripture and/or is accepted instead of Scripture. The early leaders of the Restoration Movement in America rightly believed that human creeds were responsible for dividing believers in Christ. Therefore, in calling men back to the Bible, those leaders said, "No creed but Christ; no book but the Bible." Regardless of one's feelings about those pioneers, they were right at that point: "No creed but Christ." We are to believe Christ--who He is and what He thought. It's not what I think or how I feel, but what Jesus said that really counts. We must seek to know what He said, understand what He said, and to do what He said...whether we agree with Him or not. So many give lip service to Jesus and

then go on with their written and unwritten creeds without ever considering if they agree with Jesus or not. Wouldn't it be great if all of us could say in a practical way, "My creed is Christ?"

Choices are important. When facing them we should seek God's direction — and be willing to accept it. It isn't enough to determine what immediate rewards may come. We must try to see the ultimate end of the choice. Putting ourselves or our families in an environment of dangerous temptattions is a poor choice.





"What are you doing here, Elijah" -- J Kings 19:9,13

What Are We Doing Here?

As Elijah the prophet fled into the wilderness in an effort to escape the wrath of wicked Queen Jezebel, God (ked him, "What are you doing here, Elijah?" A good question! Wherever we may be. Whatever we are doing. At this time and in this place, what are we doing here? To be more specific, what are we as a church doing here in the HEART of TYLER? The answer is really quite simple: we are trying to be faithful. Isn't it interesting that we are never commanded by God to be successful? He has asked us to be faithful (Matthew 25:21; I Corinthians 4:2; et.al.). Faithful in what? Two things: Doctrine and Practice. Doctrine means teaching. Is it too much to ask that when one enters our building on Sunday he should be able to hear how he can be saved, the unique nature of the New Testament church, how God wants us to worship, etc. We are also to be faithful in practice, that is, our attitude in presenting doctrine and our daily living of doctrine must harmonize with what we say we believe. What a pity to be correct doctrinally, but to be incorrect in attitude and practice. How tragic to have good attitudes, to try to live right, and never to teach the whole counsel of God! We are committed to being a faithful church-faithful in doctrine,

faithful in practice. If you are comfortable with that, you have found a church home.

Dear Brethren,



for May 198

The month of May was filled with so many interesting and great events, that I do not know where to begin telling you about it.

In the afternoon of April 30, right after I had mailed my latest reports to you, my family and I, together with some members of our congregation, went to the train station to pick up the seven students from Oklahoma Christian College, who just had arrived from the USA in order to help us in our three week Campaign. Since they had been travelling for nearly thrity hours, we took them to the church building for a short welcome coffee party, and after that they went home with their host family, where they could sleep throughout the following day (May 1st, a holiday in Germany). On the next day we started our work passing out 50,000 invitation cards from door to door. Every day, for three weeks, we were doing this kind of work, except for the five days which we spent down town, setting up our tract table and speaking to people who passed by, inviting them also to our meeting. After the three weeks nearly the whole town of Augsburg was covered with our invitation cards which proved that these seven students really had worked hard.

On Sunday, May 11, our Gospel Meeting started with Reiner Kallus from Graz doing the preaching, and on May 18, it was closed with another great service. Needless to say that Reiner's sermons were excellent again (he and his wife stayed in our home, as well as two of the students). Each evening before the service started the students sang for the audience, which was appreciated by everyone present. God blessed us in many ways: each night we had an average attendance of 83 persons (we just have 53 members alltogether), each night we had 22 visitors, and at the end of our campaign we had the joy of baptizing Iris Kremp, the eighteen year old daughter of one of our most active brothers in the church.

While the students from OCC were with us we took them on an excursion down to the Bavarian Alps, which they enjoyed very much, even though it was raining all day long. They also went to a theatre performance, enjoyed picnics and hikes, and had much fellowship with our young people...

From May 26-30, the annual German Women's Lecture-ship took place in Neckarzimmern. Six of our ladies attended. Christel did not go because she is attending the annual Women's Lectureship in Austria each year and cannot afford financially to go to both. The ladies returned uplifted and enthused.

On May 30, I went to Karlsruhe to start a Cospel meeting. More information about it in my next report.

Again, we thank you for all your love, your help, your prayers. We think of you often and pray for you always.



From The Heart of Tyler

Our contribution Sunday was

\$98,014.46

"But thanks be to God, who puts the same earnestness on your behalf in the heart of Titus"

2 Coninthians 8:16

Titus had the same concern, (care) for the church at Corinth that Paul possessed. However, it was no accident or happenstance -- Paul affirms that God put that concern in the heart of Titus. So it is with us. Your concern for the church and for the Cause of Jesus was beautifully demonstrated last Sunday in your outpouring of love in our special contribution. We prayed and our prayers were exemplified by our twelve hour, all night prayer vigil led by Forest McFadden. This came after the moving challenge presented to us the Sunday before by C. B. Hardin. Then, after the challenge and after the prayers and after the behind the scenes efforts and after the purpose, we gave with willingness and joy and exceeded our goal as we gave \$98,014.46. I am convinced, and I feel sure you are too, that God answered our prayers. God made us able. God put the concern in our hearts and we offered our gifts. Some gave abundantly out of their abundance. Others gave abundantly

out of their little. But, many sacrificed and know first-hand the happiness of giving. The Macedonian Christians gave "willingly of themselves," and so did you (2 Corinthians 8:3). The Corinthians were encouraged to "abound in " the "grace" of giving; to "prove the sincerity of their love;" to "sow bountifully" as they "purposed" in their hearts; and to believe that "God is able" to make them "abound to every good work" (2 Corinthians 8:7,8; 9:6-8). I like to believe they accepted that challenge, and so have you. Your generosity has prompted "many thanksgivings unto God" (2 Corinthians 9:12). God bless you... and He will! He will "multiply your seed sown, and increase the fruits of your righteousness" (2 Corinthians 9:10). One of the most significant things about this contribution is that so many participatedyoung people, young couples, widows, as well as others. This was a gift by the church--by the many and not the few. That's significant.

Importance of Public Worship

Years ago one heard many sermons on the importance of public worship. Perhaps many of us felt that it was becoming redundant and longed to hear something else. But redundant or not, public worship is important. The Hebrew writer urges, "not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near" (Heb. 10:25).

It seems clear to me that to assemble together is a Christian duty. One can hardly forget that Christ frequented the synagogues and temple; that Christ's disciples were assembled when Jesus appeared to them after his resurrection; that they were assembled at the day of Pentecost; that Paul waited at Troas until the brethren came together, etc. And the same pattern of "not neglecting to meet together" should prevail today.

But some who profess attachment to Christ's cause neglect more assemblies than they attend. We do not wonder that unbelievers stay away, or that those who have fallen in love with the world do not have any relish for such gatherings, but many who are Christians by profession are also guilty of this. Some have become once—a—day worshippers. Others come out when the weather is good. And some attend when they take a notion. It is obvious that there is little spiritual relish. Their religion degenerates into a "form of godliness" with a noticable lack of joy, de—sire, or "want to."

God deserves our service. We meet together to honor His Name, to read His Word, to declare His Praise, to remember His Son. But to fail to meet "as is the habit of some" is to pour contempt on all these things.

A failure to attend the assembly weakens the church. By being together we form a visible building; all the stones united together. To neglect this is to weaken the energies of the church and discourage the godly.

We ought to meet together for our own benefit. Our holiness, comfort and usefulness in great measure depend upon such services. Our knowledge is yet imperfect, our faith feeble, our hope clouded, our love languid. In short, we need the assembly.



From The Heart of Tyler

I know you will do what you can to help reach our goal this Sunday as we have our Special Contribution. The exhortation last Sunday at the morning worship hour was superb and we will all be prayerfully considering that very fitting challenge as we decide our particition. God bless you.

If someone was heard to say, "All they ever talk about at that church is baptism," would it be likely that the person making the statement was not baptized scripturally? If someone was heard to say, "All they ever talk about is undenominational Christianity," would it be likely that the statement was made by someone who approved of denominationalism? If a young person said to his parents, "All we ever talk about in this family is getting home on time," would you say that this young person gets home late or on time? If a worker on a job said to his boss, "All you ever talk about is that I should meet my quota," would you conclude the worker is not meeting his quota? If a Christian is heard to say, "All they ever talk about is money," ... you can draw your own conclusions.

The Struggle To Believe

The stage was set for a notable miracle. A father had brought his demon-possessed son to the disciples of Jesus, but they could not heal him (Mark 9:18). Next, the suffering father came to Jesus and in desperation cried, "If you can do anything,...help us" (9:22). Jesus responded, "If you can believe, all things are possible" (9:23). Then, weeping, the father said, I believe; help my unbelief" (9:24). How difficult it is for us to believe! We settled in our minds long ago the issue of the existence of God, the inspiration of the Bible, the deity of Christ, the undenominational nature of the church, the purpose of baptism, and the avenues of acceptable worship, ...and we believe. But, we struggle to believe that God can or will act in our lives in a powerful way today. When we are in trouble we may cry out, as did the father in Mark 9, "Lord, if you can do anything, ... " Is the real problem God's ability and willingness to help us, or is it our lack of faith? Jesus said, "If you can believe, all things are possible." The problem is not a power problem on the part of God, but a faith problem on the part of man. How we rob ourselves of blessings because we do not want to believe. Here is a promise we need to claim as we consider what we can do in response to our Special Contribution this Sunday:

And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work... He...will supply and multiply your resources. ... you will be enriched in every way for great generosity... You will glorify God by your obedience (2 Corinthians 9:8-13).

"Lord, I believe; help thou my unbelief."

Others go back to their native countries, taking with them the seed planted and diligently nurtured by all of us on the Mission's team - the system taught by our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ: LOVE and CARING. Some of them want to say "thanks" to all the American people who made their learning possible and are especially appreciative of the impact the teaching of the Bible has made in their lives." (quoting their words)

The present semester is going just great! Some classes are overflowing and you can imagine how joyful we feel having so many people come our way. But this joy is not ours only, You play a very important role in this task.





HERE AND THERE

A church was told "Be thou faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life." (Revelation 2:10) What does it mean to be faithful? Some have said "To live by faith." Others, "To be steadfast," or "To be loyal," "To keep one's commitments or promises." A dictionary definition is: 1. keeping faith; worthy of trust; honest; loyal. 2. reliable; dependable.

This reading is often made to mean that we should be faithful until we die. We should. But, Christ said, "Be thou faithful unto death." This is to be faithful even if we must die for it. Anyone loyal enough to die for his faith will be faithful until he dies. Would you die rather than renounce your faith? Would you die rather than refuse to be loval to your beliefs? Would you die rather than refuse to practice your faith?

Attendance in worship does not prove one's faithfulness. However, willful absence may prove your unfaithfulness! Sitting in a pew is not the whole of being a Christian, but assembling with the saints is part of what God requires of us. (Heb. 10:25).

God knew we needed each other. That's one of the reasons He gave us the church and told us not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together. There is strength in unity. You need the church, but the church also needs you. The church is the body of Christ and is likened to the human body. Paul said that members of the body that seem to be more feeble are necessary. You are necessary! (I Cor. 12:22)

Being necessary lays a heavy obligation upon us. If we fail to function, we might as well not exist as far as the body is concerned. In fact, a non-functioning organ may cause the body serious problems. Are you a functioning, faithful member? Lewis G. Hale Oklahoma City



Accomplishments of the past are to build upon, not to rest upon. We live in the ever present now and reach toward an ever promising future. We must now ask ourselves,

"What am I doing with my present, with its unbelievable potential, as I prepare for a future packed with promise?" What does the future hold? I may not know, but I know this: how I use my present will shape my future. - 1. Is there evidence of spiritual growth in my life?

- 3. Am I seeking to be more deeply involved in the work of Christ from day to day?
- 4. What place does Christ and the church occupy in my daily life?
- 5. Is my faith deeper, my love greater, and my commitment more complete than earlier in life?
- 6. Could I care more?
 The future will be whatever we, with the Lord's help, do with our present.

What are your plans for the future? Do you have any? What exactly is it that you want out of life? If you are like most people, you are probably still undecided and that's okay. We cannot predict or control all of our future and there is no way we can be sure of what we will be doing ten years from now. However, there is one thing we can control in our future — our relationship with God.

We all have relationships. Whether the relationship is with a close friend, boyfriend or girlfriend, we all have relationships that we treasure. If a conflict arises between you and your boyfriend or girlfriend, what do you do? If you really care about them, you do your best to make things right again. Right? 



Power and Light

Louis Braille was a keen-minded, bright child who showed great promise. But at the age of three, he lost his evesight. As a young man he went to Pa is to study in the Institute for the Blind where he showed great ability in science and music, becoming famous in Paris as an organist and violin cellist. In 1829 at the age of twenty he developed the alphabet which enabled the blind to read the literature of the world--the Braille system. France erected a statue to Louis Braille in Coupyray, where he was born, and blind people from all over the world visit that statue and, with a wonderful light on their faces, rub their fingers over the nose, mouth, and eyes. They are grateful to Braille for what he did for them. His story tells of the potential power that lies within a human being to achieve, accomplish, succeed against great odds. It also tells us

that Louis Braille literally "turned on the light" for thousands of blind people. I am reminded of the tremendous power available to us to do great things in the service of Christ. For those who will use their God-given abilities for Him, and who will rely upon His strength for achievement, success in His work is assured, and negative attitudes expressed in such statements as, "It won't work," or "We've tried that before," or "What's the use" will vanish. Louis Braille's story also reminds me that God has turned on the light for the spiritually blind. All that we know about our origin, purpose, salvation, and destiny He has revealed in His Word. Without that Revelation we would be plunged into absolute darkness. But we have light and for that we must be eternally grateful.

A WORD OF PRAISE

John Gipson, Little Rock, Ark.

Psychologists tell us that one of the deepest urges in human nature is the craving to be appreciated. Thus, we contribute immeasurably to the happiness and success of others when we express appreciation for their work and worth.

We are also advised that the giving of sincere praise brings outstanding benefits to the one who gives it. This we contribute immeasurably to our own happiness and success when we express appreciation to others.

Observation teaches that the most successful people have mastered the art of giving praise.

Giving honest praise is like "saying grace" at the table...very difficult to start, if it hasn't been our pattern. Here are some guidelines to get one started.

Look for little things for which you can express appreciation. We tend to wait for colossal achievements before uttering one word of commendation or encouragement. Rare and refreshing is the person who goes on a "treasure hunt" searching for little things to praise.

Look for things close at hand for which you can express appreciation. The human tendency is to see glamour in things at a distance and defects in things close at hand. It doesn't take much sense to find fault with things and people close by. Conversely, it requires sensitive perception to detect the genuine worth of nearby treasures.

Voice your appreciation. It isn't that we don't appreciate others...it's just that, for some unknown

"They Ain't Nothin' To Worry About"


A nationally known speaker was to give a speech on Worry at a convention held at White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, and, be re the appointed hour, he took a drive up one of the beautiful valleys around the resort. He came to a bridge crossing a rapidly moving mountain spring and got out of his car to view the scenery. As he stood on the bridge he noticed a ten-year-old boy fishing in the stream below and struck up a conversation with him. The speaker learned that the boy's name was Tommy, that he and his father often hunted in the area, and that he was playing "hooky" from school in order to fish in the mountain stream. Since the speaker was to give a speech on worry, he asked Tommy, "Do you worry?" Turning from the stream with wideeyed surprise, Tommy said, "Shucks! They ain't nothin' to worry about. I go to church every Sunday." This ten year old somehow believed that going to church every Sunday was equated with belief in "Be anxious in nothing" --Philippians 4:6

God and belief in God was an antidote to worry. But what about us? Do we worry and fret over this and that? And what good does worry do? Worry is always too early or too late. We worry about things that are past and over which we have no power, or we worry about what might happen in the future, ninety-five percent of which never happens. By worrying, we not only solve no problems, but we take the joy out of the present. If God is in control, if God cares about us, and if God wants to help us, why worry? You have vast resources for overcoming worry. Here are five of them. Read them. Remember them. Use them.

On Friday, March 7, Christel, Martina and I made a trip down to Berchtesgaden (near Salzburg) to visit Wilfried and Christa Wille, a couple who once was very faithful to the Lord, while we were still living and working in Salzburg. Later, they became so very much engaged in their work in a restaurant, that they found no more time to attend our regular church services in Salzburg (at that time they lived in Berchtesgaden -

20 miles away from Salzburg - and had two girls). To-day, they lie in Ramsau, where they work in a hotel. They were happy to see us, and while we had a good and long talk with them, we tried to find a way to get them back into the church. Please pray for this couple.


During March I continued my work as a teacher at the German Bible School in Heidelberg. Every Monday I went to Heidelberg to teach the General Epistles...

Recently Charles Hodge, in speaking for our Teacher's Appreciation Banquet, stated that during the fund raising drive to raise one million dollars for the building program at Duncanville they are baptizing more young people than ever before. Charles believes that when parents show their children the church is so important to them that they will change their life styles in order to contribute more to the Cause of Christ, young people decide they want to be Christians and a part of the church. What a power for good is example. Parents may talk of the importance of the church, but actions speak so much more eloquently than do words. The child is to be pitied who has parents who put their selfish interests before their support of Jesus' church. When a child sees his parents put almost anything and everything before their faithful involvement in and for the church, it's little wonder that he has no interest in the church and can hardly wait until he can drop out even as his parents have already done from a practical standpoint. If our children become spiritual dropouts, let it be only after we, as parents, have demonstrated that Christ and His church are the most important part of our lives, and not after we have given a pitiful half-hearted effort to the service of Christ. What are our actions saying to our children?

To Help Us Grow

There are many things that you and I as mortals cannot do. We must depend on the Creator and Sustainer to do them for us. But there are so many more things that we can do, and God expects us to use our brains, our bodies, our energies and our talents to do them, in order that we may grow.

What are some of the things God expects us to do?

First, He expects us to bounce back from setbacks, to overcome our obstacles, and to rise above our adversities. To use a familiar cliche' "The bumps are what you climb on." In God's infinite wisdom, He wants us to exercise our abilities, to stretch our spiritual muscles, and to grow strong in the process.

Second, God expects us to transform negatives into positives, and to see the possibilities in our problems, and to turn burdens into blessings. By so doing we grow in character and in wisdom.

Third, God expects us, as His people, to be instruments of love, peace and goodwill. He expects us to be expressions of joy, harmony and generosity. He wants others to see God in us, to experience God through us, and to enjoy with us. God does not physically hug the lonely person; He gives to us that privilege and responsibility. He does not verbally encourage the distressed and despondent individual; that is what you and I are here to do. God does not take food to one who hungers. He hands that opportunity to us, so that we may grow and be blessed.





From the comfort of our own homes and the safety of familiar surroundings we can penetrate and curtain, traverse any jungle, overcome any danger—and save a soul we will never see until we meet at the judgement."



Reflections Upon Thirty Years

I have been preaching for nearly thirty years. During those years, I have been engaged in "local work" in Kentucky, Oklama, and Texas, and have preached in four foreign countries and in 200 meetings in sixteen states. Over the years I have made a number of observations. I have noted that local churches have often gone to multi-staff people and are doing effective work on the local level. I have seen the "gospel meeting" run ten days to two weeks and be an effective tool in reaching the lost as the gospel was preached with power. In bygone days the "big meeting" would sometimes have overflow crowds, many outsiders, and large numbers of public responses. I have seen preachers become better trained, elders better equipped. Bible class teachers better supplied, and members provided better opportunities. I have seen the church grow at a pace unsurpassed since the beginning days of The Restoration Movement. But that's not all I have observed. I have also seen, during these thirty years, "gospel meetings" dwindle in length, attendance and response. I have seen interest in preaching decline, real church growth come to a standstill, congregations stagnate, and "sermons" without Bible, and Bible knowledge somewhat evaporate. Obviously, some changes have been good, others not good. Change we must, for we live in a changing world. Methods must change, emphasis may change, but our commitment to Christ and His Word must change only as commitment grows deeper. True, in times past, the truth has sometimes been preached with an attitude that turned people away. The answer is not moving from the proclamation of Truth to proper attitudes, but rather the living and speaking of Truth from hearts filled with genuine love for people. If we know what we believe; if we are dedicated to Truth; if we are genuine as Christians; if we boldly speak God's word as though it makes a difference; I believe we will return to the good of the past--concern for gospel preaching, reaching the lost, building up of the church, and, yes, dynamic church growth. But, it will have to begin with us. Where do you stand? Does it make any difference what you believe? Is the world lost? Do I care? What is lasting? Am I growing? Am I seriously into the Word? What is my purpose in the world? Where am I, and my friends and associates going to spend eternity? Milquetoast in either the pulpit or pew wouldn't get it thirty years ago...or today.

It is also Biblical. We cannot maintain a forward movement personally without getting personally involved in some ministry that supports the preaching of the gospel, edifying the saints, or helping the needy. I'm thankful that we have many such efforts before us at West Erwin. My only concern is that not all of my brothers and sisters are engaged in any of these ministries. I'm sure we can find ways to excuse such deficiencies, but we won't give up trying to get as many folks as we can engaged in "good works." I'm sorry that many have the mistaken impression that church attendance qualifies for a ministry, but it doesn't. That does not mean that many who do come with predictable faithfulness are not busy in good works, they are using their spiritual gifts in a variety of ways. We commend these to you as examples of good service and pray that you will seek to follow their example. If you are contented with mere church attendance, stop and think a moment. Where would you be if everyone who touched your life for the kingdom had been content only to attend? You are the means by which God can do mighty things for someone else, if you will let Him.

This writer has personal appearances, books, bulletin editorials, and sermon tapes that travel all over the world. The risk in all communication is misunderstanding. Therefore I run many risks. However. what I say is usually not the problem! Read Mortimer Adler's book, How To Speak; How to Listen. People do not listen and people do not read correctly. Misunderstandings seldom come from what I said or wrote. Misunderstandings come from "What I have not written." Disagreements seldom come from what was said.

There is a responsibility upon the auditor. Speakers/writers should strive for simplicity. But the above places most disagreement upon the listener. People read in or out what they want to hear or not hear. Most do not disagree with what I said but with what they think I said.

Also, many disagree with what they think should have been said. The most harsh Criticism does not come from what was said, thought to have been said--but from what listeners expected. This makes speakers/ writers pawns! They are used and abused. Many listeners are using speakers to correct others. Said listeners are not listeners--they are "Spankers" ... "Tell the others off."

This spices up speaking/writing! You have no idea what people will hear, think, or say. Sometimes it hurts; usually it is silly. We all need a course, "The Fine Art of Listening."

He Still Does

The 22nd Psalm speaks of David's personal suffering, portrays the suffering of God's people through the ages, and predicts the suffering of Christ. As a matter of fact, four statements from Psalm 22 are quoted at the cross of Jesus:

- 1. "My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?" (verse 1).
- 2. "He trusted on the Lord that He would deliver him: let him deliver him, seeing he delighted in him" (verse 8).
- 3. "They pierced my hands and my feet" (verse 16).
- 4. "They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture" (verse 18).

The Psalm expresses three laments that you may feel when things do not go right:

- 1. "I am hurting!"
- 2. "God doesn't care!"
- 3. "They (others, Satan, circumstances, etc.) are winning!"

However, the Psalm does not end there. There is a cry to God for help (verses 9-11), for strength (verse 19), for deliverance (verse 20), for salvation (verse 21). Finally there is praise to God who knows and hears and helps (verses 23-31) those who trust and obey Him. And He still does! Even when it seems like He doesn't, He still does. Trust Him. They, whoever they are, are not winning.

"Encouragement" is the word for the week. Everyone needs a little encouragement at one time or another in their lives. Encouragement could consist of merely a friendly smile or handshake. Just letting someone know that you care is sometimes encouragement in itself. We, as young people, may encourage our friends by our example. Your actions are being watched constantly and by your good example and encouragement, you may be responsible for bringing someone to Christ.

Do not neglect to invite your friends to attend church services, not only on special occasions, such as meetings and "bring a friend night," but encourage

February 1986

In your letters to me, some of you have mentioned that you are enjoying nice spring weather in your country. Well, we are enjoying deepest winter here in our country. Only last Sunday we had another snow shower of about ten inches, and Thomas and I had to work real hard to get the 90 yards of side-walk cleaned plus our parking lot, so that our members could get into the church building for worship. During the last several days the temperatures have reached a low of -10 Fahrenheit.

In spite of this, the attendance to all of our services is excellent, even though some of our members have to drive quite a distance to get to the building. The only problem is to heat our church building enough, which takes a lot of oil and will drive up our bill tremendously.

The cold weather even interfered with a baptism on February 11. Even though I heated the church building and the baptistry all afternoon, the water was still so cold in the evening that both Kornelia Vost, who was being baptized and I were freezing. Kornelia has been attending services for the past year. Her mother and younger sister are members. Kornelia is 21, married and has a two year old boy. Her husband is very mean to her. Oftentimes he come home drunk and doesn't know what he is doing. When Kornelia told me of her desire to become a Christian, I talked with her and her husband. He made it very clear that he was against his wife being baptized. Still, Kornelia wanted to receive remission of sins and so I baptized her. She will have to suffer much, and she will need our special love, care and our prayers. Please remember her in your prayers.

In February I started another new Bible study which is designed especially for our young brethren. They will learn how to study the Bible in the right way, how to work out a Bible lesson on their own, etc. We have chosen the first let-

ter of Paul to Timothy to begin our study. Our young men are very eager to get intensive Bible training (besides all the other regular classes which they attend each week).

Two weeks ago Thomas received his grade card from his new school. It was the best grade-card that he had ever received in his nine years of school. He is well liked by his class-mates and teachers. Needless to say, we are happy and grateful about Thomas.

Andreas finished his first semester in computerscience at the University of Mannheim, and will continue his studies... Last week-end Andreas and his wife Heike visited us here in Augsburg, and we were so glad to have them in our home again. Heike is a teacher in Kindergarten.. They have only a minimum to live on so I am paying for their travel expenses. So far, they have not asked us for any other help.

Even though my family and I are not forced to live on a minimum, as Andreas and Heike, yet we get to feel it very strongly that the value of the dollar has been declining constantly since the beginning of the year. By now, it has lost one third of its value and it is still going down. To us this means that while last year we would get about 3.40 German marks for each dollar, today we get 2.20 for one dollar. In other words, our monthly income has been cut down 30%, and we surely can feel that.

We are so happy and thankful that none of us is ill, and that we are able to continue our work for the Lord here in Augsburg. Thank you so much for everything which you are doing for us. We think of you often andwe pray that God may continue to bless each one of you.

MESSAGES FROM ACTS

Response To The Gospel: Repentance And Conversion

The book of Acts often describes response to the preaching of the Gospel with the word repentance. Those who heard the word of God and believed were called upon to repent (Acts 2:38). It is God's will that everyone repent (Acts 17:30). The coversion of both Jews and Gentiles could be expressed by the word repentance (Acts 5:31; 11:18). Those who repented were promised the forgiveness of sins (Acts 2:38; 3:19; 5:31).

Repentance means a change of mind, heart, or will. It is a fundamental change at the center of a person's life. In the Bible repentance refers to the basic direction of life, the turning from sin to God. This resolve is made especially with reference to God's action in Christ and with a view to the coming judgment.

Another word used to describe response to the gospel is conversion. This word means to turn and in the Bible refers to a turning to God and away from anything that separates from him (Acts 14:15; 26:18). It too follows on faith (Acts 11:21) and describes the response of both Jews and Gentiles (Acts 9:35; 15:19). Repentance is closely associated with conversion, and both words may occur together (Acts 3:19; 26:20). They may be distinguished as repentance referring to the inward turning (the result conduct). Hence, there is the emphasis on bringing forth works worthy of repentance (Acts 26:20). The turning at the center of a person's being must result in outward changes in action. Baptism is one of those outward turning acts resulting from repentance. (cf. Acts 2:38 and 3:19).

Although repentance most often is used of conversion repentance (the resolve to become a Christian), the word can be used of turning from sin committed after becoming a Christian (Acts 8:22). The love of God in Christ calls us to turn away from sin and to God.

Brother Harvey Grier was scheduled to enter Mother Frances Hospital on Wednesday to undergo additional tests on Thursday.



Art Linkletter used to have a program on TV which was called People Are Funny. And they are! For example, there are people who, in the name of religion, do some very non-religious things. The Catholic Crusades and inquisition were non-religious things done in the name of religion. The religious world hasn't changed much. Much religious activities, done in the name of Christ, is far from the spirit of the one who was meek and lowly in heart. It is easy for us to see that activity in the religious community as men wear names unknown to the New Testament, teach doctrines which cannot be found there, and remind us of Jesus' words, "why do you call me Lord, and do not the things which I say," and "In vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men." We haven't totally escaped this problem in the church either. There are those who decide by their own criteria who is and who is not sound in the faith. There are those who upon hearsay and by inuendo assassinate the characters

of good men. There are those who hear something about someone and pass it on as "gospel truth." Some of the biggest offenders are preachers. In the name of "defending the truth" some very "anti-truth" attitudes are exhibited. And one can always find a way to justify his actions, no matter how opposed to the spirit of Christ those actions may be. The Jewish leaders of Jesus' day justified their actions in crucifying Him. The church, as the body of Christ, is to be united (John 17:20,21; I Corinthians 1:10), and the basis for unity is the New Testament including the "Platform for Unity" presented by Paul in Ephesians 4:1-6. We are to agree with the New Testament-there is no man-made standard. If the brotherhood is ever to "be one" it must begin with me as I submit to the Lordship of Christ and to His will, the New Testament, and as I put into practice the principles of "in matters of faith, unity; in matters of opinion, liberty; and in all things, love." It's that last principle that is often difficult to practice. There is no way to demonstrate a wrong attitude in the right way, or to do a bad thing in a good way.

A Slack Hand

Solomon was certainly one of the greatest observers of human nature. As an inspired writer, he recorded for us pithy statements that are true in spiritual life as well as in secular life.

In Proverbs 10:4, he wrote, "A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich."

It would be well for some of our law-makers to read some of these statements. People who will not work will always be poor. You cannot legislate poverty away from society. It is a fundamental rule that in the long run you do not "get something for nothing." When the hand is slack, expect poverty.

The rule is true for the other side of the coin too. "The hand of the diligent makes rich." Try hard; work diligently; take courses and learn to do it better each time; you will succeed.

There are areas of our lives that differ, but the rule applies to all parts. I mean by that, the physical, the mental, and the spiritual. If you are trying to improve the physical body, just be slack in exercise and proper food consumption and you will have a weak and poor body. Slack study habits, no interest in expanding knowledge and you get a slow and ignorant mind. And most important of all, this is true of spiritual things.

I have seen people who never study, pray, worship, or give to the Lord, and then they wonder why they are dead spiritually. A "slack hand" here certainly causes poverty. (Keep in mind that "poverty" is doing without the necessities for existence.)

Your body may last 70 or 80 years; not much longer. Your mind has the power of lasting much longer than that if you use it and don't abuse it. But the soul, the spiritual part of you, will go right on into eternity. What then should occupy most of our diligence?

Isn't it about time that we all set some priorities in our lives? We need to quit piddling with trivial things and get down to the real issues. Let's get as rich as we can in spiritual values by diligence. Jesus is first and demands our best. Let's make sure there is no "slack hand" on our arm!







I Believe In Young People

I suppose every generation has thought of its young people as hopeless. "Our youth now love luxury, they have bad manners, contempt for authority; show disrespect for their elders, and love to chatter in place of exercise. Children are now tyrants, not the servants of their households. They no longer rise when their Liers enter the room. They contradict their parents, chatter before company, gobble their food up and tyrannize their teachers." Although some might think this statement comes from today's newspaper, it was made by Socrates some 400 years before Christ. I don't agree with Socrates or any assessment of youth that indicates young people in general are rebellious and delinquent. I agree with the apostle John who wrote of young men: "You are strong" (I John 2:14). In the February 10 issue of U.S.News and World Report, the results of a Gallup Youth Survey were revealed under the heading of "Exploding The Myths About Teenagers." In interviewing hundreds of young people around the country, the survey revealed that more young people are in church on Sunday (53% of teens) than their adult counterparts (40% of adults attend church). Rather than avoiding homework, 50% of older teens want teachers to assign more. Peer pressure to break the rules was ranked low. Rather than being defiant, troubled, sometimes suicidal, the survey showed that most teens are "nice, normal kids living ordinary lives." Of those interviewed, an overwhelming majority reject marijuana and want tougher laws on selling and using dope. The man most admired by these teens was President Reagan. Most teens are, however, glued to the TV set and the "crazy" music on radio, and they are materialistic (70% said being very well off financially was important). Yet, a majority of these same young people stated they were willing to devote a year to national service. Someone observed that only 3.5% of America's youth are delinquent (those are the ones we most often hear about) while 96.5% are people with values and are generally good citizens. And in the church, our young people are the best of the best. I believe in them. They are important to us. I love them.

Hey! Didja Hear?



Have you ever complained of being deprived of privileges? Have you ever complained of having too many responsibilities?

Along with privileges comes responsibilities. The two go hand in hand and in most cases, you cannot have one without the other accompanying it. We tend to want more privileges and less responsibilities. However, the more responsible we prove ourselves to be, the more privileges we are likely to have. For example, if you come home on time and do not make a habit of being late, you will, most likely, have more future opportunities to go out.

Privileges are something you earn, while responsibility is something you develop. The development of responsibility helps to earn the privileges that we, as young people, desire. Have you ever heard the saying, "You have to give a little to get a little." This could apply to privileges and responsibilities. You have to "give" (or show) responsibility to "get" (or show) privileges. Privileges are something that everyone likes to possess. However, some people are not mature enough to handle the responsibilities that are required to earn privileges. We, as young people, need to develop the maturity needed to cope with responsibility. we do this, we just might find ourselves enjoying the privileges that we desire.



Bible School Growth

Over the next five weeks we want our Bible School to grow by 25%. That can easily happen with but little effort on the part of each of us. Recently an article in the Christian Chronicle, written by Bailey McBride, suggested how the Bible School, to which we already have dedicated lots of space, and to which a large percentage of personal time and energy is devoted, can become an effective tool for growth and evangelism. Five suggestions were made as to what should happen in class: (1) every visitor should feel welcome; (2) every visitor is given the opportunity to become a part of the group; (3) every visitor should have a direct, personal encounter with the Word in a non-threatening format; (4) every visitor should have an encounter with abundant enthusiasm; and (5) every visitor needs to see the definite direction the class is taking. After class a specific family should be assigned to the visitor to nurture him--a family willing to pay the price in energy and time to serve the visitor. Before class, the church must believe in and support the Bible School. Members of the church who miss Bible class and come for worship, simply because they do not care, make poor impressions on visitors. Also, we must have dedicated, prepared teachers and a Biblical curriculum with relevant, helpful application. Who among our members is not in Bible class who should be? Invite them! Who among your acquaintances would attend class if they were asked? Invite them. Remember 25%.

Which Translation

"...you are a letter from Christ ..." 2 Corinthians 3:3.

There are hundreds of translations of the Bible. Which is the best? The most accurate? The safest? That depends on who you talk to-even among the legitimate scholars.

Of course one does not have to be a scholar to speak with certainty about the versions. I've had people who wouldn't know an alpha from a slab of raw liver tell me authoritatively that a certain version is the only accurate one.

Impressive arguments can be marshaled for most of the committeetranslated versions. Each has its strengths and weaknesses. I recently heard about one brother whose ministry consists of splitting churches over translations. That's sad! He has missed a basic teaching of the New Testament which is clear in any translation. Hundreds of thousands don't have the scriptures in their own language. So, fellowship fights over translations strikes me as a less-than-wise use of time, energy, influence and money.

Nevertheless, I'm taking a stand. And it's dogmatic! There is one version we must have! It's the one Paul talks about when he says, "...you show that you are a letter from Christ...written not with ink but with the spirit of the Living Ge..."

There are thousands upon whom the translation debates are wasted, because they're not going to read any 'written' version. But they can't keep from reading the Word "translated" into life.

If conduct doesn't square with teaching it makes no difference how accurate the translation is you use. The jots and tittles may be there without a loss, but if the attitude is not Christlike, something is lost in the translation which pollutes the message.

The only version some people read is you! Make sure it's true to the original!



I really don't wonder about that. I know what would happen. The church would grow spiritually and numerically as never before. What about you and me? Don't we need to know and care? Then we can let the LIGHT shine from the HEART of TYLER.

Super Bowl Sunday

This Sunday is the day! All the hype has been leading up to it. It's Super Bowl time and in the years ahead we will never forget that on January 26, 1986 the Super Bowl winner was... By the way, who won the Super Bowl last year? Or in 1984? It's hard to remember, isn't it? But, how much does it really matter anyway? Yet advertisers will spend millions of dollars for commercials during the Super Bowl. They know that people will be watching. Some will watch because they are avid Chicago or New England fans. Others will watch because they just like a good football game. Still others will watch the Super Bowl because it's a nice thing to do. Some, who have no real feelings about the game will even miss worship to watch it, because after all this is the Super Bowl. Who is it that is playing? Will it matter next year or the year after? Do we even know what matters...really matters? Here is what really matters: That you and I be New Testament Christians; that we be growing into the image of Christ; and that we actively share our faith. Whatever we can do that contributes to these things matters. But, right now I'm trying to remember the score of last year's Super Bowl. It was 23 to 17, or was it 27 to 12, in favor of, ...who was it that played anyway?

SEEKING THE SUMMIT

A dean of the School of Education at the University of Texas made a speech recently in which he said that most institutions and movements eventually go through three stages. They begin as **risktakers**, then they become **caretakers**, and finally they end up as **undertakers**.

Churches are no exception.

Many churches are in the **undertaker's** stage of existence. To be in their services is like attending the annual board meeting of a perpetual care cemetary. Like the church at Sardis (Rev. 3:1), they are dead and don't know it.


Even more churches have become caretakers. Like the church at Laodicea (Rev. 3:16), they are lukewarm and at ease in Zion. They are sound churches—sound asleep! General Patton once said of Britain's Field Marshal Montgomery, "Montgomery seems to be more concerned about not losing a battle than winning one." Churches that are more concerned about not losing than winning have become caretakers whether they realize it or not.

All churches ought to be **risktakers**. We need to be like the church at Antioch, whose first missionaries, Paul and Barnabas, were described as "men that have hazarded their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 15:26). The word "hazarded" is a gambling term that means to take a risk, to make a wager, to lay something on the line. These early Christians were so convinced of the lostness of men, the power of the gospel, and their personal accountability to God that they risked life and limb to get the old story to new places. There was nothing complacent about them. They were people on a bold mission — consumed and committed.

That's the bold and daring spirit that ought always to characterize the church of the living Lord. As long as we live, we ought to be people of faith, optimism and courage. The supreme tragedy of life is to outlive ourselves — as individuals and as churches. It is far better to dare mighty things and experience failure than to live in the safety and security of mediocrity.

Let's not be content to be **undertakers** or **caretakers**. Let's continue to be **risktakers** as we SEEK THE SUMMIT in 1986.





What advantage is there in covering up the real facts in the case? That only adds to sin! Parents, give your kids a break! Put first things first! Let nothing interfere with regular church attendance. Be sure they are deeply involved in our youth programs. Then, after they've gone from home with good training, you can do what you want with your own life. And I have a feeling that by that time, you'll be thrilled with putting spiritual things first and will make it a lifetime policy.





The Church

The church of the New Testament is the Great Purpose of God. In Ephesians 3:10-11, Paul speaks of "the church...according to His eternal purpose." The church was in the mind of God from eternity. That fact alone speaks of the church's importance and demands our careful attention.

The church is also the <u>Great Possession of Christ.</u>
He "gave himself for it" (Ephesians 5:25), and it was "purchased with his own blood" (Acts 20:28). The price paid for and the ownership of the church speaks of its importance and worth.

Again, the church is the Great Privilege of Men. God purposed and Christ died that the church might be available in the world for man. Note these facts:

- 1. The saved are added to it (Acts 2:47).
- 2. Reconciliation is in it (Ephesians 2:16).
- 3. We are baptized into it (I Cor. 12:13).
- 4. Christ loves it and is the Saviour of it (Ephesians 5:23,25).
- 5. Christ is coming for it (Revelation 19:7-9).
- 6. We are to serve in it (Romans 12:4-8).
- 7. We glorify God in it (Ephesians 3:21).
- 8. It (church-EK, out of, KLESIS, a calling) is the people of God, called out of darkness, by the gospel, into the marvelous light (I Peter 2:9,10; 2 Thessalonians 2:14).

I just wonder if the church of the New Testament occupies the place of importance in our hearts and lives that it should. What do you think?

A Caring Church

1985 Report

The men and women who work in the local benevolent work of the church met each Tuesday, including the summer months, of 1985. The building is open to serve the community from 9:00 until 11:30 A.M. each Tuesday. Each week there is an average of 20 people (men and women) who serve in this ministry.

During the year 1985, 204 families, with an average of 3 to 4 members in each family, have been to the Benevolent Center for help. Clothing and in some cases, food certificates, have been distributed. \$4,762.20 used for local help included help with rent, utilities, motel rooms, home repair, school supplies and food certificates.

Items shipped to the Chimala Mission Hospital in East Africa include: 7,683 hand rolled bandages, 26 sheets, 14 pr. pajamas and 262 diaper shirts made by the ladies. Miscellaneous items (soap, pins and needles, razor blades, powder, etc.) have also been sent to Chimala Mission. Also, 24 boxes of medicines in the amount of \$1,400 were sent. Postage in the amount of \$1,017.00 was used for benevolence.

Two boxes of children's clothing for Equador were packed and sent through the Broadway church here in Tyler.

Twelve boxes of clothing were sent to India.

\$10,000 went to Ethiopian relief through the West Erwin church in 1985, and \$23,710 went to Children's Homes and to Christian Services of East Texas.

If you know of a family that has been burned out, please contact Archie Lowry. He is now the Chairman for care of burned out victims.




