

Jon Sorrells is in ETMC. He may have gone home in the last day or so.



What a glorious weekend! It was such a blessing to have David and Kiera Keen and their children with us. A very special thanks to all who helped make this very full weekend possible by housing them, feeding them, and being a part of the activities that filled this weekend and made it possible for them to get to know their new church family. Thanks for your continued prayers for them during this difficult transition time.

In most of our Bible classes Sunday our lesson topic for the day was "The Way God Made Us." In the young adult class we acknowledged what a difficult subject this is; one that calls us to be loving and accepting and encouraging toward others; while at the same time one that calls us to remain faithful to the will of our Creator and Designer, and to help others to do the same. We must remember that a part of remaining faithful to God—a very big part I might add—is treating others with love and respect and humility.

Some of the most critical passages in this discussion come from the very beginning not only of Scripture, but the very beginning of humanity itself.

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth...Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness..." So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them... God saw all that he had made, and it was very good. (Gen. 1:1, 26-27, 31a)

That is the question, isn't it? Will we believe that we—all of us—are created in the image of God, and answer to that Creator, not only concerning how we treat and think about ourselves, but also how we treat and consider others, all of whom are likewise created in the image of the very same Creator?

Russell Moore, in an article entitled "What the Transgender Debate Means for the Church," notes that "we should never mock or belittle those suffering gender identity disorders. These are our neighbors to be respected and served, not freaks to be despised...In a fallen universe, all of us are alienated, in some way, from who we were designed to be. That alienation manifests itself in different ways in different people... We must affirm that God loves all persons, and that the gospel is good news for repentant prodigal sons and daughters, including for those who have trouble figuring out which is which." Amen.

IN THE MIDST OF CONFUSION

Sunday's lesson in my class was so difficult. We talked about the hardships people face when they go against God's design for living. In that conversation, we talked about homosexuality, transgenderism, and divorce. All these issues go against God's plan for mankind and the world's response to them just adds to the confusion. We are now seeing more of our church families facing these issues in their lives. It seems that more and more our world is moving further away from the teachings of God, but does that change what God expects and needs from us as the church? Read Paul's words to the church at Rome, I am speaking the truth in Christ-I am not lying; my conscience bears me witness in the Holy Spirit-that I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my brothers, my kinsmen according to the flesh. (Ro.9:1-3). Paul is talking about the Jews that would not accept Christ for who He was. As a result, they were "cut off" from Christ. There are many today that are in the same situation as those unbelieving Jews; lost and confused about their identity with Christ. It does not matter what "issue" separates people from God. What matters is; do we feel sorrow and anguish over the fact that they are lost? Like Paul, would we be willing to "trade places" with them so that they could be saved? As a church, are we willing to do our part in bringing order to a world in the midst of such confusion? These are challenging times and Christ is always challenging us to imitate Him. WWJD?

Order of Worship





This past Sunday was the first day of 2017. Just let that sink in for another moment or two...

As we opened up the New Year, we did it in the best way possible—we met together as a church family, remembered the blessings we have in Christ Jesus, and challenged each other to face the days ahead with confidence, with faith, with hope.

And with joy.

One of the Scriptures we shared Sunday morning was this one from Romans 12.

Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord.

Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. (Rom. 12:11-12)

This Sunday we begin a series on the book of 1 Peter, as timely a study for our day as I can imagine. It is a letter written to Christians who found themselves not only on the fringe of their culture, but at the bottom of their society's social standing. They had no power, no authority, and much of the time no one in the political and civic leadership who would speak in their behalf. Quite the opposite in fact. They lived in a time and culture that was antagonistic and even hostile toward them from all directions—in the government of the empire; in their local cities; in their workplaces; for some even in their own homes.

What's it going to take for you to make "Joyful in Hope" one of your themes for the year? What will it take for you to "be joyful in hope" every day, no matter what each day brings? If you think that will come with a good family, a good job, a good doctor's report, a good stock market, a good government—you are sadly mistaken. Those things will always be favorable to us at times, and against us at other times. Actually, against us I would say most of the time.

And why would you say that, Bill? Because those things are in and of this world. And the world will always be, well, the world. Jesus said that in the world we will always have trouble, and that at times the world will hate us, and hate our values. That's because the way of the cross always runs counter to the ways of the world, the way of self.

Yet John 16:33 also records these words of Jesus: "But take heart! I have overcome the world."



NEW BEGINNINGS OR NEW ENDURANCE?

I want to wish all of you a happy and blessed 2017! Many use the New Year as a chance for new beginnings, such as lifestyle changes, job improvements, or money management. Many are just glad to get the old year behind them. I want to encourage you to also include your perseverance in your New Year resolutions. One of the most important things we can give the church is our faithfulness, our steadiness, our presence with the Saints, and our ability to outlast our adversary. With all the football that is going on now, we can get some good out of all the clichés we hear such as "leave it all on the field", "play until the last snap", or "there is no quit in him"! They certainly hold true for football, but they are just as applicable to our spiritual life too. God encourages us in scripture to hold out to the end also. Paul tells us to run the whole race to win the prize (2 Co.9:24-27), the Hebrew writer tells us to hold our faith to the end (Heb.3:14), and John tells us to be faithful unto death (Rev.2:10). James says that the steadfast are blessed (James 5:11) and Peter warns of the danger of complacency (2 Pet. 3). What can help us in our endurance? I offer Peter's words as encouragement, For this reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and selfcontrol with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they will keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ...for if you practice these qualities you will never fall (2 Peter 1: 5-8, 10b). Grow stronger in 2017!

This past Sunday we began a series of lessons on the idea of us today as "resident immigrants" in the world, and the consequences of such status—or really the results of having low or no status in the world. That term is adapted from "Resident Aliens," the title of a book by William William William Walliam Villiam V and affirms these two truths:

- We are "immigrants"—"This world is not our home" as the song says. Our ultimate citizenship is in heaven, as the apostle Paul stated in Phil. 3.
- We are "resident" immigrants—Though this world is not our permanent home, it is our home for a while. And that's where the potential and even inevitable tension and conflict arise.

Consider these words in which Gary Holloway reflects on Peter addressing his hearers as exiles/strangers/immigrants, scattered to places not their homeland, strangers in a foreign land. (1 Peter 1:1-2; 2:11-12; 4:1-4, 14-16)

Scattered also implies they are in the minority wherever they live. That's made clearer by Peter's description of them as strangers. It may very well be that "strangers" is to be taken literally here. Peter's readers may be...at the very bottom of the social ladder, with few rights and little legal protection from their neighbors. But it is not only their low social rank that makes them strangers. By becoming Christians they have further estranged themselves from their culture. Even if they fit in by the way they dressed and talked, they were marked as strange and different by their Christian lifestyles...That difference between Christians and the world is still with us today. Or at least it should be. Even if we are not literally displaced persons, even if we have responsible and respectable positions in society, we don't quite fit into our culture. Even today to be a Christian is to be strange. We don't quite feel at home. We stick out. We don't play by the same rules as those around us. We don't treasure what they do. We don't think like they think. We are strange. Foreign. Homeless... Being a stranger means ridicule, discrimination, and even suffering. [Gary Holloway, Home Among Strangers: In the World with Christ, pp. 12-13]

Perhaps the most haunting statement from that paragraph is this: "That difference between Christians and the world is still with us today. Or at least it should

How about with you? Is that difference still with you today? And what would you say are some of those differences?

Peter's first words call us to live lives of hope and joy. I'd say that's part of the difference right there. See you this Sunday as we remind each other of how it's possible to thrive as resident immigrants today.



PROTECTION BY LIVING GOD'S WAY!

Last Sunday our class studied the story of the Golden Calf in Exodus 32. One of the questions that kept coming out of our discussion was, "How could the Israelites turn from God so quickly"? It had not been that long since their miraculous deliverance from Egypt. It had not been that long since the crossing of the Red Sea. It had not been that long since they all agreed that they would obey God (Ex.24:7). One of the reasons for their failure was that they still did not realize how much better life would be if they lived it "God's Way". The 10 Commandments were not only the basis of God's law for the people, but if the Israelites would live by them, it offered them protection in their spiritual life too. Look in Exodus 20 and see where God was offering them protection from false Gods (20:2-3). God was offering them protection from false worship (20:4-6). God was offering them protection from misusing God's name (20:7). God was offering them the protection of rest and remembrance (20:8-11). God was offering them protection for their parents (20:12). God was offering the protection of **human life** (20:13). God was offering them protection of marriage and personal purity (20:14). God was offering them protection of **property** (20:15). God was offering them the protection of truth (20:16). God was offering them protection for their heart (20:17). People think that living God's way will be burdensome and cause them to "miss out" in life. In reality, living God's way will help us avoid needless pain, suffering, and the destruction of our families. God wants us to live abundantly not with regrets. It is a life of protection and blessings; we need to embrace it!



(1 Peter 2:13-17)

This has now been witnessed to at the proper time. (1 Tim. 2:1-6)

For the Christian, we recognize that whoever is in power, we will be submissive and respectful and prayerful. We recognize that we best serve our God "by doing good," and that our ultimate allegiance is to the "one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave Himself..."

LIFE DOES NOT HAVE INSTANT REPLAY!

I am amazed at how many cameras it takes to televise a sporting event today. There are many angles of the play available when they use instant replay. Instant replay helps the officiating crew make the right call. It is used to correct mistakes and many wish they had that same luxury in life today. We have to live with our mistakes and we suffer when we make bad decisions. How and what we look at can help us tremendously in our decision making. Here is some advice from scripture on what we look at. Consider God's words to Habakkuk, Look among the nations and see; wonder and be astounded. For I am doing a work in your days that you would not believe if told (Hab.1:5). God is still working for us today as he was in Habakkuk's time. Don't make the mistake of thinking God is not aware or working for us today. Consider Paul's advice, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal (2 Cor.5:18). We choose every day what we want to believe in and what we want to trust in. Choosing without seeing takes faith, and God will bless those who take that leap of faith. Consider Jesus' words after He had reached someone His disciples thought was unreachable. My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. Look, I tell you, lift us your eyes, and see that the fields are ripe for harvest (Jo.4:34,35). We can reach the lost. That is the will of God. There are many who need what we have in the Lord. We just need to see them! Consider Paul's words again. Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise (Eph.5:15). We do not have the careless, aimless, and harmful walk of the unbelievers. We walk with purpose, love and service; this is the wise walk. What are you looking at today? Are you looking for the eternal or the temporary? Like our children sing: "Oh, be careful little eyes what you see! '

Consider the following from Numbers 14:4-9 "4 And they said to each other, "We should choose a leader and go back to Egypt." 5 Then Moses and Aaron fell facedown in front of the whole Israelite assembly gathered there. 6 Joshua son of Nun and Caleb son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had explored the land, tore their clothes 7 and said to the entire Israelite assembly, "The land we passed through and explored is exceedingly good. 8 If the Lord is pleased with us, he will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. 9 Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will devour them. Their protection is gone, but the Lord is with us. Do not be afraid of them."



Last week hundreds of thousands gathered in Washington D.C. to demonstrate for concerns related to the way we value and treat women in this country.

This week hundreds of thousands will gather in Washington D.C. to demonstrate for concerns related to the way we value life and the way we treat the unborn, those with disabilities and illnesses, and the aged.

You would think that those gathering in both demonstrations would be on the same side. And so it should be. But if you think they are, you couldn't be more wrong.

In the same way, Christians are called to value all people because every single person, from conception to death, has been created in the image of a loving and gracious God who values life and calls on His people to do the same. This calling challenges us to respect and love those who are different than we are; those who believe differently than we do; even those who cause us pain and suffering and seek to destroy us.

To value and respect both women and the unborn seems to be a rare thing these days. Yet God's people should not be surprised when few join us to walk through the small gate and on the narrow road (Matt. 7:13-14). It's actually a part of who we are and enhances our witness, as this theme text from 1 Peter reminds us.

But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light. Once you were not a people, but now you are the people of God; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy. Dear friends, I urge you, as foreigners and exiles, to abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul. Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us. (1 Peter 2:9-12)

DO YOU WANT A PIECE OF ME?

Last night we stopped in at Michael's to visit. The kiddos were in the back watching TV so I snuck in on them. The room was dark and they were absorbed in their show. I jumped in and screamed and all three came off the bed. I scared the bejabbers out of them! They got riled up and we ended up with a wrestling match on their bed. At one point, Reed jumped up and asked, "PaPaw, do you want a piece of me"? I told him that I was taking all of him! It was a great PaPaw moment for me and lots of fun for them. At the same time, it made me think of how some people offer themselves to Jesus. Some offered themselves for the wrong motive. Consider James and John's request of sitting on either side of Jesus at the time of Jesus' glory in Mark 10:37. Jesus told them that they did not know what they were asking for. Others offered themselves in order for the physical blessings (Jo.6:26). Jesus told them that they were not to work for food that perishes, but for food that endures for eternal life. Many came and offered themselves for healing and Jesus took care of those needs; but Jesus always taught them what it took to become a true disciple. Jesus' message was, Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his live for my sake will find it (Matt.10:37-39). Jesus knew it took a total commitment to be a Christian. He taught of the dangers of trying to live in the world and with Christ at the same time. Jesus taught of how valuable the kingdom of Heaven was and how we should hang on to it no matter what the cost. Jesus wants those that offer all of themselves, all of the time! How much are you offering Jesus?



It's easy for us to get discouraged when we see more and more suffering and injustice in our world. We live in a complex society and time, and so it should not surprise us when the problems of our communities, our nation, and our world are difficult and complex as well.

So what is a Christian to do? Of course we pray. We seek to help however we can, and we get involved in causes and efforts that we believe will help those who are facing difficulties in our community and our world. One of the most basic things we can do is live faithfully ourselves, lives that are just and considerate, loving and respectful. And when we do that in the midst of our world, we do it as witnesses to Christ.

Live such good lives among the pagans that, though they accuse you of doing wrong, they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us... For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people. (1 Peter 2:12, 15)

You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. (Matt. 5:14-16)

But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, ¹⁶ keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak maliciously against your good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander. (1 Peter 3:15-16)

We should never take lightly the power of a few good deeds and a faithful life. It changes people.

IF I HIDE, I CAN STILL DO I

Beau (our youngest Grandson) has never used a pacifier. He has always just stuck two of his fingers in his mouth and done just fine. In fact, all of us have encouraged him. At naptime, it was "Beau, get your fingers" and that was his cue to quiet down and get serious about his nap. Now that he is older, his pediatrician has declared that it was time to stop. His fingers were for grabbing and not pacifying! Needless to say, the transition has not been easy for Beau. Monday, as I headed out to work, Beau was hiding from Suzie. I heard her ask him, "Beau, are you hiding so you can suck your fingers?" He said, "yes," and then he giggled. Cute story, but I am afraid that is how we sometimes act about our own sins. If I can hide it, I can do it! If my sin hurts someone I don't know that well, it will work itself out in the long run. If it does not hurt my public image, it will be all right. We know better, but when we take God out of our sin problem, we lose sight of the real problem. David said, "Against you (God), you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight (Psa.51:4). When we don't take steps to correct our sins quickly, it puts our relationship with God in jeopardy and can cause our relationships here on earth tremendous harm. To live with sin causes our heart to harden which hinders our repentance. A lack of repentance leads to a heart that no longer hurts when we sin. A heart that no longer reacts to sin becomes further disconnected from God. We may hide our sins behind closed doors, but we still suffer the damage it causes We just don't want to admit it. Ignored sin is still sin and we need to take care of it. Our attitude should be like the Psalmist, How can I know all the sins lurking in my heart? Cleanse me from these hidden faults. Keep our servant from deliberate sins! Don't let them control me. Then I will be free o guilt and innocent of great sin. May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing to you. O Lord, my rock and my redeemer (Psa.19:12-14, NLT).



We discussed the theme text of 1 Peter (2:9-12) last Sunday. There the apostle reminds us—the church, not the USA—of our identity as "God's chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's special possession." He tells us that our mission is to "declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light," and to live good and faithful lives "among the pagans." That's where we find our evangelistic opportunities and impact as well.

The rest of the book teaches us what that looks like when it's lived out in specific situations we face every day in this world. And it may surprise you which one the Holy Spirit inspires Peter to address first. To the people of his day—and to us today—who are living as resident immigrants in a pagan society, the first subject tackled is how to relate to civil authorities.

Um, what?

For the recipients of Peter's letter in the first century, and for us living in secular societies in the 21st century, this is one of the most needed teachings. We need a word from the Lord on how to live with Christian values and faithfulness in an environment where others—including the governing authorities—are increasingly antagonistic to these values. That was their world in the first century. More and more it's becoming our world in today's America.

Most—almost all—of the time in the NT, Christians "turned the other cheek" and lived with whatever the authorities chose to do and left it at that. I think that should be our attitude as well. Most of the time. But there are a few examples of first century Christians standing their ground and calling on the authorities to right a wrong. The messages today will look at how that plays out in our society which, unlike theirs, gives us many more opportunities to be involved in civil matters.

It all hinges on how we live. "For it is God's will that by doing good you should silence the ignorant talk of foolish people." (1 Peter 2:15) In today's pagan, secular society, are you doing good?

THE STRUGGLE OF GRACE!

I am looking forward to the next few weeks as some of our bible classes are looking at Grace. We started last week with the text of Ephesians 2:1-10. There were so many good comments in class. One that interested me was, "I have always had trouble accepting the gift of God's grace in my life". Quite a few folks in class agreed with that statement. Many of us grew up with a "salvation by works" mentality. I was never taught that, but that was the example that I grew up with. As a result, good people in the church were judged unfairly because many felt they did not "do enough" to be a good Christian. I am not advocating that we do away with the "good works" that we were created to do. What I am advocating is that our attitude around those works change. Paul wrote, But if it (salvation) is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works; otherwise grace would no longer be grace (Ro.11:6). When we try to earn our way to heaven, we take God out of the picture. God wants us to rely on him for our salvation. God wants us to accept His gift of salvation; so that we can then use our position with Him to help others find their relationship with God. Once again, let's look at Paul's writing, All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation...therefore we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us (2 Cor.5:18-20). As we become more Christ like, our motives will change. We will then do our "good works" as a response to our faith and an unyielding love for mankind. Jesus commands us to love one another as He has loved us (Jo.13:34). Jesus' love for mankind went beyond the need to meet man's physical needs, it was also a love fueled by a need to meet man's spiritual needs also. It sounds like a good thing for us here at West Erwin too!

Our Scripture text in our sermon series identifying God's people today as "resident immigrants" is 1 Peter 2:18-25, a passage that speaks to slaves and masters. Thankfully our situation is different today, at least in this country. The fact that the Scriptures address these groups—very much a reality in the first century Roman Empire—does not justify the practice. All human beings are created in the image of God. All people of faith in God and belief in the Bible should absolutely and unequivocally condemn the practice of slavery.

This passage can be very easily viewed from the perspective of employers/managers and employees/workers and applied to Christians' consideration of their jobs and careers, their "workaday world." The situations discussed and inspired counsel given can be applied in our lives and in the situations we face in our lives most every week.

Unlike similar passages in Ephesians and Colossians, the 1 Peter passage only addresses slaves; the apostle gives no instructions to masters. It could very well be that he knew that the recipients of his letter—resident immigrants on the bottom of their society—did not include any on that level of the social ladder.

Peter acknowledges that at times Christians must accept unjust suffering, and points to the example of Jesus. It's one of the hardest parts of the message of 1 Peter because it goes against the grain of who we are as a country and as citizens of America. The apostle, however, clearly sees our everyday lives in work or at home or in school as a calling to ministry and an opportunity to bear witness through our words and especially through our actions. We tend to expect vindication when we suffer unjustly. It was said of Jesus that He did not, but rather "entrusted himself to him who judges justly." (1 Peter 2:23) Can we do that?

As a Christian you should feel a sense of renewal and purpose as you face each day of your life, whether you are the person in charge or one of the workers; a stay-at-home or retired spouse or parent; a student; or one still trying to figure out that part of your life. Ultimately, we're all serving the same Boss.

"Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving."

(Col.3:23-24)

One day last week as I was coming in to work, I saw a strange sight.. At one intersection, I had to stop and let a fire truck go through. He had his lights and siren going as he crept through that busy intersection. After he got through, we started to go, but then an ambulance came through from another direction with lights and siren going also. After he went through, I looked around waiting for the police car to come through next. It was an unusual sight to see those two emergency vehicles responding to different calls and crossing the same intersection at the same time. All I could think about was that there were people in peril waiting for help to respond to their crisis. We see people in peril all around us. We don't realize it because there are no flashing lights and sirens going off in the vicinity. People are suffering from failed marriages, split families, loss of jobs, hurting from addictions, and all are in peril of losing precious things in their lives. We usually don't find out until the crisis has grown so much and then we can see the day to day effects of living like this. What can we do? How can we help? We are certainly not professional counselors, but we do have the Spirit of the Lord to help us at times like this. I believe that the best thing we can give those who are hurting are our love, our patience, our kindness, and our gentleness (Gal.5:22-23). They don't need our judgment or condemnation. I believe we need to take Paul's words to heart, Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness... Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ... And let us not grow weary of doing good (Gal.6:1, 2,9). Watch out for those in peril, reach out to them in love, and let them know that you care. If we can do that, we then can become more like Christ.



If there's anything more difficult than the call for Christians to submit to the civil authorities it is the call for husbands and wives to be submissive and respectful to each other. And that is exactly the message of our passage this week from 1 Peter 3.

You would think those words would not be so distasteful to so many. And if you thought that you would be wrong. Why is that?

It's at least partly due to our culture of personal freedom, rights and independence. You may say, "Wait, Bill, those are good things!" And they are. For our country and our citizens. For Christians and for the church, those things are tools used by Satan to destroy our families and our faith.

And that's why the call of Jesus goes in an opposite direction. Consider these familiar verses.

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship." (Rom. 12:1)

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. (Gal. 2:20)

Then he said to them all: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me." (Luke 9:23)

You say, "But Bill, what does that have to do with how I treat my spouse?" Um, everything. As Ephesians 5 begins specifically addressing husbands and wives, the context for those instructions is set with this call.

Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. (Eph. 5:21)

COMING TO THE HOUSE OF THE LORD!

The word that came to Jeremiah from the Lord: "Stand in the gate of the Lord's house; and proclaim there this word, and say, hear the word of the Lord, all you men of Judah who enter these gates to worship the Lord. Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel: Amend your ways and your deeds, and I will let you dwell in this place. Do not trust in these deceptive words: 'This is the temple of the Lord,...' For if you truly amend your ways and your deeds, if you truly execute justice one with another, if you do not oppress the sojourner, the fatherless, or the widow, or shed innocent blood in this place, and if you do not go after other gods to our own harm, then I will let you dwell in this place in the land that I gave of old to your fathers forever. (Jeremiah 7:1-7).

Jeremiah's words are to the men of Judah, but in them, God gives us a good idea of what he expects of those who come to the house of the Lord to worship him. It's not the house that makes the worship, but it's the spiritual condition of those in the house that matters. Through Jeremiah's preaching, God tells us to: Not expect more than God is willing to give. Judah felt that if they went to the temple in the Lord's name, everything would be fine. God told them to amend their ways. They felt that God would protect them because they had the temple in their midst. They learned the hard way that God will not protect those that do not love, serve, and worship him properly. Love each other before we offer our worship. God told Judah they had a responsibility to be fair with each other, to take care of those in need, to value life, and to give Him the honor he deserves. He expects the same from us today. Judah's bad attitude toward their social responsibilities was reflected in their bad attitude toward their religious responsibilities. The two go hand in hand. Appreciate the price paid for us. Judah was not willing to hold up their end of the covenant. Do we dare think the same standard does not apply to us today? Throughout time, God has punished those that do not obey; what makes us think that he will deal differently with us? Our blessings do not come cheaply. How do you come into the Lord's house? Do you come to give God the honor and respect he deserves? Do you come with reverence and awe and feeling unworthy of anything he has given you? Or do you come begrudgingly giving up your time and your money? Be careful how you come into His house.



Sometimes we go through difficult struggles and experience very real hardships that threaten our lives. When we do, Satan is seeking to draw us away from God. Yet through the very same threatening experience, we have the opportunity to see God's presence in an even greater light, and to realize that if the power in our life is the Lord God, then this threat will be overcome.

Peter reminds us of this great truth by reaching back several hundred years before Christ to the days of the prophet Isaiah and Ahaz, king of Judah in Jerusalem. King Ahaz was also experiencing some very real threats as neighboring kings conspired together to overthrow him in a coup and put someone more sympathetic to their agenda on the throne in Jerusalem. Naturally, it was upsetting to King Ahaz. In a big way. Here is what God told King Ahaz of Judah about these threats he was facing:

"Be careful, keep calm and don't be afraid. Do not lose heart because of these two smoldering stubs of firewood...If you do not stand firm in your faith, you will not stand at all...Do not call conspiracy everything this people calls a conspiracy; do not fear what they fear, and do not dread it. The LORD Almighty is the one you are to regard as holy, he is the one you are to fear, he is the one you are to dread." (Isaiah 7:4-9; 8:12-13)

Peter reminds Christians of the first—and 21st—centuries that God is greater than whatever threatens us, that we don't have to fear what others fear. Rather, we revere Christ the Lord.

Who is going to harm you if you are eager to do good? But even if you should suffer for what is right, you are blessed. "Do not fear their threats; do not be frightened." But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect. (1 Peter 3:13-15)

Whatever you're going through, whatever threats you're facing, God's got this. And when people ask what's going on, and how you're getting through it, you be ready to tell them about the real power in your life.

JOSHUA: LEADING AFTER MOSES!

We do live in challenging times that can intimidate and worry us, but God's expectations for us today are the same He had for all His children since the beginning of time. It is a challenge to follow God, it is a difficult walk, and that is all the more reason to be very strong and courageous! This Book of the Law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do according to all that is written in it (Jos. 1:8). God wants His children to realize the importance of knowing His word. God's word is living and active. God's word is able to cleanse and purify our soul. God's word builds us up; it is perfect, and unchanging. It is just as relevant today as it was in Joshua's days. I pray you enjoy your time with Joshua; his faith is a great example for us.



It's a common characteristic to want to be liked, accepted, appreciated. Few if any of us really want to be left out, to feel like we're out of place, that we just don't belong.

And yet we know that this world is not our home, and that our hope is clearly in heaven.

Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus... For, as I have often told you before and now tell you again even with tears, many live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their destiny is destruction, their god is their stomach, and their glory is in their shame. Their mind is set on earthly things. But our citizenship is in heaven. And we eagerly await a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ. (Phil. 3:12-14, 18-20)

So do we turn our backs on this world, and no longer care about anything that's going on here? Of course not. Many are "enemies of the cross of Christ" here in this life, and because of that they make us their enemies as well. Yet we continue to do exactly what God did: love the people of this world so much that we seek to help them in their current struggles and share with them the way of salvation through the One who gave Himself for us and them.

Paul could say those things to the Philippians in chapter 3 because he had already told them this in chapter 1:

I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. (Phil. 3:20-21)

And he tells us to live the same way. No matter what.

Whatever happens, conduct yourselves in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ. (Phil. 3:27)

JOSHUA BEFORE JERICHO; IT'S ALL ABOUT GOD!

We left Joshua last week with the spies that Rahab hid. Today, in class, we will look at the battle for Jericho, but some good lessons can be learned from Joshua between that encounter with Rahab and the fall of Jericho. First, we learn that, It's not about us! The Lord said to Joshua, Today I will begin to exalt you in the sight of all Israel, that they may know that, as I was with Moses, so I will be with you (Jos.3:7). Being exalted by God sounds pretty good to me, but whatever I do in His service, the glory belongs to God. We are only "something" when we are with God. He gives us our hope, He gives us our source of joy, and He gives us the reason to feel good about ourselves. Secondly, we learn that, It's all about God's power!... That this may be a sign among you. When your children ask in time to come, What do these stones mean to you? Then you shall tell them that the waters of the Jordan were cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord. When it passed over the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. So these stones shall be to the people of Israel a memorial forever (Josh. 4:6-7). God wanted the Israelites to remember the miraculous way they crossed the Jordan. He wanted them to remember His power and the role it played in their success. It is the same for us today. Those miracles were meant for our benefit too. We need to remember what a mighty God we serve. We need to remember that His Son conquered death for our benefit too! We need to remember that God's power is at work in us today! Thirdly, we learn that It is about what God has made us! And this is the reason why Joshua circumcised them; all the males of the people who came out of Egypt, all the men of war, had died in the wilderness on the way after they had come out of Egypt. For the people of Israel walked 40 years in the wilderness ... because they did not obey the voice of the Lord (Jos.5:4,6). Circumcision was a way of identifying those that were in a covenant relationship with God (Gen.17) and it also a represented a removal of their stubborn sinfulness (Lev..26:40-42, Deut. 10:16, 30:6). God wants His children to stand out in the world. He wants His children to be different and recognizable to those seeking Jesus. Our obedience to the Gospel has put us in a blessed position in life and we should use that position to bring glory and honor to God. It is not about us, but it is all about the one who loves and protects us; God!



As we seek to have an impact on our world we recognize that it isn't always going to go so well for us. We've been emphasizing this as we've gone through 1 Peter, recognizing our world is not that different from the world of first century Christians.

Speaking of Christians, do you know how many times the NT uses that term to describe the followers of Christ? If you thought three, you're correct! Now, do you know the BCV for each, and what the context is? We'll share some about that this Sunday because one of the three is in 1 Peter.

If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. If you suffer, it should not be as a murderer or thief or any other kind of criminal, or even as a meddler. However, if you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name. (1 Peter 4:14-16)

It's amazing that with so few Bible uses of the term Christian, one of those would be in the context of suffering. And not just the difficulties that seem to come with life; rather it is the suffering and difficulty that comes specifically *because* one is a Christian.

Far from saving us from suffering in this world, being a Christian actually is at times the reason for our difficulties.

And why is that? It is because, as we will sing again in our morning worship assembly, "This world is not my home." And so we don't always fit in, and our values don't always mesh with the values of those around us. It's during those times of tension and even conflict that "I can't feel at home in this world anymore."

Thankfully, as we have also seen, this difference gives us opportunities to not just share our faith but to first of all show our faith. Even when the outward situation looks bleak, our inner hope and peace and even joy is genuinely felt and seen. How can we do that? Because Jesus.

"I have told you these things so that in me you will have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33)

DON'T BE FOOLED!

In Joshua 9, we read of the story of the "Gibeonite Deception". They had seen the power of God and the Israelites in their invasion of Canaan. The Gibeonites wanted a treaty with the Israelites and were able to pull the wool over Joshua and the Israelite's eyes because they "did not ask counsel of the Lord" (9:14). The Israelites just learned a difficult lesson about listening to the Lord in chapters 7 and 8; and now we see them ignoring Him again. Did they underestimate God's desire to be a part of their lives, or did they overestimate their own ability to make correct decisions? It was maybe a little of both, but don't we still do that today? What does it take to seek guidance from God? Psalm 25 gives us a few pointers in this. First we need to place our life in God's hands. To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul. O my God, in you I trust; let me not be put to shame; ... Indeed, none who wait for you shall be put to shame, ... Make me to know your ways (Psa.25:1-4). Trusting God is the key here. We need to realize that God has our best interests at heart and that sometimes puts us in conflict with the world around us. Living with God is the better place to be. Secondly, we need to secure our relationship with God. That means keeping our part of the covenant relationship with Him and being aware of the sins of our lives. Lead me in your truth and teach me, ... Remember your mercy, O Lord, and your steadfast love ... Remember not the sins of my youth or my transgressions (Psa.25:6-8). God always loves us and he is continually forgiving us if we are walking in the light and acknowledging our sin (1 Jo.1:7-8). He knows our nature and He does not hold our past against us. He loves us too much for that, but He does want us doing our best to imitate His son! Thirdly, we need to live with the confidence that God's way is the **best way.** My eyes are ever toward the Lord, for he will pluck my feel out of the net ... bring me out of my distresses ... Oh, guard my soul ... for I take refuge in you (Psa.25:15,17,20). God offers us protection, relief, and restoration. Don't let the tricks of life get the best of you. Be patient, look at His word, and seek the guidance of God. His paths need to be our paths.



BE VERY CAREFUL TO LOVE THE LORD!

This week we close out our study of Joshua. We will be in Joshua 24 where we will read his great statement, "But as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Josh.25:15). I think that statement tells us what Joshua was about. He was a great leader and a great man of God who never forgot God's promises. Joshua lived to serve God and Joshua took his stand on how faithful God was. I want to take you back one chapter and see another great statement he made during his last days as the leader of God's people. He had gathered Israel's leaders together to charge them with their responsibilities after his death. Joshua reminded them of what God had done for them, he told them to be strong and obey God, and he told them to "cling to the Lord your God". Then Joshua said this, Be very careful, therefore, to love the Lord your God (23:11). That was good advice for then, and it is good advice for us today. One of the points in the sermon this Sunday is this: Servant living means *trusting* God. 1 Peter shares this theme throughout, including these passages that remind us of the assurance we have if we will trust Him.

Cast all your anxiety on him because he cares for you. (5:7)

Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, and into an inheritance that can never perish, spoil or fade. This inheritance is kept in heaven for you, who through faith are shielded by God's power until the coming of the salvation that is ready to be revealed in the last time. In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials. (1:3-6)

For it is commendable if someone bears up under the pain of unjust suffering because they are conscious of God... Christ suffered for you, leaving you an example, that you should follow in his steps... When they hurled their insults at him, he did not retaliate; when he suffered, he made no threats. Instead, he entrusted himself to him who judges justly. (2:19-23)

Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you... If you are insulted because of the name of Christ, you are blessed, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you... If you suffer as a Christian, do not be ashamed, but praise God that you bear that name... So then, those who suffer according to God's will should commit themselves to their faithful Creator and continue to do good. (4:12-19)

And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast. To him be the power forever and ever. Amen. (5:10-11)

Easter weekend many of our young people, families, and coaches will be in Dallas for the Leadership Training for Christ (LTC) convention. Thousands of youth will participate in team events such as Bible Quiz, Drama, Chorus and Puppets; individual events such as Speaking, Song Leading, Sculpture and Photography; as well as many other individual and team events. Congratulations to all who have worked so hard for the last several months preparing and helping our terrific young people learn more about this year's theme book of Acts and be challenged by identifying ways we can "Make Him Known" in our daily lives. Please keep all those involved in your prayers over this next big week.

The theme has been taken from Paul's message to the people of Athens in Acts 17:23. Noting their many altars, he noticed one "To An Unknown God" and told them that it would be this God, the one true and living God, the God who is Creator and Sustainer, that he would make known to them that day.

Isn't that what we are all to be about, every day—making Jesus known to others through our very lives? We do that today for the same reason Paul did that in Athens almost 2000 years ago: because God created everyone, sustains everyone, loves everyone, and wants everyone to repent.

"The God who made the world and everything in it is the Lord of heaven and earth and does not live in temples built by human hands. And he is not served by human hands, as if he needed anything. Rather, he himself gives everyone life and breath and everything else. From one man he made all the nations, that they should inhabit the whole earth; and he marked out their appointed times in history and the boundaries of their lands. God did this so that they would seek him and perhaps reach out for him and find him, though he is not far from any one of us. 'For in him we live and move and have our being.' As some of your own poets have said, 'We are his offspring.' "Therefore since we are God's offspring, we should not think that the divine being is like gold or silver or stone—an image made by human design and skill. In the past God overlooked such ignorance, but now he commands all people everywhere to repent." (Acts 17:24-30)

If you are visiting with us on this Easter Sunday our West Erwin family is honored to have you! We realize there are many places of worship you could have attended today, but we are thankful you chose to be here. Our prayer is that the time we spend together today praising our living Lord Jesus Christ will bring us all closer to Him and more aware of His loving presence and gracious will.

Many of our church family are worshiping in Dallas together with others who gathered there this weekend for Leadership Training for Christ (LTC). What a great blessing these young people and their families and adult workers are to our West Erwin family, and will be to the church for decades to come!

When we think about so many who sacrifice so much in the name of Jesus, we wonder at times what causes some to be so focused on helping others come to know more about the Lord and His Word. And I think one person that could tell us something about that is James, the half-brother of the Lord.

The gospels list the names of Jesus' earthly siblings, other children of Mary and Joseph, Jesus' younger brothers and sisters (Matt. 12:46-47; 13:54-58). According to John 7:1-5, "his own brothers did not believe in him" while he was living. And yet we find them with the disciples after Jesus ascended into heaven, joining together constantly in prayer (Acts 1:14).

And with James, the change is monumental. He goes from being an unbeliever to being a leader in the church that Jesus died to establish (Acts 12:17; 15:1-21; 21:17-19). And we know that he even wrote a letter that is a part of the inspired Word of God and carries his name. The book of James is one of the plainest calls to an active faith that you can find in the Bible.

So what made the difference? What turned him around? I think we read what happened in the first few verses of 1 Cor. 15. As Paul is recounting the appearances of the resurrected Lord Jesus, he states very simply, "Then he appeared to James," in verse 7. And that did it. Seeing Him live the way He lived, and die the way He died, and then seeing Him very much alive, changed his life forever. And when we come to believe that the One who died for our sins has been raised from the dead, we too will never be the same.

"Life is difficult."

So begins the book *The Road Less Traveled*, by M. Scott Peck. Yes, it's more than just an interesting saying; more than just a great (one of many I might add) George Strait song.

It states the reality that most if not all mature adults acknowledge in our better moments to be the truth. But it is one that, for some reason, surprises us when we have to face this truth in our own lives.

Going back to the beginning, we are reminded that since the fall of humanity in the garden things in this life have been difficult. While we adults today carry on the rich tradition of describing/embellishing how difficult things were for us in years past—"I used to walk ten miles to school every day, in the snow, barefoot, uphill, both ways!"—we sometimes forget that the truth is life has always been difficult at times, and continues to be so.

Scott Peck goes on to say that once we accept this truth, "the fact that life is difficult no longer matters." While I think he may be overstating a bit for emphasis, his point is this: when we acknowledge that this life does get complicated and has its difficulties, we can begin to focus on what we can do to help our situation and to help others face their struggles and improve their situations.

In *The Road Less Traveled*, the acknowledgement that "life is difficult" leads healthy individuals to take responsibility and be disciplined as we avoid the temptation to moan about our problems and instead take positive action to solve them. And we teach our children to do the same as they face the difficulties of life. It may be that our culture needs this book more than ever.

Amazingly, Jesus didn't come to take away our difficulties. In fact, the case could be made that His coming made His existence *more* difficult, and when we follow His way—the way of self-denial and the cross—our lives also may become more not less difficult. (Matt. 10; John 16:33; 17:13-19; etc.)

It's almost as if He acted and taught specifically so that our lives could be spent obeying Him and serving others rather than ourselves. In this way we would come to realize that this world is truly not our home and that by focusing on serving Him and helping others we would gain everything this world **cannot** offer.

Huh.

HOW DO YOU COME INTO THE HOUSE OF GOD?

Guard your steps when you go to the house of God. To draw near to listen is better than to offer the sacrifice of fools, for they do not know that they are doing evil. Be not rash with your mouth, not let your heart be hasty to utter a word before God, for God is in heaven and you are on earth. Therefore let your words be few (Eccl.5:1-2). Our worship should be a sweet aroma to our Father. Worship should come from the heart with gratitude, humility, and with love for the Father. What can help our attitude about our worship? From the above passage, we see three things to remember when we come to worship. First, we need to come to listen and learn. We want to give Him the best of our words and our thoughts. Thirdly, we need to remember that He is in heaven and we are on earth. He is God, our creator, and our savior. His gifts to us are grace, mercy, and love. He is all-powerful, all-knowing, and He uses those attributes to bless us abundantly. He is worthy of our praise. Our worship is a time of adoration for God and also a time for us to encourage each other. How do you come into the house of God?



God, Give Us Christian Homes





I hope you have planned on being a part of our Vacation Bible School (VBS). The theme is taken from the children's movie "Inside Out." We spoke of a few characters from the movie last Sunday—Joy; Sadness; Disgust; and Fear. Today we will cover the last one: Anger. And the message will be a call to choose joy over anger. Yes, you get to choose. And one of the specific ways we choose joy over anger is by choosing to forgive. Yes, that too is a choice that we get to make.

So a few things about forgiveness.

- Forgiveness is only possible when you've been wronged. "But they betrayed me / hurt me / treated me unjustly, that's why I can't forgive." No. That's when you must forgive. Because...
- Forgiveness is called for by Jesus when you've been wronged.
- Our forgiving someone does not necessarily mean they do not face consequences for their actions and sins.
- Our forgiving someone does not mean that God forgives them.
- Our forgiving someone is the turning over of that person and the call of justice to the only One who can make that call: "Him who judges justly." (1 Peter 2:23)
- Forgiveness is not easy, and not automatic.
- Sometimes forgiveness takes time; some wrongs take a lifetime to forgive.
- It is vital that we are seeking to forgive; working on forgiving those who have wronged us.
- Withholding forgiveness is the opposite of "loving your neighbor as yourself" according to the Law of Moses (Lev. 19:18). In other words, we are breaking what Jesus called "the second greatest commandment" when we refuse to forgive and hold a grudge.
- Our forgiving someone has absolutely nothing directly to do with their salvation. That is based on God's forgiveness of them, not ours.
- Our forgiving someone has everything to do with our salvation. (Matt. 6:12-15; 18:21-35; James 2:12-13)
- Our forgiving someone is not based on their actions or even their repentance, but based on how God has forgiven us. (Eph. 4:31-5:2;
- Refusing to forgive simply enables the one who has wronged us to continue to have power over our joy.

Bear with each other and forgive one another if any of you has a grievance against someone.

Forgive as the Lord forgave you. (Col. 3:13)

BAD THINKING ON A ROOF!

In 2nd Samuel, we can read the sad story of David and Bathsheba. It is a story of lust, betrayal, and murder. It ends with two innocent lives lost and one of those lives was a child. What lessons can we learn from this story? First, we need to be where we need to be! David needed to be taking care of his duties as king (11:1) instead of taking his stroll on the roof. We need to be careful of where our lives take us; both physically and spiritually. If we are spending time "in the world", we need to be spiritually strong because the world will win that battle. Secondly, we need to be doing what we need to be doing! We need to be people that are constantly doing things that build our faith and not tear it down. When we ignore our prayer life, we lose our contact with God. When we ignore our service to others, we lose our compassion for those in need. When we ignore our worship, we lose our connection to our spiritual family. Thirdly, we need to be responsible for the sin in our lives and take the right steps to fix it! David survived this disaster in his life by confessing his sin to God and accepting the punishment for that sin. He did not blame others for his problem. Did it hurt? Yes. Did others suffer because of David's sin? Yes, but David took responsibility and fixed his relationship with God. We overcome our sins by doing the same thing. Are you where you need to be in your life today?



The bulletin article and sermon last week on the subject of **forgiveness** seemed to strike an important chord with a lot of us. Few things that we do are as difficult—or important—as the call to forgive as God in Christ has forgiven us, as we want to be forgiven. Here are some of the Scriptures that speak to this issue.

Lev. 19:18; Prov. 29:26; Matt. 5:21-24, 38-48; 6:12-15; 18:21-35; 22:34-40; Luke 23:32-38, 44-46; Rom. 12:9-21; Eph. 4:25-5:2; Col. 3:5-17; 1 Peter 2:19-25; Heb. 12:1-3; James 1:19-26; 2:12-13

And here are a couple of misunderstandings that we typically struggle with and that cause us great difficulty:

- My forgiving someone causes them to be free of consequences. It does not. Punishment may or may not be given, relationships may or may not remain intact, even though forgiveness has been given.
- My forgiving someone means they are saved eternally. It does not. That is up to God. My forgiving someone does not mean that God forgives them. It simply means I have turned that matter over to "the One who judges justly."

I hope you will take the time to watch this sermon at the archive link on our web site/streaming site. Or request a CD if you'd rather have the audio version. And feel free to chat with me. Again, this is one of the hardest things we can do. Everything in our natural being calls for vindication and justice, rather than mercy and forgiveness. And yet we are reminded of these words, written by the half-brother of our Lord.

Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.



KEEP IT SIMPLE!

I worked in a refinery for 31 years and had to work for some pretty blunt guys. When faced with problems that were hard to figure out, one foreman's motto was to KISS! This was not the affectionate gesture the title implies. Instead, he meant, Keep It Simple Stupid! It was his way of saying, when we make it simple, we can usually figure it out. It is the same with our spiritual lives. Many overthink God's word and as a result, have trouble in their walk. Here are seven simple lessons from David Peach (What Christians Want To Know) that are from scripture and can help us with our spiritual walk. 1) Do right! A major theme in the bible is to find out what God says and then obey Him. The Old Testament teaches us about the "letter of the law", but Jesus also taught about the "spirit of the law" (Matt.5:21-48). It matters how you obey. 2) Submit to Authority! Many people in scripture were jailed for their belief. We see that they all submitted to authority, yet chose to obey the law of God over man's law. Their common bond was the willingness to accept whatever punishment man gave them while still living for Heaven. 3) **Love others!** In order to love others, we do what is right and best for the other person in each situation even if it is not easy or convenient. Jesus said, By this all people will know that you are my disciples (Jo.13:35). Look for more lessons next week. Keep it simple!



And yet we are reminded of these words, written by the half-brother of our Lord.

Speak and act as those who are going to be judged by the law that gives freedom, because judgment without mercy will be shown to anyone who has not been merciful. Mercy triumphs over judgment.

(James 2:12-13)

It is frustrating to give sound, biblical, advice and watch those who are given it totally ignore it! Here is some "good advice" that Isaiah passed on to those he loved. Why do you spend your money...and your labor for that which does not satisfy (Isa.55:2)? Isaiah said that we should make sure that the things we chase in life have the ability to truly satisfy. Incline your ear, and come to me; hear, that your soul may live (Isa.55:3). We need to be grateful for each of these opportunities and not waste them. Seek the Lord while he may be found; call upon him while he is near (Isa.55:6). God is always available to us, in our darkest moments, and in our times of joy. He will be found by those who are seeking Him. The only obstacle we face in our search is the time element. We are promised nothing in that regard, but we can take confidence in the fact that God is always working to bring us home.





As we approach the 4th of July we praise our God for the blessing of this great nation. Independence Day is the perfect time to be reminded to pray for our leaders and for our nation and our world. The apostle Paul tells Christians to do exactly that, but also reminds us of why this is so

"I urge, then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for all people—for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people." (1 Tim. 2:1-6)

You see we pray for peace around the world so that the gospel may be spread. Like our Father we want all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth of salvation through Jesus Christ. And so while we are grateful for the freedom we have as Americans, we are especially thankful for the freedom that we have from sin.

As we think Sunday of "the breastplate of righteousness" we will acknowledge that our freedom from sin does not come from our own righteousness and obedience. Rather "in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: 'The righteous will live by faith.'" (Rom. 1:16-17) Sunday evening we will sing the great old hymn that reminds us that the "Rock of Ages" who died for us on the cross is the only one who can give us freedom from sin. We look to the blood of Christ to "be of sin the double cure"—to cleanse us from not only the guilt of sin but also its power. Like King David we praise our God and announce His blessings—not because we have no sin, but because our sins have been forgiven.

"Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit." (Psalm 32)

KEEP IT SIMPLE - PART 2

We are still looking at some simple lessons from the Bible presented by David Peach. These are good reminders of how we should represent Christ in our everyday life. 4) Be humble! God is touched by our humility. God told Solomon, If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face ..., then I will hear from Heaven and will forgive their sin (2 Chron.7:14). Humility on our part is vital to our forgiveness. 5) Be wise with our money! The love of money has kept many people from having a relationship with Christ. Having money is no sin, but trusting money over God is (1 Tim.6:17-19). 6) Be aware of sowing and reaping! The Bible teaches us that we will reap what we sow and we will reap proportionately to how much we sow. It also matters what we sow, whether good or bad. Moses once said, and be sure your sin will find you out (Num.32:23). It was good advice then, and it is good advice today. 7) Be good at settling conflicts! Scripture tells us to live peaceably with those around us (Ro.12:18-19) and that we should treat others as we want to be treated ourselves (Luke 6:31). Jesus tells us how to correct it when we fail at that. In Matt. 18, He tells us to meet with each other, and the one wronged initiates this. If that fails, get help from others. Gossip and ill-will are never mentioned. Do these lessons seem simple? Yes, but why are they sometimes so hard?



ISAIAH; HE COULD BE TALKING TO US! (Continued)

Today we continue our look at God's charges against Israel in Isaiah 5, and the similarity between the failings of their society and ours today. It should give us a reason for concern. Woe to those who call evil good and good evil, who put darkness for light and light for darkness, who put bitter for sweet and sweet for bitter (5:20). God charged them with lowering their moral values. They had become afraid of calling a sin a sin! When we let society dictate God's values, confusion and moral chaos follow. We have become a society where our children are not safe from predators and issues of sexuality have become blurred! Woe to those who are wise in their own eyes, and shrewd in their own sight! (5:21) God charged them with becoming plagued with conceit. When mankind rejects God, and fails to honor His word or recognize His teachings on good and evil he is left to depend on his own wisdom. Apart from God's influence, this is fatal! Job said, "the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom" (Job. 28:28). Woe to those who are heroes at drinking wine, ... who acquit the guilty for a bribe, and deprive the innocent of his right (5:23). God charged them with perverting justice. Their loose lifestyle caused them to rule deceitfully and not deal fairly with those that were right with God. Through all this, we can see why God gave them up to this lifestyle and allowed their destruction. Does it sound familiar?

This past Sunday's lessons were very important in our series, "Spiritual Armor for Spiritual Victory," taken from Eph. 6:10-20. We spoke of the shield of faith, and the reality of the fiery darts of Satan aimed for where we are the most vulnerable. Perhaps the key statement of the morning sermon was this:

Satan's goal is to destroy us by attacking us at this most basic level—trusting God.

He seeks to isolate us away from our church family, and challenge our trust in God. He points to the things of this world that seem incongruous with an all loving, all powerful God and says, "See there! I told you he couldn't be trusted!" Sunday evening I shared a "case study" of one who faced that very same temptation—the prophet Habakkuk. If you were unable to be in our assemblies I'm asking you to do two things.

You'll be challenged by the Sunday evening message and its difficult comments and analogies. We face some similar challenges as they experienced in the time of Habakkuk and Jeremiah. LEARNING FROM JESUS

As Christians, we have no better example to learn from than Jesus himself. Luke 7 gives us some great insights as to what character traits we need to develop as His children. First, we need to realize that no problem is too big for Jesus! The centurion believed in the power of Jesus, "But say the word and let my servant be healed" (7:7). He knew Jesus could take care of the problem, he knew that Jesus could do it from a distance, and he knew that Jesus would respond to his faith. Do we have such faith today? Secondly, we need to realize the needs of others without their asking! "And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her and said to her, 'Do not weep.'" (7:13). Jesus raised the widow's son from the dead and "gave him to his mother" (7:15). Jesus was not asked to do this; he saw the need and responded out of compassion. Thirdly, we need to realize **Jesus is still working in our world today!** In John the Baptist's moment of doubt, Jesus sent him this message, "Go and tell John what you have seen and heard: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, the dead are raised up, the poor have good news preached to them" (7:22). Whenever we doubt, we need to stop, look around, and seek the signs of His work. When our focus is on Him, we will see the evidence of His work. Do you have an "overcoming" faith? Does your faith soften your heart to the needs of others? How are you following the example of Jesus?

Today is the first of three Sundays focusing on praising God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

- Glorifying God the Father
- Celebrating Christ the Son
- Honoring the Holy Spirit

Of course we should start with the Psalms, and the words of the psalmists calling us to worship and praise our great God. We'll mention some of these words of praise from the heart of David this Sunday.

Among the gods there is none like you, Lord; no deeds can compare with yours. All the nations you have made will come and worship before you, Lord; they will bring glory to your name. For you are great and do marvelous deeds; you alone are God... I will praise you, Lord my God, with all my heart; I will glorify your name forever. For great is your love toward me; you have delivered me from the depths, from the realm of the dead. (Psalm 86:8-13)

Though it sounds as if God has already blessed him (which he acknowledges), much of the psalm is David asking for the Lord's help and blessing. He wanted to glorify God even before the Lord brought that deliverance. How could he do that?

- ➤ He was *grateful* for God's blessings already given.
- > He trusted in God in the midst of the present crisis.
- > He believed, whatever happens, God is worthy of our praise.



HOW YOU PRAY THE LORD TREATS YOU

And the Lord has rewarded me according to my

righteousness, according to my cleanness in his sight. With

the merciful you show yourself merciful; with the blameless

man you show yourself blameless; with the purified you deal

purely, and with the crooked you make yourself seem

tortuous. You save a humble people, but your eyes are on the

haughty to bring them down. For you are my lamp, O LORD,

and my God lightens my darkness (II Sam.22:25-29). This is from a song David wrote to God upon his deliverance from

his enemies. It gives us great insight into how we handle

our relationships with others. From this passage we learn

that God rewards righteous behavior. When we are

righteous, God deals with us in a righteous manner. When

we are clean in God's sight, we deal with each other in the

way God desires for us. We also learn that God is merciful

to those that show mercy. We all pray that we will face a

God of mercy at judgment; so we must show mercy here on

earth. We also learn that God rewards humility and

crushes the prideful. We all want others to treat us with

a spirit of humility; so why not treat others in the same

way? We see that God's attitude toward men is

conditioned by our attitude toward Him and others. If we

deal with others with an attitude of loving-kindness, we

will experience the same from God. Remember, treat

others the same way you pray that God will treat you.



This Sunday we continue to focus on the call to praise our great God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Today in all aspects of our worship we celebrate Christ the Son. Scripture of course is filled with passages that praise our Savior, who alone is worthy of that praise. Here's one.

"The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation...For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in him, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross." (Col. 1:15-20)

It is astounding that the Son of God, "the image of the invisible God," the One in whom all the fullness of God dwelt, would have to suffer and die. And yet He did, and He did it for one reason and one reason only: He loved us. He knew that there was no other way to save us. And so He gave His life for us.

Revelation 5 considers the great sacrifice that Jesus made in giving up His life and sums up Jesus' position now on this side of the cross with one word: worthy.

"You are worthy to take the scroll and to open its seals, because you were slain, and with your blood you purchased for God persons from every tribe and language and people and nation."

"Worthy is the Lamb."



A BIGGER BARN IS NOT THE ANSWER!

In Luke 12, we find what most translations call the parable of the Rich Fool. The story starts out by a man demanding that Jesus command the man's brother to divide the inheritance with him. Jesus refuses to take part in this but he relates the story of a man who had a bumper crop come in and all of a sudden he had the problem of what to do with his surplus. His solution was to tear down his old barns and build bigger ones. Then, he could relax, eat, drink, and be merry. God's response was to call him a fool and inform him that his soul would be required of him that very night. Jesus then said that the same fate awaits the one who lays up treasure for himself and is not rich toward God (12:21). The man got in trouble because of his priorities. At no time was there shown any gratitude toward God for the bountiful harvest. At no time was their any regard for the poor of the area that would have benefited from the farmer's surplus. At no time was their any prayer to God for wisdom in handling the matter. Bigger barns were not what the man needed; he needed a bigger faith! Bigger faith comes when God is playing a bigger part in our lives. Bigger faith comes when there is regular, earnest, and sincere worship for God. Bigger faith comes from prayer time and study. Bigger faith comes from service and showing others our love for God and mankind. What's your solution for a bigger faith?





Next Kids' Night Out: October 7th from 5:30 - 8pm in the Children's Wing. Make plans to attend and invite friends! Hurricane Harvey has caused a huge aftermath of damage. Often, we do not know how to talk to our children about these tragedies. We are tempted to not address it with them or to minimize the damage it caused. This can cause more confusion for children as they see and hear glimpses of what happened and know that it must be a big ordeal. A few years ago, I heard the importance of teaching children to look for the helpers. I love this idea and I think we can do more to add to this. Let your children feel and express their feelings about these events. Limit the amount of exposure to the news during this time. Take time to find kid-appropriate pictures and talk about what happened. Let them express their fears. This is a great time to teach them empathy by asking - How do you think it would feel to have this happen to your family? What would we do if this happened to us? Who could we turn to for help? Let them draw pictures about what they have seen or heard about it. Share scripture with them such as Psalm 121:2. Pray with them for the victims and thank God for keeping them safe. Finally, find a way for them to do something to help - make cards, shop for supplies, pray for them, or find a way to do something for the victims. Doing these things allow your child to process what they have seen and heard and feel actively involved in doing something positive to help.



It's one of the most important parts of our lives: Worship.

Yet, how do you feel about your worship of God? Do you feel anything at all? Or is it just some box you check occasionally because you *think* that you're supposed to?

What **questions** do you have about worship? Do you want to know more?

In fact you could even say that the first statement in this article is incorrect.

Worship is **not** just *one* of the most important parts of our lives.

Worshipping God is our lives.



A PRAYING SPIRIT! Pt. 2

Last week we started looking at what it takes to have an effective prayer life. Last week, we looked at two things we need to pray for. Today, I want to look at three things we need to pray from. We need to pray from a righteous heart. Let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water (Heb.10:22). If I had cherished iniquity in my heart, the Lord would not have listened (Psa.66:18). We started this discussion last week with reference to the prayers of a righteous man. God pays attention to those with sincere motives and love for Him. We also need to pray from a grateful heart. Do not be anxious about anything but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God (Phil.4:6). Christians should not have any trouble being grateful. We look to the cross and the blessings offered there every Sunday. All our spiritual blessings come from the love shown at the cross. All our physical blessings come from the love shown at the cross. We also need to pray from a **humble heart.** God, be merciful to me, a sinner (Luke 18:13). This was the prayer of the tax collector in Jesus' parable. It is a great example of the humility we need in when we approach God. Effective prayer starts with a good heart, gratitude, and humility. It ends with God's will being shown.

Why do you worship God?

That's my sermon topic for this Sunday morning. As you notice from my outline in this bulletin, I've listed some reasons.

And yes, we'll fill in the blanks on Sunday! I doubt that you'll be much surprised by what goes in them, however.

So what would *you* put in those blanks?

More importantly, what would be on your list of reasons why you worship God?

And after you've made your list, I'd like to ask you to do one more thing.

Look through that list, and ask yourself if there's anything selfish about each reason. Even just a little bit selfish.

Because here's the bigger question: Am I worshiping God for what I can get from Him?

Would I worship God if there were nothing in it for me?

You see that's the question that Job ultimately had to answer. And it was a question asked not by Job. Nor by a prophet. Not even by God Himself. It was asked by the Adversary.

"Does Job serve God for nothing?" (Job 1:9) Would you?

A FAR COUNTRY!

The term "a far country" was used by Luke to describe where the prodigal son went after he collected his share of his father's property. While he was there, Luke says he squandered his property on reckless living. When I think of that "far country", I just see someone lost. It makes me think of people that I have seen walk away from the safety of the church. The son's decline from a protected child to the pigsty is similar to their situation. First, he was selfish. Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me (Lk.15:12). People leave God for selfish reasons. They don't want the control of the Spirit in their lives and they don't want to submit to God's will. Secondly, he was alone. And when he had spent everything...he began to be in need (Lk.15:14). We put ourselves in a dangerous place when we leave the people that love us the most and care for us spiritually. Thirdly, he became a slave. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens...who sent him into his fields to feed pigs (Lk.15:15). Once we leave God, pride keeps us from admitting our mistake and we become slaves to a life without Him; something that we once thought we would never do. Luke shows us the dangers of selfishness and what it can lead to. We can see why a church needs to care for all members; there is danger in being alone. Guarding ourselves from the influence of the world is so important. Beware of that "far country"!



So here is a song written over 50 years ago, and as I sit here on Monday morning writing this article, I woke up to a mass shooting in Las Vegas that injured hundreds and killed fifty. My president is tweeting about his disagreement with a dictator in North Korea and because of this many are worried about a nuclear war breaking out. When you get down to it, man has not changed much in the last 50 years. To me the problem started when we as a society and as a world decided to take God out of the fabric of our lives. THAT'S CAUSE I'M SO BIG!

Beau (my youngest grandson) is always telling me how he is getting to be a big boy. When I ask him how he was able to do something, he replies "That's cause I'm so big!" First, we need to be better disciples. "A disciple continues in the Word, loves others, bears fruit, and puts Christ first." This was a quote from a minister who lived during the days of Adolph Hitler. He was executed during that war. He took Jesus' words to heart, If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me (Matt.16:24). For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control (2 Tim. 2:7). Embracing His spirit will help us become more like Him! Third, we need to grow stronger from trials, not weaker. Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing (James 1:2-4). With God, testing works for us, not against us! Are you doing your best to grow?

JESUS' HARD TEACHINGS - 2

Let's take a look at some of these teachings and see how we are doing. Love your enemy and pray for those that persecute you (Matt.5:44). Who teaches this in this world today? We live in a world that kills on a whim. Many say that war is the only way to peace. Jesus knew that the world would be better off with the peace He offers. But do not resist the one who is evil. But as anyone slaps you on the right cheek, turn to him the other also (Matt.5:39). It is a difficult thing to turn down the chance to retaliate. No one can serve two masters, for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money (Matt.6:24). Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you (Matt. 6:25, 33). We do like to worry. Jesus says that the most important thing to worry about is His kingdom and its work. Following Jesus is a challenge, but He gives us power to succeed.

JESUS' HARD TEACHINGS – 3

We have been looking at some of Jesus' teachings from the Sermon on the Mount. While they go against our nature to follow them, Jesus gives us His spirit to help us be the children He desires and needs us to be. *Enter by the narrow gate. For the* gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction (Matt.7:13). Eternal judgment is always a difficult subject to discuss with those we love. The wide gate is just easier, it seems better, and few find the narrow gate. Jesus said it; don't be ashamed of the truth. And he said to all, If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me (Luke 9:23). There is a reason for the order that Jesus gave these steps. If we never deny ourselves for the cause of Christ, we will never take up our own cross. If we never take up our cross, we can never follow Him! If anyone comes to me and does not hate his own father and mother and wife and children and brothers and sisters, yes, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple (Luke 14:26). While Jesus is exaggerating with the word "hate" here, He does demand our loyalty and wants to be first in our lives. If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you (Jo.15:20). Fellowship with Jesus will lead us to three things: bearing fruit, loving people, and persecution. It is why the world will not accept Jesus and it is why we must not accept the world. Remember the words to that great song that we sing, "Jesus is all the world to me"! It was true then, it's true now.





Our Bible classes this week are discussing 1 Cor. 13. No, it's not because the lesson is on wedding ceremonies...

As you know, though used in countless weddings, and certainly critical to the relationship between a husband and wife, the words of 1 Cor. 13 are given to members of the body of Christ to inform and impact the way we relate to one another. One of the points in our lesson states it well.

"Love is demonstrated by attitudes and actions."

Hear these familiar words again, and ask yourself, "Does this describe how I treat others?"

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Love never fails. (1 Cor. 13:4-8a)

THE WRONG SIDE OF JESUS

In Matt. 23, we find Jesus offering some criticism about the scribes and Pharisees. Because of their lack of understanding, they found themselves on the wrong side of Jesus. It was not a pleasant experience. Let's look at their mistakes with the hope of avoiding them ourselves. First, they were wrong about their righteousness. The scribes and the Pharisees sit on Moses' seat, so do and observe whatever they tell you, but not the works they do. For they preach, but do not practice (23:1-2). They were more concerned with how they sounded than how they looked. Our actions do speak louder than our words. Be careful when we get to quick to criticize. Secondly, they were wrong about their ministry. They tie up heavy burdens, hard to bear, and lay them on people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to move them with their finger (23:4). We are guilty of demanding more of someone else than we are willing to give ourselves. Jesus came to lighten the burdens of others (Matt.11:28-30). We need to be more like Jesus. Thirdly, they were wrong about their greatness. They do all their deeds to be seen by others... they love the place of honor...and greetings in the market places and being called rabbi by others (23:5-7). They thought that success was recognition and praise from man. Success in God's eyes comes from humility, love, and service. Are you on the right side of Jesus?
