With Jesus, it is not how low you can get the cost, but rather how much are you willing to give to be one of His. It comes at a great cost, he demands your all; but the blessings he offers can't be beat. It is the deal of a lifetime!



For I tell you, you will not see me again, until you say, Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord" (Matt.23:37-39). In Matthew 22-23, we see some direct confrontations between lesus and the religious rulers. It ended with this sad lament of Jesus over the spiritual condition of Jerusalem. SOMETIMES THE NEWS GETS ME DOWN!

Two news stories caught my attention this morning as I woke up. The first was the reaction to the Grand Jury decision not to indict the police officer in Ferguson, Missouri for the shooting of Michael Brown. As a result, rioting, looting, and fires swept the city. Businesses were burned, shots were fired, and by the grace of God, no one was killed that night. The second story that caught my eye was a story of how to avoid the stress of the holidays. In that story, a poll was taken and only 51% of the people polled were looking forward to seeing their families for the holidays. In my mind, both of these stories speak to where our society is at today. While the shooting of Michael Brown was indeed a tragedy, how is destroying businesses in the community going to help the problem? Has the fabric of our families eroded to the point where we no longer want to get together? I take us back to something Moses told the Israelites before they went into the promised land, *Know therefore that the Lord your God is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and steadfast love with those who keep his commandment, to a thousand generations (Duet.7:9).* We live in a society that for the most part has forgotten God. I believe today that we need him more than ever.



The other day, I was outside playing with three of my Tyler grandchildren, Davis, Reed, and Mikah. I quickly realized that by carrying Mikah, I was getting her wetter, because she is much faster than me. Why should I hold her back? I meant well, but it was the wrong thing to do. I put her down and we both made faster time to the porch. As I was sitting there gasping for breath, all three wanted to go back out and run through the rain again! I look back on the experience and laugh, but it also made me think of how we do that in the church sometimes. I have seen young Christians that were "held back" in their journey to spiritual maturity by an ill-timed criticism, a sharp rebuke, or a bad spiritual example from someone. We mean well, but sometimes we can be too harsh with our corrections or act to rashly. Our goal should be the encouragement to mature, not to prove our own point. Just like my grandchildren and I; we're all just trying to "get out of the storm".

WATCH HOW YOU WALK!

I therefore, a prisoner for the Lord, urge you to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Ephesians 4:1-3). In this passage, Paul is giving the church in Ephesus some qualities that they should be showing in their lives. He describes these qualities as a "worthy walk" and they are characteristics that all churches should be known for. Christians need to walk in humility; our exalted status with God is not a product of our own performance. We need to walk gently; we need to be careful of becoming too prideful or arrogant in our dealings with others. We need to walk in patience; we need to show patience with our fellow Christians and also to those outside of the church. We need to be patient when we are working with those that are outside of Christ. Remember what you were without Christ! We need to walk with loving forbearance. It is hard to keep a positive attitude when we are dealing with those that exhibit immature actions and take advantage of us, but God calls us to that standard. It does matter how we walk in life; we are representing Christ to the world!

And The Survey Says...

The elders wanted to share some highlights from our recent church-wide survey centered on developing a profile or starting point for our pulpit minister search. Keep in mind that this information simply gives us a starting place that can be utilized as our search commences. It certainly will not translate into any kind of hard and fast criteria that must be followed, but will give our Search Committee some things to keep in mind as we work to identify the man God has in mind for West Erwin. While the average desired age for a new preacher came in about 45 years, many said age does not matter. Most think approximately 10 years of previous experience is about right and around half believe a college degree is not necessary. The congregation as a whole believes we need a man with strong preaching skills who builds good relationships across all the different age groups within the church. Being an engaged evangelist whose sermons include practical application is also highly valued, as is ministering to the sick and infirm and taking a leadership role among the staff and ministers. We also received a total of 17 different names as write-ins for potential preachers. So what happens next? We are getting our Search Committee finalized and you will be hearing details about that group very soon. You said it should take about 12 months to find a new preacher with about half of you indicating it should" take as long as it takes". One thing is certain, the elders, ministers and the more than 200 members who completed surveys all agree - God knows who our next preacher is and we want to do everything we can to identify that man and get him onboard at West Erwin as soon as possible. Thank you to everyone who took time to share your thoughts in completing the survey and please feel free to continue that dialogue with the elders as we move forward. Finally, please join us in fervent prayer to keep these efforts in The Elders God's will as the search unfolds,

I visited with Clinton Culpepper a few days after his fall and surgery. He was in obvious pain, and looked at me and said, "I'll tell you one thing, don't fall!" That's good advice, especially when it comes to our spiritual life. Here are some things that we need to be careful with because of how they can make us fall. Our temptations; they believe for a while, and in time of testing fall away (Luke 8:13). Every time we give in to trials and temptations it weakens our faith. The mark of a mature Christian is their ability to remain steady. Our fears; for you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons... (Ro. 8:15). Anything involving an attitude or spirit of fear and bondage is either from our own hearts or temptations from Satan. As sons of God, His spirit gives us a sound mind, soberness, and strength. That is the power of the Spirit. Our pride; Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall (1 Cor. 10:12). Our confidence in life comes from our relationship with the Lord, not in anything we do. Pride and arrogance are not traits of the Christian who serves in humility. Our unbelief; Take care brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God (Heb.3:12). Many Christians have had their moments of weakness and doubt. Unbelief can harden the heart and that can lead us away from God. Our honesty; ...let your "yes" be yes and you "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation (James 5:12). It is hard to reclaim someone's broken trust in you. Take care, it's easier "to fall" than you think!

THAT'S THE POWER OF LOVE!

If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give away all I have, and if I deliver up my body to be burned, but have not love, I gain nothing. Love is patient and kind; it is not arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable, or resentful; it does not rejoice at wrongdoing, but rejoices with the truth. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends ... So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love (1 Corinthians 13:1-8, 13). In this passage Paul is telling the church at Corinth that the solution to their problems lies in the way they love each other. He talks of the **importance of love** in that all they do, say, and know is worthless without love. He talks of the **behavior of love** with its kindness, humility, patience, and sincerity. He talks of the strength **of love** in that it allows us to bear with all things. He talks about the **permanence of love** in that love never fails us. He talks about the **superiority of love** and that love is the more excellent way. Do you live with the power?



IF THERE IS ANYTHING I CAN DO FOR YOU

One of the things I enjoy about visiting Joe McBee is to hear him pray. As you know, Joe has suffered a stroke and his thoughts sometimes get a little scattered. But when he prays, it is easy to see that prayer has always played a big part in his life. Last week, Joe was rambling a bit during his prayer, but then he stopped, and said, "If there is anything I can do for you Lord, just let me know". I thought to myself, what a great attitude to have when it comes to serving God. I think we sometimes forget that we are God's tools for His work here on earth. To do God's work, we need to have the right attitudes. I believe the first thing we need to realize is what a **privilege and honor** it is for God to give us the opportunity to do that work. God's work will be done on this earth, and who knows if you were not put here "for such a time as this?" (Est. 4:14). We need to be grateful for the chance and not consider it a burden. Doing God's work requires **love**; love for God and love for our fellow man (Matt. 22:37-39). Love is essential in our service to God. We also need **humility**. Jesus was not afraid to take up the towel (Jo. 13) to serve his disciples. Jesus should have been on the receiving end instead of on his knees, so we should never think we are too good to do anything for the Lord. In doing God's work, we also need to show some **initiative**. When we see something that needs to be done, or see a need somewhere, don't be afraid to do it yourself. 

WHAT'S THAT SQUEAK?

Last Sunday morning I had the Crock Pot in the floorboard of my truck. I kept hearing this loud squeaking. I started trying to diagnose all kind of problems with my truck as I was driving in. I just knew it was an AC fan blower or something that was coming loose under my dash. At one point, I even thought a bird had gotten in my truck and had taken up roost in my truck. When I got to the church building, I took the Crock Pot out to plug it in, and as I set it down, it squeaked. All that time it was the rubber pads underneath the pot that were squeaking. I felt like a fool! I failed to look at the obvious and let my imagination run wild. We do that in life too. From this story, I see two things that can help us deal with problems. First, sometimes the problem is not near as big as we think it is. Don't be afraid of the unknown. Secondly, we need to make sure that we are not the problem. We sometimes are a little to hasty to try and place blame where it does not belong. It is not in our nature to accept blame. Paul urged the church at Ephesus to walk in a manner worthy of the calling to which you have been called, with all humility and gentleness, with patience, bearing with one another in love, eager to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace (Eph.4:1-3). When we live out this passage, we go from making a statement of "this is your fault" to making statements like "I may be wrong", "I'm willing to listen, and change", "I'll love you even when we disagree", and "I really want this to work out". Unity and peace do not come easy. It takes effort, good spiritual living, and the willingness to maintain peace. Are you a peacemaker or a squeaker?

REEVES' RHETORIC

As We've Ministered Together

"Not only to see but to experience the work of God in a very real way is a magnificent part of being a Christian. To trust and to know that God is at work and to place complete confidence in Him, simply striving to be His instrument in this life, is such an amazing aspect of faith.

The very Gospel message astounds me. What our Father grants to us in Christ, and not only the salvation, but the relationship, that He extends to us through the cross and resurrection of Jesus is such an awe-inspiring portrait of the wonderful God we serve. And then, just as amazing, is that He works through us. Within us. Often in spite of us. 

REEVES' RHETORIC

Two Questions

Holiness. Not the easiest concept for us to grasp. Oh I think we have an idea of holiness when it comes to God. But I wonder if we see it and believe it in ourselves?

So often we struggle with self. We struggle with self-doubt. And we struggle with selfrighteousness. The question should never be: How do I see myself? The question should always be: How does God see me? And, how do I see God? This places us and God where we need to be.

Isaiah steps into the Temple and he's not expecting much. But when he opens his eyes to the wonder and power and holiness of God, it's then that Isaiah the priest becomes Isaiah the prophet (Isaiah 6).

God is holy. He is pure. He is righteous. He is worthy. We understand His holiness no more clearly than when we are confronted by His magnificence and our own inadequacy.

But in this we find the beginning of our dilemma. Because no one knows us better than us. No one knows our inability to measure up to God better than we do. The Gospel calls us not only to salvation, but to see ourselves through the eyes of God. As those who have been made holy through the holy sacrifice of Christ. Holy not because of us, but because of Him. Holy not because of us, but in spite of us.

"Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now He has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in His sight, without blemish and free from accusation" (Colossians 1:21-22).

Holy in His sight? Without blemish? Free from accusation? Yes! How? Through Jesus. God sees us as holy because He sees us through the lens of Jesus. And this is what we call "Gospel." This is what we call "Good News."

We're tempted to not believe it. Maybe we understand it intellectually, but we struggle with allowing it to take hold of our hearts. Because doing so compels us to relinquish control. And to allow God to be God.

When King David prays to God, "Wash me, and I will be whiter than snow" (Psalm 51:7b), literally in the Hebrew his prayer is: "Un-sin me...." "Cleanse me. God, take away my sin. Make me whiter than snow. Remove all my sin stain. Remove my guilt. Make me pure. Righteous, Holy, Accomplish that which I cannot accomplish on my own. Make me more like you." And the amazing thing is, through hearts that turn to Him, He does just that.

To see ourselves as God sees us grants significant insight into faith. It empowers us to live more into (and out of) the lives that He has created for us to live in Christ Jesus.

Two questions remain: Will we allow Him to make us holy? And, do we believe that He can?

REEVES' RHETORIC

Putting It All Together

Tiersa is capable of composing something great out of seemingly nothing at all better than anyone I know. "What's for dinner," I'll ask her. "Let me see what I've got," she'll say. And she'll take a bunch of things that to me don't even appear to go in the same pantry, much less on the same plate, and she creates something incredibly wonderful (she would dominate on the Food Network shows Chopped and Iron Chef!).

At Creation, God creates something out of nothing. He speaks life into existence. "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters" (Genesis 1:1-2). The word translated "created" in Hebrew is "ex-nihilo." Literally it means, "out of nothina," Technically the text could read, "In the beginning, God, out of nothing, the heavens and the earth." Cool stuff!

And we believe it. Right? We believe that God speaks everything that is into existence. Don't we? We believe that "ex-nihilo" God creates through His Word and breathes life through His Spirit. Do we not? Why then do we find it so difficult to believe that He can accomplish the same in and through us?

Very often, you and I, we look at our lives and all we see is what I see when I go the pantry the day before Tiersa goes to the grocery store. We see nothing that's good. Nothing that is appealing. Nothing that can be put together, or that can be salvaged, or that's worthwhile. But God sees you and I, like Tiersa sees all of that stuff in the pantry, that to me looked like starvation. For what it could be. For what we could be.

God is in the putting it all together business. He is an expert in stepping in and saving the day. He continually creates something absolutely wonderful out of a complete mess. Triumph out of defeat. Beauty out of ashes.

Look to Scripture. Look to the lives of fellow followers of Jesus today. He's still doing it! "Ex-nihilo." God. Out of nothing. Faithful, strong, redeemed, alive, made new, made whole, focused, joyful, at peace - men and women of the Kingdom.

"The Spirit of the Sovereign Lord is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me to preach the Good News to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the broken hearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives, and release from darkness for the prisoners, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor..." (Isaiah 61:1-2b; cf. Luke 4:18-19).

REEVES' RHETORIC

Explaining Why

Horatio Spafford and his wife Anna had moved from England to the United States to build a life together. They had 5 children: four daughters and a son. The family settled in Chicago where Spafford began a successful law practice.

Within a matter of a few years the couple's life began to fall apart. Their infant son passed away without warning in 1871. Later that same year Spafford's law office burned to the ground in the Great Chicago Fire, ruining him financially. Two years later, 1873, as they were seeking to rebuild, Anna and the girls set sail to visit family in England. Horatio, delayed by business, made plans to follow in the coming weeks.

On its way to England, the SS Ville De Havre, the ship Anna and the girls were aboard, collided with another ship and sank. As Anna reached the shores of Europe she telegraphed her husband two crippling words, "Saved alone." All four of their daughters had drowned. Only she had survived.

While trying to make sense of all of the tragedy that had occurred and was occurring in his life, as he crossed the Atlantic Ocean, Horatio Spafford penned these words on a borrowed piece of hotel stationary....

When peace like a river attendeth my way, When sorrows like sea billows roll; Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, "It is well, it is well with my soul."

When peace like a river attendeth my way.... What I hear Spafford describing is a beautiful portrait of a gentle river that runs along side the pathway he is travelling. It is a river that accompanies him on his journey. And it is a river of peace.

The Apostle Paul writes of a peace that passes all understanding (Philippians 4:7). A peace that transcends reason. A peace that even in the midst of tragedy accompanies us on our journey. A peace that is found in Christ.

I wonder if we truly know that sort of peace? I wonder if we experience it often? A peace that stills anxiety. A peace that quiets stress. A peace that heals tragedy. Does that sort of peace accompany you every step of the way in your journey of life?

True peace is found only in Christ. Only in closeness with Him. So often we find ourselves searching for calm. Searching for serenity. Searching for inner stillness. What we are seeking is a peace that is only found in Jesus. Wonderful, soothing, healing peace.

And when peace begins to overwhelm and characterize our lives - especially in those moments when we cannot explain how – we can indeed explain why.

Glory to God!

REEVES' RHETORIC

The Gratitude We Embrace

Corrie ten Boom in her book, The Hiding Place, relates an incident she endured as she and her sister, Betsie, were housed at the Nazi concentration camp, Ravensbruck. Upon entering the barracks, they found them deplorable, extremely overcrowded, and flea-infested. The Scripture reading that morning came from 1 Thessalonians. From a smuggled Bible quietly verses 16-18 of chapter 5 were whispered to the group. "Be joyful always. Pray continually. Be thankful to God in all circumstances...." Betsie encouraged Corrie that they should stop and thank the Lord for every detail of their new living quarters. Every detail. Even the fleas! Corrie at first refused, but Betsie persisted. Finally, reluctantly, "Father, thank you for the fleas." During the next several months at Ravensbruck, they were surprised to find how openly they could hold Bible studies and meet together. They prayed and quietly worshipped with minimal Nazi interference. Finally they came to learn how they had been so blessed as to have lived with such little intrusion... the guards had refused to enter the barracks because of all of the fleas!

"Be joyful always. Pray continually. Be thankful to God in all circumstances...."

Matthew Henry in the late 1600's was attacked and robbed. Later he wrote, "Father, I thank Thee first, because I was never robbed before; second, because although they took my purse they did not take my life; third, because although they took my all, it was not much; and fourth, because it was I who was robbed, and not I who robbed."

Helen Keller, blind and deaf from birth, once wrote: "I thank God for my handicaps. For through them, I have found myself, my life's work, and my God."

The thankfulness we exemplify in life reflects the relationship we share with our Lord, the objectivity and perspective we have of life, and the aratitude we embrace in His love for us.





REEVES' RHETORIC

Straining at the Oars

At times we are tempted to think that we do this all on our own. I was once talking with a friend who was struggling. He was going through a difficult time in his life and there was no easy solution. It was going to take time and it was going to take God.

In a moment of frustration he said to me, "I feel like I'm just a speck in the ocean that's being tossed all around and nobody knows but me."

Maybe you've been there. Maybe you're there now. I had a college professor who would say, "Speak to those who are weary and hurting. Speak to them often. We are so very fragile." And so if that's you today, I want to share with you an encouraging thought from God's Word.

In Mark's Gospel we're presented a unique perspective of the account of Jesus walking on the water. Generally the miracle itself is our focus. The event comes right after the feeding of the thousands on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. Jesus and His disciples had actually travelled across the sea to spend some needed time away from the masses, but are immediately inundated as they arrive. After the crowds are filled and leave, Jesus sends the disciples on their way, now across to the other side, as He goes on a mountainside to pray and spend intentional time with God (we should léarn from Jesus).

"When evening came, the boat was in the middle of the lake, and He was alone on the land. He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. About the fourth watch of the night (3-6am) He went out to them, walking on the lake" (Mark 6:47-48a).

If you go on reading you see where Jesus steps into their boat and immediately, powerfully, divinely calms the wind and the waves and the storm. Looking to Matthew's account we see where Peter has the faith to step out of the boat and actually walks on the water toward Jesus. But when he takes his eyes off of Christ and becomes fearful of the chaos around him, he quickly sinks (something we should take to heart).

Here's what I've been getting at.... Mark says that the disciples were rowing in the boat in the "middle of the lake." John affirms they were "three and a half miles out to sea" (John 6:19). Jesus, as He is on a mountainside praying, sees the disciples "straining at the oars." They're three and a half miles out to sea! At 3am! Half way across the Sea of Galilee at 3am and yet Jesus divinely sees those He is closest to struggling. He sees those that He loves "straining at the oars." He sees them pounded by the wind and the waves, tossed back and forth in a sea of uncertainly, and it's immediately upon seeing His disciples struggle that He is filled with compassion and begins to walk toward them across the water.

The love of Christ is revealed in our Savior's actions as He comes to us in our time of need.

This is what I want you to hear: You are not alone. You have a church family that loves you dearly. And you have a Savior who is filled with compassion as He sees you "straining at the oars."

Glory to God!

REEVES' RHETORIC

A Radical Change of Mind

"You've heard it said.... But I say...." we hear our Lord proclaim over and over in the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus reinterprets. He reforms. He reprioritizes. "I know that you've heard it this way...." "I know that human nature says to respond like this...." "I know that you bring your own presuppositions to the table...." "I know this is the way that you once thought of things... but now, things are different."

Jesus steps into our world and transforms our thinking, our ideologies, our worldviews, our way of life.

Here's a tough one He tackles: "Love your enemies." "You've heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you: Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew 5:43-44).

Love your enemies!? I have a hard enough time getting along with my friends! Pray (bless) those who persecute you!? Are you serious?

And it's an active love for our enemies. And it's a very tall order! More than just a passive bearing of persecution or hatred. Loving them. Blessing them. Doing good to them. For them. Regardless of who they are or what they've done.

In this and in countless other ways Jesus calls for a radical paradigm shift. A radical change of mind. A change of perspective. A change of heart.

We see Jesus exemplify His own teaching as He prays for God to forgive those who are responsible for His death (Luke 23:34). But what about we who are ultimately those who are responsible because of our sin?

The Apostle Paul connects the dots for us: "But God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since we have now been justified by His blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through Him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life! Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation" (Romans 5:8-11).

You see while we were still enemies of God, Christ died on our behalf.

"Love your enemies." It's one of those areas of the Gospel and one of those areas of our life and faith that we would just as soon ignore. It's about a radical change of mind. From a mindset that is worldly to one that is of the Kingdom. It's about seeing the potential for the magnificent impact of the Gospel of Jesus in the most unlikeliest of places. Just like God saw it in you, and in me.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Victorious In Our Salvation

In Luke chapter 4 we are given insight into the human and divine nature of our Savior as Jesus is led into the desert by the Spirit. During forty days of fasting (or at the conclusion of them depending upon your understanding of the text) Jesus is tempted by Satan. ""If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." Jesus answered, 'Man does not live on bread alone.' The devil then led Him up to a high place and showed Him in an instant all the kingdoms of the world. And he said to Him, 'I will give you all their authority and splendor, for it has been given to me, and I can give it to anyone I want to. So if you worship me, it will all be yours.' Jesus answered, 'It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve Him only.' The devil led Him to Jerusalem and had Him stand on the highest point of the temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said, 'throw yourself down from here. For it is written: 'He will command His angels concerning you to guard you carefully; they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.' Jesus answered, 'It says: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.' When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left Him until an opportune time" (Luke 4:3-13).

Much could be said about this event in Jesus' life and ministry. The fact that it occurred (when you consider Matthew's account) immediately following the baptism of Jesus is significant. Jesus' discipline and complete and total reliance upon God in fasting during this time powerfully speaks to us. Jesus' response to each test while abiding in God's Word is crucial. Certainly Satan's distortion of Scripture in Jesus' testing is something that should be emphasized. But what I'd like for us to consider are the reasons behind the specific ways in which Jesus is tempted/tested.

"If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to become bread." Notice Satan's .condescension: "If...." Did Satan know that Jesus was God's Son? Absolutely. Did Jesus know? You better believe it! Was there anyone else present for this conversation besides the two of them? No. So why begin with question? He's testing Jesus' character! And why bread? Because of Jesus' hunger? Yes. But even more so, if ever there was going to be a moment where Jesus was susceptible and fragile in His humanity this would have been it. Our Lord, however, stood firm. And why the temptation of the kingdoms of the world? Power. Prestige. Authority. Ego. The temptation of salvation while falling from the pinnacle of the temple? Along those same lines: Pride. Arrogance. Ability. Worth. The writer of Hebrews acknowledges that Jesus was "tempted in every way, just as we are - yet was without sin" (Hebrews 4:15). And we see this reality clearly lived out in our Lord's life in His testing. But in doing so, do we to see our own humanness as we are tempted by Satan every day as well?

John the Apostle writes, "For everything in the world - the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes, and the boasting of what he has and does - comes not from the Father but from the world" (1 John 2:16). Precisely the three areas in which our Savior was tempted.

We are in such dire need of salvation. So God sent us Jesus. But He sent Christ not only to save us, but to show us. To show us how to live victorious in our salvation.

Isn't it amazing when you come across people in the church that seem to just get stronger when their situation in life is at its worst? How do they do it? What do they have going for them when others struggle at easier situations in life? I want to pass on four things a preacher shared with me on this same topic. They have a secure root. Remember the soils in the Parable of the Sower. Having a grounded faith helps us when we face trials, persecution and suffering, and the pull of the world. The deeper the roots, the stronger the tree! They have a solid foundation. Remember the lesson from the wise man who built his house on the rock! Foundations are not built to be seen by others, but the results are obvious when the storms come. Likewise, it is the times of tribulation that reveal a solid faith. They have a strong faith. Someone doubts only when they are unsure. James describes it as someone who is "driven and tossed by the wind" (James 1:6). We conquer trials when we are confident. Faith is the "assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things unseen" (Heb.11:1). They have a sharp focus. Remember what happened to Peter when he took his eyes off Jesus; he sank! Paul told the church at Colossae to "seek the things that are above, where Christ is" (Col.3:1). We give up when we have lost our direction. We are defeated when we lose sight of our purpose. When the going gets tough; what do you do? Do you dig in and hold to what got you to that spot or do you try to find something new and untried? Remember your roots, your foundation, your faith, and your focus!

REEVES' RHETORIC

Is the Cross Enough?

For the next three months our congregation will be investing into a study of 1st and 2nd Corinthians. Both Sunday morning classes and sermons will be pursuing these two wonderful texts. As a church we will be pouring ourselves into these letters and striving for a willingness and openness that would allow our Father to pour Himself into us as His holy people. "Ancient Church, Modern Challenges" is the general theme we'll be working under. I cannot imagine a more timely, unifying study for us to engage in together.

The Corinthian letters center upon effective ministry. How is the church to be effective in a culture that is so very contrary to the God we serve? How might the relevance of the Gospel of Christ be communicated in a world that sees no need for faith? How can those who are followers of the Way of Jesus be united with one another, when while we've chosen to follow Christ, we did not choose one another? How do we as Christ's Church today serve as a powerful, effective witness for the Kingdom? Unabashed, Unashamed, And unhindered

These are questions that the Corinthian letters will address.

Chapter 1 sets the stage: "I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought. My brothers and sisters, some from Chloe's household have informed me that there are quarrels among you. What I mean is this: One of you says, 'I follow Paul'; another, 'I follow Apollos'; another, 'I follow Cephas'; still another, 'I follow Christ.'

Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I did not baptize any of you except Crispus and Gaius, so no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (Yes, I also baptized the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I don't remember if I baptized anyone else.) For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to preach the Gospel – not with wisdom and eloquence, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power. For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (vv10-18).

Are we sharing the fullness of the Gospel message or are we simply speaking with "wisdom and eloquence" emptying the cross of its God-designed, God-designated power? Is the message of the cross enough for us? Is the cross, and the cross alone, truly the power for we who believe and are being saved?

It all begins with the question: "Is Christ divided?"

It all begins with the decision: "I follow Christ."

And it all begins this week!



REEVES' RHETORIC

The Cause of Redemption

"God demonstrates His own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

Love is a quality that we develop. We learn how to love. We learn love from our parents and grandparents. We learn love from those who love us along the way. As we fall in love and marry we learn to love our spouse and learn love from our spouse. Tiersa and I have in many ways "grown up" together because we came to know one another at such a young age. As we look into our newborn children's eyes for the first time we experience a love that gives us such insight into the love of God (although we're certainly content to let grandma and grandpa give us a rest as often as they like!). Through life, through experience, through trial and error at times, we learn how to better love - and what it means to love.

And yet we often wonder, "How could God love us?" Or perhaps even closer to home, "How could God love me?" But I think as honest as these questions are, they don't quite have a full grasp of God's love. Or, the reality that the Apostle John unveils to us: "God is love" (1 John 4:8,16). Love is not a quality that God has learned. Love is who God is. God reveals love because He is love.

God does not love us because we are easy or difficult to love (although through relationship we oftentimes_find ourselves either closer to God or distanced from Him - but this is our doing, not His!). God loves us because He is God. He is love. Love is who He is. Love is His character. His nature. The reality that God is love is as unchanging as He is. God's love is not drawn out of Him by us, rather, it flows from Him constantly. Steadily. Why? Because God is love.

"God so loved..." (John 3:16) not because we were loveable, but because He is love. Christ did not die for the world so that God might then love us. Christ died because God loves us. He died as the ultimate revelation and realization of God's love for us. Love is not the result of redemption; it is the cause of it....

Glory to God!

REEVES' RHETORIC

Scattering Darkness

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters. And God said, 'Let there be light,' and there was light. God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness. God called the light 'day,' and the darkness He called 'night.' And there was evening, and there was morning - the first day" (Genesis 1:1-5).

"God saw that the light was good, and He separated the light from the darkness."

From the beginning of time. From Creation. From the word "go" (literally). Light is separated from darkness. They are opposed to one another. Where one is present the other is not.

The Apostle John proclaims, "God is light, in Him there is no darkness at all" (1 John 1:5b). Christ boldly declares, "I AM the Light of the World" (John 8:12). And in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus calls us to be spiritual light in a spiritually dark world: "You are the light of the world!" (Matthew 5:14).

We are called to be light. Light in a world of darkness. Why is it that we so often toy with darkness? Why is it that we too often concede and rationalize and justify any relationship with spiritual darkness? With that which is spiritually opposed to the God we serve?

The Apostle Paul writing of the spiritual tempo of our lives asks, "What fellowship does light have with darkness?" (2 Corinthians 6:14b). Light and darkness are enemies. The presence of one defies the presence of the other. How is it that we can so easily walk out of spiritual light and into darkness? Is our faith so shallow?

In Ephesians 2:8 he asserts, "You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord." He doesn't even say, "We were once in darkness, but rather we were darkness." Outside of God. Outside of His light. But in Christ Jesus, our reality has radically chanaed.

Colossians 1:13 declares, "He has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the Kingdom of the Son He loves."

John affirms our calling in Christ and challenges that if we "claim to have fellowship with God and yet walk (live) in darkness we lie and do not live by (in) the truth" (1 John 1:6).

The call is just that. To accept and live into the calling that we have in this life in Christ Jesus to be light in a spiritually dark world. A city on a hill that cannot be hidden (Matthew 5:14). A lamp on a stand that gives light to all (Matthew 5:15).

Where there is light, darkness scatters. In our lives and in the lives of those we influence to the glory of the God we serve.

Glory to God!


Mayor's Prayer Breakfast

REEVES' RHETORIC

Practicing the Presence of God

Our journey of life is such that when we open our spiritual eyes we begin to see God at work all around us. The Psalmist King, David asks, "Where can I go from your Spirit? Where can I flee from your presence? If I go up to the heavens, you are there. If I make my bed in the depths you are there" (Psalm 139:7-8). God is all around us. He is at work in and through us and everything in life if we will simply have eyes that see. I believe this is a crucial part of faith. And maybe where mature faith comes in? Because faith that is mature has the ability to see God at work in life. Faith that is mature has the ability to see the potential for God in every facet of life. A mature faith practices living in the very presence of God.

Our faith must be real to us, if it is to be real to the world. In order for our Father to be a present reality to others through the lives we live, He must first and foremost be a present reality to us. There is within every person an innate need for Christ and Christian community. A wholeness that only comes from relationship with God in Jesus. And yet do we reveal Christ and fidelity to Him in such a way as to compel others to acknowledge and pursue our Lord and pursue faith in Him?

Think about the things that so many are searching for... a sense of belonging, validation, approval, meaning and purpose in life, a greater understanding of self, acceptance, love, to be challenged, living beyond themselves, a banner under which to claim allegiance... all of which are only fully found and fulfilled in a relationship with God through Christ and within the community of faith.

But... is that what we offer them? And (maybe a better and more personal question)... do we wholly find our belonging, meaning, purpose, etc. in Him?

What if we daily practiced the presence of God? By that I mean, what if every moment of life we were intrinsically cognizant that we were in the presence of God? What if everything, every moment, of life was lived with the acute awareness that we were in our Father's presence. (Because we are! Right?) What if we daily practiced fully living in His presence? How might that change thinas?

Paul says, "To live is Christ..." (Philippians 1:21). Think about those four words.... To live is Christ. Can we (you) really say that and mean it?



REEVES' RHETORIC

Less Complication. More Jesus.

I tend to make things more difficult than they need to be. I over-analyze. I over-think. Lover-concern. Lam too often more critical of myself than Lought to be. In some ways this way of thinking has served me well. In many, many ways, not so much.... Maybe you can relate?

To others the reverse perhaps is more the norm. Many are overly critical of others. The glass is always half-empty. Negativity reigns supreme. Aren't there some whom when you see them coming you cringe when you realize they're walking your direction? And now you're suddenly on a collision course with gloom and doom. You brace yourself because you immediately realize you're about to receive a beating that no one deserves. And not even necessarily because they're going to beat up on you, but because you know that whatever the conversation is, it's going to be negative. Aren't there some Christians you'd swear were baptized in lemon juice (and who watch way too much CNN)?

"Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt..." (Colossians 4:6).

Faith is not complicated. We make it much more complicated than it was ever intended to be. Too often we get in the way. The simplicity and beauty of the message we've received in Christ and its call to fidelity is central. The Gospel ought to bring calm. It ought to restore peace. It ought to grant clarity. It ought to. It's designed to. But does it? For you?

"Now, church, I want to remind you of the Gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you have taken your stand. By this Gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you have believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures.... ...this is what we preach, and this is what you believed" (1 Corinthians 15:1-4,11b).

In faith we open our hearts to God. And we allow Him to be God. We trust Him. We share with Him. We live life near Him. And because of covenant and because He is God we breathe a sigh of relief. Because He is in control. And in Him we are a part of that which is so much areater than ourselves.

In faith we share with other believers. We are a part of one another in Jesus. We engage in, and share in, life. We ought to at least. Our relationships with believers in Christ should be our closest. And when we struggle in our relationships as His children, we work through them. We allow nothing to disrupt our connection to Him and to each other, because we belong to a magnificent Father and to one another in Jesus.

In faith we allow the message to be revealed through our priorities. Our thoughts. Our convictions. Our beliefs. Our conversations. Our relationships. It's the way it was designed to be. It's the way things ought to be. Less complication. More Jesus.

Stealing Joy

"The one who has been forgiven little loves little" (Luke 7:47).

What is our Savior communicating to you in these nine words?

Jesus is in the home of Simon the Pharisee. The religious leader has gone out of his way to set the stage. Perhaps simply to gain a better understanding of what this proposed prophet from Nazareth is about. Maybe to make himself look good in front of his cronies by being the momentary big man on campus. Whether from false motives or pure, the fact is, the Christ has agreed to come.

But "when a woman who had lived a sinful life" is overwhelmed, simply by being in the presence of Jesus, crying as she is so humbled, overjoyed, as to be so blessed as to serve Him, Simon the host quickly turns into Simon the joystealer. "If this man were a prophet, He would know... she is a sinner" (V39).

REEVES' RHETORIC

The Practice of Holiness

"Therefore, prepare your minds for action; be self-controlled; set your hope fully on the grace to be given you when Jesus Christ is revealed. As obedient children, do not conform to the evil desires you had when you lived in ignorance. But just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do; for it is written: 'Be holy, because (am holy'" (1 Peter 1:13-16; cf. Leviticus 11:44-45).

"But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of Him who called you out of darkness and into His wonderful light" (1 Peter 2:9).

I wonder if a greater awareness of the holiness of God might equip us to be more cognizant of our own holy calling? I wonder if willful, intentional contemplation of the holiness of our Father might assist us in realizing our own holy status in Christ Jesus? Certainly we are only made holy in Christ, however we are called to holy living. To a holy way of life. All of life is sacred for those who believe. The Apostle Peter is calling for conviction. He is calling for commitment. Half-hearted Christianity doesn't cut it. "Just as He who called you is holy, be holy in all that you do." We recognize our failings. We acknowledge we are spiritually bankrupt outside of covenant. However just as the Father is holy, we are to be holy. What if holiness were in our thoughts? What if holiness were upon our hearts? What if holiness were a viable part of our vocabulary and conversations? What if a sustainable facet of our faith was the practice of holiness?

Father we pray for an awareness of holiness. To be aware of your reality and your presence in our lives. And to be aware that we have been (and are continually) made holy in Jesus. Our hope is that we would be altogether incapable of being men and women who give little consideration to your character and nature, your purpose and our calling. Our prayer is that we would be a holy people. Light in a world of darkness. Our desire is that we would be like you. That we would reflect your holiness. That holiness would be such an integral part of who we are and so very definitive in what we reveal to the world around us that there would be no doubt as to who we are and whose we are. In the name of the Holy One in whom we place all hope, and all confidence. Amen.

THE POWER OF LITTLE THINGS

John Wooden, the legendary basketball coach at UCLA, once said, "It is the little details that are vital. Little things make big things happen." I understand how this would apply to basketball, but I also think the same thing can be said of our spiritual life too. I want to look at some little things in our life that can have a big impact in the way we live. Our tongue; ... the tongue is a small member, yet it boasts of great things. How great a forest is set ablaze by such a small fire! (James 3:5). Our speech can be a fountain of blessings or it can be a source of destruction. How do you choose to use it? The damage of unkind words can last for years. The benefits of kind and encouraging speech can help for eternity. Our faith; ... I say to you, if you have faith like a grain of mustard seed ... nothing will be impossible for you (Matt.17:21). In this passage, Jesus was speaking figuratively about a small faith moving mountains, but can't a small faith in God take care of huge problems in our lives? Jesus also told his disciples that their prayer life was not strong enough to cast out the demon. Once again, we can see how the small things mean so much. A faith, even the size of a mustard seed will grow into a great faith when it is supported by prayer and scripture. Our little sins; A little leaven leavens the whole lump (Gal.5:9). Just as a small bit of leaven affects the whole loaf, those "little" sins, that seem so harmless at the time, can have serious consequences. When left alone, sin grows in our lives and damages our spiritual growth. Sin separates us from God which leaves us vulnerable to Satan. How are you handling those "little" things?

REEVES' RHETORIC

Leaving the Curtain Torn

"From the sixth hour until the ninth hour darkness came over all the land. About the ninth hour Jesus cried out in a loud voice, 'Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani?' which means, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'.... And when Jesus cried out again in a loud voice, He gave up His spirit. At that moment the curtain of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom" (Matthew 27:45-51).

From noon until 3pm, during the time of day when the sun is at its peak, darkness covers the planet, representative of course of the sin that Jesus bore on the cross. At 3pm Jesus cries out in the words of Psalm 22, a Psalm of anguish and a Psalm of victory. Jesus cries out again and gives up His spirit, meaning, He chooses to die. And "at that moment the curtain of the Temple was torn in two from top to bottom."

Here's my question: How long was the curtain allowed to be torn?

Have you ever thought about that? How long was the curtain allowed to be torn by the religious aristocracy? To the Jews who accepted Christ the tearing of the curtain meant no more obstruction, no more barrier between them and God. To the Gentile it meant there was access granted to the One, True Living God that they had never known before. As believers today through this reality of 2000 years ago we recognize that we have access to the very presence of God and are ushered in to His glory through the sacrifice (and resurrection) of Jesus. But what about the Jews whose applecart had been upset? Those who wanted everything to stay the same? What about those "devout" Israelites who thought that they had the market cornered on God? What about the watchdog Pharisees who saw this as a threat to what was "right" and "proper"?

What do you suppose they did about the torn curtain? The "veil that was rent" (to quote from the good king James)? Maybe they wrote it off as caused by the earthquake. But Temple worship in Jerusalem continued another 40 years (until its destruction in AD 70). Did they leave the curtain torn do you think? I bet not. Although well-intentioned, I would imagine they very quickly sewed it shut (or replaced it altogether). There's no biblical or even extra-biblical evidence to support that notion. But I just don't see them leaving the curtain forn. Do you?

Here's my point: In Christ, God has unequivocally removed every hindrance from our living in His presence. Right? And so why can't we just leave it that way?

REEVES' RHETORIC

Words of Wisdom

Wisdom. Wisdom is not on our radar often enough. We make choices based upon our feelings. Our emotions. Our own merit. Upon how we are affected. Upon our own understanding. Certainly these are a part of the decision-making process. But what about discernment? What about wisdom?

And what about when we make poor choices? Tragic choices? Intentional choices? When we sin? When we doubt? When we lash out in anger? When we respond selfishly? Self-servingly? Worldy? Where is wisdom then?

In the book of Proverbs wisdom is often personified. And wisdom is a woman. Read into this whatever you like.... But it's extremely interesting that the voice of wisdom speaks, she constantly calls for humility. She appeals to discernment. She pleads for fidelity.

"Wisdom calls aloud in the street, she raises her voice in the public squares; at the head of the noisy streets she cries out, in the gateways of the city she makes her speech...' (Proverbs 1:20).

She goes to where the people are. There is never any doubt as to her message. There is no question as to the need for wisdom. The need for discernment. Only the question of whether or not we will listen.

Do we seek wisdom from God? From His Word? From His Spirit? From His Son? God never contradicts Himself. He is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8). His character, His nature, His being, His purposes, are never changing. He is constant. He is true. He is just.

Wisdom pursues His will for our lives. Wisdom requests His will. Wisdom seeks His will. Wisdom accepts His will. Wisdom is discerning of His will and does not confuse His will with our own. Wisdom acknowledges His infiniteness. And our finiteness.

The Apostle Paul when writing in regard to the ways in which God has acted upon behalf of humankind, speaks of the wisdom of God and His graciousness revealed to us in and through the Gospel of Jesus. "It is because of Him (God) that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God - that is our righteousness, holiness, and redemption" (1 Corinthians 1:30). You see as believers true wisdom is found only in Christ. Only in life lived in Christ. Only in discerning God's will for our lives and having the courage and faithfulness to pursue His will.

As Christians the voice of wisdom calls to us. She calls us to right thinking. To objectivity. To faithful living. To pursue the will of God. To where true wisdom lies. In God. And in Christ.

But the question remains: Will we listen?

REEVES' RHETORIC

The Power of Words

We've begun an emphasis on Sunday mornings of the parables and "I AM" statements of Jesus. The common theme of the messages is: "Words That Changed the World." Focusing upon the ministry of our Savior and how He intentionally communicated the reality of the Kingdom to those who would hear His message. Certainly there are those who refuse to listen. But for those who embrace the words of our Lord, lives are forever changed.

As we've stated, many of our adult classes (with others to follow), as well as our high school and junior high classes, are studying the same texts each week. Although each class has a culture and barometer all its own, our hope is that as we connect our classroom study with the messages on Sunday morning we will foster an environment of connection and unity by doing so.

Words are powerful. They are powerful. And among all of God's created, human beings are the only ones who communicate with words.

Trevor Hudson articulates well, "Our words, whether spoken or written, enable us to reveal or hide ourselves, to build or to break community, to help or to hurt our neighbor. When used carefully, words facilitate self-disclosure, foster communion, and release healing. When used carelessly, they create confusion, generate conflict, and cultivate chaos. Well aware of this immense potential that inhabits our words, the writer of the Proverbs exclaims without exaggeration: 'Death and life are in the power of our words (Proverbs 18:21)."

I wonder how acutely aware you are of the power of your words? I wonder if you are intently cognizant that enveloped within the things you say lies the power of "death and life"?

How many relationships have been completely devastated by the speaking of harmful words? How many who were once close have been injured, wounded deeply, distanced, through selfish, harsh, or uncaring words?

On the other hand, how many lives have been forever wonderfully impacted through encouraging words? How many have been healed through the kind words of a friend? How many believers has God empowered to accomplish great things for the Kingdom through the comforting, assuring words of a God-sent encourager?

The power to speak death. The power to speak life.

"Out of the overflow of the heart," our Savior affirms, "the mouth speaks" (Luke 6:45).

Sunday Bible Class

Join us for Bible Class this Sunday @ 9:00. This quarter, many of our adult classes are studying in the Gospels looking specifically at the Parables of Jesus and His "I Am" statements. The title of the study is "Words that Changed the World."

The lesson this week will be from the Parable of the Good Samaritan...Luke 10:25-37.

This is a very familiar story to most of us. It is also a challenging story to most of us.

We are really good at "knowing" but often are challenged at "doing."

The parable of the Good Samaritan reminds us to show compassion or mercy... to whomever we encounter.

Consider the following from Luke 10:37... Jesus told him, "Go and do likewise."



For a man after God's own heart, David certainly had his struggles. It would be wise to consider David's teachings to those he was leaving behind. I want to share some thoughts that come from some of David's last words as recorded in 2 Samuel 23. They are still meaningful for us today. The spirit of the Lord speaks by me; his word is on my tongue (23:2). Blessed are you when you live a life that is under the control of the Holy Spirit. It is a blessing to others when you are expressing the words and ways of our Lord. The speech of a Christian should be pure, encouraging, and edifying to the body of Christ. For does not my house stand so with God? For he has made me an everlasting covenant, ordered in all things and secured (23:5). What a blessing to be in a covenant relationship with God. When we are at peace with God, our lives are in order. The chaos and confusion of a life controlled by sin holds no fear for the child of God. Peace with God is assurance of heaven. It is a precious gift we present to our children when we raise them in homes that are under God's rule. But worthless men are all like thorns that are thrown away, for they cannot be taken with the hand; but the man who touched them arms himself with iron and the shaft of a spear, and they are utterly consumed with fire (23:6,7). The Spirit blesses us with the power of discernment. We need to know the danger of association with those who are against the kingdom. A congregation that strives for a spirit of purity is a powerful force for God's work in this world. These are great lessons that challenge us today; purity in speech, purity in the home, and purity in the church.

What Are You Afraid Of?

There is an ancient legend from India that tells the story of a mouse that was terrified of cats. He brought his complaint to the king who had his magicians transform the mouse into a cat, so as to relieve his fears. This satisfied the mouse (pardon me, cat) for a little while until he met a dog. Fearing the dog he pleaded to be changed into one and so the king again obliged. Until he came face to face with a tiger. And so once again he begged to be changed into that which he feared. Consider the following from Matt. 13:37-39.



As we strive for unity in the Body of Christ, it is vital that we remember that Satan is the enemy rather than each other.



DISCIPLESHIP - JUST TALKING OR WALKING?

I never realized that when I started this article that it would grow into a series of three. I think it stems from my hearing people proclaim their Christianity, yet not seeing the evidence. How can you tell if someone is a disciple of Christ? John gives us some characteristics of disciples. A disciple will look out for others: If anyone has the world's goods and sees his brother in need, yet closes his heart against him, how does God's love abide in him? Little children let us not love in word or talk but in deed and truth (1 Jo.3: 17-18). A disciple will walk and talk like Jesus: whoever says he abides in him ought to walk in the same way in which he walked (1 Jo. 2:6). I did not see Jesus let his anger harm another. I did not see Jesus gossip. I did not see Jesus' talk harm his brothers. I did not see Jesus treat others with a lack of compassion or mercy. All these things make up our nature, but we can beat them when we put more Jesus in our hearts and strive to walk like Him. A disciple will love: Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love (1 Jo. 4:8). When we realize the why behind God's great providence for us, how can we not respond to others with that same love? Paul wrote that faith, hope, and love abide, but the greatest of these is love. We should love with a passion for the well-being of others. A disciple will overcome in this world: You are from God and have overcome them, for he who is in you is greater than he who is in the world (1 Jo. 4:4). Satan will get to us, he will cause us some hardships, but we can overcome. We have God on our side and the battle belongs to the Lord! Are you a disciple or just a talker?





I had one of my Houston grandsons on my lap during worship at Lake Houston. After the prayer for the offering, he looked up at me and asked, "Are we done now?" He did not look too happy when I told him we were only about half the way through. Children love those short services don't they? To be honest, I do too sometimes. I am afraid that we feel the same way about our discipleship; the quicker, the easier, the better. God never intended our discipleship to be that way. Discipleship takes time and work. For the next two weeks, I would like to take a look at some marks of a disciple from the book of 1st John. A disciple confesses that Jesus Christ is Lord: Our confession is the key to God abiding in us (1 Jo.4:15). It is the key to our faith. We live with Jesus as our Lord, with gratitude and love for what He did for us. We want to live for Him and let him rule in our life. He is our King! A disciple is miserable when they sin: No one born of God makes a practice of sinning, for God's seed abides in him, and he cannot keep on sinning because he has been born of God (1 Jo.3:9). For those in Christ, sin bothers, it unsettles, and it damages our relationship with God. We all sin, but our actions after the sin show true discipleship. It takes confession, prayer, humility, and sincerity to take advantage of God's grace. It's not easy, but that's the price of sin. A disciple enjoys fellowship with their brothers and sisters: everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him (1 Jo.5:1). Sometimes we need to work at loving each other. We need to love others as Christ loved us; with patience, kindness, and mercy.

REEVES' RHETORIC

The Carpenter's Son

"When Jesus had finished these parables, He moved on from there. Coming to His hometown, He began teaching the people in their synagogue, and they were amazed. 'Where did this man get this wisdom and these miraculous powers?' they asked. 'Isn't this the carpenter's son? Isn't His mother's name Mary, and aren't His brothers James, Simon, and Judas? Aren't all His sisters with us? Where then did this man get all these things?' And they took offense at Him. But Jesus said to them, 'Only in his hometown and in his own house is a prophet without honor.' And He did not do many miracles there because of their lack of faith" (Matthew 13:53-58).

It seems to me that God has a pretty hard time with leaving things alone. We need not look any further than the sun as it sets and rises again or the seasons as they change and cycle to recognize that the Heavenly Father is constantly creating, intentionally changing, metamorphosizing (not a real word, but it works) the world around us.

Is it not the same with us? As we willingly grant the Father creative license He changes us, molds us, shapes us, more into the image of Christ. More into who He desires for us to be. More into who we are created to be.

I wonder if that might not be a small part of why He chose for His Son to grow up as the son of a carpenter? As one who creates. One who repairs. One who carefully crafts. As through the carpenter's son, He continues to create and repair and carefully craft today.

"I pray that the eyes of your heart may be opened in order that you may know the hope to which He has called you, the riches of His glorious inheritance in the saints, and His incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is like the working of His mighty strength" (Ephesians 1:18-19).

I have always been thankful for sticky notes. My office is covered in them. They help me remember the day to day things I sometimes forget. There are some things that I should never forget though. Consider these reminders from scripture. Remember the thief: Jesus died between two thieves on the cross. Both reviled Jesus, yet one came to his senses (Luke 23:39-43). Remember that the worse among us can find redemption through Jesus. That should be the message of the church. Remember Paul's chains: Paul closed his letter to the church at Colossae with the plea for them to remember Paul's chains. We need to remember that Paul's suffering was for our sake too. Remember Paul's example; his hardships, his concern for the lost, and his gratitude and love for the church. Remember the rich man and Lazarus: the rich man wanted Lazarus to come and cool his tongue with a drop of water(Luke 16). He was told to remember that he had the good things in life while Lazarus had the bad. Remember; your blessings come from God, don't put them ahead of helping others. Remember that you were once hopeless: there is a reason we sing I once was lost but now I'm found. Everyone needs a savior. Paul addresses this in his letter to the Ephesians; remember that you were at that time separated from Christ, ...having no hope and without God in the world...but now in Christ Jesus you... have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he himself is our peace (Eph.2:11-14). Don't forget your state before Christ. Remember; don't let your righteousness keep you from reaching out to the unrighteous.

Peace of Mind

"Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:4-7).

There is a divine connection between prayer and peace. A divine connection that is undeniable. An often untapped resource in which through believing prayer we embrace the peace of God. These blessings come to those who are "in Christ" (Gal. 3:26-27), and are for those described in Matt. 5: 3-12. In Matt. 6:25-32 we can read of Jesus' care for us. The Lord's face will shine upon you and he will be gracious to you. God's grace is manifested in Jesus (Jo.1:17) and we should not take it for granted (2 Cor.6:1-3). It is sad that many will turn their back on the grace of God. The Lord will turn his face toward you and give you peace. It is a great comfort to know that God is paying attention to us and that He gives us peace through Jesus (Ro.5:1). His peace is better than anything the world offers (Jo. 14:27). Paul wrote this about the importance of God's peace, Do not be anxious ... let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses every thought, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Phil.4:6-7). Amen!

REEVES' RHETORIC

No Time to Waste

I turned 40 on the 18th of January. My wonderful, oldest daughter has reminded me that I am now precisely at the mid-point in between graduating high school and social security. Gee thanks, Kacey!

For some, 40 is a horrible number to move in to. But to be quite honest with you, I've been looking forward to it. I don't really know why. But as far as I'm concerned, bring on the 40's! (We'll have to wait and see as I get closer to 50, if I feel the same way about that number.)

Christian maturity doesn't have a time line. Many who have been believers for decades are still childish. No closer to being mature in Christ than they were when they started. Others round the bases rather quickly, and the conviction that comes from being in Christ and investing into the Kingdom is readily revealed in life, perspective, and philosophy.

The question is: What does Christian maturity look like?

The writer of the letter to the Hebrew believers contends, "Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil. Therefore let us move beyond the elementary teachings about Christ and move on to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God, instruction about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. And God permitting, we will do so" (Hebrews 5:13-6:3).

What I love about this passage is that Christian maturity is not defined. Have you ever noticed that? We're told what it's not. But not what it is. But what it is, is more like Jesus. And what it is, is more open to the Kingdom. And what it is, is more focused on the things that are important to God. And what it is, is less focused on the things that get in His way.

What turning 40 has caused me to better acknowledge is that I don't have time to waste. I just don't. Life is too short. And what we do with the life we're given, too important. We don't have time to waste. I don't. And you don't. The Kingdom is too important.

Glory to God!

Maturity does not automatically come with age. Hebrews 5:11-14 gives us some marks of people who should have matured, but did not. How do you compare with those the writer describes? Have you become dull of hearing? This describes a person that has become spiritually lazy and full of apathy toward their spiritual development. This behavior will prevent any kind of growth. Are you unable to share your faith? Have you lost the joy of teaching others or simply sharing your faith? Do you lack the confidence in your ability to do so? Have you changed your diet from the meat of the gospel back to milk? Do you try to challenge your understanding of scripture or do you rely on the teachings of others? Do you challenge yourself to make sacrifices that are pleasing to God (Heb.13) or have you become too comfortable to step out in faith? Do you struggle with your ability to discern good from evil? The writer said that it takes constant practice to distinguish good from evil. It takes prayer, study, meditation on His word, faithfulness, and successful struggles over temptation to mature in our faith. It takes time also. A mature Christian can discern right from wrong, whether in moral matters or in teachings. Are you a mature Christian or still a child?

REEVES' RHETORIC

The Only Voice We Hear

If you were to sit down and list the events of your day, from morning until night, what would that list look like? If you were to put pen to paper (or hands to laptop), and just allow yourself a few moments to consider what it is that consumes your days, you, like me, would probably find yourself readily listing item after item after item.

And what if you did the same thing, and made a second list, only this time you listed those things that occupy your thoughts? Concerns. Worries. Burdens. Stresses. Fears. Anxieties. Those things that consume your mental energy. Elevate your blood pressure. Deplete your spirit. Perhaps that list would fill up rather quickly as well.

We each have a lot of voices vying for our attention. Some that indeed need to be heard. Many that are of importance. Others that are wearily urgent. A number, however, that are counterproductive. Voices that distract. Voices that detract. Voices that all too easily shift us off course.

The Apostle John records these wonderful, affirming, assuring words of our Savior, "I tell you the truth, the one who does not enter the sheep pen by the gate, but climbs in by some other way, is a thief and a robber. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of his sheep. The watchman opens the gate for him, and the sheep listen to his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes on ahead of them, and his sheep follow him because they know his voice" (John 10:1-4).

Tuning in to the voice of Jesus amid all of the static, amid all of the distractions, is so very crucial for His followers. It is a discipline to be practiced. An artistry to be pursued.

Yet when His voice is the only voice we hear in the middle of all that is encompassed within those two lists, the result is peace and clarity and confidence. Aspects of the Christian life that perhaps more a few of us are in need of.

REEVES' RHETORIC

Unconditional

We are a confusing people. We say we wholly love. We contend we are fully committed. We promise we are all in. But how often we fail. How very often we fall short. We are a people of conditions. "If you'll scratch my back, I'll scratch yours." "I'll forgive you if you will jump through these hoops." "Do things my way and then we can be friends." "Let's get on the same page" (and by same page, we mean our own). "I love you, but I'd love you more if...." In many ways we are conditioned to be conditional.

We are a confusingly, conditional people.

This however, is not the Jesus Way.

God has no conditions when it comes to His love. Don't mishear (or misread) what I'm saying. Covenant with God is conditioned upon our being in Christ. But, His love for us is absolutely unconditional. Completely unconditional. No strings attached. No hidden agendas. And it is at our worst of moments, when we are at our most unlovable, that this reality is most beautiful and most powerful. And in those moments (as if it were possible) it feels as if He loves even us more.

"God demonstrates His own (unconditional) love for us in this: While we were sinners, Christ dies for us" (Romans 5:8).

"For if when we were God's enemies we were reconciled to Him through the death of His Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through His life?!" (Romans 5:10).

At the first of each year we tend to reflect upon the previous year and consider the one that lies ahead. My hope is that you enter into this new year knowing that you are deeply and unconditionally loved by our Father.

Resolutions...

Almost every year I make a New Year's Resolution... Some succeed... most don't! I can't tell you how many I've not completed over the years but I can tell you the Resolutions that have changed my life.

I am proposing a new way to look at it... Instead of a New Years Resolution, lets simply try to start each day or week with a Resolution. For example, "Today I resolve to..."

"But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well."



To start off this New Year together, I want to give you an assignment. When you go home today, I want you to read John 17. This is a beautiful prayer of Jesus. In this prayer, there are a number of assurances that Jesus gives us. I can't think of a better way to start off 2014 than with the words of Jesus. 17:2 – Jesus has the authority to give eternal life. 17:3 – Jesus gives us the keys to eternal life; know the true God, know Jesus, and know that God sent Jesus. 17:4 – Jesus glorified God with his obedience – so can we. 17:5 – Jesus was with God before the world existed – He is the Son of God. 17:6 – When we keep God's word, we are viewed as gifts to Jesus from God. 17:7 – God is a giver! 17:8 – There is truth in God's word and there is power in belief. 17:9 – Jesus prays for us. 17:10 – As God's children, we glorify Jesus. 17:11 – There is protection and unity with Jesus. 17:12 – There is power and protection in the name of God. 17:13 – There is joy in Jesus. 17:14 – It is OK to not be accepted by the world. 17:15 – Jesus prays that we don't come under the control of Satan. 17:17 – God's word is truth – His word sets us apart from the world. 17:18 – We have a job to do in the world. 17:21-23 – Our unity is not only for our benefit – it also helps the world believe that Jesus was sent by God. 17:23 – Jesus' spirit within us shows how much God loves us. 17:24 – Jesus wants us with Him. 17:25-26 – Jesus desires that we know God and keep God's love within us. As Jesus worded this prayer, his thoughts were on his crucifixion, his disciples, and for future believers. It has been called his farewell prayer for his disciples. I know it will help us in 2014!

REEVES' RHETORIC

"Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love. Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:2-3).

There is a great battle that is taking place. We may feel safe or believe we are immune. We may sense some slight influence, but for the most part we truly believe that, all in all, surely we aren't as mired as all that.

I am going to give you some words to some familiar songs. It is okay if you want to pause while you read them and sing along in your heart. O be carful little mouths what you say ... Angry words! O let them never ... Love one another, for love is from God ... We're part of the family that's been born again. These songs have been around for years, but they still speak a powerful message to me, and that is the message to "take care" of how we speak to each other. Jesus said, "For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks... I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless work they speak, for by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned" (Matt. 12:34-37). Our speech can be a powerful tool for destruction (James 3) but it can also be a powerful tool for building up (Eph. 4:29) and extending grace to each other (Col. 4:6). When we speak without thinking, or out of anger, we take the chance of doing great harm to someone. The heart of the righteous ponders how to answer ... (Pro. 15:28). Jesus gave additional warning to be careful of what comes our of your mouth, But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this defiles a person (Matt. 15:18). It does not matter what our intentions are when we slip up and let careless words come out; the damage is done. Let's be in prayer that our speech will not be hasty and harmful, but instead be gracious and loving. Pray that our words will be a source of joy and comfort to others.
