

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### Light in Darkness

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. And God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness. God called the light 'day,' and the darkness He called 'night.' And there was evening, and there was morning – the first day" (Genesis 1:1-5).

"God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness."

From the beginning of time. From Creation. From the word "go" (literally). Light is separated from darkness. They are opposed to one another. Where one is present the other is not.

The Apostle John proclaims, "God is light, in Him there is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5b). Christ boldly declares, "I AM the Light of the World" (John 8:12). And in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus calls us to be spiritual light in a spiritually dark world: "You are the light of the world!" (Matthew 5:14).

We are called to be light. Light in a world of darkness. Why is it that we so often toy with darkness? What is it that we too often concede and rationalize and justify any relationship with spiritual darkness? With that which is spiritually opposed to the God we serve?

The Apostle Paul writing of the spiritual tempo of our lives asks, "What fellowship does light have with darkness?" (2 Corinthians 6:14b). Light and darkness are enemies. The presence of one defies the presence of the other. How is that we can so easily walk out of spiritual light and into darkness? Is our faith so shallow?

In Ephesians 2:8 he asserts, "You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord." He doesn't even say, "We were once in darkness, but rather we were darkness." Outside of God. Outside of His light. But in Christ Jesus, our reality has radically changed.

Colossians 1:13 declares, "He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the Kingdom of the Son He loves."

John affirms our calling in Christ and challenges that if we "claim to have fellowship with God and yet walk (live) in darkness we lie and do not live by (in) the truth" (1 John 1:6).

The call is just that. To accept and live into the calling that we have in this life in Christ Jesus to be light in a spiritually dark world. A city on a hill that cannot be hidden (Matthew 5:14). A lamp on a stand that gives light to all (Matthew 5:15).

Where there is light, darkness scatters. In our lives and in the lives of those we influence to the glory of the God we serve.

Glory to God!

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### **Fostering Community**

When Tiersa and I were in High School I'd walk her to class whenever I could. If only for a few steps we would walk together in the same direction and talk just for a few seconds. I seem to remember a time or two that I was sent to the principal's office for having been late too often because I lingered too long at the door of Tiersa's class and failed to make it through the door of my next class before the bell. Ok, maybe it was more than a time or two....

There were also those times when there was no way to walk together. No time to talk. We were going in opposite directions. And so we'd pass notes. Any way to communicate and to stay connected during the day.

In many ways we are the most connected generation to date. Some would argue with that statement. But the means for communication are more abundant today than they have ever been in generations past. Nothing takes the place of face-to-face communication. But think of all the means by which we communicate. Telephones. Cell phones. Email. Snail mail. iPhones. iPads. iPods. iCecream (just wanted to see if you were paying attention). You can text, tweet, and blog, and if you're really good you can do all three, simultaneously. For the longest time I said that I wasn't going to get on Facebook until it was no longer in vogue. But eventually I started drinking the Kool-Aid. When it comes to means of communication, we are the most connected generation to date.

However in spite of mass communication and technological advancements in the ease of staying connected, many today still have no close friends. No one to whom they are near. Acquaintances? Sure. But no real friends. In a sea of humanity of nearly 7 billion many feel hopelessly adrift and alone.

Depression thrives in an environment of isolation. So does Satan.

God exists in community. Father, Son, and Spirit. We are created in the image of God. Spiritually. We are spiritual beings. As well, we are created to exist in community. With God. And with one another. A great part of why God has given us to one another as His church is that we commune with Him and with one another. We share life.

We are in need of recapturing the communal nature of faith (not Communion with a big "C" but rather communion – although too often we lose the communal nature of Communion as we come to the table).

As Christians I believe the answer is two fold:

- -First, we seek out closeness with God and closeness with one another. We pursue closeness with God and His church. It must be our priority.
- -And second, we seek out those who are struggling. Those who are disconnected from God and/or other believers. Those who are lonely. Those who are adrift. And we pursue avenues in which we might foster community (with God and His church) in their life.

Glory to God!

### REEVES' RHETORIC Less Complication. More Jesus.

I tend to make things more difficult than they need to be. I over-analyze. I over-think. I over-concern. I am too often more critical of myself than I ought to be. In some ways this way of thinking has served me well. In many, many ways, not so much.... Maybe you can relate?

To others the reverse perhaps is more the norm. Many are overly critical of others. The glass is always half-empty. Negativity reigns supreme. Aren't there some whom when you see them coming you cringe when you realize they're walking your direction? And now you're suddenly on a collision course with gloom and doom. You brace yourself because you immediately realize you're about to receive a beating that no one deserves. And not even necessarily because they're going to beat up on you, but because you know that whatever the conversation is, it's going to be negative. Aren't there some Christians you'd swear were baptized in lemon juice (and who watch way too much CNN)?

"Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt..." (Colossians 4:6).

Faith is not complicated. We make it much more complicated than it was ever intended to be. Too often we get in the way. The simplicity and beauty of the message we've received in Christ and its call to fidelity is central. The Gospel ought to bring calm. It ought to restore peace. It ought to grant clarity. It ought to. It's designed to. But does it? For you?

"Now, church, I want to remind you of the Gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this Gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures.... ...this is what we preach, and this is what you believed" (1 Corinthians 15:1-4,11b).

In faith we open our hearts to God. And we allow Him to be God. We trust Him. We share with Him. We live life near Him. And because of covenant and because He is God we breathe a sigh of relief. Because He is in control. And in Him we are a part of that which is so much greater than ourselves.

In faith we share with other believers. We are a part of one another in Jesus. We engage in, and share in, life. We ought to at least. Our relationships with believers in Christ should be our closest. And when we struggle in our relationships as His children, we work through them. We allow nothing to disrupt our connection to Him and to each other, because we belong to a magnificent Father and to one another in Jesus.

In faith we allow the message to be revealed through our priorities. Our thoughts. Our convictions. Our beliefs. Our conversations. Our relationships. It's the way it was designed to be. It's the way things ought to be. Less complication. More Jesus.

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### Choices

Joshua boldly declares to the people of God, "If serving the Lord seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the river, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord" (Joshua 24:15).

Elijah goes before the people of Israel assembled at Mt. Carmel and asks, "How long will you waver between two opinions?" (1 Kings 18:21).

We make choices every day. We have the God-given ability to choose. We choose to either hit the snooze button or wake up. We choose to wear green or blue. We choose our route to work (or allow traffic to make the decision for us). We choose where we have lunch. To have a fifth cup of coffee. Paper or plastic. To be or not to be (ok, maybe I'm getting a little too philosophical)... but you get the idea. We choose. We make choices all the time.

Some daily choices are pretty minor. They don't impact the grand scheme of life greatly at all. Other decisions are earthshattering. Will I choose to love my spouse today? Will I be patient with my children? Am I going to be faithful to God? These are major daily decisions. To love others. To be kind to others. To be faithful to God. Major decisions that somehow, too often, get lost.

God chooses. He chooses to love. He chooses to forgive. He chooses to be near. His nature and being are such that "light" and "love" define Him (1 John 1:5, 4:8). He is constant. He is unwavering. And He chooses.

God grants us the ability to choose. To choose Him. To choose faith. To choose faithfulness. But He does not fail to empower us to choose the way He desires.

The design of the Gospel of Christ reveals the choices of God. He could have redeemed mankind any way He desired. He is God. He is sovereign. But He chooses the cross and resurrection of Jesus. The Gospel teaches us not only of a Savior who willfully came to earth and emptied Himself and gave His physical life for our spiritual lives, but also enables us to see the choices of a wonderful God who chooses. And who chooses us.

God gives us His Son and His Spirit and His Word and His church. Why? So that we may choose. And so that we may choose Him.

### **Reacting to Thunder**

Growing up, I knew a lot of kids who were scared of thunder. When I had kids of my own, I decided I was going to try something—whenever it thundered, I put a big smile on my face and said, "Wow! Did you hear that thunder? Wasn't that incredible?

I found that the kids reacted to my response more than they reacted to the thunder itself, and it wasn't long before they would say with smiles of their own, "Dad! Did you hear that thunder?"

I think we underestimate how much people are affected, not by circumstances, but by our reaction to circumstances.

How do you react to bad news? "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Phil. 4:6-7)

How do you react to those who hurt you? "Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for to this you were called, that you may obtain a blessing." (I Pet. 3:9)

How do you react to people in need? "Do nothing from rivalry or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others." (Phil. 2:4)

Lately, people have been smiling a lot more often when it thunders. It's not because the thunder has changed, but because we're more hopeful that the thunder will be accompanied by rain.

Do you know what? Bad news is usually accompanied by growing faith, hurt is usually accompanied by growing patience, and needs are usually accompanied by growing opportunities to show brotherly love. And who couldn't use more faith, patience, and love?

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### The Voice of Wisdom

Wisdom. Wisdom is not on our radar often enough. We make choices based upon our feelings. Our emotions. Our own merit. Upon how we are affected. Upon our own understanding. Certainly these are a part of the decision-making process. But what about discernment? What about wisdom?

And what about when we make poor choices? Tragic choices? Intentional choices? When we sin? When we doubt? When we lash out in anger? When we respond selfishly? Self-servingly? Worldy? Where is wisdom then?

In the book of Proverbs wisdom is often personified. And wisdom is a woman. Read into this whatever you like.... But it's extremely interesting that the voice of wisdom speaks, she constantly calls for humility. She appeals to discernment. She pleads for fidelity.

"Wisdom calls aloud in the street, she raises her voice in the public squares; at the head of the noisy streets she cries out, in the gateways of the city she makes her speech..." (Proverbs 1:20).

She goes to where the people are. There is never any doubt as to her message. There is no question as to the need for wisdom. The need for discernment. Only the question of whether or not we will listen.

Do we seek wisdom from God? From His Word? From His Spirit? From His Son? God never contradicts Himself. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8). His character, His nature, His being, His purposes, are never changing. He is constant. He is true. He is just.

Wisdom pursues His will for our lives. Wisdom requests His will. Wisdom seeks His will. Wisdom accepts His will. Wisdom is discerning of His will and does not confuse His will with our own. Wisdom acknowledges His infiniteness. And our finiteness.

The Apostle Paul when writing in regard to the ways in which God has acted upon behalf of humankind, speaks of the wisdom of God and His graciousness revealed to us in and through the Gospel of Jesus. "It is because of Him (God) that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God - that is our righteousness, holiness, and redemption" (1 Corinthians 1:30). You see as believers true wisdom is found only in Christ. Only in life lived in Christ. Only in discerning God's will for our lives and having the courage and faithfulness to pursue His will.

As Christians the voice of wisdom calls to us. She calls us to right thinking. To objectivity. To faithful living. To pursue the will of God. To where true wisdom lies. In God. And in Christ.

But the question remains: Will we listen?



### REEVES' RHETORIC

### The Kingdom of God

"Are You Sowing the Seed of the Kingdom Brother" was a song that we sang in church often when I was growing up. Like most kids (and not a few adults) my brothers and I were at times bored with church. So we had to create ways to entertain ourselves. The only problem was that our mother and Granny Cranshaw sat in between us to separate us and keep us from getting into trouble. Therefore we had to be subtle. And so when Bill Mercer would lead "Are You Sowing the Seed of the Kingdom Brother" my brothers and I would smile as we sang. And no one knew why but us. Because what we actually sang was, "Are You Sowing the Seed of the King Dumb-Brother?" I can't sing that song today or even type about it now without smiling....

We sing about the Kingdom. We speak of the Kingdom of Heaven. We use Kingdom language. We hear of the Kingdom of God, "Father your Kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" (Matthew 6:10). "My question is: What do we mean? What is the Kingdom of God?

My belief and my assertion here is that our view of the Kingdom of God (and what we mean by "Kingdom") has a significant, direct impact upon our view of the Christian faith, and upon the way in which we see God at work within humanity and within us.

A man comes to Jesus and says, "Tell me, greatest command... what is it?" Jesus says, "Are you ready? Here it is, plain and simple: Love God." "And I know you only asked me for the greatest, but the second is so similar I'll go ahead and let you in on it too: Love others." And what's crazy is as this religious leader (who's top ten list of greatest commands of God, Jesus had just blown to bits) acknowledges the validity and profundity of what Christ has shared with him (love God and love others), he replies with, "You are correct in saying 'love God and love others.'" And I'm like, "Well duh, of course He's right, He's Jesus!" But as Jesus peers into the man's heart, and internalizes the sincerity and profound reality that all of the suddenthis guy really gets it! – Jesus affirms with a smile (I picture Him with a smile), "Oh dear friend, you are not far from the Kingdom of God" (Mark 12:28-34).

The New Testament Greek word for Kingdom is βασιλεια (bas-il-ay-ee-a). Βασιλεια is the reign of God. It is the rule of God. The Kingdom, rightly understood, is the reign and rule of God. His spiritual reign and rule. Just as we understand the concept of a physical kingdom in a Richard the Lionheart sort of way (that which is under the reign or rule of one physically), the Kingdom of God is the spiritual reign of God. Where? How? It is the reign, the rule of God, in the hearts and lives of those who have submitted their whole selves to the Lordship of Jesus Christ and who belong to (are subjects of) the Almighty God who is enthroned above.

<u>Kingdom of God</u>: the spiritual reign and rule of God in the hearts and lives of those who live under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

Oftentimes we leave the concept of Kingdom at salvation. And yet what Scripture calls us to is much more....

Glory to God!

### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

Searching for answers to the big questions of life

1 The words of the Teacher, son of David, king in Jerusalem: 2 "Meaningless! Meaningless!" says the Teacher. "Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless." 3 What do people gain from all their labors at which they toil under the sun?

Ecclesiastes 1:1-3

The Greek word "Ecclesiastes" is generally translated "the Preacher" or "the Teacher." The name of this book of the Bible is taken from the opening words in which the writer, Solomon, gives himself that title. The book is about Solomon's quest for meaning, how he tries many of the things people still try today, and how he concludes that none of them live up to their promise. In The Message, Peterson picks up on the "quest" of Solomon and calls him, "the Quester" rather than "the Preacher." In other words, the emphasis is on the search for meaning, happiness, and satisfaction rather than on the proclamation of the result of that search. Solomon wants more than power, wealth, fame, peace, and success. Having tried them all, he's convinced that they're not all they're cracked up to be. Actually, Ecclesiastes doesn't try very hard to give us "the answer" but it does a good job of asking "the question" concerning the search for answers to the big questions of life. Solomon is now an older man trying to make sense of the life he has lived. He may not have the answers to life's questions. but he knows who to ask. In our "quest" for answers we must continually turn to the source of all wisdom, the God who created us.



### REEVES' RHETORIC

### In With Both Feet

Imagine as Christ's church our having to meet in secret because of persecution. We tend to trivialize the notion in our Western worldview but the reality is that much of the church of both the past and present was/is forced to gather together in secrecy for the valid fear of oppression (either by government or society and culture). The first century church and Christians today in Muslim and Communist countries have much in common.

Beneath the city of Rome lies six hundred miles of "catacombs." The catacombs are underground burial places where Christians often met for worship and fellowship. For the almost three hundred years after Christ, Christians sought asylum in this underground maze of tunnels beneath Rome seeking to worship God in community with one another and as they were in constant fear of Roman violence.

In these underground tunnels a common inscription has been repeatedly found. Many recognize the symbol as the Jesus or Christian *fish* (the Greek word *ichthus* means "fish") but it served as an early acrostic, which stood for: "Jesus Christ, Son of God, our Savior." (I avoid acrostics at all costs in preaching – but this one I have to let slide....) What we have as magnets on the back of our luxury SUV's originally served as a ray of hope in caverns of darkness (physically and spiritually) for the early church.

I wonder about our investment of the Christian life. If in our ease of worship and ease of faith we aren't crippled in our commitment. Not that I'm praying for persecution. But in times of oppression in the church's history valiant faith has abounded. Why? Because it forced our hand whether we were in with both feet or not.

Here's my question: Are we? Are we all in? Are we completely, totally, whole-heartedly invested (heart, soul, and self) into the Christian life?

Luke records these words of our Savior: "Make every effort to enter through the narrow door, because many, I tell you, will try to enter and will not be able to" (Luke 13:24).

We're tempted to think that Jesus is talking about "them." I think it's about us....

Steadfastness. Dedication. Investment. An investment of self. An investment of life. We are too often too easily derailed.

We tend to take lightly the things we have not wholly invested in. The things we're not completely committed to. The same is especially true of faith. For this reason Christ calls us to make every effort.

Glory to God!

An Antarctic explorer advertisement from 1913: "Men wanted for hazardous journey. Small wages. Bitter cold. Long months of complete darkness. Constant danger. Safe return doubtful. Honour and recognition in case of success" and more than 5,000 men applied for the 26 job openings.

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### More Like Our Father

There have been plenty of times in my life when my mother has said to me, "Jason, you are just like your father." Depending upon what I was doing at the time and the tone of her voice it's been pretty easy to discern whether this was a good thing or not. After sharing a kind word or observing my meticulous way of doing things (which can sometimes be a curse rather than a blessing) she'll smile and say: "You are just like your father." Other times, perhaps after a bit of sarcasm or bout of stubbornness: "You are just like your father!"

The writer of Hebrews affirms Jesus as "the exact representation" of God's being (Hebrews 1:3).

The Apostle Paul writes, Christ "is the image of the invisible God" (Colossians 1:15).

Jesus Himself asserts, "If you've seen me, you've seen the Father" (John 14:9).

Christ represents God in every way. His being. His nature. His heart. So much so that to see Him is to see the Father. We too often think of Jesus as an idea, rather than as a person. But it proves difficult to follow an idea. "I am the Way. I am the Truth. I am the Life" (John 14:6). The way to God. The truth of God. The life that only God can give. All found not in the idea of Jesus, but rather, in the person of Jesus. He comes that we might have life. That we might have true, full life (John 10:10). And that we might follow Him.

Aren't we created in the image of God? Sure we are (Genesis 1:26-27). But in order to reveal Him. To reflect Him. To represent Him, in our lives, we must be shaped more and more into His image. And more and more into the image of His Son. The One whom we follow.

Jeremiah speaks on behalf of God and describes the Potter as He shapes the clay (Jeremiah 18). Of course Jeremiah is referring to God and Israel, but don't we fit into the illustration as well?

As we live life, God the Potter shapes us. He molds us. More and more into the people He desires for us to be. The Potter shapes the clay by applying pressure to the areas that need to be changed as the Potter's wheel turns. Our role in all of this? To be moldable. Pliable. To not resist the changes the Potter is making within us. Too often we refuse. We are made uncomfortable by the pressure applied. By the changes made. And yet what God is doing is shaping us. Shaping our lives. Shaping our hearts.

\* As He does and as we willingly allow Him to work within, I picture Him with a smile as He says: "You are more like your Father every day!"

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### Peace Like a River

Horatio Spafford and his wife Anna had moved from England to the United States to build a life together. They had 5 children: four daughters and a son. The family settled in Chicago where Spafford began a successful law practice.

Within a matter of a few years the couple's life began to fall apart. Their infant son passed away without warning in 1871. Later that same year Spafford's law office burned to the ground in the Great Chicago Fire, ruining him financially. Two years later, 1873, as they were seeking to rebuild, Anna and the girls set sail to visit family in England. Horatio, delayed by business, made plans to follow in the coming weeks.

On its way to England, the SS Ville De Havre, the ship Anna and the girls were aboard, collided with another ship and sank. As Anna reached the shores of Europe she telegraphed her husband two crippling words, "Saved alone." All four of their daughters had drowned. Only she had survived.

While trying to make sense of all of the tragedy that had occurred and was occurring in his life, as he crossed the Atlantic Ocean, Horatio Spafford penned these words on a borrowed piece of hotel stationery....

When peace like a river attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, "It is well, it is well with my soul."

When peace like a river attendeth my way.... What I hear Spafford describing is a beautiful portrait of a gentle river that runs along side the pathway he is travelling. It is a river that accompanies him on his journey. And it is a river of peace.

The Apostle Paul writes of a peace that passes all understanding (Philippians 4:7). A peace that transcends reason. A peace that even in the midst of tragedy accompanies us on our journey. A peace that is found in Christ.

I wonder if we truly know that sort of peace? I wonder if we experience it often? A peace that stills anxiety. A peace that quiets stress. A peace that heals tragedy. Does that sort of peace accompany you every step of the way in your journey of life?

True peace is found only in Christ. Only in closeness with Him. So often we find ourselves searching for calm. Searching for serenity. Searching for inner stillness. What we are seeking is a peace that is only found in Jesus. Wonderful, soothing, healing peace.

And when peace begins to overwhelm and characterize our lives – especially in those moments when we cannot explain how – we can indeed explain why.

### The Gratitude We Embrace

Corrie ten Boom in her book, The Hiding Place, relates an incident she endured as she and her sister, Betsie, were housed at the Nazi concentration camp, Ravensbruck. Upon entering the barracks, they found them deplorable, extremely overcrowded, and flea-infested. The Scripture reading that morning came from 1 Thessalonians. From a smuggled Bible quietly verses 16-18 of chapter 5 were whispered to the group. "Be joyful always. Pray continually. Be thankful to God in all circumstances...." Betsie encouraged Corrie that they should stop and thank the Lord for every detail of their new living quarters. Every detail. Even the fleas! Corrie at first flat refused, but Betsie persisted. Finally, reluctantly, "Father, thank you for the fleas." During the next several months at Ravensbruck, they were surprised to find how openly they could hold Bible studies and meet together. They prayed and quietly worshipped with minimal Nazi interference. Finally they came to learn how they had been so blessed as to have lived with such little intrusion... the guards had refused to enter the barracks because of all of the fleas!

Matthew Henry in the late 1600's was attacked and robbed. Later he wrote, "Father, I thank Thee first, because I was never robbed before; second, because although they took my purse they did not take my life; third, because although they took my all, it was not much; and fourth, because it was l who was robbed, and not I who robbed."

Helen Keller, blind and deaf from birth, once wrote: "I thank God for my handicaps. For through them, I have found myself, my life's work, and my God."



"R" Words: Reaffirm

(2 Cor. 2:5-11) is about someone who had caused pain and grief to the whole church at Corinth. The church had reprimanded the offender. Now, Paul says forgive and comfort that person so they are not overwhelmed with sorrow. "I urge you, therefore, to <u>reaffirm</u> your love for him" (:8). This is the only time in the New Testament this word shows up. The readers expected Paul to confirm their action

against him. Instead, he urges them to now reaffirm him so he is not destroyed. It's obvious that Paul's first concern is the well-being of the church and the offender rather than establishing a victory over the offending individual.

As each one of us read this and consider circumstances in our own lives we are all touched by the Spirit that is working through Paul. That same Spirit is also alive in us. That same Spirit also calls us to show more concern for the well-being of people rather than gloating over the victory. So.........what will you do with these words today?

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### A Radical Change of Mind

"You've heard it said.... But I say...." we hear our Lord proclaim over and over in the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus reinterprets. He reforms. He reprioritizes. "I know that you've heard it this way...." "I know that human nature says to respond like this...." "I know that you bring your own presuppositions to the table...." "I know this is the way that you once thought of things... but now, things are different."

Jesus steps into our world and transforms our thinking, our ideologies, our worldviews, our way of life.

Here's a tough one He tackles: "Love your enemies." "You've heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:43-44).

Love your enemies!? If have a hard enough time getting along with my friends! Pray (bless) those who persecute you!? Are you serious?

And it's an active love for our enemies. And it's a very tall order! More than just a passive bearing of persecution or hatred. Loving them. Blessing them. Doing good to them. For them. Regardless of who they are or what they've done.

In this and in countless other ways Jesus calls for a radical paradigm shift. A radical change of mind. A change of perspective. A change of heart.

We see Jesus exemplify His own teaching as He prays for God to forgive those who are responsible for His death (Luke 23:34). But what about we who are ultimately those who are responsible because of our sin?

The Apostle Paul connects the dots for us: "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by His blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through Him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life! Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:8-11).

You see while we were still enemies of God, Christ died on our behalf.

"Love your enemies." It's one of those areas of the Gospel and one of those areas of our life and faith that we would just as soon ignore. It's about a radical change of mind. From a mindset that is worldly to one that is of the Kingdom. It's about seeing the potential for the magnificent impact of the Gospel of Jesus in the most unlikeliest of places. Just like God saw it in you, and in me.

Glory to God!

Well, the word "rather" is used often in Scripture. In (1 Cor 5) Paul confronts the church with the fact that there was a sexual immorality among them and they were acting as if they were proud of it. Paul says, shouldn't you <u>rather</u> have been filled with grief and have put out of your

fellowship the guilty party?

In the previous chapter he confronted them with lawsuits among them and says, "Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be cheated? Instead, you yourselves cheat and do wrong, and you do this to your brothers." (6:7-8)

Life is filled with choices. "Rather" is the fork we all come to numerous times during a day. Would I rather respond to rudeness with rudeness or respond to it with kindness? Would I rather worship and serve created things or the Creator Himself? Would I rather tell a lie or speak the truth?

Notice the "rathers" you are challenged with each day and be a true, loyal follower of Christ.

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### The Greater Story

One of the connections that God has made possible in our life as His people is the connection to the greater story. We connect to the epic story of God. Because we belong to Him through Christ, His story is ours, and our story becomes His. The Apostle Paul writes, "You are sons and daughters of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ.... If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's descendants, and heirs according to the promise" (Galatians 4:26-29). We can trace our spiritual lineage to the promise and action of God at work within humanity because in Christ we are a part of the greater story.

Hebrews 11 is a chapter that we love dearly. Great heroes of faith are placed before us systematically one right after the other. By faith Noah.... By faith Abraham.... By faith Isaac.... ### Job 2: Mrs. Job, Curse God and be done with it!

I'm not sure how far one can go in thinking about Mrs. Job. Obviously this story isn't about her. It's Job's faithfulness to God even when he's getting nothing out of it that drives this story. Still, I feel sorry for Job's wife. She's suffered all the same losses he has. She's lost everything, including her family. Now her husband sits before her, quivering in agony. Her life is ruined. When she advises Job to give up on God it's because she already has. Her response is what Satan predicted Job's would be: if the blessings of God are withdrawn human beings will no longer serve him. Job's reply is that this is a foolish approach. God grants us life and we enjoy the good days that come. When things turn sour we go on trusting and serving him. That doesn't mean we're happy about things or that we don't change them if we can. It does mean that we've chosen to trust God with both the good and bad that life brings. Job is angry with God, as we shall see, but he refuses to turn away from Him, even when serving God has resulted in so much pain.

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### Straining at the Oars

At times we are tempted to think that we do this all on our own. I was once talking with a friend who was struggling. He was going through a difficult time in his life and there was no easy solution. It was going to take time and it was going to take God.

In a moment of frustration he said to me, "I feel like I'm a just a speck in the ocean that's being tossed all around and nobody knows but me."

Maybe you've been there. Maybe you're there now. I had a college professor who said, "Speak to those who are weary and hurting. Speak to them often. We are so very fragile." And so if that's you today, I want to share with you an encouraging thought from God's Word.

I was reading recently in Mark's Gospel the account of Jesus walking on the water. Generally the miracle itself is our focus. The event comes right after the feeding of the thousands on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus and His disciples had actually travelled across the sea to spend some needed time away from the masses, but are immediately inundated as they arrive. After the crowds are filled and leave, Jesus sends the disciples on their way, now across to the other side, as He goes on a mountainside to pray and spend intentional time with God (we should learn from Jesus).

"When evening came, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and He was alone on the land. He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. About the fourth watch of the night (3-6am) He went out to them, walking on the lake" (Mark 6:47-48a).

If you go on reading you see where Jesus steps into their boat and immediately, powerfully, divinely calms the wind and the waves and the storm. Looking to Matthew's account we see where Peter has the faith to step out of the boat and actually walks on the water toward Jesus! But when he takes his eyes off of Christ and becomes fearful of the chaos around him, he quickly sinks (something we should take to heart).

Here's what I've been getting at.... Mark says that the disciples were rowing in the boat in the "middle of the lake." John affirms they were "three and a half miles out to sea" (John 6:19). Jesus, as He is on a mountainside praying, sees the disciples "straining at the oars." They're three and a half miles out to sea! At 3am! Half way across the Sea of Galilee at 3am and yet Jesus divinely sees those He is closest to struggling. He sees those that He loves "straining at the oars." He sees them pounded by the wind and the waves, tossed back and forth in a sea of uncertainly, and it's immediately upon seeing His disciples struggling that He is filled with compassion and begins to walk toward them across the water.

The love of Christ is revealed in our Savior's actions as He comes to us in our time of need.

This is what I want you to hear: You are not alone. You have a church family that loves you dearly. And you have a Savior who is filled with compassion as He sees you "straining at the oars."

Glory to God!

### Righteousness

In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus says, "...unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees....you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:20). Then he helps us to understand that we'll never be righteousness enough, therefore, (6:33) we are to "seek first His kingdom and His righteousness." In other words, the only righteousness you or I will take into the kingdom of heaven is His ---- the righteousness HE gives us. We must renounce all of the

righteousness we think we have due to our keeping of the rules....we will get no praise for our achievements. The only righteousness is HIS.

Now, included in His righteousness is the forgiveness of sins. That's what we long for but can never earn. The Psalmist knew it so well and that understanding caused him to write: Have mercy on me, O GOD, because of Your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin. For I recognize my rebellion; it haunts me day and night. Against you, and you alone, have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your sight. Create in me a clean heart, O GOD and renew within me a loyal spirit. (Psalm 51)

### **GROWING IN GRACE** by Mike Gravois

### Job 1: So do you think Job does all that out of the sheer goodness of his heart?

While the audience Satan has with the Almighty is challenging from a theological viewpoint, I think it, and this question in particular, is the absolute key to the whole book. We tend to think that the book of Job focuses in undeserved suffering and how Job responds to it, but even more basic is the issue here. The Lord points out Job's righteousness to Satan, says that Job is his friend, and is an outstanding servant. Satan, that old accuser, replies that the only reason Job lives right and loves God is for what he gets out of it. Certainly, God has blessed Job, delighting in bringing good things into his life. Is Job a righteous man simply because it's good business, the smart thing to do, or is he righteous because he loves the Lord and chooses to serve him? What if Job wasn't getting anything out of his service of God? What if, instead of blessings, curses are brought to his life? Will Job then turn his back on God and curse him? While the issue of undeserved suffering is a basic one, I think this issue is even more basic. Why do I serve the Lord? Is it to escape hell and go to heaven? Is it so I won't be plagued with guilt over my sin? What if all the "perks" are removed? Again, this is about as basic a question as there is.

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### A Matter of Trust

I wonder how much we trust God. Do we trust Him? We engage God in worship. Our worship of Him is not relegated solely to what we are about, but rather encompasses the whole of one's life (Romans 12:1). We commune with God in life. We dwell within His presence. We pour ourselves out to Him in prayer. We seek to honor Him and strive for fidelity to Him. But I wonder if we trust Him....

When our children are small it's a momentous time when they take those first steps. I can remember our kids and how they would go from crawling, to standing, to finally taking those first steps. It was so neat to hold their little hands and help them to walk, but each step had to be taken on their own. At times they'd crawl over to the couch in the living room, and pull themselves up. And so there they are standing up on their own, but holding onto the couch for dear life. I'd be just a few steps away from them, down on their level, arms wide open. But the fear of taking those first steps was very real. "Come on," I'd say. "Take just one step. Daddy will catch you." And eventually, they'd muster up the courage to take that first step. To let go of the couch. And to trust that Daddy would catch them.

Really it came down to a matter of trust.

And so back to my original question: "Do we trust God?"

Hove David's words in Psalm 18:1-2, "I love you, O Lord, my strength. The Lord is my rock, my fortress, and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold." Do you see how personal King David is in his language? (I reserve the right to preach this at a later-date!}--My-strength.--My-rock.--My-fortross.--My-deliverer.--My-rock-in-whom-I-take-refuge:--My-shield.-The horn of my salvation. My stronghold.

Over and over David affirms all hope, all confidence, all trust is completely placed in God.

When he affirms: God you are "my fortress," the Hebrew word for "fortress" is "masada." There is a mountain in Israel, on the eastern edge of the Judean desert, overlooking the Dead Sea called "Masada" (Fortress). It is a powerful, beautiful, rugged piece of earth that rises over 1300 feet in the sky. David took refuge on top of Masada when he was being pursued by Saul. It was there upon Masada that he was protected and kept safe by God during a tumultuous time in his life.

And so what David conveys to us when he writes, God you are "my fortress" is this: "God when I am with you nothing can get to me." "When I am with you I am completely protected." "God when I am with you I am safe."

Is that who God is to us? Can we let go of the couch and take those steps toward Him, knowing that we are indeed safe and secure when we are with Him?

### REEVES' RHETORIC

### John and The Word

John the Apostle's words and writings are some of the most precious to me. Of course it's kind of like asking a mother who her favorite child is.... I love, love, love the Prologue of the Gospel of John (Jn 1:1-18).

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning" (Jn 1:1-2).

"The Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth" (Jn 1:14).

"In Him was life, and that life was the light of mankind" (Jn 1:4).

And so here's John's wonderful thesis: The Word (Christ) was. <u>He was!</u> He was with God. He was with God at the beginning of time. During the creative process as the world is formless and empty and the Spirit of God hovers above the waters – John affirms, Christ is there! And then, the Word became. <u>He became!</u> He became one of us. He lived among us. The living Word stepped into humanity and changed us forever.

You see the Word <u>was</u>, and the Word <u>became</u>. And because the Word became, we have <u>life!</u> Spiritual life. Eternal life. Life that is truly life.

And as I read John's literature and come to understand the Word who was and who became and who gives life, I begin to see why John focused so much upon Christ's love. John's the one who records Jesus' beautiful words: "For God so loved the world that He gave His One and Only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (Jn 3:16). John is the one who pens: "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us that we should be called children of God" (1 Jn 3:1). John is the one who affirms to us: "...God is love. This is how God showed His love among us: He sent His One and Only Son into the world that we might live through Him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins" (1 Jn 4:8b-10).

John can never even bring his pen to call himself by name. What does he always refer to himself as? The disciple that Jesus loved. Why do you think that is? My guess is he could never get past how much God the Father and God the Son loved Him. And so he always saw himself through the love of God, revealed in the Word who was, and the Word who became, and the Word who gives us life....

Glory to God!



### REEVES' RHETORIC

### **Humility and Discipleship**

One quality that really impresses God (and it's not a really long list) is humility. Humility is one of those things that just when you think that you've got it, you don't. And it's one of those qualities of Jesus that is most evidenced in the lives of those who are genuinely seeking to imitate Him.

Jesus is fully God. He steps into the world as Immanuel "God with us" (Mt 1:23). In Colossians the Apostle Paul is writing to address issues that have arisen in the church in which some are questioning the deity of Christ. He affirms, "God was pleased to have all His fullness dwell in Him (Christ), and through Him to reconcile to Himself all things" (Col 1:19-20a).

And yet he "emptied Himself" and became "obedient to death, even death on a cross!" (Phil 2:7-8). And for this reason we are called to have the very same attitude and mindset as that of Christ Jesus (v5).

Jesus always goes about being "God with us" from a position of humility. It's never a power play with Jesus. The only One who actually has the right to demand everything from a position of power because of who He is, comes to serve and comes to show us what true love and humility look like.

Too often we're not enough like Jesus. We manipulate. We force. We coerce. That's not Jesus....

Jesus' call upon our lives is if we want to be His disciples we must first deny ourselves. And I believe humility plays a key role here.

Jesus never forces Himself on anyone. "You want to be my disciple? Take up your cross and follow me," He says. "You want to come and learn and share and be a part of the bigger picture and the things that I am about in the Kingdom? Good. Follow me." Discipleship is a choice. Following Jesus is a choice. And humility is a choice.

When you are full of yourself, God cannot fill you. Only when we empty ourselves can our God fill us. Only when we empty ourselves of all pride and all arrogance and all selfishness... only when we "humble ourselves before the Lord" can He then lift us up (James 4:10).

Jesus begins the Sermon on the Mount, "Blessed are the poor in Spirit... (Mt 5:3)."

Maybe that's a good place for us to start.

- Jesus to the Pharisees (Luke 15:6)

In response to the Pharisees' judgmental and cheerless spirit, Jesus emphasized the importance of joy in His parable of the Lost Sheep. Not only does the shepherd rejoice upon finding the sheep, but he also calls for a celebration when he arrives back in the village.

In the Jewish culture of Jesus' day, the townspeople often shared shepherding responsibilities for their flocks, which meant that the loss of one sheep was a loss for the community and not just one owner. Consequently, when the shepherd would arrive safely back in the village, there would follow a time of jubilation and thanksgiving for his safe return. The joy of finding the lost sheep quickly spread beyond the shepherd to the community at large.

Jesus' parable strikes at the heart of the Pharisees' hypocrisy, for they were more concerned with their own righteous deeds than the people around them. Jesus' mealtime manners created more of a stir for them than the "weightier matters of the law" that they themselves had neglected. Rather than celebrate over the repentance of those around them, the Pharisees were envious of the popularity that Jesus had with the people.

Today, Christ invites us to join with Him in celebration over those who have been saved. There is no room for envy, pride, or competition in the church of Jesus Christ. When the flesh reigns supreme in our lives and churches, joy is stifled and the "homecoming" celebration for the once-lost is met with passive indifference.

Jesus wants us to rejoice not only when someone is found by Him, but also as that someone grows spiritually mature through discipleship. The church is the place of joy where we, as Christians, share shepherding responsibilities in taking care of new believers.

Jubilation and thanksgiving should flow from the hearts of church members as they see lost people around them being found by the Good Shepherd, and then being discipled by His followers through the Holy Spirit.



#### **Effective Ministry**

"Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord, we try to persuade mankind.... For Christ's love compels us.... So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view....." (2 Corinthians 5:11,14,16).

I've been working considerably lately with the first five and a half chapters of 2 Corinthians. Beginning Sunday September 4th we are going to be diving head-first into the Apostle Paul's philosophy of ministry. What we will see is that ministry is a way of life. Ministry is what our Father calls us to through the Gospel. And if we understand our calling correctly, ministry is not optional.

In order for ministry to be influential.... In order for ministry to be effective.... In order for ministry to be significant... it must be an extension of who we are. It has to be authentic. And because of God's relentless pursuit of us through the Good News of Jesus, and because we recognize our fallen state without Him, "from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view."

We see ourselves often in pursuit of God. And certainly we are. Certainly we do. But I believe if we are objective and if we are honest with ourselves, what we soon discover is that it is not we who pursue God, but He who pursues us. He pursues us relentlessly. The lengths He has gone through in the overarching story of God intersecting humanity throughout the ages, the culmination of the redemptive work of God in Christ through the cross and resurrection of Jesus, the way in which He magnificently works in our hearts and lives today, all reveal one thing to us: It is God who pursues. It is He who pursues us. And it is this profound reality that must compel us to pursue Him and His will and His purposes with all that we are.

How serious is GOD about this? HE said, "If your right eye causes you to sin, gouge it out and throw it away, or if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. It is better for you to lose one part of your body than for your whole body to go into hell" (Mt 5:29-30).

#### Keep the Lamps Burning

"Stay dressed for action and keep your lamps burning!" – Jesus, to the disciples (Luke 12:35)

At nightfall, over Goshen fell a stillness that only increased the Israelites' anticipation of God's promised deliverance. With the smell of fresh lamb's blood still in the streets, all Israel's families shut themselves in their homes and remembered Moses' instruction to be prepared at any moment. The people were to be dressed and ready for the Exodus. And Moses added: "Keep your lamps burning."

Thousands of years later, Jesus told his disciples to stay dressed for action and to keep their lamps burning. The *Great* Exodus was about to take place.

But this time, God was not going to take down an Egyptian Pharaoh and set his people free from physical slavery. He was going to deliver them from slavery to sin and conquer a greater enemy: Satan – the accuser himself. The disciples were instructed to stay alert and ready for the moment when God's great Exodus

would take place.

Two thousand years more and we find ourselves in the final chapters of the history book written by God himself. Once again, Jesus' words apply to us. We must be ready for the final Exodus – when Jesus will return to earth, raise the dead, judge the wicked and vindicate his people.

This time, Christ will not be coming to inaugurate his kingdom, but to consummate it. Paul tells us all creation is groaning in anticipation of that Day – the day when God will right all that's wrong and renew and restore his creation – the day when the new heaven and the new earth will become a reality.

Until that day comes, we must be faithful followers, dressed for action, with our lamps burning, awaiting Christ's return.

When Jesus returns, will he find us at our posts, fulfilling his commands? The Final Exodus has been promised. When the curtain comes down, will we be ready?



#### **Bold Prayers**

I believe that there are safe prayers and there are bold prayers. "Father, please bless my life." "Take care of my family." "Grant us a good day." Good prayers... but safe prayers.

Bold prayers dig deeper. They lay our lives before the Sovereign Lord in such a way so as to hold nothing back and give ourselves fully over to Him.... "God make me into your instrument." "Create within me the heart of Jesus." "Father do with me and my life what you will." "Grant me courage and strength and faith so that in every way you may be glorified through me." Bold prayers!

How intentional are we when we pray? Are we conscious of what we are saying? Are our words spoken out of desire for divine deliverance? Words spoken out of total reliance upon God? Do the words we share with God convey our desire that we might unequivocally accomplish His will and purpose in and through the lives He's blessed us to live - no matter what?

Here's what I see with Jesus: every word, every action, every thought, every facet of His life was lived with intentionality and with resolve. There was no doubt! His reason, His being, His purpose - all encompassed within His single-mindedness of who we was and what He was about.

As believers I wonder if that's what is seen in us. Or rather, I wonder if our intentionality and resolve is evident in everything that we are about? I believe a crucial, central component of this is revealed in our prayer life. We can tell a lot about ourselves, our mindset, and our hearts through our prayers.

How often do you pray? (Be honest with yourself). Just you and God? Do you pray with your children? Do you pray with your spouse? Men, do you take the lead? Do you pray specifically on behalf of others? (And do they know that you pray for them?). Do they come to you because they know that you are a man or woman of prayer? Do you pour out your heart to God when you pray?

And when you pray, do you pray bold prayers?

I had a very good friend, Ron Bozell, who passed away from Leukemia last December. Ron was a faithful man of God and a man of prayer. When he prayed it was the outpouring of his heart. His prayer life was an extension of who he was (and who he is to those who knew him). Over and over and over again, Ron would say: "Prayer moves the hands that move the world!" And not only did he say it, he meant it....

Glory to God!

#### Stripped and Strengthened

A house church leader in Asia was telling how persecution in his country had stripped his church of its resources. "But to my surprise," he said, "it turned out to be a good thing. We found that rather than being weakened by the removal of all external props, we were actually much stronger because our faith in GOD was purer. We had no plans, nor programs to keep running, so we

just sought the face of Jesus."

That sounded so familiar. Of course......the book of Acts, chapter 8. Persecution caused the Christians in Jerusalem to scatter throughout Judea and Samaria. When they left they took only their faith in Jesus with them. All their external props were left behind. GOD used the persecution to purify their faith and to give them reason to lean on Jesus more than ever.

Knowing how desperately GOD wants us to lean on Him makes it difficult not to consider our current times and a repeat event.

# GROWING IN GRACE by Mike Gravois Light of the World

"You are the light of the world." - Matthew 5:14

How is it that Jesus says we are the light of the world?

Doesn't he claim to be the Light of the World himself?

Is this a contradiction? How can it be that Jesus sees himself as the light, but then he sees his followers as the light too?

These questions are all the more powerful when we realize that there is no light in ourselves. We are prone to love the darkness.

Yet Jesus' words remain true. We *are* the light of the world. God has chosen to shine the light of Jesus *through us*.

Think about the moon. The moon doesn't actually

shine. It gives off no light – it only reflects the light that comes from the sun. At night, when the sun has disappeared, we are still enjoying the sun's light, coming via the reflection of the moon.

Likewise, even though Jesus as the Light of the world is no longer on earth physically, his light remains. We, his followers, reflect his light. We absorb his glory and majesty — the truth of his gospel, and we reflect those glorious truths for all the world to see. So yes, we are the light of the world... whenever we reflect Jesus!

**Prayer:** Light of the world, thank you for bringing me to salvation and for making me a reflection of your light. Help me to be a good reflection of your glory and your gospel. Amen.



#### REEVES' RHETORIC

#### The Cause of Redemption

"God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

Love is a quality that we develop. We learn how to love. We learn love from our parents and grandparents. We learn love from those who love us along the way. As we fall in love and marry we learn to love our spouse and learn love from our spouse. Tiersa and I have in many ways "grown up" together because we came to know one another at such a young age. As we look into our newborn children's eyes for the first time we experience a love that gives us such insight into the love of God (although we're certainly content to let grandma and grandpa give us a rest as often as they like!). Through life, through experience, through trial and error at times, we learn how to better love - and what it means to love.

And yet we often wonder, "How could God love us?" Or perhaps even closer to home, "How could God love me?" But I think as honest as these questions are, they don't quite have a full grasp of God's love. Or, the reality that the Apostle John unveils to us: "God is love" (1 John 4:8,16). Love is not a quality that God has learned. Love is who God is. God reveals love because He is love.

God does not love us because we are easy or difficult to love (although through relationship we oftentimes find ourselves either closer to God or distanced from Him – but this is our doing, not His!). God loves us because He is God. He is love. Love is who He is. Love is His character. His nature. The reality that God is love is as unchanging as He is. God's love is not drawn out of Him by us, rather, it flows from Him constantly. Steadily. Why? Because God is love.

"God so loved..." (John 3:16) not because we were loveable, but because He is love. Christ did not die for the world so that God might then love us. Christ died because God loves us. He died as the ultimate revelation and realization of God's love for us. Love is not the result of redemption, it is the cause of it....

Glory to God!





#### Practicing the Presence of God

Our journey of life is such that when we open our spiritual eyes we begin to see God at work all around us. David asks, "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there. If I make my bed in the depths you are there" (Psalm 139:7-8). God is all around us. He is at work in and through us and everything in life if we will simply have eyes that see. I believe this is a crucial part of faith. And maybe where mature faith comes in? Because faith that is mature has the ability to see God at work in life. Faith that is mature has the ability to see the potential for God in every facet of life. A mature faith practices living in the very presence of God.

Our faith must be real to us, if it is to be real to the world. In order for our Father to be a present reality to others through the lives we live, He must first and foremost be a present reality to us. There is within every person an innate need for Christ and Christian community. A wholeness that only comes from relationship with God in Jesus. And yet do we reveal Christ and fidelity to Him in such a way as to compel others to acknowledge and pursue our Lord and pursue faith in Him?

Think about the things that so many are searching for... a sense of belonging, validation, approval, meaning and purpose in life, a greater understanding of self, acceptance, love, to be challenged, living beyond themselves, a banner under which to claim allegiance... all of which are only fully found and fulfilled in a relationship with God through Christ and within the community of faith.

But... is that what we offer them? And (maybe a better and more personal question)... do we wholly find our belonging, meaning, purpose, etc. in Him?

What if we daily practiced the presence of God? By that I mean, what if every moment of life we were intrinsically cognizant that we were in the presence of God? What if everything, every moment, of life was lived with the acute awareness that we were in our Father's presence. (Because we are! Right?) What if we daily practiced fully living in His presence? How might that change thinas?

Paul says, "To live is Christ..." (Philippians 1:21). Think about those four words.... To live is Christ. Can we (you) really say that and mean it?

#### Jesus and Little Children

The gospels provide several views of Jesus' attitude toward children. Once, while Jesus was in the temple. the small children began shouting. "Hosanna to the Son of David!" The teachers of the law and the chief priests were indignant. They wanted Jesus to silence them. He asked them, "Have you never read, From the lips of children and infants you have ordained praise" (Mt 21:15-16). Jesus was honored by their songs. #### It's a Big Thing to Know You're Small

The Bible is God's revelation to humanity, and in it, He discloses Himself. Scripture reminds us of what we can't know about God.

- The Apostle Paul tells us that God dwells in unapproachable light (1 Timothy 6:16).
- The Psalmists praise his glory and greatness, saying that no one can fathom just how awesome he is (Ps. 145:3).
- His thoughts are so high and lofty that we cannot think them after him (Psalm 139:6).
- His ways are beyond finding out (Romans 11:33).

Verses like these clue us in on the fact that God is not like us. We were made in his image, yet we seek constantly to make him into ours. Coming to grips with the magnificence of God reminds us that we cannot fully comprehend him.

Seeking to understand God always leads us to a place of mystery. Mysteries intrigue us. Many novels, short stories, television shows, and movies utilize the compelling genre of mystery, in which more and more truth is revealed as the story progresses. In the Scriptures, the truth of God's nature is also revealed progressively, culminating in the person and work of Jesus Christ. The more we know about the infinite God, the more we see the finiteness of humanity.

But this is a good place to be. It's a big thing to know you're small. Being aware of our smallness both frightens and comforts us. Our fear of the infinite, holy God drives us to our knees - just as it did Isaiah. Yet in this posture of worship, we sense comfort. Deep down in our bones, we know we were made to worship. We were created to stand as finite creatures before an infinite God. Once our sin is exposed, we are driven to our knees in repentance before a mighty God whose perfect attributes have no end. C.S. Lewis said our talk about God is like staring at the

We cannot fully take in the sun's brilliance, but its radiance enables us to see everything else.

God's essence remains, in part, a mystery. If we are to embrace God, we must embrace this mystery. We must bow before the infinite with the firm realization that his ways are past finding out. We must put our hand over our mouth and recognize the unchanging holiness of the Holiest One. And to think that the Infinite God put on humanity and dwelt among us . . . well, now my small heart pounds with gratitude for the great love of a big God.





#### REEVES' RHETORIC

#### Nearness with God

When you get right down to it the Christian faith is about nearness with God. Certainly we are in need of salvation. We are in need of forgiveness. We are in need of the strenath that only God can provide. But when we look objectively at faith (and life) we begin to see the innate need each of us have for nearness to our Father.

And I believe this is a struggle for many. Because God seems so very distant.

As God descends upon Mt Sinai He does so in power. He had delivered Israel with power out of their slavery in Egypt. There was no doubt to any of them that He alone was God. As He leads them to Mt Sinai to engage in covenant with them He establishes a boundary around the mountain. No one was to come near. They were all to be kept at a distance. The glory of God encompasses the mountain in thunder and lightening and fire and trumpet blast. The mountain shook violently. Smoke billowed from the mountain "like a furnace" (Ex 19:18). "To the Israelites the glory of the Lord looked like a consuming fire on top of the mountain" (Ex 24:18). "When the people saw the thunder and lightening and heard the trumpet and saw the mountain in smoke, they trembled with fear" (Ex 20:18). And they stayed at a distance....

However in Christ we have a different reality. If we've learned anything from the Gospel of Jesus, anything from what God has accomplished through our Savior, anything from the cross and resurrection of our Lord, it is that our Father desires closeness with us. He wants us near. He has come near to us in Christ and so desires for us to engage Him in a close, intimate relationship in this life.

Read these powerful, comforting words from the Hebrew writer of our present reality in Christ: "You have not come to a mountain that can be touched and that is burning with fire; to darkness, gloom and storm; to a trumpet blast or to such a voice speaking words that those who heard it begged that no further word be spoken to them, because they could not bear what was commanded: 'If even an animal touches the mountain, it must be stoned.' The sight was so terrifying that Moses said, 'I am trembling with fear.' But you have come to Mount Zion, to the heavenly Jerusalem, the city of the living God. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven. You have come to God, the judge of all men, to the spirits of righteous men made perfect, to Jesus the mediator of a new covenant..." (Heb 12:18-24).

Our reality in Jesus is of a God who brings us near.

Give Thanks... Always?

Be joyful always; pray continually; give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. 1 Thess. 5:16-18

Really, Paul? Give thanks in everything? No matter

Already, you've rocked my world. You've told me to be joyful always - not just when life is going well. That means that even though I'm tempted to rejoice only in the good times, you want me to rejoice in the bad times too.

You've told me to pray continually - not just when life is going badly. Here, you've dealt with the opposite temptation. Even though I'm tempted to pray only in the bad times (when I sense I need something), you want me to pray continually - in the good times too.

Paul, you're calling me to a way of life that doesn't depend upon my circumstances. And what bugs me about this call is that you aren't some idealistic pastor asking me to do the impossible. You are doing this yourself. You're writing from a prison cell. Your happiest, sunniest letter (Philippians) is written when your circumstances are terrible.

And now, you're telling us to give thanks in all

circumstances. But how? I want to be thankful, but come on... even for bad things? Even for trials?

That's when I notice you've provided the key to thankfulness in all circumstances. You talk about the will of God in Christ Jesus. Everything that comes at us in life comes through the filter of God's love to us through his Son. Once we see the victory achieved in the worst of places (the cross), our view of our circumstances is turned upside down.

Paul, your gospel upsets all my expectations. I can no longer define good and bad circumstances the way the world does. The cross messes with me. There, the worst of circumstances brings the best of blessing.

Romans 8:28 says that all things work together for good for those who love God. That picture puts God in the center, so somehow I know that even the bad things are working out for his glory and my ultimate joy

The choice is now clear. I can look at my situation and see bad things that are against me or I can see them as things working for my good. Decision: Despair or Thankfulness. Thanks, Paul. You're right. The gospel takes my despair and transforms it into thanksgiving.



#### REEVES' RHETORIC

#### Christian Cannibalism

Contemporaries of the early church rumbled of cannibalism among the believers. The followers of Christ spoke of "eating the flesh" and "drinking the blood" of their Savior. Sounds pretty cannibalistic to me....

In John's Gospel, Jesus teaches that unless one eats His flesh and drinks His blood the believer has no life (spiritual life). There is certainly a divine connection with Jesus' statements in John 6 ("eat my flesh, drink my blood") with the instruction in the Upper Room and with the Christian Communion, but I wonder if what Jesus is saying doesn't run a bit deeper?

Jesus' claims come right after His declaration as the "Bread of Life." What if Jesus were saying that His disciples must feed on Him? (He is!) What if Jesus were saying that to truly be His we must be sustained by Him? (That's what He's calling us to!) "Look to me for your life," He calls. "Come to me to be filled," He demands, for everything else in this life fails to fill us.

Discipleship at a very basic level is Christian cannibalism.

And I love the end of the story. After Jesus gives the audience something to chew on (pun intended), many begin to leave. They can't handle it. It's too much! So much so that many begin to walk away. And not just leave the crowd. They begin to leave Jesus. Many refuse to follow Him, to be His disciples, any longer. But then John (who was there mind you) records for us what takes place in the quietness of the moment between Jesus and the Twelve. "From this time on many turned back and no longer followed Him. 'You don't want to leave too, do you?' Jesus asks" (John 6:66-67).

And I love Peter's reply in v68! His reply must be ours.... "Lord, to whom will we go? You have the words of eternal life."

"Hear the word of the Lord.....my people are destroyed from lack of knowledge."

Hosea 4

Notice that GOD does not destroy the people, we destroy ourselves. "For although they knew GOD, they neither glorified Him as GOD nor gave thanks to Him, but their thinking became futile and their foolish hearts were darkened." (Rom. 1:21)

The results....."GOD gave them over to the sinful desires of their hearts. he let them exchange the truth of GOD for lies. He allowed them to worship and serve created things rather than the Creator.

Teaching the Word of GOD is not an option. Teaching the truth of GOD is first and foremost among His people and an ever present and pressing imperative at West Erwin.

#### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

What Does It Mean to "Pray Continually?" "Praying continually" means at least three things.

First, it means that there is a spirit of dependence that should permeate all we do. This is the very spirit and essence of prayer. So, even when we are not speaking consciously to God, there is a deep, abiding dependence on him that is woven into the heart of faith. In that sense, we "pray" or have the spirit of prayer continuously.

Second — and I think this is what Paul has in mind most immediately — praying continually means praying repeatedly and often. I base this on the use of the word "constantly" in Romans 1:9, where Paul says, "God, whom I serve with my whole heart in preaching the gospel of his Son, is my witness how constantly I mention you . . ." Now we can be sure that Paul did not mention the Romans every minute of his waking life, or even every minute of his prayers. He prayed about many other things. But he mentioned them over and over, and often. So "constantly" doesn't mean that, verbally or mentally, we have to be speaking prayers every minute of the day in the fight for joy. It means we should pray over and over, and often. Our default mental state should be: "O God, help..."

Third, praying without ceasing means not giving up on prayer. Don't ever come to a point in your life where you cease to pray at all. Don't abandon the God of hope and say, "There's no use praying." Jesus is very jealous for us to learn this lesson. One of his parables is introduced by the words, "Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up" Luke 18:1. He knew our experience in prayer would tempt us to quit altogether. So he, along with the apostle Paul, says, Never lose heart. Go on praying. Don't cease.



#### REEVES' RHETORIC

#### Pursuing God

Look closely within the Gospel of Mark and see something that too often we fail to recognize at just a cursory glance....

The men who bring their paralytic friend to Jesus to be healed in Mark 2....

The man who comes to Jesus and pleads for the life of his daughter in Mark 5....

The woman who touches His cloak, also in Mark 5....

The Syrophoenician woman whose daughter was demon possessed in Mark 7....

The man who is deaf and mute, also in Mark 7....

The blind man in Bethsaida in Mark 8....

The man who brings his son to Jesus in Mark 9....

Even the children who are brought in Mark 10....

Blind Bartimaeus who pleads for mercy, also in Mark 10....

Over, and over, and over again – we see it. We see it in their stories. We see it in the lives of those of faith. It's so clear. So evident, that too often we miss it.

What is it? <u>They seek Jesus</u>. These people seek Jesus and they are blessed beyond comprehension. They seek Him and He brings joy to their life. They seek Him and He brings healing. They seek Him and He brings about restoration. They seek Him and He makes everything right. They seek and He blesses.

And this is precisely the place we fit in to the picture.... What are we to do as believers today? We seek Christ. We seek Him. We pursue Jesus. And when we do – He blesses. He brings joy. He heals. He restores. He makes our lives right. He calls us beyond ourselves.

The Prophet Jeremiah reminds us of God's promise – "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart" (Jeremiah 29:13).

Jesus puts it in perspective – "Seek and you will find" (Matthew 7:7b).

But here's where I believe the Gospel of Jesus speaks most clearly....

For all of its immenseness (yes it's a word – all I had to do was hit "ignore" on spell-check!) the Bible, although a lifetime of study only scratches the surface, entails an extremely simple story: God creates humanity. Humanity rejects God. God relentlessly pursues humanity.

The overarching story of Scripture is the redemptive work of a God who would not let us go.

Whatever the expanse between us and God, He will traverse the gap.

We see ourselves so often in pursuit of God. And certainly we do pursue Him. But if we will look objectively at who He is and what He extends to us and how He works – we will see clearly that it is not we who pursue Him, but rather it is He who pursues us....

Our God is a pursuing God. He pursues us with His grace, with His mercy, with His love. The Gospel message itself is of a God who relentlessly pursues us through Jesus.

This week, may we pursue the One who pursues us.



James would have continued to work in his father's business. With his brother John, he would have spent his nights straining at the nets and his days mending them. 



Is there a difference between an active and a mature church? Normally, we gauge an active church by the number of programs they are involved in and how well the people support the various church ventures. The Scriptures are clear regarding the criteria for measuring the maturity level of a church. Paul says it's all about Faith, Hope, and Love.

#### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

"When the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?" Luke 18:8

Faith means simply believing. Evangelistic faith means believing God to the saving of the soul or for healing of our bodies. Faith is the dynamo of all religious life and the mainspring of a substantial progress. Faith was the dominant keynote of the old dispensation; the highest tribute given to Abraham was that he 'believed God.' Spiritual forces often elude us because we demand evidence or proof, and in our day, even a sign from heaven, before we accept them. They must pass through the laboratory of theology, and be sifted. Faith takes hold on forces that are infinite and enduring; it stands high above dogma, has no elements of uncertainty, is well grounded, and bespeaks spiritual sanity.

Faith is not a spasmodic force, but an assurance of contact between the soul and its God. It should grow stronger, brighter, and undiminished with the passing years. Faith, sad to say, has become identified with creeds...

What is needed in the world today - we might say the paramount need - is not more expensive churches, more artistic music, greater eloquence in the pulpit, finer literary or social attainments, but more of the mighty moving power of God; more faith in God's Word, and more trusting in Christ's atoning blood. We need more of the old-time religion and mighty manifestation of God's supernatural power in definite religious experiences....



#### SpiritFire- More Than Near

We were bone tired and filthy. We were finally back in our South American hotel after having ridden 90 minutes back from an orphanage. We had not had time to shower before going to dinner. It was now late evening, and we wanted to check in with our daughter in the States and touch base with some folks I'm studying with in Asia. So we fired up Skype and talked to Megan face-to-face, used Skype to call a friend in Thailand, and then use QQ software to chat with friends in China. Even away from my mobile phone, I expected to be able to have instant access to people all over the world. We live in an amazing time!

I remember when I read the Dick Tracy comics as a boy, marveling at the communicator on his wrist. G-daddy, my grandfather, would laugh his Scooby Doo laugh and say, "That will never be possible." He was obviously wrong. Most of us don't wear it on our wrist, but we can put it in our pocket and do things with our mobile phones that Dick Tracy never imagined! With our mobile phones and electronic devices, we expect to have instant access to almost anyone, at any time, anywhere in the world.

So when we read a story like Queen Esther needing permission from the King to enter his presence or she could lose her life, our first reaction is befuddlement (Esther 4:9-11). How could this be?

Most of us live with a sense of naïve idealism about our freedom to talk to anyone at any time. If words, b we are honest with ourselves, however, we realize that none of us could simply board a plane, fly into Reagan airport, take a taxi to the Whitehouse, get out, walk in and expect to see the President. Even knowing the President doesn't get us out of security checkpoints, background checks, and a couple of Secret Service agents hanging around when we talk. (Those guys in dark uniforms on the roof are not we take.

We also have other limitations on our

communication with people important to us. If you are like me, you have family members who have died that you would love to call and have a chat. Not possible. Many of us have folks we want to love, but who keep us at an emotional distance, so that a real visit with them is not possible — they choose to remain emotionally unavailable. And some of us have rifts in our relationships so deep that there is not a way to get meaningful conversation started between us. Real communication is all but impossible.

This is where these following promises about the Holy Spirit are unbelievable blessings ... and yet real for us in Christ!

Now all of us can come to the Father through the same Holy Spirit because of what Christ has done for us (Ephesians 2:18 NLT). In the same way the Spirit also helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words ... (Romans 8:26 NASB).

While we have many blessings because of the Spirit's presence in our lives, let's focus on three revealed in those passages: (1) We always have instant access to God! While no earthly ruler, President or King, is comparable with God, our Father in heaven welcomes each of us as his beloved child when we approach Him in prayer! (2) We are heard clearly by God! God hears our words, but more than our words, our Father hears the longings and groanings and emotions that words cannot express. (3) We are never alone; God is not just with us, the Father lives within us! More than God being near us when we talk with him, God is in us through the presence of the Holy Spirit. He will not abandon us or forget us. He is as real and constant as the beat of our hearts and the breaths

#### The Church on Offense

I read this statement this week: "Churchgoers are more likely to have passive personalities than the population in general." It seems that thousands of personality tests were given over the past 20 years. 62% of Americans have passive personalities, but 85% of the Christians tested fell into the passive category. Questions came to my mind. Was Jesus passive? Did He choose passive men to become disciples? What kind of implications does this imbalance in the church have? Does it cause the church to become passive?

I thought of Jesus at his home town, Nazareth. He had been teaching in other synagogues throughout Galilee, so they asked him to speak on the Sabbath in Nazareth. He stood and read from Isaiah 61: "The Spirit

of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to preach good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Then he sat down and said, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." Hardly passive words!

I also read that passive churches tend to value tradition and stability over innovation and growth. The more passive we become the less we accept change. Even the slightest change at church can make people very upset.

Passive churches are very busy, but no one stops to consider whether all this busyness is achieving anything. Passive churches are not moving toward a compelling vision and GOD is not pleased with His people who are always on defense and never get on offense. I write this to say, "Get ready, for GOD has great plans for us." He wants us to be like Jesus.



#### **Traditions**

Therefore, brethren, stand fast, and hold the traditions which ye have been taught, whether by word, or our epistle. (II Thessalonians 2:15)

In II Thessalonians chapter 2, Paul warns the church there that the "lawless one" was going to come and pervert the teachings of Jesus in the church. So he warns them to watch and "stand fast" and "hold on" to the traditions they have been taught. The question of tradition often arises in the church today. We often see brethren attempting to change things in the church. When asked why they are changing things, why they are fixing what is not broken, brethren often reply, "These are only traditions and not law. We must stop teaching traditions as law." The Bible defines a tradition as:

to deliver in teaching. A tradition, doctrine or injunction delivered or communicated from on to another, whether divine (1 Cor. 11:2; Thess. 2:15; 3:6) or human (Matt. 15:2, 3,6; Gal. 1:14; Col. 2:8) (Zodhiates, 2000, Electronic ed.)

We must remember not to lump all tradition into one category. There are traditions that are divine, (come from God) and there are traditions that have come from men. The Bible commands us to "hold to the traditions ye have been taught." That is, we are to hold onto the traditions that God has given. II Thessalonians 2:15 is a present imperative in the Greek grammar. That means it is a command. Those things that God has deemed good traditions are not to be changed. They are not optional. However, there are also traditions of men. Traditions given by men are optional. They do not have to be kept and can be changed. We see Jesus violating the tradition of the elders in Mark 7:3, 5. There was a tradition of washing hands before you eat. Jesus did not keep that tradition in this instance. But the Bible says it was a tradition of the elders, and not a tradition of God. Man's traditions can be changed.

The question still remains which traditions are mans' and what are God's? Any tradition that is not commanded by God is manmade. In other words, if we have no command, divine example or if it is not implied by God, then it is something man has instituted. For example, assembling on the first day of the week is a command of the Lord (Hebrews 10:25). But the time of the assembly is not given by God. We traditionally (manmade tradition) meet at 10:00 a.m. We can change that tradition any time we want.

Sing praises unto the Lord is a command of the Lord. In the Holy and Sacred worship of God, the command is only to sing (Eph. 5:19, Col. 3:16). The command is specific and direct. This is not a matter of manmade tradition; it is a matter of God's command. We do not have the right to change the command of God "to sing" in the name of tradition. We must sing, only sing, in the way God has commanded.

"Brothers and sisters I have sinned; I repent of my sin and ask the church to forgive me." In the churches of Christ, this is the very traditional incantation used by people who come before the church to repent of their sins. However, there is no command of God that these words must be uttered before the church. This is clearly a manmade tradition.

There are many traditions that are not of God. We must study carefully to learn which traditions came form God and which came from man. If a tradition is from man, then we can change it if we want. But those traditions that have come from God cannot be changed. They must be left unmovable.



The writer of the book of Hebrews has several warnings for us. The first is about drifting. He says, "We must pay more careful attention, therefore, to what we have heard, so that we do not drift away" (Heb 2:1).

Drifting through life has become the easiest course to follow. It's easier to overlook a little neglect than to press for improvement. It's easier to accept a little immorality in our friends than to rebuke them. It's easier to keep our mouths shut than to stand up and defend the truth. It's easier to make

excuses than to do what GOD says do. The cares of this world, the lack of knowledge, and the failure to comply push us to this easier course.

The most interesting thing about drifting is this: we drift away from righteousness, but no one ever drifts into righteousness. Righteousness is intentional. If you seek a religion that makes you comfortable, Christianity is not it. There is no such thing as a passive Christian. A Christian's life is not on "golden pond." We are not called to tranquility. We are called to peace, but it is peace in the midst of struggle.

Drifting leads to unbelief and then a complete falling away. This is why the writer says, pay more attention to the Word so that you do not start drifting.



#### Our Need to Remember

Your pride and joy ... lies dead on the hills!
How the mighty heroes have fallen! ...
How the mighty heroes have fallen!
Stripped of their weapons, they lie dead.
(2 Samuel 1:19-27 NLT,
King David at the death of Saul & Jonathan)

Roy died at a ripe old age with many memories. His life was full of both good and bad memories, but he chose to remember mostly the good. The bad memories, that stirred his heart and that he shared with friends, involved the big war — World War II. So many things about his war experience he remembered in great and horrifying detail. The emotions he felt so long ago in the mid 1940's were as vivid for him in the late 1990's as they were the day he returned home from the "European Theater."

Roy survived the assault on Normandy — he was part of the second wave that landed. He carried with him the memories of water stained crimson with the blood of fallen soldiers. He experienced fear, sweat, vomit, blood, machine gun fire, grenade concussions, artillery fire, and salt water just to get to the base of the cliffs on the beach. In terror-filled moments that would forever change his life and the history of our world, his life was stripped of innocence as the realities of war engulfed him.

Not too many months later, he found himself cold, hungry, and down to three rounds of ammunition. Close to being completely surrounded and cut off from air supplies because of the weather, Roy and his buddies hung on to what little hope they could muster, enduring what has been mostly called the Battle of the Bulge. Then Christmas morning dawned, the weather cleared long enough for supplies to be dropped and word to spread that Patton and the armored division would soon be there.

Many of the young men who began the assault on Normandy with Roy did not make it home alive. They gave their lives to liberate France and the world of the Nazi evil that held a death grip on Europe. Those who did survive would never be the same. Many of them are the most patriotic folks you would ever meet, but the vast majority of them hated war. They had experienced it. They knew its ultimate realities — things get blown up while people are killed, brutalized, and robbed of the people they love.

In a day when a handful of folks fight for the title "Ultimate Survivor" in what TV deems harsh conditions, we need to remember the cold realities of the cost of freedom. First, many didn't survive the war and left behind families and friends whose lives were never the same. Second, those who did survive have carried with them through life, memories both great and awful and mercies both tender and severe. Third, forty days of hardship can't compare to the horrors of those who endure war.

It is Memorial Day in the United States. We all pray for an end for the world's need for young men and young women to be placed in harm's way. We also need to remember those who paid the huge costs of our world's conflicts — costs not calculated in dollars, but in lost lives, broken psyches, forgotten innocence, griefengulfed families, and haunted memories. And as we remember to honor those who paid this awful price, we also remember in hopes to see an end to war itself.

Please, in their honor, don't forget their sacrifices. Please, for our world's sake, don't forget to pursue and pray for peace.

Jesus had it backwards too. He would say, "If anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last" (Mk 9:35); or "whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant" (Mk 10:43). Jesus was telling this to his eager, ambitious It was pretty sandy where I grew up. When followers....."it's not your leadership abilities but your servant spirit that is the true measure of greatness in GOD'S new order of things." Christians are odd like Doodle Bugs --- we have it backward. Our highest vision of GOD'S purpose in

#### **GROWING IN GRACE** by Mike Gravois

- Discipleship 101 1. If you want to disciple, your whole life must be an example. In 1 Corinthians 4:15-17 Paul says, "Even though you have ten thousand guardians in Christ, you do not have many fathers, for in Christ Jesus I became your father through the gospel. Therefore I urge you to imitate me. For this reason I am sending to you Timothy, my son whom I love, who is faithful in the Lord. He will remind you of my way of life in Christ Jesus, which agrees with what I teach everywhere in every church." As Paul consider himself a father in the faith, he urges them to imitate him. Later in 1 Corinthians 11:1 he exhorts them, "Imitate me, just as I also *imitate* Christ," The point is that as Paul models his life after Christ they can model their life
- 2. You Cannot Teach Others What You Do Not Know Yourself. As disciplers, we will find that God will strategically allow us to walk through certain things in life, so that we are prepared to share and help others later on as they go through similar things. We can only take others as far as we ourselves have gone, They say that a teacher is primarily a learner A learner is one who goes through things, learns, gleans, and then hopefully is able to help others along the way. More is caught than taught. We disciple others by living in

- such a way that lessons are being developed with every breath we take
- 3. The Most Effective Discipleship Takes Place Living Life Together, Jesus didn't have little one-hour meetings scheduled with his disciples. He lived life with them! He ate with them, drank with them, ministered to others with them, and performed miracles in front of them. They spent every waking hour together, except for the times when Jesus needed to be alone with the Father. His life was given to these men. This was his method. Real discipleship takes place in the nitty gritty details of life. This is where most things are learned. This cool thing about this is that you can disciple someone this way without them even knowing it! By simply living life as an example, you are discipling all who come in contact with you.
- 4. Life Discipleship Requires Vulnerability and Humility. When we open up our lives to our disciples, we are opening up ourselves to the possibility of pain, criticism, and betraval. Jesus knew this better than anyone, and chose to be vulnerable anyway. Just before Judas betrays Christ, we see the John 13 example of Jesus washing the disciples' feet. And what does he say, "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed

your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. For I have given you an example, that you should do as I have done to you. Most assuredly, I say to you, a servant is not greater than his master; nor is he who is sent greater than he who sent him. If you know these things, blessed are you if you do them" (vv. 14-17). Jesus chooses the path of vulnerability and humility even though it would cost Him his life. Even though He was God (Phil. 2: 5-8). He humbled himself for the men who he loved, and made himself open and vulnerable to them. There will be times when in your attempt at living life together, in your attempt at vulnerability, that a disciple will hurt you. This is guaranteed. They will criticize you or perhaps talk about you behind your back. Give grace. Forgive. Disciple them even by your response to their hurtful act. In fact, your response to the hurtful situation will preach louder than any sermon you could share:

5. Sanctified Favoritism is Ok; Jesus did it. Jesus models a different sort of system. He did play favorites, in a sanctified sense. He had the multitudes. He had the seventy (Luke 10:1), then he had the twelve disciples (Luke 6:13), He had the three whom He singled to be with Him on special occasions: Peter, James, and John (Mark 9:2), and He apparently had the one: John (John

#### Leaving an Imprint of a Mother's Faith

"Children are like wet cement."

Moms know this often used description is true. You can do some shaping and molding, but it's never easy and kids grow up quickly and become "hardened" in such a hurry! A mom hopes to leave a significant imprint in that wet cement, and by the grace of God, that imprint can be a blessing and reminder of grace all her child's life.

The Bible hints to us that God specifically chose Mary to be the mom of Jesus to help imprint the wet cement of the Savior. There was something about both Mary and Joseph that led God to choose them to love, raise, form, and shape the Messiah!

Some are a little uncomfortable having anyone talk about a human imprint being made — a mere mortal making an impression — on the Lord, our Savior, the Son of God. Yet if we listen carefully, the Holy Spirit quietly whispers this truth to us.

After Jesus, at age 12, had declared that he had to be focused on his Father's work, the spiritual work of the temple, the Bible says:

Then he [Jesus] went down to Nazareth with them [Mary and Joseph] and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and man (Luke 2:51-52 NIV11).

Even after realizing at some level his responsibility to honor God and even after amazing everyone in the Temple courts with his understanding and answers to religious questions as he visited with the great teachers of Israel (Luke 2:45-47), Jesus went home and was obedient to his parents and continued to grow up under their influence into the young man God was wanting him to become!

Jesus was still wet cement, and Mary and Joseph

were responsible for molding, shaping, and imprinting that cement! They weren't alone in this; God was at work shaping Jesus' life (Luke 2:40), much like he is partnered with any godly parents in forming children of faith (Psalm 139:13-16; Ephesians 6:1-40).

Mary and Joseph's influence on Jesus was no accident! They were chosen by God (Luke 1:28-32). God chose them for some reasons we will probably never know, but Scripture does give us clues about some of the reasons he chose Mary and her betrothed, Joseph, to raise the Messiah. They were people of righteous character (Luke 1:34; Luke 2:39-40), gracious compassion (Matthew 1:19), and had godly family connections (Luke 1:5-17; Luke 1:39-45) with a group of very devout people who longed for God to intervene and bring redemption (Luke 2:21-38).

The role of a human mother and father shaping the development of the Messiah doesn't diminish the divinity of Jesus; it was part of God's plan. In Jesus, God chose to become human flesh and live among us as one of us (John 1:14). Jesus was God among us and one of us in every way (Hebrews 2:14-18; Hebrews 4:14-16).

Mary and Joseph remind us of the divine partnership that each of us has in forming God's child "on loan" to us for awhile. Our role is to shape, influence, mold, and imprint that child in ways that glorify the Father. We see parenthood redefined as something much more than contributing DNA to make a baby. We see the vital role of moms and dads as nurturing a child to discover his or her calling, the calling God designed into that child when the Father created that child uniquely, with purpose and for relationship with him (Psalm 139:13-16).

### Crawford's Clipboard A Great American Myth

Myth Busters is a great show on TV. I'd like to join them today by saying that one of the great American myths is that we are all a bunch of rugged individualists.

I like to think of myself as a mixture of Clint Eastwood, Sam Elliott, and John Wayne. Truth is I'd rather just blend into the woodwork.

A psychologist named Ruth Berenda busted this myth a few years ago with a simple experiment. She took a group of teenagers and broke them up into smaller groups of ten. Each group was instructed to raise their hands when the teacher pointed to the longest line. What one person in each group didn't know is that she instructed the other 9 to vote for the second longest line. The experiment was to determine how one person reacted when completely surrounded by a large number of people who obviously stood against what was true. In each case that one person would glance around the room, frown in confusion and slip his hand up with the others. They simply lacked the courage to challenge the group. Berenda's conclusion was this: Some people had rather be president than be right.

If we as parents do not teach our children how to stand alone when surrounded by those who put them to the test, then they will never be able to teach their children how to do it.....and then after a few generations look at what we have!

#### **GROWING IN GRACE** by Mike Gravois

#### **BEWARE OF SPIRITUAL IMMUNIZATION!!!**

If we, as parents, are just giving our children a little tiny dose of Jesus we may be doing them more harm than good. We may, in fact, be preventing them from wholeheartedly trusting and following Christ as adults.

Consider immunizations. When we give someone a flu shot, we're actually giving them what? A little tiny dose of the flu. Give them just enough and it will keep them from getting the full-blown flu. The natural reaction of the body is able to ward off and render harmless the flu virus. Is it possible to immunize our children from Jesus? Studies have often shown that those who are soured most on Christianity are not those people who have had no exposure to church and the Bible, but rather are those who, as children, either had bad experiences in the church or parents who sat in pews on Sunday but showed zero evidence of living out that faith the other six days of the week. They had a tiny dose and therefore were apparently immune to the full-blown effect of the risen Lord.

Why is this? Because a parent who models a half-hearted or Sunday-morning faith is essentially saying, "I know all about this Jesus guy and He's not significant enough for me to actually change my life. It's just not that big of a deal." That, friends, is a scary message to give our children. It's not just that we haven't given our children enough religious experience, it's that we've proven by our lives that there are no real-life implications of believing in God. Kids aren't stupid. Why would they want to believe in something that doesn't matter? So they abandon ship. Of course, they hold this stance only until they have their own children. Then they decide they want their children to "have religion", so they wind up doing the exact same routine as their parents. No real faith, just going through the motions. And in these motions, another generation is immunized from faith in Christ. Frightening.

That is cause for fear, parents. For all Christians, for that matter. The friends, neighbors, co-workers in our lives learn about Christ the exact same way our children do--by watching us. That is reason to evaluate the way that we live out the gospel, to get on our knees and spread God's Word before us and pray, "Do this to me! Do this to me!" We must not immunize our children from the beauty of Christ by living as if He matters little or not at all.

#### Comfort in Any Season

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God (2 Corinthians 1:3-4 TNIV).

Did you hear what Paul was saying in those two short verses? I hope so, because you are going to need to hang on to it. Life drags us through different seasons - some of them good, and some of them bad; and we are all going to need help or to be ready to help in the darker times.

One of my hardest seasons came on a Sunday night many years ago. I was speaking when one of our Shepherds hurriedly started up the church aisle, obviously bringing some kind of urgent message. The closer he came to the front of the sanctuary, the more his face showed great agony. About six rows from the front, he could hold his words no longer. In a spray of grief from a deep well of sorrow, he told the church that one of our family's 11-year-old boy had been hit by a car as he rode his bicycle to church. The little boy died before we could get to the hospital. The loss was gut wrenching, hard to accept, and devastating to all of us ... especially this boy's parents.

Words cannot describe the pain parents have in such seasons. And while many of us could offer these parents comfort because of our own recent grief, those whose words and presence blessed this grief-stricken family most were those who had been there — folks who had survived the deep wounds of losing a child and had somehow found a way to go on with their lives.

Remember how Paul wrote it, "The God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God." The truth of this is as undeniable in real life as it sounds in Scripture.

Those who have "been there," and that God has carried through the dark night of the soul, bring something to us when we find ourselves in our own "time to mourn." Because God's strength has carried them, their wounds validate ...

- the anguish of our hurt: not with platitudes, pity looks, or simplistic explanation, but the assurance that here is someone who knows and cares about our hurt.
- the uniqueness of our pain: we know their wound is like our own, but they recognize that our wound is as unique as the person we have lost.
- the strength within our spirits: they show us that they are making it through this horror with the help of God and His Spirit, so we can make it, too, and we will do it together.

They are there, for every season, so that during our time of mourning we are not alone and when we finally reach that time to dance, we have soul-level friends who will share our joy.

My prayer for you is this: If God has brought you through when you faced a season of grief and pain, may you find another to help through their season of grief.

If you find yourself in the deep well of sorrow and grief, may God bring the right folks to walk along side you, and share your journey till you are where you can help other wounded travelers yourself.

I stopped at Whataburger the other day to get a quick bite of lunch (I like their free drinks for seniors). It is my custom to refill that free drink before I leave. But when I got to the drink machine the Diet Coke had an "Out of Order" sign stuck on it.......but I did not panic! I simply thanked GOD for the one I did get.

It got me to thinking. There is order to just about everything. The universe is totally synchronized where every planet spins and rotates

in a set order which GOD gave in the beginning. Our planet has seasons: Spring, Summer, Fall and Winter in that order each and every year. GOD set that order too. There is even an order to salvation as well. A death, burial and resurrection precedes it (Rom 6:1-10).

I found this verse in (Proverbs 28:2) that says, "When a country is rebellious, it has many rulers, but a man of understanding and knowledge maintains order." When we start following "other rulers" is when we get things out of order. Out of Order means it's not working. Take some time this week to think about what might be out of order in your life.....but don't panic! GOD still cares.

#### **Growing in Grace** by Mike Gravois

Matthew would have spent the remainder of his life sitting at tax tables, cheating his fellow countrymen, and throwing parties for his rabble-friends. His children would have been cursed on their way to school and his wife excluded from all but the coarsest company. He would have remained a lackey of the hated Romans, counting pennies for a living and growing hard from the abuses of his countrymen.

James would have continued to work in his father's business. With his brother John, he would have spent his nights straining at the nets and his days mending them. Patching the sails, caulking the boat, sorting the catch, hauling fish to market -- that would have been James' lot. For the rest of his life, he would have smelled of the fish that he brought up from the depths to place on the tables of Capernaum.

We don't know what occupation was practiced by Philip or Bartholomew, Thomas or Thaddaeus. Simon the Zealot or Judas. Perhaps they were merchants or shepherds or even carpenters. Whatever the occupation, each would have stuck doggedly to the work for which he was trained, work that had probably been his father's and grandfather's. These then would have raised their families and repaired their houses and prayed in

the Synagogue on Saturdays. And, in time, they would have died, their memory buried with their remains. Anonymous men.

Except that each of these men met Jesus. One day, He had come by their table or boat or bench or store and called all of these men to a higher living. No longer were they to spend their lives on fish or taxes or sails—Jesus invited them to adopt a higher purpose for their lives. Matthew wrote the great gospel which bears his name. James became a leader in the early church and the first Christian martyr. Though billions of people have lived and died and quickly faded into oblivion, our children sing the names of these twelve and recall that through them Jesus turned a world upside down.

Jesus gives men and women significance. He makes them important. He involves them in the greatest work of all. He enlists them as partners in the progress of the kingdom. He calls them to ultimate things, to eternal realities. He fills their days with the substantial and the extraordinary and saves them from lives wasted on the trivial and trifling. When we become tired or discouraged, it does us good to remember the benefits of being a disciple.

#### Taking Flight

As spring began its first run at warming up West Texas, we joined many of our fellow Abilenians at one of the local nurseries. We purchased trees and flower baskets to try to dress up our non-descript back vard. We'll have to wait several years for the trees to make much of an impact, but little did we know what a difference one little hanging basket of flowers could

Several days after the flower basket was hund on a hook on our back porch, two things happened. First, it turned windy and cold — something it did repeatedly this spring - sending the flower basket spinning and rocking wildly in the wind. Second, a pair of small and beautiful birds built their nest in the flower basket. We didn't notice it at first, but we had to take the basket off the hook to water the flowers. One day, to our surprise, we noticed a little, white, bird egg with speckles resting in the bottom of carefully made nest. Several days later, there were four eggs. Then the mama bird made her presence known as she warmed those eggs as her flower basket home spun and rocked wildly in the strong spring winds.

Soon our little nest was full of ugly little baby birds without their feathers and with unopened eyes. Watering our flowers was a challenge — while I'm a firm believer in baptism, the baby birds didn't appear to be likely targets. We rarely saw the beautifully colored daddy bird for quite a few days. Mama bird would feed her brood and then be gone for awhile. Watering was even more interesting at this stage, but the mama bird tolerated us taking down the basket, watering the flowers around her babies, and then replacing the basket that held her nest.

Then one day, daddy bird re-appeared. There was stretching and wing-flapping and walking around in the flower basket. How they stayed up there we'll never know, because a late season norther blew through rocking and spinning the nest wildly. Somehow, the baby birds all stayed put. Then one morning they were all gone! They all flew away. While we were delighted with the success of our little bird nest adventure, we miss our beautiful little tenants!

This time of year, moms and dads all around the country are fluttering around in a dizzying spin of activity with their children. As schools and colleges come to an end for the year, many parents are watching their baby birds take flight — some are leaving high school, others are leaving college, some are getting married — as they head off into a brand new future.

Jesus had a time not too different than this. After his resurrection, he spent a final forty days with his closest followers. Then he left. As he did, he not only gave them their marching orders — we call that the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20) — but he also gave them some instructions to help them get ready to take flight.

Wait for God! As Isaiah had spoken so many years ago, waiting on the Lord is the key to taking flight. (Isaiah 40:30-31) But this is not just wasted waiting; it is a focused time of praying and praising God with joy. This waiting trusts that time in the presence of God is THE crucial step we must all take if we are to begin the future God has for us.

Stick together! Jesus' followers spent time with each other praising and praying. Even after their period of waiting, they stuck together. Later, when they were scattered outside of Jerusalem, they went out two-bytwo. They knew the importance of sticking together.

Receive God's power! One of the reasons they waited and stayed together was because they knew that God uses those circumstances to share his power. The personal presence of God through the Holy Spirit is the source of that power and they could not begin until they received this important blessing from God.

So as our "little birds" get ready to take flight into their new future, let's point them back to the same three truths that our Lord used with his precious ones before they had to fly without his personal presence.

Wait for God ... stick together ... and receive God's power.

### Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois The Cost of Discipleship Luke 14:28-30, 33

There is something about human nature that loves a bargain. Few things please us more than getting something for next-to-nothing. We dream of striking it rich quick. We boast about "what a steal" a particular item was. We flock to clearances and auctions and garage sales hoping that one day we will stumble across something of real value that doesn't cost us anything.

We're even tempted to look for a bargain when it comes to matters of faith. I believe that salvation is the free gift of God. But even as I say that my ears perk up at the words "free gift." The bargain lover in me hears words like "grace," "mercy," and "gift" and immediately I begin to wonder if there might really be a free lunch after all. It's as if God were holding a cosmic garage sale, and, while picking through the treasures, we come across *salvation* marked down so low that anyone would jump at the deal. Imagine

our delight that something as precious and valuable as salvation can be obtained at no cost to ourselves, with no risk and no obligation.

BUT one of the most perplexing paradoxes of religion is: Salvation is the free gift of God, yet it costs us everything we have. It cannot be earned, yet it requires we leave all, take up a cross and follow. It demands only our faith, yet that faith demands everything else about us. Salvation is by grace, but that grace is the most costly commodity around. The call to discipleship will cost you everything you value. Jesus wants you to count the cost before coming to Him. Don't become His disciple only to discover that He demands more than you are willing to give. Everyone will ridicule the disciple who begins and then turns back.

What is discipleship worth to you? Are you willing to pay the price that Jesus demands? Remember - salvation is a gift, but it doesn't come cheap.

#### Priesthood of Believers

The Old Testament is an amazing collection of inspired documents. While we live under the New Testament and follow its commands, one cannot have a deep and full understanding of the New Testament without at least some knowledge of the Old.

Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the apostle Peter described Christians as, among other things, "a royal priesthood" (1 Pet. 2:9). If a person only reads the New Testament, he might think that this is a nice description. Only the reader who reads the Old Law and gains insight from it can hold to this description with love and admiration of what we are to be as priests.

In the Old Testament, priests stood as the religious leaders of the people. They offered official sacrifices for the people, and took care of the sacred items in the tabernacle and, later, the temple. The priests, in many ways, stood as the "symbols" of what religion was to be; since they stood before God and offered the sacrifices necessary under the Old Law to pardon (atone for) sin.

Introducing the entry "priest," The International Standard Bible Encyclopedia gives us this basic information: A priest is one who is duly authorized to minister in sacred things, particularly to offer sacrifices at the altar, and who acts as mediator between men and God. ... It was in virtue of the priestly functions that the chosen people were brought into near relations with God and kept therein. Through the ministrations of the priesthood the people of Israel were instructed in the doctrine of sin and its expiation, in forgiveness and worship. (Volume 4, page 2439)

While a study of the priesthood in a much deeper manner is necessary, that brief description is sufficient for our thoughts in this brief post. How are we, as New Testament Christians, to be like the Old Testament priests? It is not that we are to be like Old Testament priests. In fact, calling New Testament Christians "priests" denotes something far greater.

One fact not given in the previous description is that priests were from a specific tribe of God's people: the Levites. Certain clans (or families) within that family, then, were charged with specific functions surrounding worship and the tabernacle or temple. If you were born to the tribe of Levi, you were a priest, and held a function within Old Testament worship and rite. If, instead, you were born to, say, the tribe of Reuben, you could not be a priest. It was that simple.

When Peter, in the New Testament age, wrote, "You are a royal priesthood," he was indicating a great change. Notice to whom this letter from Peter was addressed: "To those who are elect exiles of the dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia." To state this simply, Peter was addressing this letter to Christians of every background who were being persecuted and dispersed due to their faith.

What is the significance of that in our discussion? Peter is stating that anyone and everyone—despite any family history—is a priest. In other words, there is no more need of an earthly high priest to stand before an altar and offer sacrifices each year for the sins of the people.

Why? Because we have a greater High Priest (cf. Heb. 4:14-16). Jesus Christ, when He shed His blood on the cross, removed any need for further sacrifices of blood. That, in turn, removed the need for a priest to offer animals on an altar before God.

One of the great truths of the New Testament is that we are not part of the "Reuben-Christians" or the "Gad-Christians" or the "Levi-Christians." It is also wonderful to know that we are not "clergy" and "laity." All faithful Christians are priests.

Be grateful for the sacrifice of Christ, and for the "middle wall of partition" (Eph. 2:14) it broke down. God sent His Son to this earth to break down that dividing line, and you and I are blessed to live in the era wherein we are all priests. Let's live like it!

# **Growing in Grace** by Mike Gravois **The Call to Discipleship**

Mark 1:16-18

As He walked along, He saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow Me," Jesus told him, and Levi got up and followed Him. Mark 2:14

The call goes forth and it is at once followed by the response of obedience. The response of the disciples is an act of obedience, not a confession of faith in Jesus. How could the call immediately evoke obedience? Attempts have been made to separate these two events. Something must have happened in between, some psychological or historical event. Unfortunately, the text is silent on this point. It displays not the slightest interest in the psychological implications for the man's religious decisions. And why? For the simple reason that the cause behind the immediate following of the call with a response is Jesus Christ Himself. It is Jesus who calls, and because it is Jesus, Levi follows at once. This encounter is a testimony to the absolute, direct, and unaccountable authority of Jesus. There is no need of any preliminaries, and no other consequence but obedience to the call. Because Jesus is the

Christ, He has the authority to call and to demand obedience to His Word. Jesus summons men to follow Him not as a teacher or a pattern of the good life, but as the Christ, the Son of God. In this short text Jesus Christ and His claim are proclaimed to men. Not a word of praise is given to the disciple for his decision to follow Christ. We are not expected to contemplate the disciple, but only Him who calls, and His absolute authority. According to our text, there is no road to faith or discipleship. no other road, -- only obedience to the call of Jesus.

Jesus calls people to follow Him today just as certainly as He did in the days of the first century. And now, as then, those who hear His call must make a decision -- do they accept His invitation or decline it? Unfortunately, many people who think they are saying "Yes" to Jesus have no understanding of what He is inviting them to do.

Being a disciple, answering Jesus' call, means dying to self, taking up a cross, and following Him. Are you that kind of disciple? Such is the only kind of disciple that Jesus will accept.



#### Anxiety

"Be careful for nothing, but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God."

In today's world there is an epidemic of people who suffer from anxiety. There are so many, that our pharmaceutical companies are making millions on anxiety pills and other medications. Studies show that 9 of the 10 of you reading this have in the past, or are currently on some sort of medication to help you with your anxiety. The causes of this epidemic are inclusive. Some believe it is due to a bad diet, or even the dietary supplements placed in our processed food. Some believe it is due to a lack of exercise in our daily routines. Still others believe it is due to a struggling economy and impending poverty. While we agree that all of these factors play a role in causing anxiety, they are not the main case. The main cause for one being overly anxious is a lack of faith in God.

The Bible tells us to "Be careful for nothing," (Philippians 4:6). The King James Version renders this verse "Be careful." But the term "careful" in the Greek language means, "to be full of care." It means to care to the point that it causes you worry or anxiety. Other versions of the scripture will render the verse, "Be anxious for nothing." The Bible is not telling us to not to care, it is simply telling us not to care to the point of excessive worry. Anxiety then should not be a part of the faithful Christian's life. Here are a few things to help us learn to be less anxious in life. Dr. Gary Collins, a well-known Christian counselor, gives these tips. He writes,

Trust in God. The person who learns to walk in daily contact with God comes to agree with the hymn writer who wrote, "I know not what the future holds, but I know who holds the future," (Collins, 2007, p. 155). Indeed we will worry less, have less stress and less anxiety when we realize that God is in control of the situation. Trust in Him! Cast your cares upon Him for he cares for you! How sweet it is to be able to sit back and relax knowing that God is in control! I am reminded of when I was a boy and we used to take road trips with my family. My mother drove the car, and as a boy I never needed to watch the road, and I did not worry about traffic or other cars. I did not need to follow a map or a GPS. Gas was not on my mind. I could sit back and enjoy the ride. Why? My

mother was at the wheel of the car. I knew she would never allow anything to happen to me. Therefore I needed not to

Learn to Cope. Coping with the causes of anxiety, when and before they arise, can prevent the development of anxiety, (Collins, ibid). There is a long list of things that will help us to cope, or accept a situation. Each of these things needs to become a part of our regular lifestyle. For example, admitting fears, insecurities and conflicts when they arise will help to relieve some stresses. One can never actually address a situation until they admit there is a situation to address.

Keep Things in Perspective. In threatening, challenging or potentially dangerous situations, it is easy to panic, but it is better to ponder the circumstances and try to determine the ways to cope, (Collins, ibid). We as humans have the uncanny ability to make mountains out of molehills. Everything that glitters in not gold, but we must also remember that things are not always as bad as they seem. We must learn to let our emotions settle before we take action or panic. Sit and wait on the Lord, for he has said, "Be still and know that I am God" (Psalms 46:10). When we have calmed down, when we have had a good night's sleep, when we have let God work on the situation, then things will seem more manageable.

Reach Out to Others. Caring about others and reaching out to help may be among the most effective ways to deal with the cares and anxieties in one's own life, (Collins, ibid). One of the very best things you can do when you are full of anxiety is to use the excessive energy caused by anxiety to help others. Keeping busy while your mind is full of worry helps to take your mind off the points of stress, and working helps to clear excessive energy. Reach out and help others especially when you are worried about things.

#### The Way of Discipleship

Discipling men and women is the priority around which our lives should be oriented.

Why do we say this? because Jesus Christ Himself said it in His final words before His ascension into heaven.

"Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

Matthew 28:18-20

It shouldn't seem strange that Jesus Christ should place such a high priority on discipling. After all, Jesus was simply asking His followers to do what He had done with



But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead. I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus (Philippians 3:13-14 TNIV).

In the mid-life crisis cult-classic film, "City Slickers," Curly (played by Jack Palance) turns to Mitch (played by Billy Crystal) and asks him if he knows what the secret to life is. The dialogue that follows goes like this: "No, what?" Mitch stammers. Then Curly holds up one finger and says, "This!" "Your finger?" Mitch questions. "One thing, just

one thing." Curly emphasizes. "That's great, but what's the one thing?" Mitch asks. "That's for you to figure out," Curly responds.

We can look on these lines as trite, simplistic, or simply comedic commentary. However, if we are honest with ourselves, we know that something deep in our hearts resonates with the truth of this dialogue. Somewhere down in our soul, we know we are not here by accident and that we are not some random result of genetic matter.

Then, we remember Jesus' comments to Martha about "only one thing worth being concerned about." We also recall the apostle Paul's autobiographical statement, "One thing I do!"

# **GROWING IN GRACE** by Mike Gravois

We can learn a great deal about people from their attitudes to the misfits of society. Some bully them; some despise them; some laugh at them; some patronize them; some ignore them with embarrassment. The attitude of Jesus to those no one else bothered with was like none of those we have mentioned. His care for unwanted individuals is one of the most endearing things about Him.

At the outset of His ministry a leper kneels before Him begging His help. Others will keep away. But Jesus, knowing how much it will mean to this man to have His healing touch mediated through a touch, stretches out His hand and touches him, saying, "Indeed I will; be clean again" (Mark 1:40ff).

In the Gerasene country a wild figure steps out from among the tombs, a man no one can control,

shouting with uncouth cries, and bleeding from elf-inflicted gashes. Where others would dodge away with a shudder, Jesus faces his rage and calmly commands the unclean spirit to leave him (Mark 5:1-13).

A shy, self-conscious woman, who feels so painfully different from others because of the hemorrhages she has suffered for twelve years, trembles with fear when she finds that Jesus knows she has touched His cloak for healing. The warm sympathy of Jesus goes out to reassure her as she hears Him say kindly, "My daughter, your faith has cured you. Go in peace, free forever from this trouble" (Mark 5:25-34).

Jesus had a mission to lonely, unwanted people, and so has His church . . . The Christian knows that everyone mattered to Jesus, so everyone must matter to him.



# More Than Change

We know that change is the one constant in our lives on this side of eternity. Donna and I have been overwhelmed with change over the last couple of years, so we took some time to get away and enjoy a quaint little town in Central Texas. This is a town filled with all sorts of shops that sell just about everything.

We were only making the rounds at a specific kind of shop. We were really there to relax, and for us that means reading, enjoying the quiet, and sharing a few uninterrupted dinners together. We found one of those kinds of shops and it looked quaint and filled with promise from the street. The parking area was large, the approaches were new ramps and steps, the shop had fairly fresh paint, and looked quite nice. However, there were few cars in the parking lot and this puzzled us.

I parked under the shade, always a good move on a 100-degree day. As we walked up to the shop, I noticed two things. First, while the approaches, steps, and landscaping were new and nicely done, the porch to this building had many rotting boards — so many that I thought I was going to fall through when I first stepped onto the porch. Second, no one was in and a sign said, "Back in five minutes!" So we sat in the heat and waited about ten minutes. No one showed up and I noticed that the whole front porch was filled with boards that were rotting away underneath their fairly recent paint job. The spot at the steps groaned again under my weight — ugh, that's for another week — as we left before anyone returned.

Hum! This shop is a lot like many self-

We know that change is the one constant in improvement projects I've heard about — a lot of time spent on the externals and little time devoted to the person and values underneath the externals.

There are quite a few things I would like to change about myself right now. Yet I want these to be more than external changes: I want real transformation. Slapping a metaphorical new coat of paint on me — you know what I mean, changing my hair, dropping a few pounds, getting some new clothes, the external stuff — is not going to get me very far if I don't ask God to be at work through the Holy Spirit to truly transform me. I must partner with the Spirit of God if real transformation in the direction of Christ is going to happen (2 Corinthians 3:17-18).

Jesus accused the religious hypocrites of his day of caring only about externals while being rotten on the inside (Matthew 23:27-28). I sure don't want that to be true of me!

So let's join each other in committing to more than change: let's call each other to spiritual transformation. And if you have some things you've done to help you in the spiritual work of transformation, we'd all sure love to hear about them. Share your thoughts on the blog as we try to "spur one another on" to love, good deeds, and holy living (Hebrews 10:23-25)

It's good for us to re-read Job 38 & 39 to

help us to know that HE is GOD and we are not. GOD throws out a wall of questions. "Where were you when I laid the earth's foundation? Tell me, if you understand. Who marked off its dimensions? Surely you know! What is the way to the place where the lightning is dispersed, or the place where the east winds are scattered over the earth? Do you know when the mountain goats give birth? Do you watch when the doe bears her fawn? Do you know the time they give birth? Do you give the horse his strength or clothe his neck with a flowing mane?"

We buy the arrogance Satan sells (it's cheap). And GOD hates it (Prov 8:13). We even tell GOD what we are going to do today and tomorrow! I can hear Him laughing now.

#### **Growing in Grace** by Mike Gravois

Have you ever been lost? I don't mean inconvenienced or temporarily disoriented - I mean LOST. Turned around, completely confused, scared to death and about to cry kind of lost? There are few things that frighten us quite like not knowing where we are. No familiar places . . . no familiar faces. Nothing to give us a reference point . . nothing to help us orient ourselves and find out what direction we should be going.

There is another kind of lostness, though, that frightens me even more - spiritual lostness. It's not that you don't know where you are. With this kind of lostness, you don't have any idea where you're going. You have no home to go to, you have no direction to strive for. Like a homeless person living on the streets, you wander your own spiritual streets, and "lostness" becomes not just a temporary state of affairs . . . "spiritual lostness" becomes characteristic of every day of your life. You get used to

being turned around and confused and scared. You get used to there being no reference point . . . no principles to help you orient yourself and give yourself some direction and purpose.

-Jesus contends that every human being who ever lived was **lost**, without hope and without God in this world (Ephesians 2:12).

-Those people who have been **found**, those who have discovered a purpose and direction for their lives, have done so not by their own merit and hard work but by confessing their lostness to God and turning the wheel of their lives over to Him.

-When all is said and done, the only difference between the man in the pew and the man in the street is that one is a lost person who has been found and the other is still out wandering the streets of life looking for something to point him in the right direction.

# **Strange Neighbors**

Five university boys moved into the house next door last year. You have to understand, they moved into the biggest house on the cul-de-sac. This is not a rent house street. Several of the neighbors are older. Nearly everyone on the street has grown children. Most neighbors were — and some still are — a bit edgy about the situation.

Truth be told, the five guys have been great — respectful, fairly quiet, and aside from some parking problems, terrific neighbors. And since they moved in next door, I've remembered the house I lived in when I was in college. There were five of us, too. We were pretty good guys, but we were still college kids — cars everywhere, lots of coming and going, late hours, and good music.

One morning after we have been "toilet papered," the trees held long strips of flowing "decoration" and the house was literally wrapped around with toilet paper. Bits of paper littered the lawn, toilet paper intertwined in the leaves of our shrubs, whole rolls wrapped our cars, and long streamers blew through the trees only to settle in white clumps on the ground.

Not too far into that morning, the phone rang. It was the little old lady from next door. She was upset because some of our "delicate tissue" was all over her yard. We weren't sure at first what she was talking about; then it dawned on us that our house had been "decorated" while we slept. She was nice, but it was also clear that she would have much preferred for five college boys to live somewhere else. We were respectful and cleaned up the yard, but realized that despite what we might think of our fine selves, we definitely were not the most desired neighbors on the street.

Then one night the little lady next door knocked on the door very upset and seemingly disoriented. Actually, she was asking for help. Several of the guys dropped everything and ran next door. She was obviously flustered and didn't know what to do. Her

husband was quite pale, lying on the bed, and barely moving. One of the boys called for an ambulance. Another tried to stay with her and calm her down. The other one of us went to wait by the curb and wave down the ambulance. Meanwhile, the guy on the phone then called one of her friends to meet her at the hospital.

The ambulance pulled up with lights flashing and took the little old man to the hospital. A couple of our guys drove his wife to the hospital. The others of us turned on lights and locked up her house for her and said a prayer. A couple of guys stayed at the hospital till friends came to be with her. Thankfully, the little old man recovered from his heart attack and came home about a week later. We let them know we were there if they ever needed us ... any time — day or night.

Needless to say, we didn't receive any more calls about "delicate" tissues and pretty soon all the people on the street knew about the "nice boys" in the brown ranch house. I can assure you, we did not become a quieter brood after that, but folks knew more about our hearts and gave us the benefit of the doubt. Life places strange neighbors together — like loud boys in their early twenties next to a quiet couple in their eighties. In His sovereign grace, God places even stranger neighbors together in Scripture. Go read the Gospel of John, chapters 3 and 4. Notice all the incredible differences between these two people. There couldn't be any more mismatched neighbors. Yet there they are! A man and a woman ... a leader and someone powerless ... a religious teacher and a religious outcast ... a Jew and a hated half-Jew ... someone so important he had to come at night and someone so outcast she came alone at midday. Yet if you read their stories, you realize that despite their differences, they both knew they needed something more ... something of God that they couldn't get from their day-to-day lives, their runaway relationships, or their stuck-in-a-rut religious responsibilities.

# **Growing in Grace** by Mike Gravois

What is astonishing is the variety of people that Jesus met and ministered to: men and women, old and young, Jew, Samarian, Syrophoenician, Greek and Roman, Sadducee and Pharisee, Zealot and Herodian, rich men and poor men, lepers, demented, blind, deaf, lame, tax collectors, herlots, fishermen, lawyers. The gospels were not deliberately setting out to list all this variety of people - but here was a man who drew the crowds and attracted individuals . . .

One is immediately struck by the contrasts - Jesus will dine with the despised and the honored, with friends and with adversaries and critics. He speaks out for the poor, but He does not

#### ostracize the rich. Michael Griffiths The Example of Jesus, pp. 127 & 129

For some reason, many people throughout history and from a wide variety of religious beliefs have defined religion solely in terms of a relationship with God. Faith is a vertical business conducted between heaven and earth that has little relation to the horizontal connections we have with our fellow man. Part of the genius of Jesus of Nazareth was showing that intimacy with God necessitates the right treatment of people. You cannot claim a love of God, whom you have not seen, without loving the people you see every day. To Jesus, religion is not just vertical and Godcentered; it is horizontal and people-centered as well.

And they found what they needed in Jesus. He brought light to their darkness and water to their parched souls. Jesus was better than something new: lesus was someone fresh that brought the Breath of heaven and the opportunity for new starts. They left behind their darkness and empty water bucket to follow Jesus.

Most of us would look at Nicodemus and the unnamed woman at the well and never pick them out as potential neighbors, much less as fellow-followers of Jesus. Clearly, our horizons are often too narrow and our prejudices are just too deep to put such widely divergent people together. Yet Jesus entered their worlds and listened ... and Jesus didn't just listen to their words; the Lord listened for their hearts. Jesus was tender and tough. He was tactful and forceful. But most of all, Jesus was patient and gently prying as He listened for their needs and as they shared their wounds and yearnings. Then He spoke words of truth to them when they were ready. The woman followed immediately and brought her whole village to faith (John 4:39-42). Nicodemus took some time, but he eventually showed his faith in Jesus by defending him before the ruling council (John 7:45-52) and associating himself with Jesus after the crucifixion (John 19:38-42), just as Jesus had said (John 3:13-21).

Who in your world, who among your neighbors at work or home or school, has God placed near so their hearts can be heard and their needs, wounds, and yearnings can be heard? Who are the neighbors that Jesus sent you to hear? Jesus didn't just come to save the world (John 3:16-17), He also came to call us to partner with Him in the mission of grace:

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you" (John 20:21 TNIV).

# **Yell Hold Up?**

I don't mean to say that I have already achieved these things or that I have already reached perfection! But I keep working toward that day when I will finally be all that Christ Jesus saved me for and wants me to be. No, dear brothers and sisters, I am still not all I should be, but I am focusing all my energies on this one thing: Forgetting the past and looking forward to what lies ahead, I strain to reach the end of the race and receive the prize for which God, through Christ Jesus, is calling us up to heaven. (Philippians 3:12-14)

I guess I'm now officially in the older set — I spend more time looking for good shoes than I do good suits. I like a lot of things done in routine — same TV shows, same places to eat, and same morning routine. So I understand not wanting a bunch of unnecessary changes, and when changes come, I want them to be done well and carefully. However, I was reminded several years ago how frustrating it is to hold up the progress of everyone else just to keep things going at a manageable pace.

We were coming home from a vacation and we had driven for 6 or 7 hours on all sorts of highway surfaces. Some of them were smooth and uncluttered. Some of them were full of cracks, holes, lane closures and traffic re-routing. Toward the end of this bad surface driving marathon, we finally reached the best surface of the day — freshly paved, perfectly striped, and in perfect condition. To my utter amazement, there was only one noticeable problem with the surface; we had to drive 20 miles with one lane closed and the speed limit reduced by 20 mph ... for no apparent reason. There was even a highway patrolman using radar to stop folks who fudged on the speed limit! Traffic backed up as the trucks had a hard time keeping up their speed on the hills and all of us had to drive well below what should have been the legal speed limit on the best paved, striped and harder for your people to answer your call to go forward to shouldered highway of the 1100 mile trip!

Somewhere about half way through this frustrating and dangerous mess, a powerful conviction swept over me. "This reminds me a lot of church thinking. We're all set to go,

we have great opportunities and we're blessed, talented people to carry out the Lord's mandate, but we're stuck going too slow for too long. Why? Because someone doesn't want to take the time and the risk to set God's people free to be all he wants them to be and to do all that he wants them to do!"

I know this problem isn't anything new. God had to use the persecution that broke out against the church in Ierusalem to get them to evangelize Samaritans and begin to reach out to Gentiles! (Acts 6; Acts 8; Acts 11) God had to use a vision, angels and the revelation of the Holy Spirit to get Peter and the Jerusalem church to baptize and include a gentile in his circle of Christian fellowship. (Acts 10; Acts 11; Acts 15)) It wasn't easy breaking out of the familiar and comfortable mode of doing things, even for apostles who had been with Jesus and had received his Great Commission mandate. (Matthew 28:18-20)

While so much of what gets passed off as outreach in much of today's church-talk is really just a push for selfinterest, let's also realize that our world stands in need of God's grace revealed in Jesus Christ. Our mandate is to begin where we are, to reach out to those nearby, and then see our influence as world-wide. (Acts 1:8) We're never going to get there in any of those three dimensions by keeping the highway closed down to one lane when God has paved the way, striped the lanes so we can see where we should go, and made sure the road is ready for his traffic. Instead of always asking who is going to be uncomfortable with an outreach effort, let's ask the question Jesus wants asked: how are we going to reach lost sheep, broken hearts, and forgotten people of our day?

Dear Father, never let me live so long that I make it embrace your mission of reaching a lost world and reclaiming your lost sheep. In Jesus' name I pray, Amen.



# From Drift to Shift: SH!FT\_READ faithfully

Ed was a man's man — Green Beret, Military Intelligence, full bird Colonel, Texas DPS Intelligence, Private Eye, and physically fit into his seventies. He weighed every morning to see how much Bluebell ice cream he could eat that day. Then he would do his workout or play tennis. The most touching part of Ed's story, however, involved Leona. Fifty years after the events and with a big smile on his face as he would tell the story, small tears would glisten in the corner of his eyes.

World War II and the army came calling for Ed. Yet rather than rushing off and getting married to Leona and risk leaving her a widow, maybe even with a child to raise on her own, Ed did what he believed was the honorable thing. He made his love for Leona clear, but decided to wait till after the war to get married. Leona did something honorable as well. She wrote Ed every day he was gone — every day for years!

When Ed would tell this story years later, he would talk about how he loved those letters. He didn't receive them very often — after all, it was war. But when mail call came, he always had the biggest stack of letters. He would put them in order and then eagerly read them ... again and again. He was happy to tell you that those letters sustained him through very hard times and he returned from war loving Leona even more than when he had left.

Even though the news in those letters was old, the love communicated from Leona was fresh. Even though the information was the same each time Ed read those letters, the relationship was deepened as Ed hung on to every word and looked for a fresh nuance each time he read. Even though the distance between Ed and Leona was great, their hearts remained connected through the letters.

We all know we are supposed to read the Bible. In fact, if I had started off by saying that, I doubt you would have read this far. Yet holiness is built on God's incredible and sacrificial love for us. Scripture is more than a library of 66 books with varied human authors, written over the course of more than a thousand years. The Bible is a collection of God's letters to his beloved children who are at the front lines of war engaged in hand-to-hand combat with the enemy.

While we can say a lot of things about the nature of the Bible, the truth is that the principles of Leona's letters to Ed are even more true of God's Scriptures written for us:

- The news may be old, but the love can stay fresh.
- · The message may be things we've heard repeated, but our

relationship will be deepened by reading it.

 The distance between us and these events in the past may be great, but our hearts can remain connected with the same God who acts in our lives today!

Years ago, I interned for a church that had a huge open Bible on the communion table at the front of the sanctuary. From a distance, the pages looked yellowed and well used. Yet after several Sundays there, I began to wonder about that. Most folks didn't bring their Bibles to church and they sure didn't seem to use them or know them away from church.

One night as I was taking a short cut through the sanctuary to my car to head home, I stopped and looked at the old Bible. As I turned back several pages they began to look more stained than worn. Sure enough, I came to the page where water from a roof leak had dripped for some time and stained the old Bible. It became a symbol of something deeply lacking in the life of this church. They lacked a yearning to know and be shaped by the word of God.

We are at the front lines of battle. We are in a war against Satan and his desire to hold people captive, wreak havoc to the peace between nations, and to corrupt the hearts and minds of all who love Jesus. Yet so much of what we turn to for information, advice, and moral guidance comes from everywhere ... but God! No wonder there are so many casualties, so many who lose faith, and so many who get sucked under by the rip tide of culture. So let's hear the reminder Paul sent Timothy about the importance of the Scriptures:

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have become convinced of, because you know those from whom you learned it, and how from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that all God's people may be thoroughly equipped for every good work (2 Timothy 3:14-17 TNIV).

And let's also remember the passion of Ed for the letters he received from Leona. When we do, we suddenly will find ourselves doing far more than reading the Bible: we will find ourselves seeking God through his loving words to us!



# **Secret Things**

Years ago I learned how to answer difficult Bible questions by using a portion of Deut. 29:29 – "The secret things belong to the Lord." After taking another look at that passage I have discovered it's "real" purpose. It says ---- "The secret things belong to the Lord our GOD, but the things revealed belong to us and our children forever, that we may follow all the words of this law."

GOD is the Big Revealer. As HE reveals

things to us, then we become accountable to HIM to act on them. For instance, if you have never read "For we are GOD'S workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which GOD prepared in advance for us to do" (Eph 2:10), then you did not know that GOD lined your day up with good works for you to do. Now that you know this ---- you have become accountable for your actions toward these good works. You can thank me later for pointing this out.

What you and I should be doing is praying daily, asking GOD to reveal to us what HE wants to do in the church and in our personal lives. When HE reveals it ---- then it's ours to act on.

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois

An ambassador must effectively communicate a message. If he is unsure of that message, he'll never be an effective ambassador. Many Christians are ineffective ambassadors because they are not sure of the content of their message and are unable to communicate it understandably to others. For many, understanding the gospel is like understanding a mathematical problem. They hear the mathematical problem explained in class and clearly understand it as the professor goes through it, but when a friend who cut the class asks them to explain the problem, they are at a loss on how to do it in terms that are clear enough for the friend to grasp. Many who have believed and understood the gospel for themselves are unable to articulate it clearly enough to another person so that they, too, might know and experience the same Lord . . .

In communicating the gospel it is essential to realize that Christianity is not a philosophy or a way of life but a living person, Jesus Christ. Unless a non-Christian realizes the fundamental issue is his personal relationship to this person rather than what church or congregation he should belong to, what amusements he should not attend, etc., we will have failed. Not even the crucial question of whether the Bible is the Word of God is the central issue in salvation . . .

The gospel, then, is Jesus Christ Himself -- who He is, what He has done, and how He can be known in personal experience.



# SH!FT my LIFE: LIVE\_holy

Nearly all of us have some form of portable electronic device — a mobile phone, mp3 player, laptop computer, GPS, or iPad. These are wonderful devices that can be used in many useful ways. Yet if we are honest, no matter how hard we tried to make the best purchase at the time we bought our device, it was overhyped in ads and soon replaced by a new and improved model.

I have several of these devices, love most of them, and yet as many things as they do, they can't make my wife love me more, grow hair in my bald spot, or trim two inches off my waist line.

So when we see ads for the newest, latest, best, most fantastic mobile phone, mp3 player, computer, or tablet pc, we are a bit skeptical. We know that a newer and hetter one is going to come down the marketing pike in a few months. We carry this skepticism with us into our spiritual lives. How can anything measure up to the us life. Instead, it is a call to realize how precious we claims the Bible makes about God?

No one in the Bible has a higher view of God than Isaiah. His claims and expectations of God are of "do's" and avoiding a list of "don'ts"! It is not over-the-top. The beauty of his descriptions of God, his high and lofty view of God, his understanding of God's holiness coupled with God's willingness to be involved in humanity's messes is unparalleled. Yet Isaiah's encounter with God more than lived up to his expectations!

The reality of God was far beyond any hype Isaiah could have imagined. In fact, Isaiah's encounter with God left him grasping for words to describe God's magnificence and grace. This encounter with God helps more religious hype, but it desperately needs us to us understand what it means to LIVE\_holy (Isaiah 6:1- LIVE\_holy! 8). To live holy means:

- We recognize God's **majesty** shared with us Isaiah 6:1-4
- We accept God's mercy lavished upon us Isaiah
- We embrace God's mission accomplished through us Isaiah 6:8

To **LIVE\_holy** is to recognize that we are precious to God, made holy at a high price, and designed for God's great purposes (1 Corinthians 6:19-20 and 1 Peter 1:13-20).

In our church community, we have several families that have gone to extraordinary efforts to have children — some through physical birth and some through adoption. And while we recognize that every single child is precious, there are some amazing stories to tell about the sacrifice of these parents to bring special children into their families.

We love these special children enormously. We love our own children beyond what words can say. Yet as much as we love our children, we know that God loves us more and has sacrificed far more to make us a part of his family. So we understand God's call to LIVE\_holy is not made to limit us or hurt us or deny are to God and God's great purpose for our lives.

To **Live\_holy** is much more than keeping a list something we do to earn or merit God's love and mercy. Instead, to LIVE holy is a response to the majesty of God within us and the mercy of God lavished upon us. To LIVE\_holy is to recognize the grace we have received and to respond by living out God's mission, God's Kingdom lifestyle, in our broken world. Our purpose is to reflect God's righteous character and gracious compassion in our lives!

A plateau is an elevated tract of land that is level. It's sometimes called a tableland. This word picture is often applied to an absence of progress such as an individual's learning. When our learning has reached a plateau it has ended. As one man put it, "When you're through learning, you're through." In other words, when you stop learning you make the conscience decision that this is the most I will know.

A number of churches in our nation have been involved in a research to help them understand where

they are in the spiritual growth process. A growth continuum was charted and one of the discoveries was that about 25% of the membership feel that have reached a spiritual plateau....they have stopped learning and growing spiritually.

As individual Christians we can do three things if we are in such a place. One, decide to grow. Make the decision to not be satisfied sitting your days out on a tableland. Two, create a plan. A plan is absolutely necessary and to work that plan is the key. Set your own goals to read and study all you can about a particular subject. Then get after it. If you need certain resources such as a Bible Dictionary or a full concordance, get them. Three, help someone else to grow and to learn. When you help someone else learn you will never lack for knowledge yourself.

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois I WANT TO KNOW CHRIST

What does a Christian have to know? What does the Christian have to know first and foremost? There are many answers to the first question, there is only one answer to the second. We need to know about Scriptures and how to find our way about the Bible. We need to know about morality. We need to know about doctrine and about some of the distinctive teachings that Jesus brought from the Father.

But when all of that is said and done, when we've learned all these things, have we yet become Christians? Is it possible to learn about doctrine, morality, the Bible, the plan of salvation but never really learn about Jesus?

Christians must know many things. But there is only one thing which is fundamental, only one thing which is first and foremost. The Christian is one who knows Christ. Christ is the focus of our learning. He is the foundation upon which all else in our lives is built. We study the Bible to know Christ. We learn of salvation to be in Christ. We behave morally to be like Christ. Of all the things a Christian must know, only one thing is primary and that is Jesus.

A Christian is one who knows Christ. We must not define Christians only by what they know of religion or ethical living or even the Bible. Christians are experts in Jesus. Though a knowledge of Jesus will lead to right doctrine and morality, such knowledge is Christ-centered and flows from our appreciation of Him.



Perhaps our best response is prayer such as the Psalmist in (Ps 141:3): "Set a guard over my mouth, O Lord; keep watch over the door of my lips."

# Growing in Grace by Mike Gravois Exodus 29: It's a LOCAL CALL

Moses is on the mountaintop, both physically and spiritually, in conference with God Almighty who's giving him all kinds of instructions. The Lord intends to make the people of Israel a unique nation on the face of the earth. Right now the Lord is in the process of setting everything in motion. In the midst of the detailed plans for the Tabernacle and it's furnishings I hear an earth shaking promise from God. He says, "I'll move in and live...I'll be their God...they'll realize that...." This concept is both humbling and thrilling. The Lord isn't going to sit up on Mount Sinai, distant and unapproachable. Instead, he's moving in with them. In this passage in Exodus we find that the Lord intends that it be a "local call" when his people call his name. He's moving in and has no desire to be beyond our reach. It's humbling to think that God Almighty would take such interest in mere human beings. However, it's also thrilling to consider that he wants to move into my neighborhood and be an active participant in my every day life. For Moses, this is all about the Tabernacle and worship there. For me it is all about Jesus coming and then sending his Holy Spirit to "move in and live" in my heart. "Oh Lord, come on in, you're welcome here."

I attended the funeral of my next door neighbor on Monday. The preacher's opening remarks included a plea for the audience to please turn off their cell phones out of respect for the family. My first thought was, "Good for you for saying that!" But as I pondered a bit farther, I began to think, "What an embarrassing moment" that we should have to be told to turn off our phones. Here's a wife and children and grandchildren mourning

over the loss of their granddad, father, and husband.....and we have to be <u>told</u> to turn off our cell phones! When did we lose our respect for others that we, as grown-ups, would have to be told to turn the cell phones off? Have we lost all sensitivity?

Scripture tells us to "Show proper respect to everyone" (1 Peter 2:17). We do that because we are image bearers! We bear the image of Christ. You and I, as Christians, are to show proper respect to others, especially in critical times, without being told. Sometimes it scares me to think about how far removed we are from the Christ we worship and how little His Word has affected our lives.

#### 1 Samuel 25: A Wife of Noble Character

The encounter between David and Saul at En Gedi results in a sort of peace between the two. David isn't ready to return home, but Saul isn't pursuing him for the time being. Under the cease-fire David is thinking about more pressing needs, like food! In the vicinity there's a successful farmer who's shearing his sheep. This is more than just a farm chore. It's a big feast, a celebration of the success of the farm. David sends a few men to humbly ask the farmer to make a donation to his troops. The result is insult and denial. This infuriates David. There have been many times when he could have just taken some of Nabal's sheep. Instead, his men have treated his shepherds with respect and kept their hands off of Nabal's property. In his anger, David is on his way to raid Nabal's farm and take revenge by taking his life. Meanwhile, Nabal's wife, Abigail, hears what has happened. She leaps to action by gathering a huge load of supplies and going out to meet David and his men. She humbly greets David and then presents a three-part argument as to why David should not do what he intends to do. First, she's giving him a gift of many supplies. Second, her husband is a fool who's not worth his effort. Third and most importantly, she tells David that taking revenge is beneath him as a man of God. Isn't it interesting that David wouldn't kill Saul who was seeking his life, but now, because he's insulted he's about to kill Nabal? Which is worse, having a powerful person try to put a spear through you or having a stupid person say a stupid thing to you? The trouble is that we're often like David here. The things that get us off track aren't when we deal with some major, obvious issue. When that happens we turn to God for his help, trusting in him. However, when it's a small thing, just an insult or a thoughtless driver who cuts us off in traffic — well, we'll just handle that ourselves; maybe teach them a lesson or two. We need people like Abigail around who can remind us to show some good sense in those "little things" that are such a danger to us.

#### Be Forgetful

In his book Great Church Fights, Leslie Flynn tells of two unmarried sisters who lived together, but because of an unresolved disagreement over something insignificant, they stopped speaking to each other. By the way, this happens to be the result of refusing to forget. They continued to live together and eat at the same table, yet without a word. A chalk line marked their respective sides of each room in the

house. Each one carried on their individual life without crossing into the other one's space. Neither sister was willing to forgive and forget.....so they coexisted in silence.

It's amazing how quickly we are able to reveal whether or not we possess a Christ-like heart. The world around sees it. The world around us hears how quick we spout out the words, "I can forgive, but I can't forget!" It's like we erect a monument to remind us that that person has offended us. How can such a statement ever be classified as true forgiveness?

To utter such words really says, "I know nothing of Calvary. I know nothing of GOD'S amazing grace." Be forgetful --- it's part of forgiveness.

# Joshua 2: They arrived at the house of a harlot named Rahab and stayed there.

As the Israelites prepare to cross the Jordan two spies are sent to learn about their first target, Jericho. They slip into the walled city and take up residence in what was likely a common place of lodging. Some commentaries say that Rahab's house was likely a tavern and inn. While some squirm around Rahab's being called a "harlot" it's likely that the scriptures are simply telling it as it is. When she acts to protect the spies she is acting out of self preservation. Still, her actions carry real weight. In spite of her questionable past and her lack of knowledge about the God of the Israelites she's concluded that this God of theirs is powerful and will deliver Canaan to his people. She may not know the Ten Commandments or the Shema or the story of Abraham and Isaac, but she's heard enough about this God that she'd rather be on his side than on the side of the people and gods of Canaan. In what might be considered a "practical conversion" she picks that God over all others. Hopefully, in the years to come her theology will mature and her relationship with God and his people will deepen. However, for all of us, our faith journey has to start somewhere. Deciding one would rather be on God's side in the battle isn't a bad place to start.



# Psalm 1: Chewing on the word of God

The book of Psalms is the world's finest songbook. For centuries the Hebrews turned to the Psalms and chanted them as a part of their worship. Four part harmony hadn't been invented yet, but they had the themes of worship down pat. Not only are the Psalms worship songs, they're often prayers too. They're not always high sounding and polished prayers. Often they're prayers from the heart and they reflect the entire range of human emotion. If I know a few things about harmony and chord progression that the Psalmist didn't know, I have to admit that the Psalmist knows some things about absolute honesty with God that I need to learn. The first Psalm is a simple consideration of what kind of people God likes. Right at the heart of it is the fact that God likes people who "chew on Scripture" day and night." This goes way beyond doing my daily devotions and reading a bit of the Bible. Instead, it reaches down into my life as I take what I've read and consider how it applies to what I'm doing throughout the day. Today, I'm reminded that God likes people who like his Word. That's a fine reason to allow it to permeate my life.

# 2 Kings 4: Desperate Faith

This is a surprisingly powerful story. Elisha the man of God promises a woman from the town of Shunem that she's going to have a son. The child is born the following year. A few years later the little boy becomes suddenly ill and dies. His grieving mother seeks out Elisha. As she's coming she encounters the servant of Elisha first. Clearly something's wrong, but when Gehazi asks her how things are, her reply is "Everything's fine." It's only when she gets to Elisha that she pours out her heart. Elisha goes to the lifeless child and performs a miracle, raising him back to life. While I see that this is another story intended to show me how powerfully God is working in the life of the

prophet, I'm drawn to the Shunammite woman. If there's ever an example of desperate faith it's here. Her heart is broken as she lays her dead son on the bed. The only thought on her mind is to get to the man of God, the miracle worker who promised the son in the first place. She desperately wants to believe he can make things right, but looking into the face of such loss it's nearly impossible. Knowing that, she realizes she has to get to Elisha as quickly as possible, and, instinctively, she knows that even saying the words, "my son is dead" will destroy the mustard seed of faith to which she clings. How is it that "it is well" in her life? It's because she's holding on to God with her last ounce of spiritual strength. This is miracle-working territory. Without a cross or an empty tomb she believed the impossible. God can do a lot with faith like that.

George Hall has sent us a year-end report for the three schools of evangelism conducted by the Biblical Institute of Central America. You may go to the web site at http://www.bica.info/ to view the full report or you can read a copy posted on the Missions bulletin board in the Main Foyer. The following is a brief summary: Guatemala: 717 baptized, 514 restored, 3 new churches established. Honduras: 925 baptized, 862 restored, 13 new churches established. Nicaragua: 1033 baptized, 438 restored, 3 new churches established. West Erwin budgeted \$135,000.00 for this work in 2010. It looks like we got a great return on our investment!
