National pollsters tell us three fundamental facts about the unchurched. First, more than half our population does not go to church. Secondly, the unchurched tend to be younger than church goers. Thirdly, about 80% of church members came to Christ prior to age 20 and more than half of those before the age of 13. Of the 16 baptisms we have had at West Erwin in 2003, 13 were under the age of 20 (81%).



## BE THANKFUL

A designated day of thanksgiving has been observed in America since December 4, 1619. First, a group of 39 English settlers came to what is now Virginia and declared the day of their arrival (Dec. 4, 1619) as a day of thanksgiving. Second, by July 30, 1623, Governor William Bradford decreed a day of thanksgiving for the colonists of Massachusetts. Third, President George Washington issued a proclamation naming November 26 as a day of national thanksgiving. Fourth, by 1830 New York had an official state Thanksgiving Day, with other states soon following its example. Fifth, President Abraham Lincoln formally proclaimed the last Thursday in November, 1863, as a day of Thanksgiving. Sixth, each year after Lincoln's proclamation, the President of the United States formally proclaimed that the last Thursday of November should be observed as Thanksgiving Day. Seventh, in 1941, Congress set forth the fourth Thursday of November as Thanksgiving Day and a legal holiday. Thanksgiving is a good thing, and for the Christian

Thanksgiving Day is every day. In Colossians 3:15 Paul linked thanksgiving to the privilege of being a part of the body of Christ, the church. In Colossians 3:17 he referred to thanksgiving in connection with the privilege of serving Christ. Near the beginning of several of his letters Paul thanked God for his brethren in Christ. In Romans 6:17 he thanked God for salvation from sin. In 2 Corinthians 9:15 the apostle thanked God for the gift of Christ our Savior. In Philippians 4:6 thanksgiving is presented as an antidote for anxiety. In I Corinthians 15:57 thanks is offered to God for the final victory enjoyed by Christians at the second coming of Christ. In Ephesians 5:20 Paul urged the Ephesians to thank God for all things and in I Thessalonians 5:18 he said, "In everything give thanks." Thanksgiving is as much a part of the Christian's life as is the receiving from God of "every good and perfect gift" (James 1:17). Every day is Thanksgiving Day for us, so let us "be thankful" (Colossians 3:15)





# A SIGN OF THE TIMES

In the September 13, 2003 issue of the Christian Chronicle, a newspaper dedicated to printing happenings among the churches of Christ around the world, it was reported that at least five congregations have introduced instrumental music into some of their worship services. Several people who have been students of growth patterns and trends within the church were interviewed and gave their ideas about whether or not the introduction of instruments by these churches represents isolated events or a trend among the churches of Christ. One of the things that especially arrested my attention was the observation by one of the men interviewed. He said that some in the church were no longer holding to things that have distinguished the churches of Christ through the years -things like baptism for the forgiveness of sins, the Lord's Supper observance every Sunday and only on Sunday, and singing without the addition of instruments. His observation was that these distinctions are eroding among some brethren "as the culture impacts these churches." I

find it interesting that "the culture impacts these churches." I know very well that we are affected by the world around us. However, Jesus has taught us that we live in the world but that we are not of the world (John 17:16). Paul said, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed" (Romans 12:2). The early disciples turned their culture upside down (Acts 17:6). Of course, we do not want to be different from the culture just for difference's sake. After all, Paul said, "I have become all things to all men, that I might save some" (I Corinthians 9:22). We certainly do not need to distinguish ourselves from the culture in areas of custom or judgment. However, in becoming "all things to all men" Paul did not violate the will of God. There's the rub. Some today are allowing the culture to impact the church as they move away from Scripture. In matters of faith, and singing is a matter of faith since it is the only music authorized by Scripture, the church should be impacting the culture rather than the other way around. - Jay Lockhart

All we are and all we have are gifts from God. He gave us the world and everything in it. He gave us life! Nothing that God gives is meaningless. His greatest gift came wrapped in swaddling clothes and left in radiant robes! Our response to His gift is called worship. But worship without gratefulness is just mechanical legalism that means nothing to God. Under the Old Covenant God said, "I reject your festivals and I don't like your solemn assemblies. Even though you offer to Me burnt offerings, I will not accept them" (Amos 5:21-24). God wanted righteousness, not rituals. He wanted faithfulness to their covenant that showed itself by consistent living. In the New Covenant He made with His people, God said, "If I speak with human eloquence but don't know how to love another person, I'm nothing more than the squeak in a rusty gate" (I Cor. 13:1). Worship is devoting our lives to using every gift that God has given us to glorify Him.

Christ is another great example of someone that was misjudged because of his appearance. All indicators were that it was time for the Messiah to come to earth. The book of Daniel documented the arrival of Christ precisely to the first century The people were ready for the Messiah, they were looking for the Messiah and when he (Jesus) came they rejected the Messiah. They were looking for the Messiah to descend into Bethlehem, then ride on a cloud to Jerusalem. They anticipated that the whole world would look toward Jerusalem as Christ descended from the cloud to the throne of David. With the whole world focused on Jerusalem, Christ would then appoint his chosen people (the Jews) to rule over the world. What they didn't expect was that the Messiah would be a carpenter's son from Nazareth. What they expected was a ruler who would establish an earthly kingdom; what they got was a ruler who established a spiritual kingdom. All of this was prophesied in the Old Testament. During the winter quarter I will be teaching the Adventurer's Class (FLC - Sunday mornings) on the subject of So It Is Written, So Shall It Be. 



Worship is an ongoing, consistent, living sacrifice to God according to Romans 12:1-2. It requires submission, not obedience.

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world

This world really gets in our way, doesn't it? Paul puts it into simple words to help us recognize that the world we live in is a huge barrier in our path to being living sacrifices for God. It lures us into apathy, it tempts us to seek physical pleasures, it appeals to our pride and our need for acceptance, and it easily molds us into conformity with the rest of mankind.

This is Satan's goal. He's the Prince of this dark world and the Master Deceiver. He can sell you on the idea that a life of worship is really only one hour a week. He runs from terms like "submission" and "living sacrifice" and "being acceptable to God." He is satisfied just to have just a part of your life, because God says He wants all of you or nothing.

God longs for the day that His people will no longer be dominated by human nature, but that we can live, walk and breathe as Christ-centered people. It's submission not obedience. Obedience is a law term. Submission is a word that belongs to love and respect.

# "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

For several years in the 1980's I had the chance to coach a high school girl's volleyball team in Little Rock, Arkansas. It was an experience that I treasure to this day. We were not a powerhouse by any stretch of the imagination but we took the talent we had and we worked hard. We were a 1A school who played several 2A and 3A schools and not once did we have a losing season. One of the things that I stressed to my girls was that in order for us to win all of the players would have to be able to play all of the positions well. What I meant by that was, my setters would have to be able to spike, my spikers would have to be able to set the ball, all of them would have to be able to serve the ball well. In other words, my players were going to have to be multi-dimensional players. If they weren't willing to develop themselves in this way, then they would sit with me on the bench while the game was being played. However, I am pleased to report that they all did become multi-dimensional players. During my five years of coaching volleyball at this 1A

school in Little Rock, five girls received full scholarships to various colleges to play this sport at a higher level. One of the reasons they were able to do this was because they knew every aspect of the game.

This week, as you have the time, sit down and evaluate your service to the Lord. Ask yourself, "Am I a multi-dimensional servant?" Do you participate in one area of work of the church or are you involved in many areas of concern? Don't misunderstand, if you truly only have time to be involved in one aspect of service then we need you to be involved in that one work, but on the other hand, we also need more of you to become multi-dimensional servants. There is a lot of work that goes on behind the scenes in our Bible school program. We have over 110 workers who participate in multiple tasks each Sunday morning. Sunday night and Wednesday night in our educational ministry. Many of these workers also help out with our Children's Worship, Children's Bible Hour, Summer Extravaganza and other events. Workers, I just want you to know that we couldn't pull this off (giving God the glory) without you. Thank you for your labor of love.



# RESTORING SANITY TO THE JUDICIARY

People in this country have long talked about the separation of church and state. The concept is based upon ten words found in the Constitution of the United States. Those ten words are: "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion." The founding fathers of the United States wanted to guard against a "state church" such as existed in Great Britain and, therefore, included the so-called "separation of church and state" clause in the Constitution. Any student of history knows that the founding fathers were basically men of faith and never intended that the Constitution forbid the mention of God in the public arena. As a matter of fact these men sanctioned the engraving of the Ten Commandments, "In God We Trust," and other evidences of our spiritual heritage on public buildings and in public places throughout Washington, D.C. They did not believe that opening the sessions of Congress with prayer or that opening the workday of the Supreme Court with the words, "God bless the United States and this Court" violated the intended meaning of the Constitution. When the courts of America ruled that prayer or Bible reading in schools, that prayer before athletic contests and during graduations, that "under God" in the Pledge of Allegiance, and that a public display of the Ten

Commandments were unconstitutional, none of these things were the real target. The real target was to get God, morality, Christian values, and the recognition of our religious heritage out of the public life of America. When the founding fathers set up three branches of government, their purpose was to provide checks and balances so that no branch of government would become too powerful. It seems that the judiciary with its appointed for life justices is out of control and needs to be reined in by the Congress. Incidentally, the debates in Congress over partial birth abortion and what constitutes marriage are encouraging signs that the courts will not be allowed to make laws for us but to get back to the interpretation of laws, which is the court's job. You cannot vote for an appointed judiciary, but you can vote for Congressmen who appoint them and who hold to positions that most Christians feel are right. We have been silent for far too long. Our voices against anti-God rhetoric must be heard -- from our pulpits, in our writings, in our contact with our congressmen, .. and at the ballot box.

# "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates Teachers, Have You Ever Felt This Way?

The American Heritage Dictionary defines frustrate in the following ways: (1) to prevent from accomplishing a purpose or fulfilling a desire, (2) to thwart, (3) to cause feelings of discouragement, (4) to nullify, (5) to disappoint. When was the last time that you felt frustrated? If you are like me, it probably hasn't been that long ago. When was the last time that you were involved in a project that you were putting your all into, only to have someone come along and with just a few spoken words, or perhaps even unspoken words tear your enthusiasm completely down? It hurts, doesn't it? After all, it appears from the scriptures that we, as Christians, are to edify one another (as long as we are walking worthy) and yet so often we seem to become exactly like so many of the members of the church at Corinth and instead of building each other up, we tear each other down. The apostle Paul often found himself frustrated. When the people looked at his credentials you'd think they would have been

impressed, but far too often they were not. They even questioned his apostleship. He was by far the greatest authority on church growth living at that time and more than likely he was the greatest expert of his day on how to teach the lost. Yet time and time again he was trampled on by the brethren.

Spiritually speaking Paul was a giant of a man. What might discourage us to the point of quitting made Paul persevere. He pressed on. His commitment was to God and not to man. He knew he was involved in a noble task and try as they may, he was not going to give in to their petty ways. Teachers, whenever you find yourself discouraged, take a few minutes to reexamine the life of Paul. Read 1 & 2 Corinthians and see how they tried to tear him down. Read 1 & 2 Thessalonians and see how even Satan attempted to "thwart or discourage" Paul and yet he refused to give in. It should stand to reason that when we are walking worthy we should not be made to feel unworthy, but the fact of the matter is we often are. How we react to those who discourage us will determine if Satan wins or if God wins. Let's take the advice of Paul and "press on toward the mark."



# "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

I wanted to take a few minutes to talk to you concerning "mission work." This is a broad term that can apply to foreign efforts as well as domestic efforts. For example, we support works on the foreign mission field in (1) Togo, West Africa, (2) Russia, (3) Eastern Europe, and (4) Mexico. Here in the United States we support (1) the building fund for the church in West Point, Nebraska, (2) the Angleton church in the Miami area (preaching school) as well as other efforts domestically. Then we have funds that go to support schools/children's homes/and special works. We are heavily involved in mission work here at West Erwin. We even try to get our kids involved in these areas. Danny Snell's classes have helped sponsor individual students in Nicaragua and I know those students have been blessed. For the past 9 months the kindergarten through 5th grade classes (in our educational ministry) have collected almost \$400.00 toward the

breakfast program in Managua. This program is a great success and it does a wonderful job in not only feeding the hungry children of Managua, but also these children have the opportunity of hearing the Word of God. My question at this time is, are all of K-5th graders involved in this work? A second question that I have at this time is, are all of teachers/parents/staff making sure that we are collecting this money on a regular basis? Let me encourage our teachers to do whatever is necessary to remind our students that they need to be collecting their quarters for this project. Parents, you are the main catalyst in securing these quarters for the kids in Managua. We gave each of the students a film container that will hold several quarters and you can help us by reminding your child to put their quarters in it. If they lost it they need to see their teacher and they will be given a new one. The last Sunday of each quarter these quarters will be collected in class. As I said earlier, so far (approximately 9 months) we have collected close to \$400.00, which is good but if all our students would fill one container up, we could collect \$400.00 each quarter. Students, you're doing a lot, but let's do even more!







# REFLECTION UPON THE DEATH OF MY FATHER

My dad was a tall man. In his prime he was taller than either my brother or me. He was tall physically, but he miss occasionally. On Thanksgiving weekend of 1950 a was tall in every other way as well. His ethics and morals were impeccable. His honesty and integrity were never questioned by anyone. His devotion to Christ and the church was steady. My dad obeyed the gospel when he was a young adult and was a faithful member of the Southside church, now Camden Avenue, for the rest of his life. My mother and her parents, as well as other members of her family, became Christians because of the influence of my dad. As a boy growing up I knew him as a man -- a real man. He spoke softly but his words, or even a look, could transform my misbehavior in an instant. My dad would not miss church when it was within his power to be there. In all the years as I was growing up I can only remember one Sunday that he missed and that was when he was sick in bed. The only exception I can remember

was that there were times he worked shift work and had to snow storm left 36 inches of snow on the ground but Sunday morning found my dad walking the two miles to church through the snow. That's the way he was. He was a gentle man, but stern; a loving man, but strict; and a serious man, but fun loving. He liked his automobiles and kept them spotless ... to a fault. When I wrecked his car in 1955, totaling it, he never said a word about how careless I had been -- his only words upon hearing I was in the hospital were, "Is Jay okay?" When I was baptized in 1950 my dad gave me a big hug and neither of us could say a word. He was proud of his sons and encouraged us to be men. He showed my brother and me how to treat women by the way he treated our mother. My dad was tall. I would like to be as tall as he was.

Believe me when I tell you that my basketball days are long gone, but there was a time that I really enjoyed the game. In fact, it was my life. It consumed me in just about every way possible. I loved to watch the game, I loved to study the game and I loved to play the game. I was so caught up in basketball that I decided at an early age that I wanted to be a basketball coach. Even though I wavered a little bit in this commitment, eventually I became a basketball coach. I had the privilege of coaching for 2 years in Miami, Florida and for 5 years in Little Rock, Arkansas. But after 7 years of coaching I finally realized that my lifelong dream had become a nightmare. Don't get me wrong, there are a lot of dedicated coaches who have coached for years and who seem to still love the game. My frustration came about because of all the additional responsibilities that I had as a teacher and I came to understand exactly what the term "burnout" meant. Not only did I come to understand what the word "burnout" meant, but it has made me very sympathetic to those that I work with

today in the Bible school program. We have some really dedicated teachers who take on numerous responsibilities inside and outside of the classroom. They have their regular 9 to 5 jobs. They have their responsibilities of being a parent or a grandparent. They have their various organizations, etc. that they are a part of, and then to top it off, they teach on Sunday mornings and/or Wednesday evenings at church. Quite frankly some of our teachers are burning themselves out. There are some things that the non-teachers can do to help our teachers out and perhaps help them to avoid burnout. First, understand the time factor. Our classes start at 9:00 a.m. They do not start at 8:40 nor do they start at 9:15. Second, if you go into one of our children's classrooms and the teacher isn't present, then go in and sit with the kids until the teacher shows up. Third, be sure to tell the teacher that you appreciate all the work that they put into their class. Fourth, volunteer to be a part of the class as a teacher's aid, etc. And *fifth*, include all of our teachers in your prayers. If you will follow these 5 basic suggestions not only will your life improve but you may even help our teachers experience less

# "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

I like to read. Well, that might be stretching it a little bit, but I do find it a joyful necessity to read. One of my favorite "educational" authors is a man by the name of *Findley Edge*. Mr. Edge wrote a book entitled <u>Teaching For Results</u>. In his book he shocked his readers by demonstrating that many of our Bible teachers aren't getting the results that they desire in their classrooms. He shared with the reader the surveys that demonstrated that even after 5 years in the classroom many of the students could not answer the simplest of Bible facts. Who's to blame when our classroom experiences fail? Is it the student's fault or the teacher's fault?

Well, many place the blame squarely on the shoulders of the students. Those that teach are quick to point out that they cannot teach if the student doesn't show an ounce of interest in the subject, if the student isn't enthusiastic about learning and if there isn't a degree of willingness on the part of the student to

advance in knowledge. However, we as teachers need to realize that we hold the key in motivating our students to show interest, to gain enthusiasm, and to demonstrate a willingness to learn. It is called the "GREATEST STORY EVER TOLD," and we need to present it that way.

Teachers, if you are having a hard time conveying the Word of God to your students, please take just a moment and review your method of presenting the message. All of us as teachers need to realize that our students simply do not all learn in the same exact way. Some of our students learn best through abstract teaching (lectures), some of our students learn best through reflective teaching (discussion, etc.). Another group of students might learn best through concrete teaching (factual) and yet another group might learn best through active teaching (hands on). If we go into the classroom and teach one way and one way only then we might reach 25% of our students but what about the other 75%? If you feel like you are failing in your classroom, before you get out of teaching, try to figure a way to incorporate all four of these teaching approaches in your classroom. If you can do this successfully you will reach your students.

# ON GIMMICKS AND IMITATION

I learned in my logic classes in college that if you begin -- questions like: "What do I want?"; "What pleases me?"; worship upon the false premise that worship is primarily 10:24-25; and John 4:23 are passages that emphasize the foregoing. But, does the Bible say anything about worship being exclusively or even primarily for us? If so, where? happen? Be assured .... it already has! The fact is that worship is primarily for God and when we worship God as He directs we reap certain benefits. However, if one accepts the premise that worship is primarily for us, then he begins to ask the wrong questions

# ON GIMMICKS AND IMITATION

I learned in my logic classes in college that if you begin -- questions like: "What do I want?"; "What pleases me?"; with a false premise you can rarely reach a correct "What seems to be working in mega-churches?" The conclusion. In the church today we draw some false conclusion is that we should imitate these churches, that conclusions because we begin with a false premise. whatever gimmicks they use for drawing people we should use, and that whatever people's felt needs are in regard to worship we should seek to fulfill. Now, no doubt, all would agree that we can and should do whatever is legitimate and right to interest people. However, the problem that arises is this: If we leave Scripture to establish from human reason that worship is primarily for us, then it is a short step to leaving Scripture to introduce into worship things that God has never authorized simply because we think it's good. Would this ever really happen? Be assured .... it already has!

# **OUR BELIEF SYSTEM**

Some time ago I visited with a denominational friend who is a serious, diligent, and thorough student of the Word. He has insights into scripture that are incredible and has deep understanding of various biblical themes. Yet, when he comes to a passage like Acts 2:38 his exegetical abilities seem to fall apart. He can see how repentance is essential to enjoy the "forgiveness of sins" in Acts 2. He can see how when Jesus said his blood was shed "for the forgiveness of sins," he was saying that his blood was totally necessary to the "forgiveness of sins" (Matthew 26:28). However, when Peter said, "Repent and be baptized ... for the forgiveness of sins," he is unable to see the necessity of baptism to salvation. Why is this? I'm not sure. It may be background, family tradition, theological training, or bias. The fact is, I read several authors who have great insights into many biblical themes, but who seem to lose their equilibrium when it comes to the place of baptism in God's plan. We are not exempt to this problem in the church. We have brethren who argue

for women deacons on the basis of Phoebe in Romans 16:1. Yet they know that the word "deacon" is servant and is used in the New Testament in reference to anyone who serves, including Jesus. They know there are qualifications for "deacons" in I Timothy 3, but that the New Testament gives no qualifications for "deaconesses." To reply that the "women" or "wives" of I Timothy 3:11 refers to "deaconesses" is to overlook the fact that Paul could have used the word for "deacon" in this verse but he did not. Others in the church argue for the practice of things not authorized by Scripture -- "the Bible doesn't say not to." Could it be that the problem is really this: one makes up his mind as to what he wants to believe and then sets out to justify his beliefs by Scripture. Shouldn't one come to the Scripture to form his beliefs rather than to justify what he already believes? The Bible still says, "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God" (I Peter 4:11). - Jay Lockhart





# SURPRISING INSIGHTS FROM THE UNCHURCHED


This is the title of a recent book written by Thom S. Rainer that Stafford North, Distinguished Professor of Bible at Oklahoma Christian University, shared with the readers of the *Christian Chronicle* for December, 2003. North observed that Rainer surveyed 2000 evangelical churches and from them identified 353 formerly unchurched individuals who had decided to be identified with a church. According to North, Rainer believes we learn more from the unchurched who become churched than from the unchurched who remain that way. Rainer asked the 353 formerly unchurched people questions that helped him tabulate what factors came into play causing them to affiliate with the church they chose. Here are the factors that had a strong influence and the percentage who said that factor was important to them:

1. Preaching	90%
2. Doctrines of the church	88%
3. Friendliness of the members	49%
4. A member "witnessed" to them	41%

5. A family member attends 38%
6. Relationship with non-family member 25%
7. Sunday School class 25%
8. Children's/Youth Ministry 25%
9. Worship Style 11%
10. Location 7%

If these questions had been asked of people who changed churches the answers would, no doubt, have been different, but these are the answers the unchurched gave. Note that virtually everyone said that personal relationships influenced them (see numbers 4, 5, 6). Note further that doctrine was important to 77% more of those interviewed than was worship styles. Note also that location was of least importance. For the unchurched, at least, if Rainer's study is valid, the fact remains that if a church has a definitive message, if members will ask people to come, if members are friendly when they do come, if something is happening at the church, people will come no matter what the location is.

In the August 30 - September 5 issue of TV Guide there is an article featuring Ellen Degeneres entitled "I'm Back!" I don't know about you, but I am growing weary of the television networks forcing Ellen on the viewing public. Six years ago Ellen starred in her own sitcom and it was decided that Ellen the person and Ellen the character would both announce they were gay. Within six weeks the TV show was canceled. When it comes to TV, it's all about money. The networks and producers may push and push and push, but if advertising products are not bought or the rating of a program are down, it's gone. What can you do? Don't watch the programs and don't buy the products. Do write the network, but don't expect a positive response. Also, it is extremely important that we not be lulled into slumber by our politically correct culture, which would like for our country to become totally secular as it becomes more and more anti-God.



# WHAT A DAY!





Paul tells us to be compassionate Christians but the self-righteous continue to point and complain and condemn. Why call Jesus "Lord" and not obey Him? "Do not judge, and you will not be judged; and do not condemn, and you will not be condemned; pardon and you will be pardoned" (Luke 6:37).

### THE GAY AGENDA

I can remember when gay meant cheerful, happy, lively, and merry. Now, however, even the dictionary includes in its definition "homosexual." It's called "an alternative lifestyle," and the gay community wants respectability ... and its getting it. One of the TV networks pushed "Ellen" on the public a few years ago but the ratings bottomed out and the program was taken off the air. Never mind, however, because several sitcoms have homosexual characters in their programs. They are always presented in the best light as kind, gentle, and good people so that the viewers will accept the characters ... and the lifestyle. The gay agenda is to push for full acceptance, but it is never satisfied. In the military, "don't ask, don't tell" isn't enough. In religion. membership in some churches isn't enough and neither is being a priest -- they must be appointed bishops. In society, to be openly gay and to enjoy being treated with respect (and every person does deserve to be treated with respect) isn't enough -- you must approve of the lifestyle. That's where we are in our pluralistic culture. It's not enough to agree that every person has a right to

choose his lifestyle. It's not enough to treat every person with Christian courtesy. You must agree with and approve of their point of view and even promote it. As a Christian, I want to treat every person with love, kindness and gentleness but I do not condone everything everybody does. Neither do I agree that the right thing is to do is whatever one believes to be the right thing. The gay lifestyle is "an abomination" to God (Leviticus 18:22) and in His sight it is unnatural and shameful (Romans 1:26-27). This lifestyle can be glossed over by adorning hishop's cloaks, or by portraying those who would speak against it as intolerant bigots, but the fact remains that Scripture in no way condones or approves this behavior. Now come some in the religious community saying that the Bible must be adjusted to the culture and that acceptance of the gay agenda shows that the church is broadminded and accepting. What does God think about this? We need not wonder. Read again what He says. In God's sight some things are still an abomination, unnatural, and shameful ... no matter what the culture may think. - Jay Lockhart

be only an observer. In all of these areas it is easy to say, "Don't blame me. It's not my fault." Freud helped develop this thinking by suggesting that our genes make us do what we do and Marx fortified this position by saying our societies are to blame. However, God holds us personally responsible for what we do and say or do not do and do not say (Romans 14:12). In the church we must not be on the sidelines watching things happen. We must not think of the work of the church as "what they are doing." The church is the body of Christ and the body functions properly when "every part does its share" (Ephesians 4:16). We are all responsible. We all have a place to fill. Can the body count on me? Can God count on me? Responsibility accepted says, "Here am I, send me!" What are you saying?

## "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

For the last two weeks I have written about Thomas Connellan's book, Inside The Magic Kingdom. As you remember, this book deals with the 7 keys of success that Disney World incorporates into getting people to return to the park. These 7 keys to success are: (1) Everyone is considered a custodian, (2) Pay attention to detail, (3) Everyone walks the talk, (4) Everything walks the talk, (5) Customers are best heard through many ears, (6) Reward, recognize and celebrate, and (7) Everyone makes a difference. At this point, let me ask, "Should these 7 keys to success be considered in the work of the church?" The answer (to me) is yes! The fact of the matter is that what we are attempting to get people involved in is far more important than what Disney is attempting to get people involved in. From the first point which attempts to get people to take a little pride in the appearance of the building and grounds, to point seven which is an attempt to remind us that we all have a role to fulfill, all of these steps should facilitate growth.

We recently completed our annual VBS ministry. This year's attendance averaged 295. In the past three years our VBS has experienced rapid growth. We have gone from an average of 200 in 2001, to 280 in 2002, to 295 in 2003. Even with this growth we still have a lot of room for improvement. Hopefully within the next couple of years we will be approaching an average of 400 in our VBS. But my question is, "What has made our VBS grow?" First, let's always give God the glory. After all, we spent countless hours praying and preparing for our VBS and in the process we directly involved God. He blessed our VBS. Second. let's remember that those who were selected to coordinate did an outstanding job in developing a team atmosphere and the end product was evident. From the refreshment center to the learning centers, everyone took their responsibilities very seriously and yet still had an enormous amount of fun with it. Third, all seven of the keys of success that Thomas Connellan wrote about in his book could be found in our VBS. All of these things factored into us having a great VBS. I'm already planning for next year's VBS. It's going to be great!

When things are going well with my schedule and I'm able to accomplish most of the things on my "To Do: list, I've noticed I get very confident in myself and I have a tendency to float off from depending on God. I become self-reliant. I have everything under control. Then God steps back into the picture. Then God steps back into the picture to show me just how pompous I have become. If you'll think I'm sure this scenario will be relevant to your own life.

When you and I take our schedule to God in prayer every day, we'll be like that tree planted by the stream. Our burdens will be much lighter. When we rely solely on ourselves we become frustrated and impatient. Life

becomes one great big bundle of obstacles. That's when we become that bush in the dry wasteland. We don't see God because we're not praying and we're not praying because we're too busy trying to fix things ourselves. Include God in your schedule and be amazed at the difference.

## "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

In my last week's bulletin article I talked a little bit about *Thomas Connellan's* book entitled **Inside The Magic Kingdom**. In this book Thomas Connellan lays out 7 keys of success that Disney incorporates to aid them in getting people to return to the Magic Kingdom. Last week I mentioned (1) Everyone is considered a custodian, (2) Pay attention to detail, and (3) Everyone walks the talk. This week I want to introduce you to the other 4 keys to success.

Everything walks the talk. This step sounds like step number 3 but is a lot different. Everything at Disney plays into the vision that Walt Disney had for the Magic Kingdom. From paintings to sculptures, it all has a theme that aids you in having a positive experience while attending Disney World. A lot of effort was put into fulfilling this step.

<u>Customers are best heard through many ears.</u> Disney prides itself on assessing their various resorts, attractions, and

theme parks. They really want to know what the guests think. Each cast member (employee) upon hearing a compliment or a complaint is to follow up on what they hear.

Reward, recognize, and celebrate. Disney has a 3 step approach when honoring their employees. First, they publicly announce any accomplishment of a cast member. Second, they post an award so that all other cast members can read about the honoree. And third, at the next meeting they celebrate (usually by using various characters, i.e. Mickey or Donald) the honoree.

Everyone makes a difference. This last key to success is driven home in all of the previous 6 keys to success. From the cashier to the executive, by working together a difference is made to each guest at Disney. This key to success sums up Walt Disney's vision. He wanted people to enjoy his theme park as much as he enjoyed it. If you were to stop all the guests each day at Disney World and interview them you'd find that 70% of them are return guests.

Next week I am going to once again talk about these 7 keys. In that article I will attempt to summarize how I feel these 7 keys can be applied to the various ministries of the church.

The greatest role model for all of us is Jesus. Paul said, "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus." ### **GOD AND YOUR SCHEDULE** (part II)

I heard a preacher once say, "God is who He says He is, believe it!" So, I have been working in the area of relying on God and I want to share with you what He has shown me I need to do. First, I need to go to Him each day for help with my schedule. As I pray, I acknowledge that this day belongs to Him. I ask Him to rearrange it or even change it completely so that I can do what He wants me to do. God has come through for me so many times. I've had appointments canceled and deadlines extended. He has shown me better ways to do a particular task. He has sent me helpers who volunteer ideas and services. All these things happen after I have prayed. So, why don't we lean on

the Lord? It's His day, not ours. No matter how efficient we are, it's God who is in control.

Judge Sam Griffith came by the office today to drop off vegetables from his garden. He does this all during the growing season to help furnish fresh vegetables for the people who eat at the Karing Kitchen. He calls the garden "God's Garden." Yet he admitted his frustrations at times and confessed he had to remember to hand it over to the Lord. And God never failed him.

## "Heirs Of Life Together" I Peter 3:7 Douglas L. Yates

To the best of my recollection I have visited Disney World at least 7 times. I love Disney World. Over the years I have wondered why so many of us continue to go back to Disney World year after year. Believe it or not, I am researching that very topic by reading a book written by *Thomas Connellan entitled:* Inside The Magic Kingdom. Thomas Connellan is an executive who was invited to attend a small seminar with just 4 other people who were all interested in learning why Disney had so many repeat guests. After his experience at this seminar, Tom wrote this book focusing on 7 keys to Disney's success. Let me list a few of these keys.

<u>First</u>, everyone who works for Disney (45,000) is considered to be a custodian. That's from the cashiers to the CEO. All employees (or cast members as they are called) are strongly encouraged to pick up all trash that they see and discard it in the appropriate place.

Second, an enormous amount of time and effort is given to the smallest detail. For example, you may be shocked to know that every night (if weather permits) the tops of all 38 hitching posts found in Frontier Land are stripped and repainted. The top of the posts have hand prints from the thousands of visitors each day and because Disney wants to leave a great impression they repaint these posts each night.

Third, another Disney success key is that all the cast members (employees) walk the talk. Disney believed that actions speak louder than words so he expected all cast members to walk the talk. He didn't want his administrators to tell those below them what to do, but rather to show them what to do.

Well, you may wonder why I'm telling you all of these things. As I was reading this book I began to think about the church and how all of us need to be working together as a team. I thought about the facility, the programs, and our philosophy and it clicked. If we are going to be successful as a team here at West Erwin we must all realize that we are custodians who give attention to all the details and who let our actions speak louder than our words. I'll conclude this article in next week's bulletin.





The church would be in "no man's land" because it was too liberal to be in the mainstream of Christians, to belong to any religious organization except the churches of Christ and too conservative to be the church Jesus built, and to have any rule of faith and acceptable to the denominational world. Having lost its practice other than the Scriptures.

We can be assured of this fact: when churches are led away from biblical authority for what is believed, taught, and practiced; when churches no longer speak as the Scripture speaks; when churches think of themselves as a century; when churches accept the assumption that if the Bible doesn't specifically say not to do something, then it may be done with Divine approval; when churches are more concerned about human thoughts, desires, and perceived needs than they are with what God thinks or says; then those churches will decline and the leaders will be slow to understand why. We have no right, and should have no desire, to be anything religiously other than

### WHEN YOU SAY, "I LOVE YOU"

When you say to someone, "I love you," you are saying 2; Ezekiel 16; and the book of Hosea to see God's love for something significant. It is unlike anything else you might say. Nothing else you say to another so affects them or you. When you tell someone you love them, it makes you vulnerable -- they may not accept or return your love. Telling someone you love them involves the whole self (intellect, emotions and will) and will not leave you the same as you were. When you say, "I love you," you place responsibility upon yourself because love has its demands. God has always said, "I love you" to people. To ancient Israel God said, "I love you" and demonstrated it by bringing the nation out of Egyptian bondage, caring for it in the wilderness, and bringing it into the promised land of Canaan. He loved Israel when no one else did and He took her to be His wife. He faithfully gave His heart to her but she rejected His love and became unfaithful to Him as she followed other gods. Yet God loved her still and begged her to be faithful to Him as she has been in the days of her youth, but she would not and finally God's patience ran out and the nation was judged and destroyed (see Jeremiah

Israel). God keeps saying to us, "I love you." He gives us what we need to sustain physical life. As the answer to our sin God loved us and gave Jesus to die for our sins. He gathered the saved into a family called the church where He blesses us with all spiritual blessings (Ephesians 1:3), answers our prayers (James 5:16), and works in our lives (Romans 8:28). We have professed our love for God. We love Him because He first loved us (I John 4:19); the greatest commandment is to love God (Matthew 22:37); and we would be most ungrateful if we failed to love the One who loves us so (see I Corinthains 16:22). Loving God is more than saying the words! Jesus said, "If you love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). John added, "If anyone says he loves God and hates his brother, he is a liar" (I John 4:20). Saying we love God makes demands upon us -- we must make the will of the Supreme the supreme will of our lives. Do you love God? Do you really or are you just talking?

#### THE BOOK OF LIFE

There is no question about it! God has a book which is a register of His people and is called the Book of Life. Moses was aware of God's book as evidenced by the fact that he asked to have his name blotted out of the book for the sake of rebellious Israel (Exodus 32:32). It is interesting that God replied to Moses, "Whoever has sinned against me, I will blot him out of my book" (verse 33). David spoke of those who troubled him when he prayed, "Let them be blotted out of the book of the living, and not be written with the righteous" (Psalm 69:28). This indicates that David knew of God's record of the righteous. Paul said that his Christian coworkers had their names in the Book of Life (Philippians 4:3). Jesus told his disciples to rejoice because their names were written in heaven (Luke 10:20). Jesus said to the church at Sardis that he who overcame evil would not have his name blotted out of the Book of Life (Revelation 3:5). In Revelation 13:8 we learn that those who followed evil did not have their names written in the Book of Life. At the judgment the Book of Scripture will be opened to judge men and another book which is the Book of Life (Revelation 20:12). Those whose

names are not in the Book of Life will be cast into the lake of fire (Revelation 20:15). In Revelation 21:27 we learn that those who enter heaven will be those whose names are in the Book of Life. Those who add to or take away from the words of the book of Revelation will have his part taken from the Book of Life (Revelation 22:19). Finally, the names of those who are members of the church have their names written in heaven (Hebrews 12:23). What do we learn from these Scriptures? We learn that God has a book called the Book of Life which lists the names of His people. God's people in the New Testament are disciples, saints, members of the church. One may have his name blotted out of God's Book by living an unfaithful life. If one's name is not in this Book he will be lost. It is essential that you become a disciple of the Lord (Matthew 28:19-20), that you seek to live in harmony with the Lord's will (Revelation 3:5), that you are baptized into the Lord's body, the church (I Corinthians 12:13). Then, with the full assurance of faith, you can "rejoice because your names are written in heaven."



#### THE LORD DOESN'T HAVE A FAVORITE TEAM IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

It's called "The Road to the Final Four" and "March Madness" -it's the NCAA college basketball tournament! Every basketball fan watches the 65 teams which are selected to play in the tournament become 32, then "The Sweet Sixteen," the "Final Four," and then one team becomes the national champ. Along the way a team plays a close game and, as members of the winning team are interviewed on TV, one player is heard to say, "The Lord was really with us today!" Was He? Does that mean the Lord was not with the other team? We would agree that athletes have God-given abilities, but I doubt that the Lord is very concerned about who wins a basketball game -- even the national championship game. The Lord doesn't have a favorite basketball team. However, the Lord is concerned about our world and He does rule in the kingdoms of men (see Daniel 4:32). While God doesn't tell us to pray that our favorite team will win, He does tell us to pray for world leaders (I Timothy 2:1-2). God is involved in world events. In a war, such as we are engaged in now, both sides may feel they are in the right, but is there any conflict between nations that may be called "a just war?" Romans 13:1-7 shows that government is ordained of God and that government officials are ministers of God "to execute wrath on him who practices evil." For this reason we support the work of a policeman, and,

yes, a soldier as one who carries out God's plan for the nations. But can we identify the evil doer? In our local environment the evil doer is the one who fails to acknowledge law. On the international scene the evil doer violates the basic laws of human rights and/or the rights of nations to live in peace. During World War II Hitler clearly violated both of these principles and should have been opposed even at the price of war. Today Saddam has done the same and it is just to oppose him for what he has done and for the threat he is to people who love peace and human dignity. If we can identify who is right in a conflict, then we may conclude God is on that side. In some cases wars have no just side, but in the case of a threat to human rights and peaceful existence, Saddam may be stopped. Romans 13 gives us that right. If the U.S. was at war in Iraq to steal its oil fields, she would go beyond the just cause of opposing a ruthless dictator and both sides would be in the wrong. War is always a bad thing, but threats to human rights and world peace is a worse thing. As a nation we must be sure our motivation is right and go on to do what seems must be done. In the meantime, let us pray for peace, for our loved ones in uniform, and for a speedy resolution of the

#### "Heirs Of Life Together" Douglas L. Yates I Peter 3:7

In my office I have several books that were written by one of the leading church growth experts. His name is Donald McGavran and he was a professor at Fuller Seminary in California before he passed away. Donald McGavran was not a member of the church of Christ but he sometimes spoke about the church. Once, during a lecture, he said regarding the church: "For a church to claim to be a New Testament church because it has the right form, as it regards to deacons and elders, and the right ritual in regard to communion and baptism, and the right name is, to be sure, good. But the claims sound a little hollow when the New Testament life and exuberant ability to proclaim the Gospel and propagate churches are lacking. A marble statue of a horse might exhibit all the outward forms of a horse but if it can't run or father colts, then it really can't claim to be a horse. To truly be the New Testament church, the membership must desire to grow." He then added, "The churches of Christ in the United States, with their ardent belief in the Bible as God's authoritative infallible revelation, with their great stress on the priesthood of all believers and lay leadership, following the simple original form of Christianity so clearly demonstrated in the pages of the New Testament, have a marvelous opportunity to communicate Christ .... I pray God's richest blessings on the churches of Christ as they surge out to the ripe fields all around, and experience the joy of harvest." You probably noticed that McGavran issued both a warning as well as a commendation to the churches of Christ. First, his warning was simply that because we wear the name of Christ doesn't necessarily mean we are Christians. According to McGavran, what makes us Christians is if we believe so compassionately in what we profess that we are willing to share that message with others. Second, he commended the church for understanding the importance of following God's set standard rule of authority: the Bible. McGavran also writes concerning the way in which we can become compassionate concerning church growth. His thought is that each church should utilize their Bible school program to focus on the Great Commission, which is exactly what we are attempting to do here at West Erwin.



#### **NOTES OF INTEREST**

We are excited about a number of happenings around West Erwin in these days. In addition to the countless acts of service being performed on a daily basis, our attendance at our church meetings is encouraging. As you know we have experimented with some changes in meeting times over the past year or so on Sunday evenings and I want to share with you some of Doug Yates findings.

- 1. Our average attendance on Sunday evenings in 2002 was 366 (excluding one Sunday evening when we hosted an area wide meeting).
- On September 16, 2001 we began meeting at 5:30 on the third Sunday evening of each month to accommodate our Small Groups which met after our worship service.
- From September 16, through October 2002, we met at 6:00 p.m. on Sundays except on the third Sunday when we met at 5:30. During these 51 weeks we averaged 359 and on the third Sunday we averaged 340.
- 4. Beginning in October 2002 we moved every Sunday evening meeting to 5:00 p.m. During the next 21 weeks

- we averaged 380 (compared to the 359 average for the previous 51 weeks). On Small Group nights we averaged 402 (compared to the 340 average on Small Group nights when we met at 5:30).
- Our highest attendance on Sunday evenings has been during the 21 weeks we have met at 5:00 and our lowest attendance was during the time we met at 5:30.
- Observation Some of our members prefer meeting at the old time of 6:00 p.m. Those involved in Small Groups need more time after worship than 6:00 allows. However, the 5:30 time on Small Group nights did not work well for us. Our attendance has been consistently higher since we have been meeting at 5:00. This is still an experiment to be further evaluated later this year. Two things are certain: we will cooperate in what seems to be best for the whole church, won't we?; and a going church for a coming Lord needs to average over 400 on Sunday nights. We solicit your help in prayers and involvement.

Over the years, I have heard a lot of people say, "I wish I had invested \$1,000.00 in Wal-Mart when it first started. If I had, I'd be worth over \$1,000,000.00 today." day and age. Since 1960 total nonviolent crimes among juveniles has risen by 300% and total violent crime is up 500%. The question we must ask and attempt to answer is "why?" Why have we allowed ourselves, as a nation, to get in such a condition? Perhaps the answer is, "We have forgotten God!" We have forgotten to teach our children as instructed in Deuteronomy 6 (1) when we put them to bed, (2) when they rise up in the morning, (3) when they are working, and (4) when they are at play. Nations have suffered because of inconsistent teachings regarding God. Even though nations have struggled with the training process, the church should certainly be able to rise above such ineptitude. As far as the church is concerned, surely we can have a positive impact on our youth so they can break the inconsistent pattern which seems to exist today. It begins in our homes as godly parents sharing the inspired, inerrant, authoritative Word of God with our children. It continues on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings as godly teachers break the bread of life with their students, and it continues by example as we strive to be Christ like in all that we say and do. Let's put God first for ourselves and also for our children.

Try as we may, we will never outrun our responsibility to meet the enemy (Satan) head on and to be prepared to do battle with him. We'd better be prepared because let me assure you, Satan has no intention on giving up on tricking us into sinning. You can run from Satan but no matter where you go he's going to be there also. It reminds me of a Civil War story as told by Brigadier General E.P. Alexander just after the signing of Lee's surrender at Appomattox. Brigadier General Alexander saw a farmer that he recognized from the first battle at Bull Run (which took place at the beginning of the Civil War). The man's name was Wilmer McLean. McLean owned a large farm at Bull Run on which the battle took place. So devastated was that property after the battle ended that McLean decided that he would sell the property and move far away. His prayer was that he would never see another soldier for the rest of his life. After selling the property, McLean moved to a small town 200 miles away, in the

middle of nowhere. And for a few years he was safe from the battles of the Civil War. He thought he had made the right decision but then it happened again. Here came the soldiers with their cannons, guns, and horses. They tore up his property once again and laid his house to ruin. The town that McLean had moved to was Appomattox. The first major battle of the Civil War took place on his property and the last major battle of the Civil War took place on his property. Too often today Christians are a lot like McLean. We try to run but to no avail. We cower down and refuse to make a stand. The Bible doesn't teach such nonsense but instead it encourages us to "resist the devil and he will flee from us." If we want to be victorious in our battles with Satan, it will come (giving God the glory) because we have prepared ourselves for battle. We have put on truth, righteousness, peace, faith and salvation through a study of His Word (Ephesians 6:11-17). One way in which we can be prepared is by attending our Bible classes. 

#### THE HOLY SPIRIT

Generally we are more comfortable in talking about God and Christ than we are the Holy Spirit. Most of us in the church believe in the Godhead -- that three persons make up the Deity, namely the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Some reject this idea asking, "How can there be one God and three Persons?" However, the issue may be made clear if we remember that when we say there is one God, we mean one Deity or one Godhood or one God family and that there are three Persons in that one God family. In a human family there may be a father, a mother, and a child comprising one family. While this illustration should not be pushed too far, it does demonstrate how Father. Son and Holv Spirit comprise one God. The problem is, we tend to equate "God" with the Father instead of with "God family." There is one Godhood consisting of three Persons. All three Persons were involved in the physical creation of the world. The Father created, through the agency of the one we know as the Son, and the Spirit gave it order (see Genesis 1:1-2; John 1:1-3, 14; Job 26:13). All three Persons were involved in the Divine plan to save man from his sin as the Father purposed, the Son fulfilled the purpose, and the Holy Spirit made the purpose known (see Ephesians 2:10-11; Acts 2:22-24; I Corinthians 2:13). Questions usually arise concerning the Holy Spirit in regard to the Spirit's

work in the lives of people. For example, the Spirit convicts the world of sin (John 16:8), but how? The Spirit is given as a gift to those who obey the gospel (Acts 2:38), but how? The Spirit strengthens us (Ephesians 3:16), but how? It is always right to speak about any subject in the language of Scripture. So how did the Spirit convict men of sin in Acts 2? It was through the preaching of the Spirit's message by the apostles (see verses 4, 14-35, 36-38). The Spirit is given as a gift to those who obey the gospel (Acts 2:38 and 5:32). This means the Spirit dwells in the Christian's body (I Corinthians 6:19) and He strengthens us by His power in the inner man enabling God to do far above all that we can think or ask through His power at work in us (Ephesians 3:16, 20). If a man desires to know and obey the truth, God in His providence will bring that man and the gospel together (see John 7:17), but there is no biblical evidence that the Holy Spirit comes directly to the non-Christian. As a matter of fact, in every conversion story of the book of Acts, human messengers came to sinners with the gospel. We will never understand completely the workings of God in this world and we must not place limitations upon God which He does not place upon Himself, but in every biblical subject, including the Holy Spirit, let's speak the language of Scripture.

#### **TIME**

Benjamin Franklin supposedly said, "Dost thou love life? Then don't waste time; for that's the stuff life's made of." The apostle Paul said, "Redeem (i.e., buy up or make the best use of -- JPL) the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:16). Time is an important commodity given to all of us one second at a time, 24 hours each day, and 168 hours in a week. Based upon the Bible's "three score years and ten" (Psalm 90:10) or 70 years, Dr. Leslie Weatherhead calculated what time it is for each of us based upon our age: if your age is 15, the time is 10:25 a.m.; if you are 20, the time is 11:34.; if 25, the time is 12:42 p.m.; if 30, it is 1:51 p.m.; if 35, it is 3:00 p.m.; if 40, it is 4:08 p.m.; if 45, it is 5:16 lives? p.m.; if 50m it is 6:25 p.m.; if 55, it is 7:34 p.m.; if 60, it is 8:42 p.m.; if 65, it is 9:51 p.m.; if 70, it is 11:00 p.m. What time is it for you? Another good question is: How do we use our time? If one lives to be 70 and is an average person, he spends: 20 years sleeping; 20 years working; 6 years eating; 7 years playing: 5 years dressing; 1 year on the phone (in Danny Snell's case this is increased to 10 years and something else must give up its time); 3 years in waiting (for married men this increases to 10 years and see above); and 1 ½ years in church (provided he attends 3 times

a week). Attending church cannot be an accurate measurement of spiritual growth, but think about it: we spend 2% of our time in church, provided we attend all services, without missing a single one, over a period of 52 weeks! With some qualification (realizing we may spend some time in private study and meditation and we may attend special meetings and group sessions) we spend, on the average, little time in developing our spiritual lives in comparison to the other things that occupy our time. Is it any wonder that we continue to emphasize that we must take advantage of every opportunity to enhance our spiritual


#### ELDER APPRECIATION RECEPTION

These children are from the poorer neighborhoods of Managua. Most of them do not even have access to proper water supplies, a usable sewer system, or a source of electricity. Even though this program will not deal with providing them with these items, it will deal with providing them with a nutritious meal to start off the day. They will receive physical food as well as spiritual food. Thanks, Marian, for organizing this campaign.

#### **TRUTH**

I talk with people very often about truth. In our day there are many who follow human reason, especially in religion. Human reason affirms things like: "There is no absolute truth." "Truth is what you believe to be truth." "What is truth to you may not be truth to me." And on and on it goes. This kind of reasoning seems satisfying to lots of people even though it contradicts itself by stating that to these folks their "truth" is that there is no truth. Moreover, this point of view does not hold up in the public school room or the university classroom. After all, if one approached history or math or chemistry or English in this way the result would be chaotic. There is absolute truth. The sun is 93 million miles from earth; H20 is water; "I work" is a verb: Columbus did sail the ocean blue in 1492; Jesus is the Son of God and His Word is religious truth (John 17:17). Human experience points out the folly of following strict human reason -the airplane pilot who doesn't trust his instruments may crash into a mountain even though he sincerely believed he was flying higher than he was. The Bible warns about the folly of following human reason to the exclusion of truth: "There is a way that us seek to agree with God and acknowledge that His word is seems right to a man, but its end is the way of death" (Proverbs 14:12). So, let us stand for the truth of God's Word and let it be

the standard for all religious matters. We can stand for the truth of God, and do so boldly, without being caustic, belligerent, or hateful. Recently a man wrote to me after seeing a Search program. He disagreed with me on some point. I wrote him a letter and in as kind a manner as I knew how I explained my understanding of the Scripture in question. A few days later he responded to tell me that my explanation had cleared up the matter for him and he understood what he had previously misunderstood. In discussing Scripture with people, we do not always agree, but we nearly always keep a friendship between us. There is a vast difference in pointing out what we believe the Scripture to teach and reasons for believing what we do than in viewing every position that one may have as equally valid. It is amazing to me that so many people can express emphatically their views which clearly contradict Scripture and we are reluctant to state what the Scriptures clearly teach. Let us study Scripture, prayerfully seek to understand and apply it, and then lovingly state in word and deed that the Bible is the standard. Let

#### WAR AND PEACE

Through the years world events have forced people to contemplate the reality of war and peace. As the dark clouds of war have loomed, some world leaders have worked hard to keep the peace while others have been determined to go to war. In times of impending war, believers have struggled with the issue of whether a Christian can participate in carnal warfare. Some have responded affirmatively saying a soldier is an instrument of the state and is ordained by God to punish evil doers (Romans 13:1-8). Other responded negatively saying the command to love one's enemies prohibits a Christian to go to war and he can have nothing to do with it. Still others occupied a position somewhere between those two extremes. During World War II there were Christians who entered the armed forces as combatants and Christians who served, but as noncombatants. The fact is that in world conflict everyone contributed to the war effort on some level from the soldiers who fought to the farmers and industry workers who supplied the war machine. However, questions remained: Can a Christian be a soldier? Can a Christian support his government in a war effort? Who are the good guys and the bad guys in a war? Is a "just war" to be justified? And, what is a "just war"? Many grappled with these issues during World War II, Korea, Viet Nam, the Gulf War, and now in midst of the prospects of going to war with Iraq. It is not our purpose here to debate the wisdom of going to war with Iraq or whether or not we should overthrow that government. Our purpose is to discuss the question of whether or not a war is ever justified and whether or not a Christian can

actively support any war. First, government is ordained of God and a soldier or a policeman is an instrument of the state to insure an orderly society (Romans 13). Second, because a soldier or a policeman is an instrument of the state and is not responding to an evil in a personal way he does not violate the command to love enemies, turn the other cheek, or go a second mile. Third, all war is bad, but sometimes we do not choose between good and bad but between bad and worse. Many believe going to war with Hitler was bad, but to allow him to conquer the world was worse and he had to be stopped. Today there are those who believe Saddam is a legitimate threat to the western way of life and that it is better to topple him now than to risk the destruction he will bring upon the world later. Before World War II Britain's Chamberlain negotiated with Hitler to achieve "peace in our times" but history shows the difficulty of negotiating with a ruthless madman. History also shows that had Great Britain and the rest of the free world listened to Winston Churchill and moved to stop Hitler early, countless thousands of lives would have been spared. The issue of war is bad. A nation going to war against her neighbors to take what isn't hers or to expand her borders, or to gain an illegitimate advantage is one thing. But, for a nation to go to war to defend itself against an evil aggressor is something quite different. What is a Christian to do? Through all the rumblings of a possible war, let us pray for peace. In the face of attack, let us negotiate. When negotiations fail, let us rise up and defend our free rights.

#### INDEBTED TO MANY

Recently during a sermon, which I called "The State Of The Church", I discussed our great past, our gratifying present, and our glorious future as a church. During the presentation of that message I asked for a show of hands by those who had been at West Erwin for eighteen years or less and then by those who have been here more than eighteen years (I chose eighteen years as the dividing line because my ministry here has covered that length of time). Perhaps to the surprise of many, more than 50% of the people in that Sunday morning audience of about 600 have been here less than eighteen years! We have accomplished much, with the blessings of God, in these years including five building projects, mission outreach, television, greater service to our community, spiritual and numerical growth, and more than a 100% increase in our giving. However, the work done in Tyler since the planting of the church here in 1885 was significant and we are indebted to many who have gone on before us. Most of us may have only heard names like Lemmons, Dunn, Mathis,

Etheridge, and McKenzie, but these men filled vital roles in the early years of this church. In later years names like Mackey, Metcalf, Holland, A. Rasco, and Thompson are remembered by old-timers as vital forces in the church. Still later in this church's history there were names like Rushing, Haws, Walker, Hardin, O'Bannon, Carpenter, Richey, and Massey remembered for faithful service. Of course there have been many others who have made great contributions to the work of Christ at West Erwin, but these who have been mentioned are some of those who were on the cutting edge of the progress of this church through the years and who have "all died in faith", but being "dead yet speak." What a tremendous debt of gratitude is owed to them by those of us who even now benefit from what they did! And now, to this list of great soldiers of the cross, we add the name of a dear brother, a faithful servant, a loving elder, Hillard Hughes. To them all we say, "Thank you. We honor your memory and pledge to leave a legacy as honorable as yours." -Jay Lockhart

#### "Heirs Of Life Together" Douglas L. Yates I Peter 3:7

The Gospel of Matthew records the account of Jesus walking on the Sea of Galilee. Peter sees Jesus and desires to walk on the water with the Lord. The Bible says: "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." So he said, "Come." And when Peter had come down out of the boat, he walked on the water to go to Jesus. But when he saw that the wind was boisterous, he was afraid; and beginning to sink he cried out saying, "Lord, save me!" And immediately Jesus stretched out his hand and caught him, and said to him, "O ye of little faith, why did you doubt?" (Matthew 14:28-31).

What we find here is that Peter loses focus of his goal and begins to fail. His intentions were good and the Lord allowed him to walk on the water, but when he stopped focusing on Jesus he began to sink.

The Bible tells us some will challenge our focus on living for Christ. In fact, Paul writes in 2 Timothy 3:12 that "... all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." We can know and accept that there will be difficulties in following Christ. We must be prepared to meet these challenges along the

II Corinthians 5:7 gives us at least one solution. Paul tells us, "we walk by faith, not by sight."







#### "AS HIS CUSTOM WAS"

We know little about the early life of Christ upon the earth. synagogue on the Sabbath day. Luke says, "so he came to Except for the birth narratives of Matthew and Luke and a brief look at Jesus by Luke when he was twelve years old, the first thirty years of Jesus' life are silent. Yet we believe we know what was happening in his life from his birth until he began his ministry. We know the family of Jesus was poor because Joseph and Mary offered a sacrifice of doves or pigeons when they presented Jesus to the Lord at the temple (see Luke 2:24 and Leviticus 12:8). We know Joseph, the legal guardian of Jesus, was a carpenter (Matthew 13:55) and would have taught Jesus his trade (the rabbis said, "He who does not teach his son a useful trade is bringing him up to be a thief"). The home life of Jesus gave him a balanced development as the "increased in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men" (Luke 2:52). Jesus also might have attended one of the synagogue schools for children that scholars believe existed all over Palestine in the period of his youth. We know this for sure: when Jesus was growing to manhood and preparing for his personal ministry, he attended the

Nazareth, where he had been brought up. And as his custom was, he went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day and stood up to read" (Luke 2:16). Some scholars believe his reading was the custom, but the message is the same: he could not read regularly in the synagogue unless he was in attendance, so Jesus attended synagogue services on a regular basis. It wasn't a matter of convenience or take-it-or-leave-it or sometimes, but it was a matter of commitment: "as his custom was." Jesus felt the need to be in worship assemblies of his day and it was a "habit" (something repeated regularly) with him. If the Son of God felt this need, how much more should I, needy as I am, feel the compulsion to meet with God's family, the church, on a regular basis. God knew I would benefit from the church assemblies, so he said, "Nor forsaking the assembling of ourselves together" (Hebrews 10:25). If you are not in the "habit" or you are out of the "habit" why not make the commitment as we being a new year to assemble regularly - Jay Lockhart with the saints.
