SOPHISMS

Sophism is not a Greek word for sophisticated. It's not a word we hear or use much. However, we hear the concept which is suggested by the word over and over again. The dictionary dereasoning." See, we all knew the meaning of sophism all the time and the use of sophism is abundant. We make an argument and defend a position because the argument and position seem reasonable to us. Never mind that neither the argument nor the position have any basis in fact. Recently our president responded to a question to the grand jury: "It depends on what your definition of is is." Seemed perfectly plausible to him but it was clearly a fallacious position. We may do the same thing in the church. "We've never done it that way before," is a perfectly legitimate reason for some to stay with worn out methods, but the argument is fallacious. "I don't agree with what you said," gives us reason enough to reject any point in a sermon, although the point may in fact be true. Here are three sophisms that are often heard in religion:

1."I think that if someone is honest and sincere, what he believes is unimportant." Do you know of any scripture that teaches this? How does one harmonize the above statement with Proverbs 14:12 -- "There is a way that seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death"? What about the honest, sincere Saul of Tarsus? The Bible still says the truth makes one free (John 8:32), and while the nation of Israel had a zeal for God it was

alienated from God because her zeal was not according to knowledge (Romans 10:1-3).

- suggested by the word over and over again. The dictionary defines sophism as "a plausible but fallacious argument or form of reasoning." See, we all knew the meaning of sophism all the time and the use of sophism is abundant. We make an argument and defend a position because the argument and position seem reasonable to us. Never mind that neither the argument nor the position have any basis in fact. Recently our president responded to a question to the grand jury: "It depends on what your definition of is is." Seemed perfectly plausible to him but it was
 - 3. "But the Bible says, 'Whosoever shall call upon the name of the Lord will be saved." Yes it does, but it is a sophism to think calling upon the name of the Lord is simply saying something like, "Lord, save me!" Acts 22:16 tells what calling upon the name of the Lord means for an unsaved person: "And now, why do you tarry? Arise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord." (emphasis mine JPL). Calling upon the name of the Lord includes doing what the Lord asks us to do.

Sophisms may be rather harmless in some areas of life, but in relationship to God just being sincere, or believing, or calling out to God for salvation may lead us to "a plausible but fallacious argument or form of reasoning," and that's a sophism.

THE AMERICAN RESTORATION MOVEMENT

It must have been an impressive meeting, that gathering Campbell, Stone, and Smith blazed trails and led the way. in Georgetown, Kentucky during Christmas week of 1831. It was a meeting of two groups who had been working at par- wrote in 1835: allel purposes, one basically in Ohio and Virginia and the other principally in Kentucky. Their joint purpose was to restore the ancient order of things pertaining to the church. One of the groups had as its outstanding leader Alexander Campbell, a man of keen intellect and his analytical insights have rarely been surpassed. The spokesman for this group, which called itself Reformers, was the illustrous "Racoon" John Smith, a Kentucky preacher who was committed to the restoration of New Testament Christianity. The spokesman for the other group, simply called *Christians*. was the pious and humble Barton W. Stone, who preached for the Cane Ridge church near Lexington, Kentucky. These two groups united their efforts and the Restoration Movement in America expanded, largely as a result of that 1831 meeting, into New York, Pennsylvania, Michigan, Indiana, Wisconsin, Maryland, the Carolinas, Tennessee, Alabama, and beyond. The rest is history. The churches of Christ in America are the heirs of the Restoration Movement of the 19th centrury and we continue the work of restoring New Testament Christianity today. Men like

Here is a quotation from Stone taken from an article he

"The Scriptures will never keep together in union and fellowship members not in the spirit of the Scriptures, which spirit is love, peace, unity, forbearance, and cheerful obedience. This is the spirit of the great Head of the body. I blush for my fellows, who hold up the Bible as the bond of union yet make their opinions of it tests of fellowship; who plead for union of all Christians yet refuse fellowship with such as dissent from their notions. Vain men! Their zeal is not according to knowledge, nor is their spirit that of Christ. Such antisectarian-sectarians are doing more mischief to the cause of and advancement of truth. the unity of all Christians, and the salvation of the world than all the skeptics in the world. In fact, they create skeptics."

The restoration of New Testament Christianity, which calls for the unity of all believers in Christ upon the basis of the teachings of the New Testament, leaves no room for the binding of human opinion upon others.

ENCOUNTER OR PLEASANT EXPERIENCE?

George Barna has probably conducted more religious polls than anyone and has shared his findings in his many books about Americans and their religious beliefs. Recently I came across this quote from Barna: "Those who are responsible for developing the worship experience make assumptions about how adequately prepared people are to worship God. Eventually people cease to expect a real encounter with God and simply settle for a pleasant experience."

THERE'S RISK IN FAITH

C.S. Lewis, whose books on Christian faith have sold more than any other writer, was born 100 years ago, yet interest in his writings continue to soar. He began his career by writing children's stories but may be best known for Mere Christianity, a book dealing with Christian apologetics. Other well-known books include The Screwtape Letters, Surprised By Joy, The Problem of Pain, and A Grief Observed (written at the death of his wife). In the latter book, C.S. Lewis said about faith: "You never know how much you really believe anything until its truth or falsehood becomes a matter of life and death to you. It is easy to say you believe a rope to be strong and sound as long as you are merely using it to cord a box. But suppose you had to hang by that rope over a precipice. Wouldn't you then discover how much you really trusted it? ... Only a real risk tests the reality of a belief."



THE DEATH OF OUTRAGE

William Bennett, well-known on the Washington, D.C. scene has written a best seller entitled The Death of Outrage. An interesting title ... one which appropriately fits our time. In our country there is much about which to be outraged, but where is the outrage? What I am about to say has nothing to do with politics. If the president of a college did with a coed what the president of the United States did with an intern, the president of the college would have been dismissed immediately. If John Doe, average citizen, had been summoned before a Grand Jury and committed perjury, as our president did, he would be in jail. But, politics colors the picture and most of our people, apparently, want to say it doesn't matter. Where is the outrage? When more babies are aborted than fighting men are killed in all our nations' wars, where is the outrage? When legislators pass bills that prohibit the mention of God's name, the reading of Scripture, or the praying of prayers in our public schools and they do this because of the pressures of a few who cry for separation of church and state (a position which is a thousand miles from what the founders of the country meant by church and state separation), where is the outrage? When sexual perversion is presented on TV as an "alternative lifestyle" and we are asked to agree with the point of view that this kind of action is acceptable, where is the outrage? When our children are taught in schools and colleges that the universe originated from nothing and that man is a glorified beast, where is the outrage? When drunkards are permitted to drive automobiles and injure innocent people, where is the outrage? When convicted felons are allowed early release from prison and to walk the streets to commit crimes again, where is the outrage? When elected officials circumvent the law to raise campaign funds and think it is permissible because "everybody does it," where is the outrage? When there is little difference in the lifestyles of those who claim belief in Christ and the church, where is the outrage? When we have only enough religion to make us comfortable but not enough to prompt commitment, where is the outrage? Does anything disturb us, shock us, make us angry anymore? Or have we experienced the death of outrage?

I like John's prayer for Gaius: "Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers" (3 John 2). How did John know Gaius was prospering in his soul? He had heard that Gaius was walking in the truth (verse 3) and equated the two: walking in the truth makes our souls prosper (healthy). When you and I prosper in our souls, the church is healthy. Some time ago we made a study of the age patterns in the West Erwin church and discovered, somewhat to our surprise, that we had about the same number of members in each ten year age group from the 20's through the 80's. Since people are living longer now than formerly, there is a "graying" of the church, and this is good. Not only are those in their 70's and 80's and even 90's the church of yesterday, they are the church of today. This group attends church meetings with faithfulness (though some cannot physically do this any longer). They visit visitors to our services and the sick and shut-ins. They give of their resources to support the work of Christ. We love and need these "senior citizens." The group of folks made up of those in their 40's, 50's, and 60's should be the "mainstays" of the church, and in many ways they are. These are folks who should be teaching our

classes, giving to meet the bulk of our budget, and leading the church. We need this group, too. Then we have the teens, the 20's, and the 30's. These people bring an atmosphere of optimism, excitement, and vision to any church. We need this group. Finally, there are the children ... the precious children -- in the nursery, in classes, in worship training, in Bible Hour, in the assembly, in the halls and fovers, sometimes loud and underfoot, but so necessary to what we are about. A healthy church needs all of these. Without the older members we miss the wisdom and experience which come only with time. Without the younger members and children we miss the excitement of a bright future. When a church is fortunate enough to have both groups, it has an opportunity to be a healthy church. I say has opportunity because balanced age groups do not assure health for a church. No church is healthier than its individual members -- you and me. If your material prosperity equaled your spiritual prosperity, how would it be with you? So, John's prayer for Gaius is my prayer for each of us: "Beloved, I pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers."

Take any one of those items and extrapolate it into sophisticated adult terms and apply it to your family life or your work or your government or your world and it holds true and clear and firm. Think what a better world it would be if we all - the whole world - had cookies and milk about 3 o'clock every afternoon and then lay down with our blankies for a nap. Or if all governments had as a basic policy to always put things back where they found them and to clean up their own mess.

And it is still true, no matter how old you are - when you go out into the world, it is best to hold hands and stick toaether."

AMONG THE CHURCHES

In the course of a year I visit, counting Wednesday evenings in the summer, about fifteen churches. These congregations are usually located in Texas, the Southwest, and the Midwest. Some of these churches have as many as 1000 members while others are in mission areas and may have as few as 50. As I visit these churches I am seeing an emerging pattern. While what I am about to say is far from a scientific study (too few churches and too limited geographically), I want to share some thoughts. First, the churches I visit seem to be spiritually healthy. Most of these churches are happy, friendly, and biblical. The people love the Lord, the Word, and each other. Some are experiencing growing pains and have some tension between old and new methods and procedures, but they want to be the New Testament church. For the most part, these churches have uplifting worship, sing both old and new songs, and appreciate their leaders. They are engaged in missions at home and abroad and are optimisite about the future. Second, in the communities where I go I see an alarming polarization of churches. Ultra-conservative churches, in resisting what

they call liberalism (which is anything they disagree with), isolate themselves more and more and are in decline. Churches that are on the edge of liberalism (those who have forgotten their heritage, their message, and which in giving people what they want have neglected to give them what they need) are not growing. Third, the churches I visit are generally middle of the road and are trying to avoid the ditch on either side of that road. They are the churches that know who they are, have vibrant worship services, Bible preaching, happy faces, and are growing (though all seem to need a greater evangelisite zeal in order to grow as they should). All in all, the churches in areas where I go are in decline if they are legalistic, issue oriented, ultraconservative or if they are so far left of center that they have lost their identity. Although both extremes are vocal and seem to be many. I am convinced that the mainstream of the church is in the balanced. Scriptural middle and generally the church as we approach a new millenium is healthy and making a great impact for Truth. I'm hopeful.

WHAT IS AN INVOLVEMENT MINISTER?

When I started full- time preaching in the 1960's churches with four and five hundred members had one preacher. These churches grew numerically and spiritually and served the communities where they were located very well. But those were the 1960's. I don't know any church of size that is growing which has only one staff person. There may be exceptions to this, but I'm not aware of them. In the 1990's church growth experts tell us that growing churches have one staff person per 150 members. I believe this for two reasons: (1) studies show it to be true; and (2) my personal experience. When churches first began to have Educational and Youth Ministers people asked. "What are they going to do?" Now we hardly see how we could do without them. In the future the same will be true of Involvement Ministers. We've been talking for some time about the need for a person to work in this area. Daniel Morgan did much work in involvement before his move to Memphis and subsequently to Brazil. What would an Involvement Minister do?

So 2(24) + 3 - FEG-T.





CHANGING TIMES

The world has always been changing but never quite like it is changing now. Words that describe our changing times include: computer age (what changes have been made in the last 10 years or 1 year or 1 week?); tolerance (meaning in our society that anything goes and everyone's view is of equal value); relativity (meaning there are no absolutes); pragmatism (if it works it must be right); and post-Christian (the concept that we live beyond the ideals of the Christian religion). Other changes which have occurred in the last guarter of the 20th century include: more mothers have gone into the marketplace and "stay-at-home" moms are now the exception: the now generation makes less than their parents; God has been banished from the national scene; and fewer of us go to church. Changes have also taken place in the churches of Christ. In my lifetime I have seen us move from "across the tracks" to become a vibrant force in our communities. We have built larger and more functional facilities; we have gigantic budgets; we have vans and busses; we are going into all the world; and we have lost our evalgelistic zeal at home. Additionally, we have seen in the church changes in the way we do our work. Can you remember when a church would announce a two week Gospel Meeting, and fill the house every night, and baptize fifteen or twenty? More recently we had such meetings run from Sunday to Wednesday and in many

places they are a thing of the past. Also, we had Vacation Bible Schools which were conducted almost entirely by non-professional people and with great success. Now we do much of our work through a professional staff. In addition to a preacher we also have Education Ministers, Youth Ministers, Involvement Ministers, Golden Age Ministers, Children's Ministers, Visitation Ministers, Personal Evangelism Ministers, and Counselors. Some people are in favor of all these, some are in favor of some of these, and others are not in favor of any of these. But the fact is, the church has changed. In the midst of change there are some things which must never change. Our commitment to the Word of God as the final, complete, and authoritative standard in religion must not change. Our devotion to the restoration of New Testament Christianity must not change. Our call for true discipleship of people who love the Lord, His church, and the lost must not change. Our emphasis upon worship "in spirit and in truth" must not change. And our goal of glorifying God and of growing into the image of Christ must not change. In a changing world some changes we see are good, some are bad, and some are neither good or bad but neutral. In the church we must remember this: Any change that brings me closer to God is good and any change that -- Jay Lockhart takes me away from God is bad.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Across America millions of people attend religious serv- are we to offer worship to God? In every age of Bible hisices on Sunday mornings. We are told that church attendance is down in the 1990's, but the fact remains that most of us still go to church. What does it all mean? Why do people do this? Why go to church? There are many reasons -some are dragged there by spouses or parents quite against their wills; some are there because they think they ought to be; some are there to see or be seen; some are there to be entertained; some are there out of habit; and some are there because they feel a need for God and they have a need to worship God. How do we go about worshipping God? Some give little or no thought to this question: some do what they want or like; and some seek to worship as God has given instruction in the New Testament. What is this instruction? "In spirit and in truth" (John 4:24); with "singing and making meloday" in the heart (Ephesians 5:19); with prayer (Acts 2:42); with teaching (Acts 2:42); and with giving and the Lord's Supper (I Corinthians 16:1-2: Acts 20:7). That these avenues of worship were practiced by the first century church is substantiated in I Corinthians. chapters 10-16 and is underscored in church history. How

tory it is clear that the right things are to be done and in the right way. Worship is never acceptable to God upon the basis of doing the right things only or upon the basis of the right way only, but upon the basis of doing the right things in the right way -- "in spirit and in truth," Worship is designed to praise God and to change the worshipper. Worship is not entertainment, what I can get out of it, or getting through so I can get to the cafeteria -- it's about honoring a holy God and the transformation of the worshipper. The problem in worship is not the order of service, the number of prayers, old songs or new songs, or how long it takes to serve the Supper. The problem is our failure, or even refusal, to be changed because we have been in the presence of the holy God and have offered to Him our worship "in spirit and in truth." We get from worship what God designs for us to get only when we forget self and give to God and others what we should as we worship by doing the right things in the right way --" in spirit and in truth."

WORLD BIBLE SCHOOL

There is a picture on the bulletin board in the fover of about 75 people who make up the church in Gboko, Benue State, Nigeria. This congregation is the direct result of World Bible School, Its preacher, Simion Okwijirku, and many of the members are former students of World Bible School. This method of reaching people has probably reached more people and resulted in the planting of more churches in the past several years than any other single effort of the churches of Christ or perhaps it has done more than all other efforts combined. God knows. World Bible School is something in which nearly anyone can be involved. If you would like to participate, regardless of your age or gender, call the church office and we'll get you started.

EASTERN EUROPEAN MISSION

In a recnt letter from Richard Baggett, our contact person with Eastern European Mission, we learned that the minister of education over all of Russia has reviewed the

curriculum for teaching the Bible which members of the church have developed and he has approved it for all schools in Russia! Hopefully, this will neutralize any oppositions within Russia. What a breakthrough! The challenge will be for the churches of Christ to supply the funds to insure enough Bibles and printed materials to meet the demand. For this reason EEM is asking churches of Christ to give \$1 million dollars on Sunday, August 30, 1998, to underwrite the project. This money will be used to print children's Bibles, adult Bibles, a 300 page textbook, A Newcomer's Guide to the Bible, and 10 character lessons specifically based on the Russian children's Bible. How effective have the efforts been in Russia so far? In Barnaul, the chief city of the Altai Region, there were 12 Russian Public School teachers baptized into Christ as a direct result of the training they received to teach the curriculum to their students! How do you account for the Soviet Union breaking up? The attitude of Scovorodnikov to contact members of the churches of Christ to teach the Bible in the schools of Russia? This opportunity now before us? We -- Jay Lockhart must answer the call!



GOD-LIKENESS

When we become Christians we are the children of God and He is our Father. As God's children we are to take upon ourselves the family likeness -- the characteristics of God-likeness. I suppose we are never more God-like than when we show mercy to others. The Bible says that God is rich in mercy (Ephesians 2:4) and according to His mercy He has saved us (Titus 3:5). Mercy is "active compassion" -- feeling with someone and doing all we can to help the hurting. A closely related word to mercy is kindness, carrying the idea of "active beneficence" and "sweetness of disposition." As Christians, children of God who demonstrate God-likeness, we are to be merciful to others: "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy" (Matthew 5:7); and we are to be kind in our treatment of others: "Be kind to one another" (Ephesians 4:32). Now mercy and kindness are not just words to say or to talk about -- these are attributes to be made a part of the lives of people who want to grow in the quality of God-likeness. Mercy and kindness are practical -- we can put them into practice every day in our intra-personal relationships. Although these qualities may not come naturally to all of us, we can grow in them

and in our growth become more like God our Father. How can we demonstrate mercy and kindness? First, treat every human being, whether rich or poor, young or old, like us or unlike us, with dignity. James says (2:9) that to show respect of persons is sin. Second, in dealing with others, ask yourself how you would want to be treated if your situations were reversed. Remember the "Golden Rule" based upon Matthew 7:12. Third, try to enter into the other person's experience and really feel with him. Fourth, listen to what the other person is saying and listen with your heart as well as with your ears. Fifth, before you speak, ask yourself some questions: How will what I am about to say be perceived by the other person? Is my attitude and my tone of voice in harmony with loving my neighbor as myself? What would Jesus do or say under these circumstances? The issue here is important for those who claim to be children of God. How we respond to others reflects upon who we claim to be. If we are dealing with people on behalf of the church, how we treat them reflects upon the church. The quality is God-likeness. -- Jay Lockhart

MY DAD IS TALL

I have always thought of my dad as being tall. When I was a child he was really tall to me. As I grew up neither I nor my brother were quite as tall as Dad. With the passing of the years, my dad is no longer taller than my brother and me -- physically. But to both of us he will, in all the important ways, be tall. Here are some things I am remembering today about my dad ... who is tall. During World War II when we didn't have a car we walked to church (a mile or so from where we lived) and when it rained my dad carried me (I only remember this from what my mother told me. but I remember the story and it is real). He took us on trips to the mountains, fishing on Buckeye Lake, swimming in the river at Leachtown, and cookouts at the park. He taught me to work when I was a reluctant learner, to pluck chickens, to pick beans from the garden, and to raise to live. I never heard my dad say an ugly word. I have calves. He watched me play football, tossed a baseball with me in the front yard, and was present when I preached my first sermon. He got me my first job ... and the second ... and the third, taught me how to drive, and

bought me my first car. He expected me to paint the house in the summer, deliver my newspaper route on time, and speak respectfully to my mother at all times and under all circumstances. I think he could walk on water. I believe he could do anything he wanted to do, and I know he could scold me quietly and yet put fear in my soul. He hugged me when I was baptized, bragged on me when I was learning to preach, and helped me go to college. He rejoiced in my victories, felt with me in my defeats, and said not a negative word when I wrecked the family car. After I was grown my dad traveled all over the country to be with me, attended gospel meetings with me, and heard me preach the same sermons over and over again. Dad taught me how to live but, more importantly, he also showed me how heard him say many wise words, and I know him to be faithful to Christ. He always put first things first, is always there when I need him, and is my hero. You see, my dad is very tall! Happy Father's Day, Dad. -- Jay Lockhart

FORGETTING THE MOST IMPORTANT

It's a lovely story that Luke tells -- Joseph, Mary, and the prepare her lesson well, have adequate visual aids and boy Jesus traveling to Jerusalem with other pilgrims to observe the most important of Jewish feast days, the Passover (Luke 2:41-52). After the days of Passover observance, Jesus' parents began the journey back home to Nazareth. It would be a long trip with nights spent along the way and they would "camp out." A journey like that would require preparation -- food for themselves and their animals, changes of clothing, and water. No doubt Joseph and Mary made all of these preparations, but they later found that they had forgotten the most important thing of all -- they had left their boy behind! I wonder if we ever do something like that? While we are busy doing things, needful things, necessary things, do we ever forget what is most important? A father may work fourteen or sixteen hours a day and, if you ask him why, he would probably say, "I'm doing this for my wife and children." However, if in providing for his family he never has time to watch his children perform in a play or in a concert or in a ball game, is he forgetting the most important? A Bible school teacher may

handouts, but when the children arrive for class if she fails to minister to the child with fear on its face or the one with uncertainty in its heart or the one who doesn't feel good, has she forgotten the most important? In our worship, if we get side-tracked by the order of the service or who is leading what or "singing that song again." and fail to remember that we are there to worship the Lord who is high and lifted up, who is the Holy One of Israel, who is in our midst, do we not forget what is most important? When after the service is ended we visit with our friends and neglect to welcome the newcomer, the visitor, and the lonely, do we not forget the most important? When we help the poor but we fail to treat them with dignity and respect as persons made in the image of God, do we not forget the most important? When we get so caught up in the decor of our church building that we overlook the fact that we are in the people business and that people are what really matter, are we forgetting the most important?



FOR YOUR TOMORROW

On the tombstone of John Harmon, a British soldier who fell in Burma during World War II, are the words, "When you go home, tell them of us, and say, 'For your tomorrow we gave our today." As I write these words it is Memorial Day and I'm thinking of all those through the years who for our tomorrow gave their today. Since the birth of our country 222 years ago more than 1,184,000 Americans have died in the defense of freedom. Each one who died was saying, "For your tomorrow we gave our today." According to tradition Memorial Day began during the Civil War when some Southern women chose May 30 to decorate soldiers' graves of both the Union and Conferderate armies. Major General John A. Logan in 1868 named May 30 as a special day for honoring the graves of Union soldiers. The last Monday of May is now designated as Memorial Day and is a legal holiday in most states. As we observe Memorial Day we remember our fallen military men who gave their todays for our tomorrows. But today I'm also thinking of others who sacrificed their todays for our tomorrows. Our parents did this as they did without in order that we might have. They made untold sacrifices for us in our growing up years, giving their todays for our tomorrows. And then

there was that special teacher we had in school, the teacher who had prepared and planned and then we came along was ready to bring out the best in us -- for our tomorrow giving their today. The same is true in the church. Think of all those, in recent times as well as modern times. who have made tremendous sacrifices to bring the gospel to us. These, too, were saying, "For your tomorrows we gave our todays." All of this leads us to remember the greatest sacrifice of all -- God's gift at Calvary when in the death of His Son He opened the gates of heaven for us as Christ bore our sins in His body upon the cross. Christ gave His today for our tomorrows and eternity and we remember. We remember when we obey the gospel, when we live the new-found life in Christ, and when we come around the Lord's table each Sunday. Isn't it amazing how often we trivialize the greatest gift known to man by forgetting -- forgetting the devotion we experienced when we first became Christians, forgetting to live the Christian life before a watching world, and forgetting to assemble around the table? Think! Remember! "For your tomorrow, I gave my today."

Dull and dry worship neither honors God nor does it uplift His children. There are some things YOU can do to ensure that YOUR worship is neither dull nor dry. Three suggestions for you:

- 1. Prepare before you go.
- 2. Participate while you are there.
- 3. Practice when you leave.

Prepare, Participate, Practice -- pretty simple. How much **preparation** goes into your worship? Do you run like crazy all week long, stay up late the night before, wake up on Sunday just in time to take a quick shower, throw on some clothes and hurry out the door? Where is the preparation in that?

What about the second P? When you arrive to worship God, do you actively **participate** or due to your lack of preparation do you sit there comatose? Prayers, Songs, Communion, Giving, Scripture Reading, Bible Study are all areas in which you can participate without ever leaving your precious pew.

That brings us to where the rubber really meets the road, the third P. Do you really put into **practice** what you have been challenged with from God's Word? The personal application of our studies is critical for spiritual growth to take place.

Are you coming to worship God this coming Lord's Day? **Prepare** before you go. **Participate** while you are there. **Practice** when you leave. If you do that, God will be honored and you will be uplifted!

THE UNITY FOR WHICH CHRIST PRAYED

Every student of Scripture knows that when Jesus came to the end of his earthly ministry and was in the shadow of his cross he prayed for his followers: "that they all may be one, ... that they also may be one in us, that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:21). It's little wonder that so many people have been interested in the unity of believers. A few years ago there was the Ecumenical Movement among some of the mainstream denominations which at best resulted in talk and at worst watered down further the muted messages of denominationalism. However, people continue to talk about unity and the more people talk about it the less it seems to happen. Some say, "Let's be united on belief in Christ and forget about the other teachings that divide us." This won't work because it leaves folks standing for almost nothing and falling for almost anything. Others say, "Let's be united in what I say is truth." That won't work either because what one may say is no more important or less important than what others may say. Still others say, "Let's be united upon the Word of God alone." That would be a working plan if we would but work the plan, but it's difficult to do. It's difficult because our opinions keep creeping in and we demand that people honor our opinions as if these opinions were from God. Since we demand that others honor our opinions, we divide and divide, draw our

circles ever tighter, and unity becomes a shallow sounding word. What does respecting the authority of Scripture mean? It means that when the Scriptures speak plainly on any subject we honor the Scripture. It means we also honor the silence of Scripture -- we cannot legislate what God has not. It means we respect the autonomy (self-rule) of the local church under its elders who are answerable to Christ. Preachers cannot be watchdogs for the brotherhood and respect the principle of autonomy. Respect for the authority of Scripture means that in matters of opinion (things about which the Bible is silent) we must exercise liberty. To be specific, I have no right to judge another congregation's soundness based on what song book it uses, what kind of building it builds, whether it sings hymns written a hundred years ago or yesterday, or whether I agree with the methods used to fulfill its mission of saving souls by preaching the gospel, doing works of benevolence, or edifying itself in love, since the Bible is silent on all of these things. When we press issues which in the Bible are non-issues to the point of breaking fellowship with brethren, we may preach unity but we are practicing division. Since division is clearly a sin (Prov. 6:19: I Cor. 1:10: Rom. 16:17-18) we would do well to heed Paul's words: "endeavoring to keep the unity of the spirit in the bond of peace" (Eph. 4:3).

HAVE YOU EVER BEEN LONELY?

There used to be an old song that asked, "Have you ever been efforts. On the other hand, we need the help of visitors who lonely? Have you ever been blue?" Have you ever been lonely? Of course you have ... we all have been lonely. Have you ever been lonely ... in a crowd? This kind of loneliness occurs when a college student leaves home for the first time or when a husband and father is on a business trip or when an aged mother sits in the dining room of a nursing home -- loneliness in the midst of crowds. This kind of loneliness can also take place in the assemblies of the church. We come together because of common needs, interests, and responsibilities, but in the midst of an assembled church we may feel rather alone. Why is this? Why do some people visit us and go away saying, "That's the friendliest place I've ever been!", while others leave and say, "There's no warmth there."? I'm not sure I know the answer to that. Yet, I'm going to risk dealing with it. We try to be a warm, friendly, caring church. That's why we have assigned people as greeters at every door, why many of us "mingle" before and after worship times, and why we have a greeting time at the beginning of our assemblies. That's why we have follow-up letters and visitation and phone calls and invitations to dinner -- we want to be friendly and create an atmosphere of warmth and acceptance. However, we sometimes fail even when we make our best

come our way and of members who may feel neglected. Every so often we see visitors, as soon as we dismiss, head for the door with their heads down. Sometimes we literally run after them so we can speak to them before they get away. This person may reach the conclusion that we're not very caring. Members who seldom attend worship or who are present only once a week or who leave immediately after worship (or just before worship is concluded) may feel as though they do not really belong or that no one really cares about them. As an alternative I would like to suggest this: if you feel lonely in a crowd or if you feel that you don't fit in or that no one cares, attend our worship services -- all of them. Then stay around afterwards and give us the opportunity to greet you personally. If you are a member here, become involved with others -- call or visit or write a few lines to someone who needs encouragement; have some folks into your home for a period of fellowship; find a need in the church and fill it. In the final analysis, Solomon's words should be remembered: "A man who has friends must himself be friendly" (Proverbs 18:24). One more word: All of us need to do a better job in making others feel loved, wanted, and accepted. Think about it!

ARE YOU SAYING WHAT YOU MEAN TO SAY?

We have all heard these statements: "Talk is cheap": "Actions speak louder than words"; and "What you do speaks so loudly I can't hear a word that you say." It's easy to say things we don't mean. Things like: "I'm so glad you got the promotion instead of me"; or "I'll pray for you every day": or "I love your hat...the one with the spangles on it." Words are important -- they are vehicles of communication. But for words to be meaningful, they must be accompanied by complementary actions. Our actions sometime speak for us in place of words. We may say we are faithful members of the congregation; we may thank God in prayer for the privilege of attending worship; we may sing about how much we love Jesus; but the question is: do our actions agree with what we say? Or, to put in another way, are we saving by our actions what we really want to say? I'm assuming here that we really do love Jesus; that we really do love the church; and that we really do want to do the right thing. Let me be more specific by asking a series of questions. When we are out of town on a weekend and we get back on Sunday evening at 6:30 or 7:00, just in time to miss worship, are we saying what we really mean to say? When we have company and we just can't make it to

church, are we saying what we really mean to say? When we are at work on time every day of the week at 7:00 or 8:00 a.m. but are consistently late for Bible class on Sunday at 9 o'clock, are we saying what we really mean to say? When we see that our children attend school regularly and have their homework done on time, but place little emphasis upon Bible school and lesson preparation for church, are we really saying what we mean to say? When our service to God has a secondary place in our lives, are we saying what we really mean to say? Let's think about it and do better as we say what we mean and mean what we say...in word and in deed. See you Sunday!

THE LIFE OF A MISSIONARY

It's not an easy task -- being missionaries... especially in the Third World countries. One may object, "Oh, but they get to travel around the world!" Another may say, "They only occasionally have to deal with elders...or deacons!" Still another may claim, "They have little supervision!" And on and on it goes. My response to one who speaks of world travel is, "Why don't you become a missionary and travel around the world?" Concerning elders and deacons I would reply, "Some of my best experiences are with elders and even some deacons!" And supervision: "If one in church work can't do his work without supervision. I wouldn't recommend him for the mission field...or for any place else." I'm sticking by my guns: being missionaries is tough work...vet essential and rewarding. One of the things that makes their work difficult is the "little privations." I remember spending twenty days in England a few years ago. Do you know what I missed most? Ice, I missed having a glass full of ice over which to pour water or a soft drink. After preaching one night, we drove 80 miles to an American missionary's house to watch his refrigerator make ice and

to have a glass filled with ice to drink from. The Hollands in Togo experience these privations -- not only family and friends, favorite cereals and foods, central heat and air, but right now electricity! Each day, because of the lack of rain and lower electricity output, they have electricity sic hours on and twelve hours off. With the heat around 100 degrees and the humidity at 80-90%, they are suffering. This shortage of electricity not only affects the temperature inside their house but it also affects cooking, laundry, keeping food fresh, and working with computers to prepare lessons. The Hollands are not complaining -- they are not that kind of people. They are going through some difficult times and they need our prayers -- prayers for a break in the high temperatures, prayers for rain, prayers for a solution to the electrical shortages (some options like generators are being considered), but mostly prayers for their health, their perseverance, continued success in their work. Did you hear someone say, "Oh, for the life of a missionary: World travel."





"SERVE GOD ACCEPTABLY WITH REVERENCE AND AWE" - HEBREWS 12:28

One of the most interesting things about people is their attitudes...our attitudes reveal so much about us. I'm thinking just now about our attitudes concerning worship. Most of us attend worship every Sunday...and we have for vears. Because this is true, worship may become ordinary or commonplace with us. That's why we must give careful thought to our worship is we are to be faithful and effective. We must approach the worship of God with a sense of "reverence and awe." There is a lot of lightness about worship which is seen in absenteeism, "hall monitoring," lateness, talking, leaving early, catching a few winks, getting it over with, etc. -- no sense of reverence and awe. Harold Kushman, in Who Needs God, makes this observation: "The next time you go to the zoo, notice where the lines are longest and people take the most time in front of the cage. We tend to walk briskly past the deer and the antelope, with only a passing glance at their graceful beauty. If we have children, we may pause to enjoy the antics of the seals and monkeys. But we find ourselves irresistibly drawn to the lions, the tigers, the elephants, the gorillas. Why? I suspect that without realizing or understanding it. we are strangely reassured at seeing creatures bigger or

stronger than ourselves. It gives us the message, at once humbling and comforting, that we are not the ultimate power. Our souls are so starved for that sense of awe, that encounter with grandeur which helps to remind us of our real place in the universe, that if we can't get it in church, we will search for it and find it someplace else." Now, my question is, why can't we or why don't we find this sense of awe in worship? Isn't it because of the attitudes we have as we approach worship? Worship becomes ordinary and commonplace! We must recapture the true meaning of worship and we must see who God is. Then, and only then, certain things will happen. First, we will see God, as did Isaiah, "high and lifted up...holy." Second, we will see ourselves as in need of this holy God. Third, we will be so filled with gratitude for what He has done for us, is doing, and will do that we will humbly seek to worship Him "in spirit and in truth." Fourth, we will come to the house of worship with expectancy and we will linger to speak of His worth. Fifth, we will see worship as one of our greatest privileges. And, sixth, we will "serve God acceptably with reverence and awe."



PARACHUTE RIGGERS

I recently read a story about Charles Plumb, who was a jet fighter pilot in Vietnam. After Plumb had flown about 75 combat missions, his plane was shot down by a surface-toair missile. Plumb ejected and parachuted into enemy hands where he was captured and then spent six years as a prisoner of war. He survived his ordeal and today lectures on lessons learned from that experience. One day as Plumb sat in a restaurant, a man came up to him and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down!" Plumb asked, "How did you know that?" The man replied. "I packed your parachute." As Plumb sat in surprise and gratitude, the man pumped his hand and said, "I guess it worked!" Plumb said, "It sure did ... in fact if your chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today." That night Plumb couldn't sleep for thinking about that man. He kept wondering how many times he might have passed him on the Kitty Hawk without really seeing him or speaking to him because, you see, he was a fighter pilot and the packer was just a lowly sailor. Plumb thought of the many hours the sailor had spent quietly folding and packing the parachutes, holding in his hands each time the fate of someone

he didn't even know. When Plumb now speaks, he asks his audience, "Who's packing your parachute? We all have people in our lives who provide what we need to get through the day." It's a good question, isn't it? "Who's packing your parachute?" Now stop for a minute and consider how many people to whom you are indebted -- people who provide support for our lives, for our work, and for our ministries in the church. I, personally, owe a debt of gratitude to so many who contribute to my work. There were my college teachers who helped prepare me for ministry. There are churches which contributed to my development -- people who gave much more to me than I ever gave to them. There are the opportunities people in the church have given me to preach and teach. In the present there are those behind the scenes, folks who see that everything at the church building is ready on time for our services, others who lead the services, and still others who attend and participate and encourage. Many of these are the unnamed, but vital, parachute riggers -- people who save our lives, or at least contribute to life being better. To them I say, "Thank you."

WHAT DO I OWE YOU?

salesperson, "What do I owe you?" That's an important question to ask in the church, the family of God: "What do I owe you?" Here are some things we owe each other.

- 1. "Receive (accept -- JPL) one another" (Romans 15:7). The Greek word here means "to take one's self, to grant one access to one's heart, to take into friendship." We should go out of our way to truly accept every faithful member of the body. Reach out to some brother or sister today.
- 2. "Submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Ephesians 5:21). Submission here means "to give way. yield, to cease fighting." This admonition means that because we respect Christ, the One who was submissive on our behalf as He went to the cross, we think not so much of our own rights or plans or opinions as we do of others' rights, plans, and opinions.
- 3. "Admonish one another" (Romans 15:14). This word means to "teach, instruct, warn, counsel." This verse shows that to admonish successfully our motives must be pure and our knowledge of God's word must be apparent.
- 4. "Be of the same mind with one another" (Romans 15:5-6). We are to work hard for the unity of God's people based not upon opinion but upon God's Word.

- When purchasing something in a store we might ask the 5. "In honor giving preference to one another" (Romans 12:10). Make others look good by encouraging them, showing appreciation for them, expecting nothing in return from them, and yielding to their wishes.
 - 6. "Be devoted to one another" (Romans 12:10). This means "to love tenderly." A good commentary on this verse is Philippians 2:3-4 -- "Let nothing be done through selfish ambition or conceit, but in lowliness of mind let each esteem others better than himself. Let each of you look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others." John said, "Let us love one another" (I John 4:7).
 - "Serve one another" (Galatians 5:13). Jesus came not to be served, but to serve (Matthew 20:28). The greatest in the kingdom of heaven is the one who, like Jesus, is a servant (Matthew 29:26). Instead of asking, "Who will serve me?", why not begin to ask, "Who can I serve?", and begin today!

If I will pay my debts to you and if you will pay what you owe to others, the body of Christ will function properly and all of us will be faithful and happy people.

AN OPEN LETTER TO FATHERS

Dear Dad.

The day you began to be called Dad was a wonderful day in your life. After the long months of waiting, the day finally arrived and off you went with Mom to the hospital. There was more waiting and then it happened. You might have waited in another place with family and friends with you, or you might have been in the delivery room. Either way, the miracle of birth took place and the doctor said to a beaming you, "You have a son (or daughter)!" Do you remember how you felt? How did you feel when you looked upon that little face for the first time? What thoughts went through your mind as you held your own child for the first time? You were so happy, so humbled, so proud, so blessed. You no doubt knew that this child was a gift from God. David said, "Children are a heritage from the Lord, the fruit of the womb is His reward" (Ps. 127:3). You must have also thought of your new responsibilities -- not only to provide food, clothing, and shelter for the child, but to also train, educate and help the child to develop into a good person. There is no greater responsibility given to a father than this: "And you. fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord" (Eph. 6:4). As the years went by you were involved in the activities of your child. There were school activities, ball games. scouts, sleepovers, family outings, and wants which often

outran needs. Do you remember? You were a good dad. Your child loved you and you spent some real quality times with him. But, what about the spiritual development of your child? Have you emphasized Christ, the church, Bible classes, and worship more than other things? Have you taken to heart the need to be the spiritual leader for your child? Does he see you as God's man, a man who loves Jesus and who insists that his child is in church? Does he see you as an example of what he is to be in God's sight? One of the saddest laments of Scripture is in the words of David when he cried for his son Absalom after the boy's untimely death: "O my son Absalom, my son, my son Absalom, if only I had died in your place! O Absalom my son. my son!" (2 Sam. 18:33). What is not evident in this lament is the fact that David had neglected Absalom -- he had never trained his son, disciplined his son, or provided spiritual leadership for his son. Absalom did not need for David to die for him -- he needed spiritual training and example. It was too late for David, but it may not be for you. Do right by your child. Do what you know you should. Give your child the greatest gift you can ever give him -- a faithful Christian father. Begin today! I hope to see you in church this Sunday--with your child.

Let us remember that God "is able to do exshey, who then preached for the Broadway church in Paducah, Kentucky, about a group of students which visited a lighthouse to study its operations. As they were considering the powerful light which shone from the top of the lighthouse. one student asked the keeper, "What would happen if the light went out?" The keeper, with some passion, said to the student, "The light can't go out!" He continued, "This light can't go out because too many depend on it. There are those on the shore and those on the sea who are guided by it; without it they would be lost and many would perish. If the light went out, even though no one were hurt, people would lose confidence in it and ever afterward they would live in dread that suddenly there would be darkness. Too many people depend on it; it can't go out!"

On Sunday, January 25, we presented our theme for 1998. Based on 2 Timothy 1:6 our theme is: "Stir Up The Fire." This is a year of renewal, rededication, and revival. Fire represents "God within," and that's our enthusiasm (the Greek word is a compound word: EN - " in" and THEOS - "God" or "God within"). Fire represents God's presence in our lives to ture is exceedingly bright. Stir up the fire!

ceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us" (emphasis mine --JPL) (Ephesians 3:20). It is ours to give ourselves into the hands of God in order that the fire within may be stirred up to burn brightly. And as the fire is stirred within us and glows brightly from us we become "the light of the world" (Matthew 5:14). How desperately this world of darkness needs the light! He who said, "I am the light of the world" (John 8:12), also said, "You are the light of the world." Christ is depending on us. The church depends on us. The world depends on us. It is so important that we illuminate, penetrate, and warm (the functions of light) this community. It can happen as we accept the admonition of Paul to Timothy and our theme for the new year: "Stir Up The Fire!" So, remember the price paid for your salvation at Calvary and the excitement you experienced at the time of your conversion; recommit yourself to Christ and His church; and recapture the belief that God will use us this year to His glory. Be involved! Make your time. your talents, and your treasures available to Him and the fu-

SILENCE

It's intriguing to me: "There was silence in heaven for about half an hour" (Revelation 8:1) -- silence in heaven! There may be silence in heaven, but hardly any silence on earth! We want noise. There are many good people who, when they arrive at home in the evening will hardly enter a room without turning on the TV. It's not so much a matter of watching (we have the TV on when we dress, eat dinner, or read the newspaper), it's a matter of noise to break the silence. We don't care much for silence. So when one goes to the seashore he takes his boom box with him in order that he won't have to live in the silence between the rolling of the surf and the crying of the gulls. Yet it's still true: "Silence is golden." It's in silence that we are able to listen-to listen to our hearts, to others ... to God. But we have no time for silence and so we impoverish ourselves by failing to hear self. others, God. We would do well to have some time each day reserved for silence. We need a time for no phones ringing, no TV blaring, no boom boxes shrilling ... a time for silence. In silence we may learn some important things about ourselves as we contemplate our lives -- our priorities, our purpose, our direction. In silence we may learn something about God if we use the silence to meditate upon His Word. Solomon said, there is "a time to keep silent" (Ecclesiastes 3:7). The prophet said, "But the Lord is in His holy temple. Let all

the earth keep silence before Him" (Habakkuk 2:20). We might do well to set aside some times in our worship assemblies for silence. John said, "There was silence in heaven ..." Would we be better people if we said. "Let there be silence


