Nice Palace, But No King

The legends of the Taj Mahal. They all fascinate, but there is one that haunts. The bride of the prince died. The prince was devastated. He resolved to honor her by constructing a temple that would serve as her tomb. Her coffin was placed in the center of a large parcel of land and construction began around it. No expense would be spared as her final resting place was created.

But as the weeks turned into months, his grief for the princess was eclipsed by his passion for the project. The prince no longer mourned her absence. He was consumed by the constrction. One day, while walking from one side of the construction site to the other, his leg bumped against a wooden box; a coffin, now forgotten, hidden beneath layers of dust and time. Unaware of his own expired passion, the prince brushed the dust off his leg and ordered the workers to throw the box out.

The one the temple was intended to honor was forgotten. And the temple, void of anyone to remember, was erected.

Eerie, isn't it?

Could someone build a temple and forget the reason? Could someone construct a palace, yet forget the king? Could someone sculpt a tribute and forget the hero?

You answer those questions. Answer them in church. The next time you enter an assembly of worship, position yourself where you can see the people, then decide.

You can tell the ones who remember the slain one. They're wide-eyed and expectant. They're children watching a gift be unwrapped. They're servants standing still, as a king passes. You don't doze in the presence of royalty. You don't yawn while being given a gift, especially when it is the king doing the giving.

And you can tell the ones who see only the temple. Their eyes wander. Their feet shuffle. Their hands doodle and their mouths open - not to sing, but to yawn. For no matter how hard they try to stay amazed, all temples - even the Taj Mahal - lose their luster after a while.

The temple-gazers don't mean to be dry. They love the church. They can cite its programs and boast of her leaders. They don't mean to grow stale. They put on hats and hose and coats and ties and come every week. But still there is something missing. The one they once planned to honor hasn't been seen in a while.

But those that have seen him can't seem to forget him. Often, in spite of the temple rather than because of it, they find him. They brush the dust away and stand ever impressed before his tomb - the empty tomb.

The temple-builders and the Savior-seekers. You'll find them both in the same church, on the same pew, and at times, in the same suit. One sees the structure and says, "What a great church." And the other sees the Savior and says, "What a great Christ."





"So we built the wall" --Nehemiah 4:6

A Tool

When Nehemiah returned to Jerusalem following the Babylonian captivity, his task was to rebuild the wall around the city. Nehemiah's work was urgent and important. so important that he said. "I am doing a great work and I cannot come down" (6:3). Yet the wall was not what Nehemiah and the Jews were about. When the wall was completed the people did not worship the wall, bow down to the wall, or glory in the wall. Their purpose was to glorify God, to be His people, to do His work, The wall was a tool to help them to be effective as God's people. It served to protect the city--that's what the wall was for. The temple had been rebuilt and the worship according to the Law had been re-established. The wall was a means to an end. So it is with our new building. The building will be elegant, beautiful,







Our annual year-end contribution will take place this year on December 10 and will be applied to the building fund. Be planning and be generous as we move into the 1990's and the 21st century!



Guest Editorial -

It's a little hard, many times, to say just where it began. Things often begin without our even noticing or at least recognizing the significance of what is happening.

Take the family, for instance, which is accustomed to attending all the public assemblies for Bible study and worship. Everything on Sunday is arranged around the meetings of the church, both in the morning and in the evening. When Wednesday arrives the family knows that this is "prayer meeting night" and no event will be planned to conflict with this assembly of the saints. These times when the church comes together are prized as occasions of edification.

One Wednesday evening dad comes home just about "worn out" with the day's problems and hassle. He decides to stay home and rest telling mother and the kids to go on without him "just for tonight." However, those evenings when he is "just too worn out to go" become more numerous and pretty soon mother is tired and the kids have homework, so the whole family stays home. Sunday night, needing to rest before the next day's work, dad decides to stay home. Again, it is only a matter of time until his absence becomes habitual and, again, the whole family begins to be absent with him. Eventually they become a "Sunday morning" family with little to no real involvement in the work and worship of the church.

Once you treat lightly your attendance at any regularly scheduled gathering of the church, you have set the pattern for drifting away completely. Perhaps you will continue to come once on Sunday, but this attitude toward a divine appointment will prepare your conscience to justify more and more neglect of spiritual duties.

The writer of Hebrews who gave us the familiar exhortation on "not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together (Hebrews 10:25) also warned, "Therefore we must give the more earnest heed to the things we have heard, <u>lest we drift away,"</u> (Heb.2:1).



Incurably Religious

Carl Jung, one of the greatest psychiatrists who ever lived, said, "During the past thirty years, people from all the civilized countries over Europe have consulted me. I have treated many hundreds 🧭 patients. Among all my patients over the age of thirty-five, there was not one whose problems in the final analysis was not that of finding a religious outlook on life. It is safe to say, then, that every one of them fell ill because they lost that which the living religions of every age had given to their followers. And I would say that not one patient in thirty years under my care was ever really healed unless he regained a healthy. religious outlook." Jung's belief reminds us that man is incurably religious. He doesn't decide tó be religious; he is religious. God made him that way. Therefore, in the heart of every man, whether that heart beats in the brown-toned body of the Spaniard, the yellow-skinned body of the Oriental, the black body of an Afro-American, or the pale-skinned body

of the Caucasian, there is a longing for God. So real is this longing that there is an emptiness in man's soul when he lives without God that can never be filled with the passing things of this world. Twentieth century man is on a quest. Like Sir Galahad, the knight of King Arthur's legendary Round Table, searching for the Holy Grail, man searches, longing to be filled with things, but ever empty. He wears a business suit, works in a factory, drives a truck, teaches school, sits in a church building on Sunday, and is empty and unsatisfied because he has never surrendered his heart to the Will of God. There is no commitment, no excitement, no joy, just emptiness, though surrounded by everything. Augustine, the ancient theologian said, "Thou hast made us for Thyself and we cannot rest until we rest in Thee." How slow we are to learn. Think about it. It's not religion that fills, it is God who fills when hearts are seeking Him wholly.





We sincerely believe that they need this additional Bible study time. Let me share the following article with you from the Christian Bible Teacher of September, 1989.

Why Attend Sunday Night And Mid-Week Services?

ones that we believe are most common:

If you were to ask many of God's people why they do not come to Sunday night and Mid-week evening services of the church, you would receive various and sundry answers. Some of these we are listing are the

- "I don't think it is necessary to go more than once a week."
- 2. "I just have too much to do to rry and go."
- 3. "I have to get up early for my job and I just need my rest."
- 4. "I was just too tired to dress myself and the children."
- 5. "That's the night some special friends of our get together."
- "My favorite television show is on that night."
- 7. "My husband won't go so I won't leave him."

If we were to give any of the above seven excuses. which are often given, would it take a mastermind to see whether we are spiritually minded or not? Every excuse offered above is carnal and not spiritual. So, for final consideration as to whether a member of the Lord's church should attend evening services, I set forth the following scriptures: James 4:17, "Therefore to him that knoweth to do good, and doeth it not. to him it is sin." Then in Hebrews 13:17. "Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls." In I Corinthians 15:58, we find, "Therefore my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for asmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord." Colossians 1:10, "That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God."

In view of the above scriptures, we would have to ask ourselves, "Are these activities good work?" Are these services approved by the Elders in their effort to carry out their responsibility in feeding the flock?" Finally, "Would you benefit from them and be

a part of a good work?"







Let's Do It All The Time

Daddy, why don't we do this all the time?"

The speaker was a little boy sitting directly behing me. The question was prompted by a man who was being baptized. He had walked down the aisle with a friend to confess Christ publicly and demonstrate his faith in the Lord's death, burial and resurrection.

I had just finished preaching at the North Atlanta church that Sunday morning and this man had been attending AA meetings hosted by the congregation. It was a moving testimony to the power of the cross and warmth of friendship.

But I couldn't get the little boy's question out of my mind. It haunts me still, "Daddy why don't we do this all the time?" Why don't we here at GCR and in all churches baptize "all the time," at every service? Consider a few of the answers I've come up with. We don't baptize "all the time" be-

Too many of us have a selfish attitude toward the church. We think of it only in terms of how it can meet our needs and, if it does so, we never worry that the needs of the lost go unmet.

We often take a casual attitude toward Bible Study attendance, missing if we feel tired, have visitors in our home, or just don't care to get up on a certain Sunday morning. This attitude slows growth and stifles excitement, leading to fewer conversions. Many of us who attend faithfully never invite a lost friend. Saved people cannot be saved again, so we have no candidate for baptism. Some of us steal God's tithe week by week, and we cannot expect Him to bless a congregation of thieves.

I could go on, but I can sum it all up in one statement: We don't baptize "all the time" because we simply do not intend to. Well, Christ intends for us to, if Matthew 28:19 is any indication. We need to give some attention to our intentions if we are going to claim Him as Lord.

By the way, we have baptized for five consecutive Sundays. let's keep it up, "all the time."



Gospel Meetings Don't Work Anymore

. . . Unless the People Do!

I member it well! Those days not so long ago when an announcement could be made that a church was going to have eight or ten or fifteen days of preaching... and the building would be filled, ten or twenty would be baptized, and that many more would be "restored." But this is not those days. This is now. Announcing a Gospel Meeting does not assure full houses: most of the time there are few responses, and outsiders don't come. Now granted, we cannot live in the past. Our methods of doing the Lord's work must ever be changing as we seek to present the unchanging message of Christ in the very best ways available. The special series of meetings is only one of the ways we have used through the years to advance the Lord's Cause. In the 1980's it's harder to get people out. Our own people do not attend very well so we don't expect outsiders to attend. But please do not criticize me, or the church, when we announce a Gospel Meeting and try to reach people with the gospel. A church doesn't have to have this kind of meet-

ing, but if it chooses to have it, so be it. The church is simply trying to reach out with the message. What kind of outreach do the critics have who say the day of the meeting is over? It's harder to be sure. These days are the 80's not the 50's. However, in preaching in six or eight of these meetings a year for the past thirty years, I have noticed something. When our people really get involved, when they attend every service, when they invite their friends, when they pray, something wonderful happens-people are baptized and the church is strengthened. I remember a meeting in 1987 at West Erwin...over 500 average attendance for six services, over a dozen baptized (mostly adults), other responses, excitement, edification. And why? The people worked and prayed and cared and were involved. No plan of the church will work unless the people do. If people plan the work and work the plan, then nearly any plan will work! Think about it and HEAR DOUG PARSONS EVERY DAY, OCTOBER 8 - 11!


be unfaithful to our stewardship. To do our best we must have vision and faith, and we must approach our work without





Where Do You Place Your Trust?

When Asa became king of Judah in 912 B.C., he brought about some much needed reforms and God blessed him. His reign of forty one years overlapped seven kings of Israel. Asa led his army of nearly 600,000 against an Ethiopian onslaught of one million men saying, "Help us, O Lord our God, for we trust in Thee," (2 Chronicles 14:11) and "the Lord routed the Ethiopians before Asa," (14:12). The prophet Azariah came to Asa to inform him: "The Lord is with you when you are with Him. And if you seek Him, He will let you find Him; but if you forsake Him, He will forsake you," (15:2). Then Asa did a very foolish thing. When Judah was invaded by Israel, Asa made a treaty with the Syrians to help him instead of trusting the Lord, as he formerly had done. to deliver him. Then a prophet from the Lord came to say, "You won victories in other days because you relied upon the Lord. Now you have relied upon flesh and you will experience great trouble." What

was Asa's reaction? He "was angry with the seer (prophet) and put him in prison," (16:10). Later Asa became ill but "he did not seek the Lord, but the physician," (16:12). What a rapid change! Asa forgot that "the eyes of the Lord move to and fro throughout the earth that He may strongly support those whose heart is completely His," (16:9). Someone said, "He who does not learn from the mistakes of the past is bound to repeat them." These things recorded in the Old Testament are for our learning (Romans 15:4). So we raise the question: In what do you place your trust? David said. "Some trust in chariots, and some in horses; but we will trust in the name of the Lord." (Psalm 20:7). In our day some trust in riches, some in power, some in intellect, some in bombs. In what do you trust? If your answer differs from David's: "We will trust in the name of the Lord," ...what are you going to do when trouble comes?


- 1. Our bus will not run for the 8:15 assembly. It will continue the present schedule.







Deep in the Old Testament we find the story of Ahaziah, king of Judah. He came to the throne of Judah in a rather unusual way. Ahaziah's father was Jehoram. When Jehoram became king he immediately killed all of his brothers, no doubt because he felt they were a threat to his rule. The Bible says Jehoram walked in the ways of the kings of Israel and did evil in the sight of the Lord. Finally, God afflicted him with an incurable disease and he died at age forty, "to no one's regret" (2 Chronicles 21:20). Upon his father's death, Ahaziah, Jehoram's youngest son, became king because all of his brothers had been slain by Arab invaders. Ahaziah "did evil in the eyes of the Lord, as the house of Ahab had done, for after his father's death they became his advisors, to his undoing" (2 Chronicles 22:4). One of the many tragic lines in Ahaziah's story is to be found in 2 Chronicles 22:3, "His mother encouraged him in doing wrong." It is sad to read of the evil in the life of

Ahaziah's father. It is tragic to re of the advice the house of Ahab ga Ahaziah, "to his undoing." But the mo tragic part of Ahaziah's story is tl his mother encouraged him in doing wrom Oh, the powerful impact of a mother's i fluence ...for good or ill! Many of can recall the influence for good of loving mother. But what about your chil ren? Are they still at home? Are th still under your influence? And what ϵ they seeing? Are you, by your influenc teaching them to love the Lord, to be Bible study and worship, to grow spiri ually? What do they see? Do they see y put nearly anything and everything befo your service to God? Do you influen them to do good or evil? What a trag waste of opportunity is told in the sto of Ahaziah and his mother! It could ha been different if this mother had ma better choices.



The New Birth

Jesus taught that a new birth, a birth of water and the Spirit, was necessary to entrance into the Kingdom of God (John 3:3,5). This birth reminds us of the radical change which takes place in the life of one who lives under the control of King Jesus. Paul affirmed that in Christ one becomes a new creature, or new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17). Since we understand that one enters Christ by the act of baptism (Romans 6:3), we see that one enters Christ, the Kingdom of God. becomes a new creature when he believes and is baptized (Mark 16:16) and. therefore, is saved. 

"Go, take to yourself a wife of harlotry" -Hosea 1:2

Brokenheartedness

he of the great tragedies of the Old Testament is the story of Hosea. The story begins with these words: "When the Lord first spoke through Hosea, the Lord said to Hosea. 'Go, take to yourself a wife of harlotry, and have children of harlotry; for the land commits flagrant harlotry, forsaking the Lord.'" (Hosea 1:2). So Hosea married Gomer and there were three children born: one named Jezreel ("I will put an end to... the house of Israel"); one was named Lo-ruhamah ("I will no longer have compassion..."); and one was named Lo-ammi ("Not my people," or "not my child."). Read that last one again: "not my child." Hosea's wife was unfaithful to him; she played the harlot and Hosea was not sure the third child was his. What does he do? He sends his children to beg their mother

to come home (2:1-2). She refuses. Finally, when Gomer loses her beauty, is no longer desirable to her lovers, and is about to be sold on the slave market. Hosea goes down to the auction block and buys her back (3:2)! What a heart-rending story. Hosea's experience is God's experience. As Gomer was unfaithful to Hosea, so Israel was unfaithful to God. As Hosea kept loving Gomer, so God kept loving Israel. As Hosea was willing to buy Gomer from the slave market, so God was willing to forgive Israel. Hosea was qualified to preach powerfully to Israel because he experienced the brokenheartedness of God. So it is with us. If we are to be faithful, effective, serving Christians we must see ourselves and the world through the eyes of God. We must see our sin as God does if we are to know the joy of salvation and experience the holy fire of God in our hearts. We must see the lost world as God sees it if we are to be zealous evangelists. To see as God sees and to feel as God feels. we must have the brokenheartedness of God. Then, like Hosea, we will be used by God.







Whisenant Writes Again

Last summer more than three million copies of a book by Edgar Whisenant, 88 Reasons Why The Rapture Will Be In 1988, were sold or distributed across the country with the prediction that Christ would return between September 11 and 13, 1988. Now Whisenant has the audacity to defend his mistake by saying he missed the Second Coming by a year and this is "the one-year warning God promised to give us." He says September 23, 1989 is the beginning of the end. Like so many others, Whisenant uses New Testament passages in Matthew 24 and Luke 21, which has Jesus answering the question his disciples asked about the destruction of Jerusalem, in an effort to "prove" his theory by applying these verses to the end of the world. He also misapplies

numerous other passages to "prove" a physical Battle of Armageddon in Israel. World War III, the "rapture," and a literal reign of Christ on earth for a millennium. It's interesting that the proceeds for the new book, The Final Shout: Rapture Report 1989, will be given to missionary organizations in the event Whisenant's predictions for 1989 do not come to pass! On Arturo Toscanini's 80th birthday his son was asked what he considered his famous father's greatest achievement. He answered, "For him... whatever he happens to be doing at any moment is the biggest undertaking in his life, whether it be conducting a symphony or peeling an orange."

It's refreshing to see a person who gives every effort his best. We lost something very precious when we lost pride in responsible workmanship. The skilled craftsmanship of certain Oriental families-their refusal to cheat on a single detail-produced works of exquisite beauty.

I've seen beautiful hand-carved doors which were begun by a father who spent all his life working on them. The project was continued by his son who also spent his entire life on it, and completed by the grandson near the end of his life. Three generations consumed on one project.

Whether the elegance of the workmanship could justify the expenditure of that amount of time and skill is questionable. But certainly no more questionable than our modern extreme of unconcern Happy Birthday for quality workmanship. There is nothing commendable in shoddy performance, built-in obsolescence, and careless construction.

There is something morally wrong with an unconcern which permits four days for arrival of an airmail, special delivery package at a destination 500 miles from its point of origination; with a promise of completion of work at a certain time knowing full well that the deadline will not be honored; with showing samples of handsomely done work and then delivering obviously inferior merchandise.

Excellence in workmanship is not too much to expect. If pride in being a human doesn't produce it, pride in being a Christian should.

"One may pick his friends, but not to pieces." "Fault finding is one talent that needs to be buried and the grave forgotten." The chronic faultfinder is most generally one who does nothing for himself.

We can usually find what we are looking for. Look for the best and you will find the best. What a different world we would have if each searched the other as minutely and carefully for his virtues as he did for his vices. A good motto to follow is: "Search others for their virtues and thyself for vices."

There are some suggestions that will help us keep from becoming hypercritical. Love is the key to the remedy. Albert Barnes, author of a well-known Bible commentary, wrote, "True love makes us kind to another's imperfections, charitable toward his faults and often blind to their existence."

Self-examination makes us less critical of others. Usually, the keener our eyes become to the faults of others the blinder they become to our own, and the more we magnify the vices of another the more we minimize our own.

We also need to apply the principle of Ezekiel 3:15, "I sat where they sat." Put yourself in the other person's place.

Make it a habit to look for the good. The buzzard and the honey bee see different things. Each finds what it is looking for.

Let's make it a habit of helping build each other up, rather than tearing one another





CAN YOU TRAIN YOUR CHILD TO BE A WINNER?

"Ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath; but bring them up in the nuture and admonition of the Lord." Ephesians 6:4

We hear a lot today about how to discipline our children. Yet it seems as though we live in a world without discipline. The debate rages on about negative discipline versus positive discipline. To many, it sounds like a heated argument between "spanking" and "bribing."

Too often we are guilty of doing only a half way job. We admonish, that is correct, bad behavior and point out defects all too quickly. We also forget the limitation God places on this aspect of parenting when he said, "provoke not your children to wrath." We punish our kids not to shape their behavior but to satisfy our own often childish anger. We take our anger and give it to our children without considering that it is provocation. We, as parents, have the right and the responsibility to correct our children's bad behavior not because it makes us angry but because (needs correcting.

One author defines the difference between the abuse of a child and the discipline of a child as the emotional state of the adult. A child should have a reasonable fear of discipline if it is to be effective. When an adult punishes while in a rage, reasonable fear turns to terror and discipline turns to abuse. Never spank your child while you are angry! Wait, there is time for that later. Also, make sure that your menu of possible forms of admonition has more on it than one or two items.

The job of raising winners is less than half done when we have finished admonishing them. We are also to "nurture" them. Nurturing means we create children who believe in themselves. They believe they can, that they are capable, and that they like themselves because they see us believing in them and liking them.

Self-esteem never comes from inside ourselves. It is always a gift from someone else. The three most important sources of self-esteem are mother, father, and mate. How often do we see people in counseling that are shattered, bent, and broken because the capabilities were never nurtured as children. It is not our place to break a child's spirit but to nurture it. God is also an important source of self-esteem. "I know I am somebody because God does not make junk!" I am precious in His sight. He sent His Son for me that I might be His child as well!



Is The Church In Decline?

Studies in church growth confirm it...the church is in decline. The early church began with three thousand (Acts 2:41), grew to five thousand (Acts 4:44), and then multiplied (Acts 6:1). In the 1950's it is reported that the church was the fastest growing religious group in the United States. But today?...it seems that most churches are in decline and that only a few are really growing. Why? No doubt there are many factors--deterioration of a neighborhood is a real problem; an economy that forces young people to move on to other communities is another problem; a failure to dream and to envision the possible is still another. However, I want to observe that some churches decline because they lose their message, their direction, their purpose. Check it out. If a church loses its message it has nothing with which to hold people and no amount of gimmicks will ever take the place of message. I'm not advocating here a hardline, legalistic, judgmental, heartless formalism. I am advocating the mind of Christ and a healthy respect for the authority, the power, and the distinctive message of the Word of God. I think it's time to re-examine our message...and our attitudes as we prepare for the last decade of the 20th century. Why is the church growing where you are ...or in decline?





Servants




"And let all the people say amen." Psalm 106:48

Amen

In white, middle class, city churches one seldom hears anyone say, "Amen." Oh, a few occasionally say the word at the close of a public prayer. Sometimes it is heard at the conclusion of a song and once in a great while it is heard during a sermon. However, if someone says amen during a sermon, it sometimes is muffled and startles the preacher so one is reluctant to say it again. I'm reminded of the old story of the visitor who, at the conclusion of prayer, said a hearty amen. People turned and looked at him. Then as a song was ending he said, "Hallelujah!" People looked and frowned. During the sermon he was heard to say, "Praise the Lord!" It was too much, so an usher came to him asking, "What are you doing?" The visitor answered, "Worshipping the Lord." The usher said, "Well, we don't allow that in here." Is it ever appropriate to say amen? Our black brethren would say yes. We might say no. Why do we answer as we do? Are we too sophisticated? Are we void of feelings? Is it unscriptural? Few would say it is unscriptural to say amen (see I Corinthians 14:16). Maybe we are just too uninvolved or too insensitive to say it. However, once in a while someone becomes so bold as to say amen, even during a sermon. What do we mean by our amen? Do we mean what is being said is something that is right in light of Scripture or simply, "I agree with that." If we only mean we agree, there is little meaning to an amen because we may only be affirming our prejudices. The question should not be, "Do I agree?", but "Is it right?" I would encourage amens but let our amens affirm God's truth rather than personal biases.

Flash

Many generous people have committed over \$200,000 to our much needed expansion program, and we are grateful. However, it should be noticed that nearly every week finds us failing to meet our weekly budget. For the first twenty-one weeks of 1989 we have missed our budget by an average of \$1,300 per week or a total of \$28,770 for the year! Let's take care of those weekly obligations.


Kilgore Meeting







2 Corinthians 9:7

WHEN GOD'S PEOPLE SEE A NEED

When famine in Judea was predicted (Acts 22:27-30), Christians throughout the Roman world prepared to respond to the need arising from famine. As a matter of act, Paul's instructions about the giving of material possessions in the New Testament spring from this need. The most lengthy portion of Scripture from Paul on giving is found in 2 Corinthians 8-9 and is the inspired answer to fulfilling a human need. This was a need that could be filled by contributing money and shows how God's people should respond to other needs which can be met by monetary contributions. The Corinthians had promised a year before that they would help and Paul encourages them to carry out their commitment. Paul's encouragement came from what others had done, i.e., the Macedonians who had given liberally although they were poor (8:1-5), his own confidence in them (9:2), their former zeal (9:2), and a visit from brethren to stir them up (9:3-5). Also, there was a reminder of what God would do for them when they sacrificed for others (9:8-11). But the greatest motivation for giving was the proof of "the sincerity of your love" (9:8), i.e,, more than mere words. How does love give? Paul says, "bountifully" (9:6), i.e., extravagantly; "cheerfully" (9:7), i.e., hilariously; personally (9:7; I Corinthians 16:1-2); with purpose (9:7); and obediently (9:13). As a church, we have a need -a need to provide space for the additional people God is about to give us. To meet this need we are entering a building program and this Sunday the West Erwin family will have an opportunity to completely underwrite this program with a gift of over \$200,000. Do what you can; give much or little; by cash or pledge; but do what you can. The body functions properly when "each member is doing his part" (Ephesians 4:16). Come this Sunday with prayerful preparation.







Preaching In An Age Of Entertainment

Doug Parsons, who preaches for the Golf Course Road chin Midland, is scheduled to preach at West Erwin in our October meeting. He is a great preacher and a superb writer. I commend the following article from him.

Have you ever noticed how many television commercials say nothing about the products they advertise? The typical jeans commercial shows a painful drama about the woes of adolescence but never mentions jeans. A perfume ad is a collage of sensuous images with no reference to the product. Beer commercials contain some of the funniest material on television but say very little about beer.

Amusing Ourselves to Death is the name of a perceptive but disquieting book by Neil Postman, a professor at New York University. The book argues powerfully that television has crippled our ability to think and reduced our aptitude for real communication. Postman says television has not made us the best informed and most literate generation

in history. Instead, it has flooded our minds with irrelevant and meaningless information.

By far the book's most trenchant message is in a chapter on modern religion. Postman, not a Christian in the strictest sense of the word, nevertheless writes with piercing insight about the decline of preaching. He contrasts the ministries of Jonathan Edwards, George Whitefield, and Charles Finney with the preaching of today. Those men relied on depth of content, profundity, logic, and knowledge of Scripture. Preaching today is superficial by comparison, with the emphasis on style and emotion. "Good" preaching by the modern definition must above all be brief and amusing. It is entertainment-not exhortation, reproof, rebuke, or instruction (cf.2 Timothy 3:16; 4:2).

Most churches typically feature a half-hour sermon with lots of amusing anecdotes but little doctrine. In fact, many preachers think of doctrine as undesirable and impractical. A major religious magazine recently published an article by a well-known preacher. He mused for a whole page about the futility of both preaching and listening to sermons that go beyond mere entertainment. His conclusion? People don't remember what you say anyway, so most preaching is a waste of time. His last statement was cutting but true: "People, I've discovered will forgive even poor theology as long as they get out by the hour."

There is an obvious parallel between that kind of preaching and those trendy jeans-perfume-beer commercials. Like the commercials, it aims to set a mood, to evoke an emotional response - to entertain - but not necessarily to communicate anything of substance. Such preaching is sheer accommodation to

a society bred by television. It is not the kind of preaching that Scripture mandates. We are to "preach the word" (2 Tim.4:2). "speak the things which are fitting for sound doctrine" (Titus 2:1), and "teach and preach..the doctrine conforming to godliness" (I Timothy 6:2-3).

If the dilemma of modern preaching is to be changed, Christians must insist on biblical preaching and be supportive of men who are committed to it. How does a preacher of integrity reach people who may be unwilling or even unable to listen to carefully-reasoned expositions of God's truth? That may be the greatest challenge for today's Christian leaders. We cannot yield to the pressure to be superficial. We must find ways to make the truth of God known to a generation that not only doesn't want to hear, but may not even know how to listen.


We Are Expanding Our Facilities!

Wasn't Tast Sunday a marveTous day! We had the largest number of people present for we ship that we have ever had without a secial drive. We really had wall to wall people and it was great. The announcement of the baptism of Melissa Patten brought added joy to the day.

The West Erwin church now has 627 members with about 120 children who are too young to be members. Our absentee list shows that we average 140 of our members and about 60 children at other places each Sunday (shut-ins, out-of-town, sick, etc.). We have averaged 546 in worship since September 1. 1988, and have exceeded 600 two times. Note these facts:

1. Of 627 members and 120 children (a potential of 747) we have 200 absent each week for various causes. This absentee number which remains fairly constant each week. leaves us with a potential of 547 present on Sunday mornings.

- 2. Last summer, when most churches feared a slump, we surged to an average of 555 each Sunday morning and exceeded 600 four times during three months.
- 3. Last fall, when we normally would expect a surge, we had no surge and exceeded 600 only two times in six months.
- 4. Our potential attendance (see no. 1 above), compared with our current average attendance, does not leave room for very many visitors.
- 5. These figures show that the number of visitors in our assemblies is down, and we believe this is true, in part, because of our crowded conditions. When visitors to a congregation have a choice, they will not attend where families cannot sit together, where they have to search for seating, where crowded conditions must be endured-members might, but visitors won't (verification supplied upon request to the doubtful!).
- 6. So, we are building! Enlarging our facilities! Making room for continued growth! We are providing space for all whom God will give us as we keep on being the light shining from the Heart of Tyler. Let's support it, pray for it, and use it to the glory of God! The plans are being drawn by the architect and the congregation will be fully informed about the details soon!



It's great to have our teens back safely from Colorado. Reports of the trip seem to be very good. With the exception of several bus breakdowns, all had a great time with no serious injuries. The time spent with Jeff Walling and in the devotionals with each other was also great. A great big "thank you" to Stan Clark for going as our sponsor. We are already looking forward to next year.



Elders Announce Bold New Plan

O' Sunday, March 19, Jamon Kirby, speaking for the elders, announced at our morning assembly a bold new plan for providing 156 additional seats in our crowded auditorium. Kirby, who stated that various plans had been studied, including a possible balcony and opening up the chapel which joins the auditorium, said that the most feasible plan seems to be adding twenty-one feet to the front of our present auditorium, which would provide fourteen additional pews. The front of the auditorium would remain basically as it is, just moved back twentyone feet. The project, which will be completed in about six months at a cost of about \$200,000, will provide needed relief from our crowded conditions and give opportunity for additional growth. The capacity of the auditorium will be increased from 550 to over 700. A building committee. appointed by our elders two years ago and

consisting of Matt Haws, Leon Welborn, and Stan Mallory, has presented several plans for expansion, but this plan seems to be the most feasible. Work on the addition will begin almost immediately. Fifty-two thousand dollars are already in a building fund, and our elders have designated May 7 as a day for a special contribution which, hopefully will pay for the entire project. The West Erwin church has enjoyed steady growth over the past five years, but the growth has slowed since last Summer due in part to our limited space. It is hoped that over the next thirty days each West Erwin family will prayerfully consider what it can give toward our building program on May 7, and that through the giving of cash and pledges for the year we can exceed the goal of \$200,000. The entire project is our commitment to keep shining as the light from the heart of Tyler.

Some of our young people and Stan Clark will be on their way home from Colorado when you get this bulletin. They got fresh snow on Tuesday, so the skiing should be great. Augsburg News For February, 1989

Throughout the years I was always so proud of myself to be able to say that I have never missed going to my office because of illness. ...But last week the flu got me - and it got me well! For three days I had to go to bed because of fever and pain of every little bone of my body. I am thankful to God for the experience of being ill, but I am even more thankful for having overcome the illness so fast.

In my last letter to you I mentioned Monika Reitschuster, one of our young sisters in the church, who was expecting a baby. While I was writing the letter, the baby was born. It is a girl and her name is Lena. This is the second baby which was born into our congregation within the last several weeks, and we are expecting another one to be born in March. This is a special blessing to us, because we are lacking children in our church - as Germany is lacking children altogether.

During February we had a number of visitors to stay in our home. Among them were also Andreas, Heike and Julia of Heidelberg, as well as Thomas from Graz. was so good to have the children and the grandbaby to

stay with us again for a weekend.

Since last November we did not have any snow at all here in Germany. In other words, nature skipped the winter season altogether. This is unusual for our country, and the meteorologists cannot remember when something like this has happened the last time. For most people - including myself - this is a positive situation because too much snow in town is a burden and a danger. But on the other hand the lack of snow and cold weather causes a lot of illnesses among the population. And this, we have experienced even among our church members. Never before was I called to make as many visits to sick members as in the past months.

During February we were supposed to have our first Gospel Meeting for this year. Ludwig Klinke from Wiesbaden was to be the speaker. Two weeks before the meeting was to start, he called and informed me that he could not come at that time and that we would have to postpone the meeting until March. We are now preparing for the meeting and looking forward to great success. Please pray with us.

Last weekend I was in Karlsruhe to preach for the church there. This congregation of about 30 members does not have a full-time preacher and invited me several months ago to come and preach for them, which I gladly did. It was an encouraging visit.

"For God has not given us the spirit of fear." -- 2 Timothy 1:7

Fear - Faith - Foolishness

Near the time of the late <u>Ira North's</u> death he was asked about the greatest need in the church today. His reply: "Balance." Maybe he was right. It seems that we have always had a problem with lance--avoiding extremes.

When Martin Luther recoiled from the meritorious works system of Roman Catholicism, he jumped right by the Biblical truth of "faith that works by love" (Galatians 5:6) to the doctrine of justification by faith only. Balance is so difficult, not only in doctrine, but in practice as well. A recent article in the Christian Chronicle told of churches which had spent millions on building complexes and which now are in trouble because of the downturn in our economy. Some would call it faith, others foolishness. On the other side of the issue is neither faith or foolishness, but fear. Because of fear there are those who will not be foolish (that's good), but who will neither manifest faith (that's bad). God is not under obligation to bless our

foolishness. God will not bless our fear. The one talent man of Jesus' story said, "I was afraid," and was called a "wicked and slothful servant" (Matthew 25:25-26). Faith will either defeat fear or fear will defeat faith. Both fear and foolishness can be overcome by biblical faith. Our faith must be visionary, courageous, and even daring as we plan beyond what we can see and beyond what we can do. On the other hand, faith is not jumping off a tall building believing God will save or driving 100 m.p.h. on a crooked road believing God will protect or getting head over heels in debt believing God will pay it--that's foolishness.

What we need is balance—a faith that will give room for God to bless (which will overcome fear) and a faith that will not tempt or mock God (which will overcome foolishness).



"Then Moses summoned Bezalel and Oholiab and every skilled person to whom the Lord had given ability and who was willing to come and do the work."

Exodus 36:2

Where There's A Will There's A Way

Then God instructed Moses to erect the labernacle, a tent of meeting where He would meet Israel, a wonderful thing happened. The Tabernacle was an elaborate tent with furniture overlaid with gold and was to be built by the freewill offerings of the people. In Exodus 36, the Bible says the Lord gave ability to the people who were to do the work. God never calls men to do a work for which He does not equip them. That's the reason that what God wants accomplished can be done -- He gives men the ability to do it. However, there is something which must accompany ability, and that something is willingness on behalf of men. Notice the text with emphasis being mine: "to whom the Lord had given ability and who was willing to...do the work." Now there is the key

to the success of God's people -- God gives skills and we give willingness to use the skills. In Moses' day, not only were the workers skilled and willing. but the people were willing to give what God had given them, according to their ability, to accomplish the work. Exodus 36 says, "And the people continued to bring freewill offerings morning after morning. ... And so the people were restrained from bringing more, because what they already had was more than enough to do all the work." (Exodus 36:3, 67). The problem we face in our work is not the ability or the means to accomplish the work but the willingness of the people of God to be so committed to Him that we dedicate our hearts and hands to His work.

"Who Is My Neighbor?"

Jesus answered: "A certain man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, when robbers attacked him, stripped him and beat him up, leaving him half dead. In the same way a Levite also came there, went over and looked at the man, and then walked on by, on the other side. But certain Samaritan who was travelang that way came upon him, and when he saw the man his heart was filled with pity. He went over to him, poured oil and wine on his wounds and bandaged them; then he put the man on his own animal and took him to an inn, where he took care of him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper, 'Take care of him,' he told the innkeeper, 'and when I come back this way I will pay you back whatever you spend on him.' "And Jesus concluded, "Which one of these seems to you to have been a neighbor to the man attacked by the robbers?" The teacher of the Law answered, "The one who was kind to him." Jesus replied, "You go, then, and do the same."





-Exodus 34:24

God Is Dead?

you remember when, a few years back, a college ofessor up East startled us with the brazen affirmation: "God is dead!" We were aghast. We were angry. We were insulted. The very idea! We knew that God wasn't dead. While we were shocked and maybe a little threatened, few really understood what the pofessor meant when he said, "God is dead." Friedrich Nietzsche (1844-1900), the German philosopher might have been the first to say, "God is dead." What does it mean? Nietzsche was not saying the true God has ceased to exist, but that man had ceased to be conscious of God and that as far as man's consciousness is concerned, God is dead. If man is unconscious of God, somebody must take His place, and that somebody is man himself. Where does this inflated idea of man come from? Nineteenth century man thought of himself as superior man. Humanism. namely, "glory to man in the highest," which became popular after Darwin's theory of evolution provided an erroneous view of origins, became the norm of the intellectuals. According to this view, man had developed into the biggest and best thing in the universe. However, simply because

man is not conscious of God does not mean God does not exist, or that "God is dead." But consider this: what basically is the difference between the "God is dead" advocates and the "believer" who, in a practical way, is unconscious of god in his daily life or in his plans or who relegates God to the long ago and far away? What is the basic difference between the unbeliever and the Christian who doesn't believe God really does anything in today's world? Does God rule in the kingdoms of men (Daniel 4:32), or not? Can God cause anything to work together for good in the lives of His children (Romans 8:28), or not? Does prayer really accomplish something (James 5:16), or not? God told ancient Israel that when they left their homes three times in the year to appear before Him, "no one will covet your land," that is, God would work in the lives of even evil people to prevent their taking advantage of the absence of God's people from their homes (Exodus 34:24). If we believe God doesn't do anything, can't do anything, today, then perhaps we have consigned God to death.

Voices In The Wilderness

Telemachus, so the story goes, was a fifth century A.D. desert hermit who came the Colosseum in Rome where 50,000 ople were watching gladiators fight animals and each other to the death. It is said that Telemachus climbed over the rail and entered the arena -- spectators never entered the arena! As he stood in the arena, the crowd grew silent and Telemachus shouted, "In the name of Jesus Christ, forebare!" One of the gladiators struck Telemachus with the flat side of his sword, knocking him to the ground. Slowly Telemachus arose and shouted, "In the name of Jesus Christ, forebare!" Someone in the crowd shouted, "Kill him!" One of the gladiators thrust him through. The people in the stands began to leave -- at first just a few at a time, but then in droves they left. It is said that

the death of Telemachus was the end of the gladiator slaughters in the Roman Colosseum. Why? Because one man, a desert hermit, laid his life on the line and stood up for what he believed, even when others did not...or would not. Here and There

Friendliness must be emphasized as an attitude most vital to our work as a congregation. It involves being friendly. This is not a mannerism or merely for show; it is an art. Genuine friendliness is learned through intense study and effort. Here are some tips:

- 1. Train yourself to notice those in the assembly whom you do not recognize. You can do this without craning your neck or acting peculiarly. Simply pay attention to people.
- 2. Watch for an opportunity to smile at visitors, stopping by briefly to introduce yourself, or simply thanking them for being present.
- 3. Avoid entangling yourself in isolated discussions with those of this congregation. We don't suggest you avoid your brethren--just avoid being cut off from speaking with others. (Hopefully you'll have other opportunities to enjoy the local brethren).
- 4. Put your whole heart into making the worship meaningful. Sing with vigor and spirit. Keep an atmosphere of reverence as much as you can during the sermon. Avoid causing distractions, which to you might not seem harmful, but to visiting friends might be unnecessarily rude.
- 5. When you ask visitors their names, really listen. Then repeat the names aloud to be sure you are correct. That is a good way to remember them later. Ask about their home, job, vacation, hopes, or anything in which they are interested. Let them talk to you. It is an established truth that this one feature permits strangers to feel more "at home" with you.

Finally, tell them what a joy it has been to have them visit our services. And mean it! Sincerity here speaks far more eloquently than words.






