Reflections on 2008

2008 has been a tremendous year at West Erwin. God has blessed us richly in many ways. As we draw 2008 to a close and look forward into 2009, I wanted to take a few moments and share some reflections with you.

2008 marked a year of change in our staff. Early in the year, Doug Yates announced his move to Clarksville, TN, and then Jo Butler passed away unexpectedly in April. Later in the year we hired Michael Whitworth as Education Minister, and Lindsay Kelly as secretary. Both are excellent additions to our staff. Israel Sandoval was also added as Hispanic Minister and is doing an excellent job with our Spanish speaking classes and worship.

2008 also marked some milestones for other staff members. On September 28th, West Erwin celebrated 40 years of service by Frances McBee, 20 years of service by Danny Snell, and 42 years of service by Leonard Thompson. West Erwin is blessed with longevity of service.

Among other things, Don Crawford did a wonderful job helping to coordinate the ever-increasing needs for food, clothing and other assistance in our community. With Hurricane Ike, the demands on our Benevolence Center increased and many more families were assisted this year.

Our overall numbers were increasing this year at

West Erwin. Our Sunday morning attendance rose 34 over last year's number to an average of 709 per Sunday. Bible Class saw an increase of 26 to an average of 447. Our evening service also increased by 12 to 416 per Sunday night service. However, our Wednesday numbers declined by 7 to an average of 338.

We had 68 members place their membership with us along with 27 of their family members. That's the second highest number to place membership with us in this decade. There were 3 babies born and we had 13 of our members to pass away in 2008.

We witnessed 41 people put on their Lord in baptism this year. That is more than double our average for the past 10 years.

Our contribution for 2008 was phenomenal. \$1,675,223 was contributed overall. That's \$320,103 over the budget for the year. We are truly blessed people.

No one knows for sure what the future holds. But my forecast for 2009 is bright for the Christians at West Erwin. I can see us meeting challenges, growing closer, reaching more, loving more and finding more blessings from God. Thank you for a great 2008. Pray for even more of God's glory to shine in 2009.







Thankful In All Things

On Sunday I spoke with some of our members who 21, when He said, had recently been traveling. They told me that while on their trip someone broke into their hotel room and stole several items, including some jewelry.

Isn't it a shame that anyone would want to take what is not theirs? But let's face it. In this culture of ours we will face many people who are not going to make the right choices. The key for us is to keep the proper perspective in life no matter what happens to us, whether it is something good or something evil.

I am reminded of the account of the English minister and commentator, Matthew Henry (1662-1714). and what he wrote in his diary after he was robbed. Notice his attitude.

> Let me be thankful - first because I was never robbed before. Second, because although they took my wallet they did not take my life. Third, because although they took my all, it was not much. Fourth, because it was I who was robbed, not I who robbed.

Naturally we find it disturbing when someone steals what is ours. Jesus addressed this in part in Matthew 6:19-

Open Our Eyes That We May See...

"Our Blessings" and continually praise God for them.

"Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

In the sermons this month we have been placing our focus on our blessings and how we should be thankful to God. But life's setback can also produce an opportunity to thank God, just as Matthew Henry had learned.

Paul encourages us in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 when he says, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, in everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

Have you spent time today to thank God for your blessings as well as your struggles? If not, now would be a great time to let God know that you are thankful in all

here?





What's In Your Bible?

A series of television commercials for a credit card company asks the question, "What's in your wallet?" They hope to impress the viewers with the benefits that their card offers.

In a similar fashion, we might ask the question today, "What's in your Bible?" What would we see when we open it up?

Over the years many versions of the Bible have been published and some of these are known for the oddities or mistakes that they contained. Here is a short list of a few of these Bibles.

The Breeches Bible, 1579. This was so called since Genesis 3:7 was translated, "The eyes of them bothe were opened...and they sowed figge-tree leaves together, and made themselves breeches."

The Place-maker's Bible. This rendered Matthew 5:9, "Blessed are the placemakers, for they shall be called the children of God." Of course this should have been peacemakers.

The Unrighteous Bible, 1652. This Bible contained an error in 1 Corinthians 6:9 that said, "Know ye not that the unrighteous shall inherit the Kingdom of God?"

The Adulterer's Bible, 1632. This one must have opened a few eyes for the omission of the word, *not*. In

this Bible the 7th commandment is rendered, "Thou shalt commit adultery."

Isn't it wonderful that today we can avoid many of these careless errors in our Bibles? We can trust the contents and the texts of our copies of God's word.

This past week I've had the occasion to reacquaint myself with every page of my Bible. You see, last week my Bible that I've used for the past 9 years began to fall apart.

I was sad at the moment because that Bible was really "broken in." But a few years back I had purchased an identical Bible in anticipation of when the current one gave way.

So for a little time each day, I've been going through my Bible, page by page, and transferring my highlights, notes and other marks from one Bible to another. This has been a really wonderful exercise. As I turned each page I was being reminded of all the wonderful stories, facts, lessons and commands that God has preserved in the Bible for us.

But beyond that, I'm able to see the evidence of my past journeys in God's word. And that, my friends, helps to draw me closer to God more and more.

"If I only had more time." How many times have we heard or said the statement? Chances are pretty good that we are all very familiar with the concept of running out of time.



Moments With Mike

Pick A God, Any God

In our culture of consumerism it shouldn't come as a surprise that people "shop" around for gods all the time. Oh, I don't mean to imply that Wal-Mart or Macy's has a special section for deity. Rather, I'm speaking of the process whereby so many people bounce from one god to another looking for the right one for them.

From the Christian perspective such a process surely seems odd if not preposterous. Yet even in the Bible many people were abandoning the true God while searching for other gods to take His place.

You might well ask, "Why would anyone abandon God in favor of some other god?" Excellent question. Let's examine a couple of examples from the Bible.

In Exodus 32, the children of Israel tired of waiting for Moses to come back from Mount Sinai. They convinced Aaron to help them manufacture a "god" that would go before them. They collected gold and formed it into a golden calf.

When that idol was completed, the people proclaimed, "This is your god, O Israel, that brought you out of the land of Egypt" (Exod. 32:4). Upon seeing the calf, Aaron built an alter before it and set a time for a feast.

Obviously this gold idol could not have been responsible for freeing the Israelites from bondage. Yet,

they people seemed happy to have anything in their eyes that they could worship. Their faith in God and Moses has faded quickly. They were impatient and wanted a new god.

In 1 Kings 18, Elijah faces a similar situation where God's people had chosen another god to worship. The prophets of Baal had influenced the people to leave the true God. Elijah challenged them by saying, "How long will you falter between two opinions? If the Lord is God, follow Him; but if Baal, follow Him." That verse (21) continues to say that the "people answered him not a word."

Elijah proved the true God to be the only one worthy of worship and once again God's people are convinced to come back to the real God.

Today things are not much different. Like the people of the Old Testament, we have very short memories when recalling the blessings of God. When times become difficult or when our patience with God wears thin, we go shopping for another god to better suit our needs.

But let us remember that there is only one true God. Let us recall Peter's response when many were leaving Jesus and when Jesus asked if they would leave also. He said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68).

What do you do when you realize that you are the most powerful person in the room? On the eve of his death, Jesus assembled the disciples in an upper room. He then removed his outer garment (John 13:4), the external symbol of his earthly authority, and began to wash the feet of his disciples (13:5). All the while, he knew he was the most powerful person in the room (13:3).

When he resumed his place at the table, Jesus asked if they understood what he had done. As the most powerful person in the room, he had washed their feet. They no longer had an excuse for refusing to do the same. He then gave them this principle: No servant is greater than his master (13:16). So I ask again: What do you do when you realize that you are the most powerful person in the room? All of us enjoy a measure of power as parents, older siblings, employers, voters, civil servants, and even as volunteers here at West Erwin. But how are we leveraging our power? For the good of others? Or to glorify ourselves? Jesus gives a gentle, yet firm warning: Use power to benefit others, rather than for selfpromotion. Otherwise, a person may be guilty of elevating the servant above the Master.

What Sermon Does Your Life Preach?

I have spoken in the past of Felton Spraggins, who was a wonderful friend and who was our preacher in Georgia until his untimely death in 1990. Felton exhibited so many positive traits which have influenced my life and my ministry. He had a genuine sense of friendliness and was a great encourager. In fact, he encouraged me to go into the pulpit.

I came across one of Felton's articles recently and wanted to share it with you. Felton cared deeply for personal evangelism and outreach, and he reminded us often that the world sees all of us as the church, not just the preacher. Please consider his thoughts from 1984.

Peter sets forth the pattern for God's glorification among unbelievers through the Christian with these words, "having your conduct honorable among the Gentiles, that when they speak against you as evildoers, they may, by your good works which they observe, glorify God in the day of visitation" (1 Pet. 2:12). Not everyone is able to preach, sing or to teach publicly, but each of us can be a living epistle in which others may read of Christ.

A minister closed his sermon with an eloquent appeal. Among those accepting the invitation was a woman of wealth and high social standing. She gave the following statement regarding her response to the invitation.

"I want you to know just why I came forward tonight.

It was not due to any word spoken by the preacher. I stand here because of the influence of the little woman who sits here before me. Her fingers are roughed by toil, and the hard work of many years has stooped her low. She is just an obscure washerwoman who has served in my home for many years. I have never known her to become impatient, to speak an unkind word, or to do anything dishonorable. I know of countless little acts of unselfish love that adorn her life. I'm ashamed to say it, but I have openly sneered at her faith. Yet when my little girl died, this woman helped me to look beyond the grave and to shed my first tears of hope. The gentle magnetism of her life has drawn me to Christ. I want what has made her life so beautiful."

The little woman sitting near the front had eyes streaming with tears of joy. Addressing the congregation, the preacher said, "Let me introduce you to the real preacher of the evening."

Although we may not be eloquent with words or even able to write, all of us can glorify God with our lives. "Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven. (Matt. 5:16).

Felton's life is still "preaching" in my life. What about your life? What sermon is it preaching to others?

For the past several months, I have been involved with a rather in-depth study of Genesis. The benefits I have reaped from this study have been a great blessing, and I would like to share one of those benefits with you this week. Did you know that buried in the mundane chapter of Genesis 5, which contains the genealogy of Adam, we have an early announcement of the New Testament gospel?

English readers of the Old Testament often miss the significance of names, but such significance was not lost on the original Hebrew audience. The name Adam means "man." The name Seth means "appointed." The name Enosh means "frail" or "mortal." The name Kenan means "sorrow." Mahalalel means "Blessed God." Jared is derived from a Hebrew verb meaning "will descend." Enoch means "teaching." Methusaleh means "his death will bring," and he died in the year of the Flood. Lamech means "despairing" and comes from a root from which we get our English word lament. The final name, Noah, means "relief." Placed together, the ten names of Genesis 5 read, "Man appointed mortal sorrow; [the] blessed God will descend teaching [that] his death will bring [the] despairing relief." Tucked away in the names of the first family are hints of God's redemptive intentions. Thank God for that precious scheme of redemption!

"So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing by about the meaning of the passage he is reading. the word of God." Romans 10:17.

I believe very strongly in the Bible school program. Most of us live very busy lives, and if it were not for some



Life-change from start to finish. I have made this the goal of my ministry here at West Erwin. But what is the true nature of this life-change? As I mentioned Sunday morning, life-change goes far beyond the affirmation of certain religious beliefs. Being convicted of New Testament teachings is very important (1 Tim. 6:3), but right behavior is just as important as right beliefs (Eph. 4:1).

The message that Jesus brought to earth was an announcement of God's kingdom (Mark 1:15). Christ declared that God's transforming rule was now available to the whole world. All of us are soberly reminded at times that we are not all that God desires us to be. But as our Lord and Master, Jesus wants to bring change to our life that far surpasses New Year's resolutions and self-help books. He wants to overhaul our entire lives from start to finish so that we might be "thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:17).

We are admittedly a work-in-progress, a work that will continue our entire lives (Phil. 1:6). "For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works" (Eph. 2:10). The word "workmanship" in that verse is the Greek term poiema, from which we get our English word "poem." We are God's masterpiece or work of art...one that He is intent on completing in His own time. But we have our own responsibility to become "workable clay" in the Potter's hands. A paintbrush that will not cooperate with the artist is soon cast aside.

Sadly, many Christians settle for less than life-change. The devil convinces us that less than a 100% effort is still good enough. We settle for superficial indicators of "faithfulness," rather than the inward transformation of a renewed mind (Rom. 12:2). We collectively lower the bar of expectations, blind to the fact that we are missing out on spiritual greatness (John 10:10)! As C.S. Lewis once put it, we're like a child ignorantly wanting to go on making mud pies in the ghetto because we cannot conceive of what a "vacation on the beach" really means. When it comes to life-change, we are far too easily pleased.

Simply put, life-change means to progressively become what Jesus would be if he were living in our place. Each passing year finds us more compassionate, joyful, and gracious with courtesy and delight overflowing like rivers of living water. If such change becomes the story of your life and mine, Jesus will one day present us before our Father as "holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation" (Col. 1:22). Hallelujah, what a Savior!

Although I had not spoken to Nilas for many years, his influence is still very much with me and I'm sure with many other preachers who were encouraged by him. There is really no way to quantify the amount of good that has occurred as a result of his encouraging words. I thank God for people like Nilas Manley.

When God And I Don't Agree

An old story is told of a battleship captain bringing his ship into port. In the fog of the night he spotted what he assumed was an oncoming vessel. He ordered that the warning horns be blown and then he attempted to contact the other ship on the radio.

Exerting his supreme authority and status he boomed, "I am the captain of this battleship and I order you to change your course immediately." But the reply he received was not exactly what he had expected. "Well, you may be the captain of that battleship, but I am the keeper of this lighthouse, and I suggest that you change your course before you run into the shore!" Imagine his situation when he realized that he was not the supreme authority that he supposed himself to be!

There are times in our lives when we may not be in agreement with God. What then? Should we stubbornly stick to our ways, or should we be open to embrace the ways of God?

As sinners outside of Christ, we realized that our actions/sins caused us to be separated from God and subject to His eternal punishment. (Isa. 59:1-2; Rom. 3:23; 6:23; 2 Thess. 1:7-9). Those facts helped us to seek God and find the remedy for our sins. Why? Because we realized that when we disagree with God, it is always God who is right.

Jeremiah wrote, "O LORD, I know the way of man is not in himself; It is not in man who walks to direct his own steps." Jer. 10:23. When we do not agree with what God has said, we must immediately realize that it is God who holds the supreme authority. God will always be right. We will not.

Even as Christians we may realize that we are not always in agreement with God. At these times, we must remember that it is God, not man, who holds the supreme authority in all matters. Through repentance, confession and prayer, we find that we can once again be in agreement with God. (1 John 1:9).

It doesn't matter how many times we blow our horns, express our rights, or exert our "authority." If a thing is wrong, then it is wrong. Just as the captain realized that he could not play "chicken" with a lighthouse and win, we also must realize that whenever we do not agree with God, it is always God who is right.

Solomon wrote, "There is a way that seems right to a man, But its end is the way of death." Prov. 14:12. Friends, if we ever find ourselves not in agreement with God, let us be humble enough to search His word and conform our ways to His ways. See you Sunday! Mike





Noah looked foolish building an ark in the Sarah looked foolish shopping for maternity clothes at ninety. David looked foolish going into battle against a giant with a slingshot. The Israelites looked foolish marching around Jericho blowing trumpets. Peter looked foolish climbing out of the boat in the middle of the lake. GOD looked foolish allowing His Son to be killed

on a cross. But that is how GOD works! His foolishness shamed the wise! We have never killed a giant with a slingshot; we have never seen walls come tumbling down; we have never walked on water because we are afraid of looking foolish!

GOD has not changed His methods. He still chooses "the lowly things of this world and the despised things — the things that are not — to nullify the things that are." He still wants to dazzle the world by shaming the strong and the wise. Why? So the world will turn to HIM. Therefore, do not allow the fear of looking foolish keep you from being and doing what GOD wants you to be and do. That fear comes from the enemy, Satan.

But a small detail of the story often escapes many. God never spoke to Naaman during the entire ordeal. Rather, He communicated his will through a slave girl, two kings, Elisha the prophet, Elisha's servant, and Naaman's servants. He spoke through **community**. Today, I believe the same to be true. Some may seek the will of God, only to hear nothing, and such may be so because we have not invested ourselves in the community of God. On the other hand, if we involve ourselves in a spiritual family, God speaks to us through that community and strengthens us during life's storms. If you are currently not part of a Bible class here at West Erwin, let me encourage you to start attending. Your life and faith will never be the same. God will cleanse you from start to finish, just as He did for Naaman.

Gumption

We don't use that word much anymore. What a shame. I grew up on that word. Another word might be "spizzerinctim." Having trouble with that one too? How can such good words just fall through the cracks never to be heard again?

Joshua had it and he did not hesitate to declare it in his famous "...as for me and my house..." speech (Josh 24:15).

Our nation is in a very trying time right now and as Christians we need to resurrect words like gumption and spizzerinctim to describe our stand for what we believe and in Whom we trust. We have never been so challenged as we are today to join Joshua in announcing: "as for me and my house we will serve the Lord!" Do you have the gumption to do so?



For much of my life, I have heard many preachers comment on the truth and wisdom of 1 Corinthians 3:6. In the context, Paul is convincing the Corinthian Christians that though he and Apollos were different men with different talents and abilities, they were both working towards the same goal and serving the same Lord. He says, "I planted, Apollos watered, but God gave the increase" (NKJV).

I have always appreciated the sentiment—that is until I learned that this verse is commonly mistranslated. Properly rendered, Paul states that he planted, Apollos watered, but God was giving the increase **all along**. In other words, Paul did his part, and Apollos did his as well, but God was at work in both of them from the beginning. None of us are a oneman show. Rather, God does great things through us by his power if we are united in Christ. One person may teach a class, a second may lead a prayer, and a third may serve as a greeter, but God works through all of us to give an increase. There is no "I" in team, but there is a "me" if you scramble the letters up. However, let us leave the scrambling to someone else and simply work to glorify our heavenly father in all that we do.






Unity Sand Ceremony

For those of you who attended Bryan and Rachael's wedding last Saturday, you witnessed something new and different, but most meaningful. For years many weddings have used what is called a Unity Candle where two candles are lighted at the beginning of the ceremony by the parents of the Bride and Groom. Then later in the ceremony the Bride and Groom each take their candle and light one candle to symbolize the unity of the marriage covenant.

The Unity Sand Ceremony very elegantly captured the meaning of the two lives becoming one. It also created a lasting keepsake as a reminder of what was taking place on that very special day.

Two different colors of sand are used and the Bride and Groom take turns pouring the sand into that special keepsake container. The sands blend together to symbolize how their two lives have been joined together to become one, never to be separated again....forever entwined.

I thought to myself, this is really what takes place when we become Christians. I thought how our baptism is the cleansing and purifying step that GOD has chosen to prepare us to become the Bride of Christ. And I thought how the entrance into the kingdom of GOD is like a marriage....a covenant relationship.....the blending of two beings, never to be separated again.....forever entwined. Moments With Mike

Dave Miller will be with us to present the Silencing Of God Seminar, June 9-11. The following is written by Dave.

Adolf Hitler is credited with saying: "By means of shrewd lies, unremittingly repeated, it is possible to make people believe that heaven is hell—and hell heaven. The greater the lie, the more readily it will be believed."

Americans have been subjected to just such lies. For over 40 years now, we have been told that the Founding Fathers advocated "separation of church

and state" and opposed public expressions of religion. We have been told that the Founding Fathers embraced "pluralism" and "multi-culturalism, and that they advocated acceptance of all religions as equally valid. We have been told that America was never intended to be a "Christian nation." And we have been bullied and berated with the claim that those who oppose immoral behaviors (like abortion and homosexuality) are "politically incorrect," ignorant, insensitive, intolerant, and lack compassion.

Indeed, the United States of America is in the throes of a full-scale war for its very life and soul. American society has been undergoing swift transition as social and political liberals, the ACLU, the NEA, and activist judges wage a vociferous

culture war. Make no mistake about their objective. They wish to expunge every manifestation of God, Christ, and the Bible from American life.

But America's intimate connection to Christianity from the very beginning was embedded deeply in our public way of life. Though the adversaries of the God of the Bible have been steadily chipping away at America's foundations for 50 years, many indications of our nation's Christian heritage remain. In fact, the evidence is overwhelming and breathtaking for those who care to take the time to recover America's forgotten past. The truth of the matter is that the vast majority of those who were responsible for

establishing this country believed that the Christian religion must be the basis of the Republic if their grand experiment was to last.

The Silencing of God Seminar is designed to awaken Christians to the urgent need to recall



our nation from the moral and spiritual depths to which she has plunged. It issues a stirring call to reaffirm the biblical values that are being systematically stripped from our public life.






From The Beginning

California was in the news last week with their supreme court decision to allow same-sex marriage. This comes as little surprise to most of us since the trend has been toward this type of outcome. However, from the beginning it has not been so.

How do we know that? Listen to the words of Jesus from Matthew 19:4-6:

And He answered and said to them. "Have vou not read that He who made them at the beginning 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate."

The "from the beginning" of course was a reference to Genesis 2 where God created Eve to be a companion for Adam. Isn't it a shame that this basic design for mankind has been distorted and perverted as we see today?

In an effort to justify homosexual behavior some scholars have suggested that the real sin of Sodom and Gomorrah was not homosexuality but in fact was a lack of hospitality. But anyone who has read the Book of Jude

verse 7 would know that "as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities around them in a similar manner to these, have given themselves over to sexual immorality and gone after strange flesh, are set forth as an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire."

Same-sex relationships have been around since the Old Testament days. They were condemned then and they are condemned today as well. In 1 Corinthians 6:9-11 Paul lists several sins including fornicators, homosexuals and sodomites. He states clearly that these will not inherit the kingdom of God. Some in Corinth had been guilty of these sins, but they changed. In verse 11 Paul says, "And such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God."

Friends, the political and cultural pressure is on to allow and condone all kinds of sin. But do not be deceived. From the very beginning God's plan was for marriage to be between a man and a woman.

As with any sin, may we see the wisdom in God's word and dedicate our lives to following that instead of our own desires. May we, like God, love those in sin and compel them to see the love of God and redemption through Jesus Christ.





Speaking of Mothers

has been some organized attempt to show respect and honor to mothers on a particular day. In our country, the concept of Mother's Day was first suggested in 1872 by Julia Ward Howe, who also wrote the words to the Battle Hymn of the Republic.

In 1907 Anna Jarvis organized a campaign to have Mother's Day celebrated nationwide. The concept gained in popularity and in 1914 President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed that the second Sunday in May should be a national holiday.

The Bible says that being a mother is a position that is filled with responsibility, love and honor.

Mothers are responsible. Solomon writes of mothers being industrious home managers, able to accomplish a wide array of tasks while causing her family to call her blessed. (Prov. 31:27-28). He also writes that as a parent, she should share the responsibility to train her children in the way they should go. (Prov. 22:7). Timothy was blessed to have a mother and a grandmother who taught him in the ways of God. (2 Tim. 1:5).

Mothers are full of love. In 1 Kings 3:16-28 we find the story of Solomon and the two mothers brought before him. One mother had accidentally smothered her infant during the night, and then replaced him with the son

History shows that as far back as the 1600's there of the other mother. The next day each mother claimed the live baby. Not knowing for sure which mother was telling the truth, Solomon exercised great wisdom by attempting to literally divide the live baby and give to each mother. Through love, the real mother quickly objected, seeking rather to see her son live without her than to be dead with her.

> Mothers are honorable. In the Old Testament, if a child showed disrespect to a parent by hitting or cursing them, they were to be put to death. (Ex. 21:15, 17). Solomon writes often about how we should honor our parent through our actions. (Prov. 1:8; 10:1; 15:20; 17:25; 19:26). God intends for our mothers to be respected, loved and honored.

> Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother," which is the first commandment with promise: "that it may be well with you and you may live long on the earth." (Eph.

> Certainly to have a special day of honor for our mothers is a worthy event. Gifts, favors and hugs certainly will make her day more enjoyable. But to really honor your mother, one should live righteously each and every day.

Unlearning

I read this week that we are born with only two innate fears: the fear of falling and the fear of loud noises. What that means is every other fear is learned. It also means every other fear besides falling and loud noises can be unlearned. Our learned fears are what keeps us from becoming what we were meant to be. I have also discovered that unlearning what I have learned is twice as hard.

In John 5 Jesus meets a man at the pool called Bethesda who had been crippled for 38

long, miserable years. He had learned the only way he could possibly be healed is by getting into the pool while the water is stirring, but no one would help him. Jesus came that day to uninstall what he had learned—that which had imprisoned him for so long. Jesus simply said, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk."

Faith, then, has two parts: one is learning what we don't know; secondly, unlearning what we do know...especially those misconceptions and fears that have crippled our spiritual growth. GOD has a plan for each of us. He wants to set us free to become what He knows we can be in order to glorify Him on this earth.

Unlearning is twice as hard- it is not impossible! Nothing is impossible for GOD.

BIBLICAL INSTITUTE OF CENTRAL AMERICA TRIP by Jay Bynum

A week ago this past Saturday three members of the mission committee, Jay Bynum, Aaron DuVall, and Todd Kempton accompanied by Israel Sandoval, Jose Martinez and his wife Rosa left Tyler to spend a week in Guatemala, Central America. The purpose of the trip was two fold. First to check on the work that West Erwin supports at the Biblical Institute of Central America (BICA) located in Guatemala City. Second, to work with the 38 students and staff of the school, in helping establish the first church of Christ in the city of Esquipulas, Guatemala.

After attending worship services Sunday morning with some 450 brethren and witnessing 3 baptisms at Iglesia de Cristo, Pinares del Norte, which is the largest church of Christ in Guatemala City, the group along with George Hall, left for Esquipulas. Located about 4 hrs east of Guatemala City, Esquipulas has a population over 20,000. The principal religions are Catholic and Pentecostal.

The days were spent in several neighborhoods and in the city's market area talking to people about Christ and inviting them to the campaign, (our version of a gospel meeting) that ran from Thursday thru Saturday. There were 13 baptisms before the campaign began resulting from bible studies with residents of the city, including the owners of the motel and one of their maids. By Saturday night there had been some 25 conversions and a church had been started in another Central American city.

While six went on the trip, all the members of West Erwin who have prayed and given of their means have had a part in this mission work and its success. Thank you for your prayers, support, and encouragement. Look for a complete presentation on the trip in the near future.

Moments With Mike

The Best Seat

When we attend certain events we often find ourselves our point of view as we humbly consider our position in trying to obtain the best seats. Ten rows up on the 50 life. yard line, courtside at the basketball game, or front row center for our child's play. But when we come to worship we often do not think in those same terms.

For years I listened as preachers, song leaders and others made requests that people move down closer to the front instead of staying in the balcony or in the rear seats. Especially when the numbers are down, those pleas certainly made sense. When we sit closer together we tend to sing better, fellowship more and also tend to encourage those who lead us.

However, the best seat in worship is not to be found merely in its location, either front row center, or in the very rear of the auditorium. From our human standpoint, the best seat in worship is the one occupied by you, wherever you choose to sit.

Having a concept of one place being better than another can create an occasion for favoritism or preferential treatment. James discusses this from the perspective of welcoming others in James 2:1-4 as he front, nor is it on the back row. The best seat is the one urges us not to treat the poor and wealthy differently. On the other hand, in Luke 14:8-11, Jesus addresses this from

"When you are invited by anyone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in the best place, lest one more honorable than you be invited by him; and he who invited you and him come and say to you, 'Give place to this man,' and then you begin with shame to take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit down in the lowest place, so that when he who invited you comes he may say to you, 'Friend, go up higher.' Then you will have glory in the presence of those who sit at the table with you. For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Wherever people decide to sit in our assemblies, it does not trouble me. I realize that they have made the commitment to come and worship God and I thank God for that commitment. What does trouble me is to realize that others who were capable of attending had made a decision that hour to stay away from the assembly.

No, friends, the best seat in the assembly is not up that you occupy when you come to join others in worship!

Relearning How to Cast

In other words Jesus is sufficient for every need, every desire, every problem, every challenge, every demand, and every struggle. HE can handle all your problems. The word "cast" means to throw. Throw all your worries and concerns and fears upon Jesus the Christ. Transfer them to this transference is the fact that HE cares for you.

Recently, I have been faced with a situation where I have been tempted to worry and I am relearning how to apply Peter's instructions. I have cast this over to Him who says He cares. It is His now. I refuse to worry about it any longer. How can I do this? Because I trust that HE cares. I have decided to walk forward and not back. When the situation tries to control my thoughts, I resist it. I refuse to worry about it. I have given it over to Christ who cares. And now enjoy a peace that belongs to me because of HIM. That peace is part of my inheritance.

As believers in Christ we are a new species. Humbling ourselves before the Lord and casting our cares on Him is our natural response. We are a worry free people! If you have forgotten this, take a quiet moment to hand your burdens, your cares, your fears over to HIM for He cares for you. Believe it.

It is never easy to say "goodbye" to anyone, especially those who are so much a part of our everyday lives. But for the Christian, it is more "see you later," than "goodbye," for we shall be reunited.

Oh what comfort we receive by knowing that this is not the end.

I had a unique opportunity to attend Harding University's Spring Sing this past week and I enjoyed it very much. I am a Freed Hardeman graduate and I never took a single class from Harding but I've always enjoyed visiting their campus. It is a beautiful campus. As usual, the campus was crowded with students and visitors walking, talking and throwing frisbees. So many activities were taking place that it kind of left me dizzy. As we walked around the campus, just outside the auditorium, we came upon a group of college students who were singing. A large audience gathered and so we went over and listened for awhile. The group sang several religious songs and they were well received by the audience. I started looking around the audience at the faces of those college students who were listening. I could tell that these students were really enjoying not just the voices of the singers but more importantly the message of those songs. It did me a lot of good to listen to the beauty of those voices blending together. It also did me a lot of good to observe the audience as they were edified through these wonderful songs.

"Dear Today, I was so sad this morning with the piece from the "scientist" who reported that monogamy was not a natural thing. First of all I'm sad that anyone could skew his understanding of our world into believing something like that, and secondly, I'm sad that the Today Show chose to even consider airing such a report.

Please, Today, as a citizen who is concerned about the direction that our country is taking morally, will you please start taking the high road on these moral issues? Media, unfortunately, is such a vital ingredient in the framing of the America Moral Compass, and I beg you to be more responsible in your choices.

GOD bless you with wisdom as you continue to make decisions about these very important issues."

When the rest of the Christian world rises up in this fight, demanding to be heard, perhaps then we will see some changes

I feel that often we miss out on such life altering moments. For whatever reason we sometimes don't put as much into our singing as we know we should. We become complacent and lackadaisical in our approach to this aspect of our worship to God. God gave us our voice and we should use that voice to His glory. Ephesians 5:19 tells us: "Speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord." What a great verse to motivate us to give our all to the Lord when we sing to Him. Let's also remember that when we sing we are implementing a great teaching technique to those who surround us. Remember, Colossians 3:16 tells us: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom: teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord." We should view our singing as a way to edify the believer and to evangelize the lost. It is a teaching moment for the believer and the non-believer as well. Those young men and women singing in front of the auditorium put me in the frame of mind to remember my Lord and Savior. They caused me to reflect on Ephesians 5:19 and Colossians 3:16. And when it was over I was glad that I stopped by to listen and observe and to be taught.

In the days that preceded his death, Jesus gave a prophecy which at that time must have seemed improbable to some that heard it. He said in John 12:32, "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men Sadly, some people do not yet realize that we can not unto myself."

Jesus was, of course, "lifted up" on the cross as our all. well as from the grave. His resurrection is one of the basic foundations of the Christian faith today. Not many doubt that Jesus actually lived on the earth. Skeptics record that He was a great teacher, but little more. But it is the fact of the resurrection that proves that Jesus was

Paul passionately reasons with the Christians at Corinth about the importance of the resurrection. In 1 Corinthians chapter 15, he devotes a long section to the arguments based on Christ being resurrected.

First, he tells us "Christ died for our sins." 1 Cor. 15:3. Second, Paul gives proof of Christ's resurrection with a list of eye witnesses in verses 5-8. Third, a convincing argument is given through vs. 19 that Jesus and may we renew our determination to draw ever if there is no resurrection, then Christ is still dead. If closer to Him. Christ is still dead, then we are all still in our sins, and if that is the case, then our religion is all in vain.

> In this Psalm David lays out his troubles, calls for God to attend to his cry and then to deliver him from his adversaries. His confidence in God is great and he ends by saying, "For You shall deal bountifully with me."

I like David's confidence that God will hear his God desires that we pray to Him and we have concerns and then deal with them properly. Likewise we also should have this confidence and attitude.

I don't know how many of you suffer from sleepless nights. I know that periodically I do. This problem usually occurs when I have a lot on my mind. I lay down to go to sleep and then my mind kicks into high gear. I may start thinking of a new ministry we are about to start or (in my case) a new work that I'm about to be engaged in. The flood gates of methods, techniques, etc., pour in and then for the next few hours I'm laying there with my eyes wide open. Other times I remain awake due to regrets or mistakes that I've made in my past. I start thinking about those things and here I am again 2 hours later with my eyes wide open. Sometimes my thoughts get pretty serious and at other times they are pretty silly. For example, the other night (for whatever reason) I started thinking about a basketball game that I coached over 20 years ago. We lost that game in the last few seconds. My coaching record in basketball was 119 wins and 65 losses. That's not a bad record; however, I tend to dwell on the losses more than the wins I guess because I always thought we should've won those games. So, over 20 years later I am still kept awake by a

last second loss. As my tenure draws to a close here at West Erwin I am experiencing sleepless nights. I am trying my best to finish my work here having everything lined up for the summer months. Generally I plan ahead for about 3 months at a time. You have to plan ahead if you are an education minister. Planning ahead for 6 months has been a challenge. A lot of you do not have your summer lined up and here I am asking you to make a commitment to us for the summer months. But there you are, agreeing to help even though the details may still be sketchy. I deeply appreciate all of our workers, teachers, helpers, speakers, etc. who have pitched in during the beginning of this transition and who have dedicated themselves to helping us out in this matter. There is one area that we really need to shore up before I go. I will be asking some of you to step up to the plate as teachers through the summer months. That will be my last official act here and I hope you will accept this challenge. This will take a lot of pressure off our elders if we can lock our teachers in for the summer months. Teaching is a labor of love that carries with it an enormous amount of responsibilities. So please consider this work and let's get busy for the Lord during the summer of 2008.

As the owner of the dog you must project calm, assertive energy. This is the only language he really understands. If the dog does not have that assertive director he, himself, will attempt to rule the home.

Incredible! Yet, I can't help but think that it is the same with people. That aggression is a symptom of an unsatisfied person -- one who has unfulfilled expectations in his life; the lack of exercise, discipline and affection is the reason so many of us are out of balance; and that without Christ as the King and Ruler of our lives we are trying to direct our own steps.

We had a great start to our new quarter. We have some great teachers in our classrooms and they are ready to go with their lessons. Let me encourage you to pick up one of the "Class Action" brochures and select a class and then attend that class each and every week. I am confident that at the end of the quarter you will be glad you did. Let me also encourage each of our students at West Erwin to thank their teachers for all of the time, energy and effort they put into their classes. I know that a lot is involved in this work and that it is very rewarding but I also know that a thank you goes a long way in the longevity of a teacher's career.

Several years ago I decided to become a teacher and I have not regretted that decision at all. At one time in my life (for about 5 years) I taught a Sunday morning Bible class; a Sunday night Bible class; a Wednesday evening Bible class and then at the Christian school I taught three Bible classes each day 5 days a week. I gained an enormous amount of experience in those years and it did not burn me out but rather motivated me to

continue in this line of work for the last 20+ years. It is a privilege to teach but with this privilege comes an awesome amount of responsibility. Some people seem to have a natural talent to stand before a crowd and teach in an almost ad-libbing way. Believe me, even though it looks like they are ad-libbing they really are not. They've studied this subject and know the material they are teaching.. They've become an expert on the subject matter and so with total confidence they teach their lesson. Other teachers stand before their students and they, too, seem to be ad-libbing. However, they do not know their subject matter and they have put little if any time into their material for class. They talk about a lot of things that they are confident in but it has little to do with God's Word. The difference between the two teachers is that the students of the teacher who has became an expert on the subject that he is teaching go away from their class with a world of knowledge, wisdom and understanding (Col. 1:9-10). The teacher who thinks he is an expert but who teaches on everything but God's Word, his students leave the classroom knowing no more about God's Word than when they came to class. That's a shame, isn't it? Let's study to show ourselves approved.

Are You Safe?

I'm writing this bulletin article from a hotel room in Jackson, Tennessee as I'm in the area for the annual Freed-Hardeman lectureships. But my plans for Tuesday evening were delayed for several hours as a severe storm passed by this area.

During the evening some 68 tornados were generated over 4 states and the results were very destructive. At the time of this writing some 44 people have been confirmed dead as a result of the nighttime storms.

One of the hardest hit areas of destruction is just one mile to the north of my hotel. The Union University campus is located just to the north of Interstate 40 and I'm staying on the south side of that same road. 8 or 9 students there were trapped for over an hour as several dorms suffered damage and collapse. Amazingly no one died in this area.

For most of the day reports were circulating of the pending line of storms. In fact, the tornado sirens were blaring downtown as I made my way back into Jackson from the lectureships. This town has been hit hard two other times in the past 8 years so they take warnings seriously, and with good reason. Minutes after I entered my room and turned on the news they showed my exact area and issued a warning. At that moment the power went off and stayed off for three hours.

"Are we safe?" No one knew for sure. "Where is the storm?" Reports quickly circulated of a dozen large trucks overturned just 12 miles to the west. Shortly afterwards the storm struck the area just a mile north of us.

We were all very fortunate to escape any damage or injury. As most of the hotel guests were huddled in the lobby you could hear many of them giving assurances of their safety to loved ones on the phone. "Are you safe?" was certainly an often asked question last night.

Friends, danger can come with or without warning in our lives. Spiritually or physically we need to be prepared to face the danger and protect ourselves accordingly.

One of my favorite verses in the Bible comes from Psalm 27:1, where David says, "The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; Of whom shall I be afraid?"

We can't stop temptation any more than we can stop a tornado. But we can heed the warnings, take cover and protect ourselves as we stay clear of the danger. We can also enjoy the assurances of knowing that we safe with the Lord. The residents of Jackson know that the time to prepare for safety is before the storm hits.

Are you safe from the storms of life? See you Sunday! Mike

Moments With Mike

Encourage Daily

Have you been encouraged lately? I know that I have been and I hope that you have been as well. Our attendance numbers are on the rise and we have seen 4 people become Christians already this year. Our membership is growing as well by people who have decided that West Erwin is the congregation for them. All of these things provide for a wonderful sense of encouragement.

Aubrey Johnson in his book, <u>The Barnabas</u> <u>Factor</u>, lists several aspects of the anatomy of an encourager. Here are a few of his thoughts condensed for us to consider.

The encourager should have:

- A Mind—to think good, pure and positive thoughts.
- Eyes—to perceive the good in every situation.
- Ears—to actively and enthusiastically listen to others.
- Lips—to verbally communicate respect and confidence.

 Hands—to sense and act on opportunities to do good.

Hebrews 3:12-13 says, "Beware, brethren, lest there be in any of you an evil heart of unbelief in departing from the living God; but exhort one another daily, while it is called 'Today,' lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin."

But, like the structured times of regular schools, they should also be teaching us how to keep on learning.

What then is true with us? Must we too be declared righteous by GOD? Or have we been taught to trust in a gospel of sin management?

It has become easy to verbalize that we trust the Lord for life after death, yet what proof have we shown the world of our trusting Him right now for everything in this life? How can we disconnect life now from faith and be declared righteous?

Gene Taylor recently wrote an article entitled: The \$3,000.00 Telephone. This article was published in the Sebring Parkway Church of Christ bulletin located in Sebring, Florida. Gene's article conveyed the following thought to the readers. It seems that 50 years ago the phone company would rent their phones out to their customers for \$5.00 per month. Eventually they stopped doing this unless a special request was made by the customer to continue. Gene Taylor's parents decided to continue paying the \$5.00 a month fee. That was in 1958 and this is 2008; that's 50 years at \$5.00 a month which equals \$3,000.00. That is quite an expensive phone. To the Taylors it just seemed so cheap to pay the \$5.00 per month that they never saw the need to change.

Many people are in the same boat when it comes to how they view the wages of sin. Sin seems pleasurable and convenient to them (Heb. 11:24-25). They get into a comfort zone which seems to have little if any pain associated with it and they stay in that comfort zone. What they do not realize is that this comfort zone is sin and if they stay in it they will be judged accordingly (Rom.

6:23). It seems to me that our responsibility as Christians (spiritually speaking) becomes how can we wake them up and get them moving in the right direction. Let me make the following assessment regarding at least one way: Attend a Bible class! For example, in my Sunday morning Bible class we are studying the book of Genesis. Listen to the Words of God as He described how the people of Noah's day were living: "And God saw the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." Genesis 6:6

These people were living in sin and they were also in a comfort zone, unwilling to listen to God. They perished. We've spent a lot of time in my class talking about Genesis 6 and we want desperately not to make the same mistake that the antediluvian people made. The only way we can be sure not to follow in their footsteps is to study God's Word and then live accordingly. That doesn't come by happenstance but rather by seeking out His Word and living faithfully to that Word. Our Bible classes are a wonderful way to strengthen our commitment to God and to try to help others along the way. Let's all be in class on Sunday!

Speaking of plans, our sermon for Sunday night will be on **Planning Your Life's Journey**. Will Rogers once said, "Plans get you into things,


but you got to work your way out." Someone else said, "It takes as much energy to wish as it does to plan."
