

THE WHOLE COUNSEL OF GOD

When Paul took his leave of the elders of the church at Ephesus he said, "I am innocent of the blood of all men. for I have not shunned (avoided -- JPL) to declare to you the whole counsel (will, purpose, plan -- JPL) of God" (Acts 20:27). Surely there is no preacher anywhere who does not believe he declares the whole counsel of God. However, it should be apparent that this is a hard job -- to claim to declare the "whole" (not part of or some of, but all) will, plan, and purpose of God. Desiring to proclaim "the whole counsel of God." those of us who preach should keep a careful account of what we preach over an extended period of time to see if we are preaching the same things over and over or if we are in fact reaching toward the goal of proclaiming the whole of God's plan. To be sure, everything God says in His Word is important, but everything is not of equal importance -- Jesus spoke of "weightier matters" (Matthew 23:23) and Paul said the death, burial and resurrection of Christ are things of "first importance" (I Corinthians 15:3). Obviously, some things need to be preached more than others, but most of us would like to think we are preaching the "whole counsel of God." Now think with me for a moment. Suppose someone attends a congregation for several years and begins to analyze what he has heard preached. He finds that he has never heard anything from the pulpit that he believed to be unscriptural. However, as he thinks about people, everybody loses. it, he has not heard anything in detail about how to be

saved, the essential nature of baptism, the New Testament church, why we partake of the Lord's Supper each Sunday, why the music of the church is vocal, or specific sin. Has the "whole counsel of God" been preached? Or, suppose he recalls that he has heard a great deal about obedience and working "out your own salvation with fear and trembling," but nothing about the grace, mercy and love of God or our utter dependence upon the righteousness of Christ in order to be saved. Has the "whole counsel of God" been preached? On the other hand, suppose one of our high school graduates goes off to college and he doesn't know the difference between the church of the New Testament and modern denominationalism or the New Testament description of who a Christian is or why we worship as we do. Have we presented "the whole counsel of God" to him? If the Christian college professor sends that young person home for the holidays with more questions about his faith than Biblical answers to fortify faith, has the college or the professor presented the "whole counsel of God?" In life and in religion we need balance -- balance that keeps us from extremes. But when and if we neglect or refuse to accept Biblical authority for what we believe and practice; when and if we fail to instill in our people the "whole counsel of God" and when and if we no longer know who we are as God's

Myth 2: I can't afford it. Walking is free so walk three miles three times a week in your neighborhood. Myth 3: My critics will think I'm wasting time. Tell them you are taking care of God's temple (and you are). With a regular exercise program you will feel better, sleep better, and get more done. Myth 4: My lifestyle doesn't allow me to eat right. Change your lifestyle! Eat grainy cereal for breakfast. Eat soups and salads for lunch instead of greaseburgers and fries. East reasonable serving sizes for dinner and watch the fat and carbohyhave been generous in the past and we will be generous drates. Go easy on the night time snacks and drink more water. During the holidays many of us will pick up a few pounds, so as the New Year's resolution start a physical fitness program ... and stick with it. You will feel better, look better, and be glad you did! - Jay Lockhart

WHAT WILL BE NEXT?

For a few years now we have been hearing that the churches of Christ need a "new hermeneutic," that is, a new way of interpreting Scripture. The "old hermeneutic." interpreting Scripture basically by command, example, and inference, was to be abandoned in favor of the "new." although nobody seemed to know what the "new" was! Various attempts were made by those who embraced this idea to give it definition, but these attempts seemed to be ambiguous and disappointing. When I first heard of the "new hermeneutic" I thought I might know what it was and time has borne out what I thought: the "new hermeneutic" is a blatant disregard for the authority of Scripture. That's what it is. The advocates of the "new" could not accomplish what they desired by commandment (something clearly stated in Scripture which limits us to what is stated and to whatever action is necessary to accomplish what is stated), example (an action of the early church, behind which there is a background command), and inference (something necessarily implied by the information at hand, though not specifically stated), so they began to move away from biblical authority. Now, consider what has happened. A church in Tennessee has introduced instrumental music into worship and elders in a Texas will be next?

church have stated in print that the New Testament does not prohibit the use of instrumental music. The New Testament says sing and that is a specific kind of music which eliminates other kinds of music. As a boy I knew when my mother sent me to the store for a loaf of bread that meant I was not to get milk even though she did not say I was not to get milk. When Scripture tells us specifically what to do, that eliminates doing something else. Two churches in Texas have now taken the Lord's Supper on Tuesday and Thursday respectfully. A church in Texas announced that women can do anything in that church except be elders or preach. A church in Texas dropped the designation that distinguishes us from other religious groups because it did not want any longer to be identified with the churches of Christ. Others have been saying for awhile that the church of Christ is a denomination among denominations born in the 19th century and that all of us should acknowledge such to be true. I deny that I ever joined a denomination unless the disciples of the first century were members of a denomination because I did what they did and I became what they became. On and on we go and we can only wonder, what - Jay Lockhart



POLARIZING

I do not know anyone who would disagree with this statement: In Jesus Christ all class, economic, social, and racial barriers are eliminated and "there is neither Jew nor Greek. there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female; for you are all one" (Galatians 3:28). That statement is true, isn't it? And we accept it as true in theory if not in practice. It's hard to deal with our differences. In the first century church, James dealt with the problem as it may exist between the haves and the have nots (James 2:1 ff.). It is always easier to divide over our differences than it is to work through them and "keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace." In our times we are witnessing the polarization of the church. The history of the Restoration Movement in America has seen its problems (we have dealt with issues and divided over Bible classes, women's head coverings, one container for the fruit of the vine, war, church cooperation, and orphan homes to mention a few). We have experienced our issues that divide us, but now we are polarizing -- extremism on both ends of the liberal/conservative spectrum is pushing us further and further apart. Those on the far right (ultra-conservative) are so sure they are right and that the church is in apostasy (that is, everyone but them) and those on the far left (ultra-liberal) are so sure they alone can save the church from dying that these two groups are further apart than

ever. There are several problem areas which need to be dealt with, but one is what I call "religious snobbery." The dictionary says that a snob is "a person who feels and acts smugly superior" to others. The snobbery on the far right causes people to seek to bind their traditions and personal opinions upon the whole church and to divide from anyone who does not honor their human views and vocabulary. The snobbery on the far left causes people to exhibit a superior elitist attitude toward those who do not embrace their loose interpretation of Scripture and their practices that now include taking the Lord's Supper on days other than the Lord's Day, instrumental music in worship, and dropping what the church is called in order to disassociate themselves from mainstream churches of Christ. Both of these extremes seem to me to be void of the spirit of Christ which includes humility, servanthood, and obedience to God (Philippians 2:5-8). Both attitudes move people away from the spirit and the letter of New Testament Christianity and the church that Jesus died to establish. Rather then further polarizing, let us accept the authority of Scripture: let us seek to be the church of the New Testament; and let us endeavor to manifest the mind of Christ. This attitude will overcome polarization and religious snobbery and will give us the opportunity to be what we claim to be ... simply Christians. - Jay Lockhart



WHAT WILL I DO?

When I was a boy growing up in West Virginia I gave lit- church related preaching schools and universities do not tle thought to churches without preachers. There were produce enough preachers to offset this loss each year. several men in the small church where I grew up who preached on Sundays for area churches which did not have full time preachers and, as far as I knew, every church that wanted a preacher for any given Sunday had one. When I went to college to better prepare myself to preach, churches all over West Tennessee, North Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, and West Kentucky had teachers and students from Freed-Hardeman as fill-in preachers or regular weekend preachers when they were needed. As time passed by I kept hearing, with some surprise, that there was a preacher shortage. I just thought, up until then, that any church wanting a preacher could have one. Then I became aware of the fact that there are many small churches in mission areas without preachers. Today there are large churches throughout the United States with vacant pulpits. According to J.J. Turner of the Bear Valley Bible Institute in Denver, we are losing at least one preacher a day in churches of Christ. All the

There definitely is a preacher shortage among us. Does it matter to us? When we need a preacher, we go out and get one. We are so accustomed to having a preacher on Sundays that when our regular preacher is gone we feel we must bring someone in -- we can hardly survive one Sunday without a preacher. Yet, what do we do to help train preachers? Do we ever encourage our sons to preach the gospel? Do we encourage our young men in the church to give their lives to preaching? Do we pray that God will send reapers into the fields already white unto harvest? Do we support financially those who train preachers? Here is a strange phenomena: we feel we need preachers in our congregations but we leave it to others to encourage young men to preach, to train them, and to support those who train preachers. Don't we have some responsibility here? The question is: what will I do about it?



What you do, even if it is small, is so very important. A man retired at age 65 and wanted to do more for the Lord. He felt he was limited in what he could do, but he decided he could invite people to church. So he went about inviting and inviting and inviting. When he died ten years later at age 75, there were 875 people attending church because of him! Don't ever assume that because you are only one person or because you are limited in what you can do that your attendance at worship, your giving, your invitation, your act of kindness, your word of encouragement, your involvement, your prayer does not matter. Little is still much when given into the hands of God. See you Sunday!

that many of us are running in the red zone and we are there are places to be. However, let's stop and see if all experiencing physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual burnout. For our own good, the good of those who mean the most to us. and the good of the kingdom of God, we must slow down long enough to take a long hard look at our hearts. If we have the heart for it, we can prioritize our lives and get the RPM needle off the red zone before we suffer a blowout at worst or fail to do what needs to be done most right can find the heart for it, we can get out of the red zone on now at the best. Let's get focused. Of course, there is the the RPM gage!

How is the RPM gage running in your life? The fact is job. Of course, there are schedules to meet. Of course the demands upon our lives are worth what they are costing us. First, what really matters? Your health (physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual) matters. You can't maintain personal balance and ever be going at 100 m.p.h. in every direction. So try to figure out what is most important right now and say no to the rest. Family matters, but limit your kids' outside activiites. Let the children engage in a limited number of extra activities. They don't have to participate in every possible extracurricilar activity. Jobs matter, but let us remember that income pays the bills while getting priorities straight builds our lives. Church matters, but we often do not have time to participate as we should in worship, service, prayer, and study because of all the other stuff in our lives. Prioritize! Do a heart check! 

LEARN FROM EXPERIENCE

Fiasco, a word that means failure, comes from the Italian word for a common bottle.

It was the practice of ancient glassblowers, when noticing the slightest flaw in the article upon which they were working, to discard it for later conversion into a common bottle.

What might have been a beautiful Venetian vase was now a fiasco. In this manner, failure and fiasco became associated.

If you've ever caused a fiasco in your job or home, you'd probably like to erase the scene from

your memory. But don't -- at least not until you've made an effort to salvage something from it.

Look at it this way: One of the most valuable traits you can possess is good judgment. But where do you learn good judgment? From experience.

And how do you gain experience? By making ment. Then have each child write or share four statements judgments that sometimes don't pan out as you expected they would.

So making a mistake which results in failure on your part is actually a means of improving your skills -- provided you take the time to learn.

Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead. I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward Philippians 3:13-14 in Christ Jesus.

Each challenge we face provides us with an opportunity to overcome with the help of our Heavenly Father. The fiascos in our lives are chances for us to excel by growing and learning from our setbacks. How do you view your present difficulties? Use them as a means to grow closer in your walk with God.

A HAPPY FACE ON THE CROSS?

Mathews-Green, a syndicated columnist and regular commentator on National Public Radio.

Are we headed that way? A "feel good" religion? Enjoy vourself, follow your heart's desires, live comfortably and enter into glory. The columnist points out that there is a hunger "for an all-forgiving God who will commiserate when we do what self-fulfillment requires." And she lavs it on the line by saying that the widespread cultural hunger is the yearning for God who is not a Father in heaven, but a "grandfather in heaven who likes to see the young people enjoying themselves," as C.S. Lewis put it.

Who can deny it? The popular religion of today more often than not focuses on joy, happiness, peace and prosperity rather than the more demanding concepts of obedience, duty, responsibility, accountability, faithful-

Religionists who just want to cuddle and hug might have a hard time adjusting to such things as going to jail. "Will the church of the new millennium put a happy face suffering countless beatings, being whipped or beaten on the cross?" That's the question asked by Frederica with rods or meeting danger wherever they go. What would happen if they were constantly attacked by their own countrymen and false brethren? What if their religion meant toil and hardship, sleepless nights, hunger and thirst, being cold and suffering from exposure? (Read II Corinthians 12:23-28). Yet, that happened to a man who took his eyes off of himself and looked to Christ.

Mathews-Green wrote, "The biggest challenge to the church will come from within. Hearing the multitudes cry for safety, comfort and approval, will we be seduced into supplying only that?" Or, will we have the courage to speak also of repentance, crucifixion of self and discipleship?

It's hard to put a happy face on the cross whether you are talking about Christ's or our own.





THE PRAISE TEAM

We hear a great deal these days about "praise teams." What are these? Usually this title belongs to a group of men and women who have good singing voices and who for them to exercise this gift?" Of course not, but not in a may be microphoned as they either sit together in an auditorium during worship services or stand together before the congregation. Usually the "praise team" is made up of four men and four women but sometimes there may be more people involved. The "praise team" may lead the congregation in singing or simply join the traditional song leader in leading the congregation. Some in our brotherhood think this is the greatest thing that has happened in the church lately while others believe it is an innovation and sign of "liberalism." Let me make some observations. First, putting a microphone on someone is neither good nor bad in itself. Second, good singers sitting together or standing together in worship is not contrary to Scripture. Third, doing something in worship because I like it or not doing something because I don't like it has no basis in Scripture. The real question is, "What has God authorized?" Fourth, if the purpose of "praise teams" is to entertain us, we are missing the real purpose of worship. Fifth, the first choirs were introduced into worship because of the poor quality of congregational singing. Sixth, I personally am troubled when women are given leadership roles in worship because there is no evidence in the New Testament that this was done in the first century church and I

believe the New Testament prohibits it. Someone said. "But, women have the gift of singing ... could it be wrong leadership capacity. Some women have great speaking gifts. Should they exercise their gifts by preaching in the church assembly? Some women have great leadership abilities. Should they exercise their abilities by serving as elders in the church? Seventh, we need to remember that worship is primarily for God, not us. Also, what is pleasing to us may not be pleasing to God. The only way I know what pleases God is by what is revealed in Scripture. Eighth, I believe that God has authorized a "praise team" for worship and that "praise team" is made up of every worshipper. If all of us collectively and each of us individually would participate in doing what God has asked us to do, and that is to sing, then we would have a high quality of singing by the entire congregation. That, after all, is what God has authorized, isn't it? The fact is that the quality of singing in many congregations is poor because the participation is low and that's a sin against God. Elderships are going to have to decide what their congregations do in worship, hopefully within the parameter of Scripture, but the idea of special "praise teams" might not come up if God's authorized "praise team" had been doing what it should.





Over and above our regular giving on Sundays, we will open our hearts and our billfolds to those who need us. The West Erwin church has always increased it's budget each year and this year we are asked to give over \$17,000 each week. It's not always good to compare, but that budget compares most favorably to any church I am acquainted with which is of similar size to West Erwin. As always, we may not reach our budget every single Sunday this year, but we will exceed it for the year. Additionally, we raised most of the money in advance for our new Family Life Center and will no doubt pay it off before the end of the year. But, when a special need arises, you always arise to the occasion and meet the need. A few Wednesday evenings ago one of our families needed some help. You gave four times what you were asked to give. You are a generous people. When people are generous. God gives them additional ability to be even more generous. You are living proof of this fact (see 2 Corinthians 9:8).



WHAT IS THE MISSION?

If I asked you, "What is the mission of the church?", what time church workers to become so involved in many would your answer be? Most Christians would say our mission is to preach the gospel to the whole world. I believe that is the right answer because of the commission given by Christ in Matthew 28:18-20 and Mark 16:15-16. The church of today must face the new millennium with passion work where Jesus placed the emphasis of His work, the for our mission as we make local and worldwide evangelism our priority. There are two reasons for this emphasis: (1) Christ commanded it; and (2) many people are looking for something better in their lives. To fulfill our mission, several things should be kept in mind. First, we must have a vision that sees beyond our personal and congregational needs to embrace the whole world. Second, we must be involved in meeting the physical needs of people with the bigger goal of teaching them the gospel. Others will always be able to do a better job than we can in simply meeting everyday needs of people. We want to continue to do what we can in this area but with the higher goal of salvation. To provide bread for life is to leave people lost unless we also share the Bread of Life. Third, church staff members need to model our concern for evangelism. Its possible for full-

things, good things, that we neglect our greatest work. Fourth, God has blessed His people in America with the resources to preach the gospel to the entire world in every generation. When we choose to place the emphasis of our job will be done (see Luke 19:10). Fifth, we must be committed to the Bible as the final, complete, authoritative word of the living God which alone is "a lamp to our feet and a light to our way, to guide us safely home." That commitment includes a recognition that God's Word is all religious truth and that people can accept it and be made free: that people who have not obeyed the gospel are lost; and that, in a world of tolerance and without absolutes, a plea for New Testament Christianity is a fresh breath of air that many are needing and are searching for. This is not time to compromise the message or to muffle our plea -- the New Testament only will still produce Christians only and only the church that Jesus built. May God give us the grace to see, to believe, and to proclaim the message



- We have shot abortionists and called it justifiable.
- We have neglected to discipline our children and called it self-esteem.
- We have abused power and called it political
- We have coveted our neighbor's possessions and called it ambition
- We have polluted the air with profanity and pornography and called it freedom of expression.
- We have ridiculed the time honored values of our forefathers and called it enlightenment.

Search us. O God, and know our hearts today; cleanse us from every sin and set us free. Guide and bless these men and women who have been sent here by the people of Kansas, and who have been ordained by You to govern this great state. Grant them wisdom to rule, and may their decisions direct us to the center of Your will.

Or a group can be in the fover during worship (this group helps keep lions out of the foyer, and it works because no one has seen any lions there in years!). When a young mother has to take a child out of the auditorium during worship, she is shocked at the "party" going on in the fover where worship cannot happen. We can have

If you asked ten people who enter our building on Sun- and need people in the fover to help anyone needing assistraining and attending to small children, not a palce to catch up our visiting. If it is only a place of visiting, worship cannot happen. Nearly every week when the office staff comes to work on Monday mornings things on the desks have been gone through, unfinished work has to be rearranged, and sometimes the computers have been used. Now why would anyone need to be in the offices for any extended time during worship? In this atmosphere worship can't happen. So think about it. Worship is not about going in and out of the auditorium, walking hallways, monitoring the parking lots, getting people to serve at the last minute, adjusting the air conditioner, or visiting in the fover (though all these things become necessary at times). Worship is about the exaltation and glorification of the God who is holy. Remembering this and participating reverently in song and prayer and study and communion and giving allows worship to happen



SEEING THE GLORY OF GOD

We will not have the experience of Moses as God alfound the most distant object ever seen. Researchers at lowed him to look upon His back (Exodus 33:17-23). Neither shall we have the experience of Isaiah at the temple (Isaiah 6). We cannot expect to see the throne and the One upon it with John (Revelation 4). But we must see the glory of God in His book of revelation. the Bible, in the book of the things He has created (Romans 1:20; Psalm 19:1). Albert Einstein, world renowned physicist and best known for his theory of relativity, had little use for organized religion. I don't defend him in his view of organized religion, but I understand it. Einstein, who died in 1955, felt that preachers talked too casually about God. He felt that we do not have enough respect for the greatness of the Creator of the universe and that he saw more of the majesty of God through his telescope and his study of physics than through the preaching of preachers. Einstein thought preachers were not talking about the real thing when they spoke of God. All of us, preachers included, need to see the glory of God because His majesty is indescribable. Consider some facts. A recent newspaper article reported that astronomers using the Hubble Space Telescope have

the State University of New York detected a galaxy of 13 billion light years away by a faint ultraviolet light. It makes the third time in a year that astronomers have found what they thought was the most distant object ever viewed. Remember that one light year is 5.87 trillion miles. The milky way in our galaxy is 100 thousand light years (587,000 trillion miles). It is estimated there are 100 billion stars in our galaxy. The sun is one of these. The temperature of the sun is 6000 degrees centigrade and travels at 155 miles per second, which means it orbits our galaxy every 200,000 years. Now, our God spoke all of this into existence. This God has said, "To whom then will you liken me, or to whom shall I be equal?" says the Holy One. Lift up your eyes on high, and see who has created these things. by the greatness of His might and the strength of His power" (Isaiah 40:25-26). No wonder David said, "The heavens declare the glory of God" (Psalm 19:1). This is the God we will worship Sunday. See His glory! Be stunned by His majesty!

All for you, Daddy." The father was crushed. He put his arms around his little girl, and he begged her forgiveness. My friend told me that he kept that gold box by his bed for years. Whenever he was discouraged, he would take out an imaginary kiss and remember the love of the child who had put it there. In a very real sense, each of us as parents has been given a gold container tilled with unconditional love and kisses from our children. There is no more precious possession anyone could ever hold.

THE POWER OF THE WORD

"For the message of the cross is foolishness to those the teens appear. One very important finding of the survey power of God" -- I Corinthians 1:18

The Christian Chronicle (May, 1999) published the results of a fourteen year survey among teenagers associated with the churches of Christ conducted by researchers at Abilene Christian University. Some of the results are eye opening. The survey showed that many of our teens base their religious beliefs upon their opinion (that's not something new in our world, but it does alarm us that our teens are there). The survey also revealed that our teens are excited about some things in church: singing praises, having close friends who are trustworthy, sharing common bonds, experiencing new forms of worship, helping the unfortunate, bringing the lost to Christ, and pulling together in times of crisis. On the other hand, teens are turned off by sermons, elders, Bible classes, worship services, rehearsed prayers that last forever, old and outdated hymns, and services that are too solemn. The survey also showed that the most crucial decision time for faith and lifestyle for teens is the ninth grade. Additionally, the more quality time teens spend with their parent, the more spiritually sound

who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the was how powerful regular Bible reading is upon all areas of life. For example, when Bible reading is a part of a teens life prayer becomes more important, service is important, depression is low, respect is high, and apathy is down. So what are we to do? First, within the frameworks of Scripture, let's make our worship assemblies more exciting as we worship with enthusiasm, pray from our hearts, sing old and new songs, and allow sermons to be a word from God. Second, since elders are generally a turnoff for teens, let them be real shepherds, be visible, and get to know teens. Third, let parents be spiritual leaders for their kids and spend quality time with them in and out of our assemblies. Fourth, since the ninth grade is so important to decision making, let's give emphasis to middle and junior high students and have the vest training possible for them. Fifth, let's encourage those who work with teens by providing them with the best materials available and by supporting their work. Finally, let's help our parents develop good parenting skills and their own spirituality. All of this is important -- the future may depend upon it.

17:17). We know He told His apostles that the Spirit would guide them into all truth (John 16:13). We further know deciding religious questions. The influence of history has that the Ephesians became Christians when they heard led many to turn away from Biblical authority. Add to this and obeyed the gospel which Paul said was the truth (Ephesians 1:13). We also know that Jesus said we can know the truth which will make us free (John 8:32). Why, then, have so many reached the conclusion that we cannot know truth, we do not have truth, and truth is relative. that is, what is truth to you may not be truth to me? Let me offer some possible reasons. The Council of Trent (1545-1563) stated that church traditions were of equal weight to the Bible. The Reformers of the 15th and 16th centuries broke with the authority of tradition and held to Scripture as their authority. However, the Reformers made little difference between the Old Testament and the should want to and commit myself to living right. The fact New Testament and all parts of the Bible were equally valid for the support of doctrine (a problem still with us as people fail to rightly divide the Word). Then came rationalism and higher criticism of the 18th and 19th centuries which cast doubt upon the accuracy of the text of

We all know that Jesus said God's Word is truth (John Scripture which has come down to us and which questioned divine revelation and the authority of Scripture for the fact that many want to approach religion subjectively. that is, they want truth to be what they want it to be, wish it might be, and feel it is. God did not create the various religions, doctrines, and divisions in religion -- He "is not a God of confusion" (I Corinthians 14:33). God speaks today through Christ (Hebrews 1:1-2) and that message is the New Testament. Our task is to "buy the truth and sell it not" (Proverbs 23:23). We are to seek, find, and accept truth as authoritative. I will never know everything, but that is not to say I know nothing -- I can know the truth and be made free. I do not do everything I know to do, but I that I am imperfect does not annul the perfect standard of Scripture. It is still valid: "Let us speak where the Bible speaks" -- it's still the authority and will be the standard at the final judgment.





When youth are told there is no absolute truth. their own "truth"? As a nation, we have allowed our foundations to be eroded and we wonder why the structure is trembling. One time David asked, "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" So what can the righteous do? The righteous can go on being righteous! We can keep on serving Christ, living above the world. and being the light in our communities. We can out live, out love, and out fight the forces of evil. The hour is late but it's not too late. We can still come to our senses as a nation. God honors the righteous even if they are few.

CLASS NOTES by Mike Gravois TIPS FOR POWERFUL PARENTING Give Your Child Straight A's

AFFECTION. A purposeful touch between a parent and child creates a psychological bond. We can "say" things through physical touch that we can't say with words, and our children receive benefits that they probably cannot comprehend, much less put into words. Nothing quite reassures them of our love for them as an intentional hug. Have you hugged your child today?

AFFIRMATION. A nurturing parent uses words to convey support, protection, comfort, encouragement, sympathy, tenderness, and caring. The way we interact verbally with our children has a lasting effect, determining their level of security and their ability to emphathize.

ATTENTION. When your child is talking, tune out all the distractions to give him or her your full attention. Maintain eye contact, and do your best to clear your mind. If our children are worth nurturing -- and we all know they are -- then these listening skills are worth practicing.

I WAS HUNGRY

Last Sunday morning our adult Bible classes were given the opportunity to contribute to the hungry in Russia. We can hardly imagine going a day without adequate food ... are available in Barnual, but without money the people can and clothing and a nice place to live. It's easy for us to forget that countless people in this world do not have our luxury. We were all moved by the knowledge, shared with us by Barry and Pam Sizemore, missionaries to Barnual, Russia. They told us of people who have salary enough only for the bare necessities for living; people who have meat to eat only as a luxury; people who have fresh fruit and cheese only as an occasional treat once a month; people whose salaries have been cut to one-third of what it once was and who are paid only one-fourth or one-half of that; and people who experience the price of goods being triple what it was. Several of our brothers and sisters in Barnual suffer from real need -- not only the need for food but also for clothing and medicine. Two stories that especially touched our hearts included the fact that many people are living off what was harvested in their gardens in September and stored in "cellars" in the ground. By now the vegetables are moldy and pretty much devoid of food value, but the people eat them because there is nothing else. Also, if

people get sick they simply stay in bed, hoping they will get better, because they have no medicine. Food and medicine obtain neither. 

Reclain Mealtime

In the fast-paced world in which we live it is crucial that we find a time for all of the family members to sit down at the same time, in the same place, and share some quiet moments together. Mealtimes can be an ideal time to check in with each family member and see what is going on in their lives.

Too often we have adopted an eating style referred to as "grazing." Grazing occurs when a meal is prepared and then left on the stove so that each family member may eat when it is convenient for them. This also occurs when family members are left to fend for themselves at mealtimes.

Schedule mealtimes for your family where participation is not optional. Turn off the TV and any other distracting appliances. Begin a conversation using a discussion starter such as, "Share what you are most grateful for this week," or "One difficulty I am having that I would like support for this week is ..."

Let your kids come up with a discussion starter.

There are hundreds of activities that vie for our time and attention. We, as parents, need to help our children set realistic boundaries and priorities in their lives. Family time must be one of those priorities. Look for ways to make mealtime fun and interesting. Creative meals, games such as 20 Questions, celebrating special events, celebrating for no reason at all, etc. can all add up to the specialness of time spent together around the table.

FAMILY NIGHT ACTIVITIES

"Share Our Lives" (I Thessalonians 2:8)

Start by having each member get a favorite treat from the kitchen. Discuss why the Bible tells us to share. Then have each member give their treat away. How does sharing make you feel? End with hugs and juice.



5) Do Not Stop Short Of Your Goal.







MONDAY MORNING MUSINGS

It's Monday morning. I'm in my office and I'm thinking answer is a confident, "Yes." How can I be so sure? First, about yesterday. Yesterday the church met and we sang praise to God, we praved, we remembered Jesus in the Supper, we gave support for our God-given work, and there was a sermon. As a preacher, the one who gave the sermon. I am asking myself, "Did the sermon make any difference?" It was a sermon on "The Attraction of Jerusalem" in which the point was made that as Jesus was attracted to Jerusalem to fulfill his purpose (Luke 18:31-33). so all of us have our Jerusalems -- the things that call to us from the hills, compelling us to be all that we can be. The question was asked. "What in life is worthy to be my Jerusalems?" The challenge was issued: "In choosing your Jerusalmems, don't forget what matters most." As I think about vesterday. I am asking myself, "Was the sermon wrung from the heart of a preacher who properly prepared for the preaching hour with study, prayer, and tears?" Was the sermon biblically sound, properly illustrated, and personally applied?" "Did the sermon make any difference?" As I reflect upon that last question. I determine that the

when God's Word is presented, God is glorified. Second, when Christ is the message, Christ is honored. Third, when preaching occurs, the preacher is changed. Fourth, when the Bible is planted in the hearts of hearing people, they are changed. Fifth, God has said that His Word "shall not return to me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). The answer is "Yes." And because this is the answer, on this Monday morning I am ready to return to the Book, the lexicons, concordances, articles, word studies, illustrations, and commentaries -- I am ready to prepare my mind through study, my heart through prayer, and my message through struggle. Why? Because the hour will soon arrive again -- the hour when the people will be asking, "Is there any word from the Lord?": the hour when lives will be changed: the hour when I fulfill my passion. It's an hour of singing, prayer, communion, giving, and study. It's an hour when the faithful in Christ will be together -- an hour that does make a difference.
