CONNECTION CORNER

When God opens our eyes, as He did for Elisha's servant in 2 Kings 6:8-18, we gain "spiritual vision". In other words, we see the world as God sees it, instead of letting our fear tell the story. Here's what can happen: Sometimes our fears come true, but God still comes through. Elisha's story is actually the second time the city of Dothan is mentioned in the Bible. The first is in Genesis 37. One day, some brothers were out tending sheep near Dothan, and they saw their teenaged brother coming toward them. Joseph was his daddy's favorite, and they were tired of hearing him boast about being better than all of them. So, when he reached them, they grabbed him and threw him into a pit until they decided whether or not to kill him. Imagine you're a seventeen-year-old kid, and you've been thrown in a pit by your older brothers. You've just now realized how much they hate you, so you're not entirely sure you'll survive this. Wouldn't you pray for God to protect you? I'm sure Joseph did. In the end, the brothers didn't kill Joseph, but they did something instead that, to Joseph, must have seemed even worse. They sold him to slave traders who were passing by.

Elisha prayed and got a miracle. But Joseph prayed, and there was no miracle. Listen... most of the time that will be the case. Miracles are rare. If they weren't, we wouldn't call them miracles! God intervenes in a supernatural way at strategic times that only He knows. Most of the time, instead, He works more quietly, in ways we can't see until we look back on them.

That was certainly true for Joseph. After years in slavery, he was sent to prison for a crime he didn't commit. But then, through a remarkable turn of events, he became the trusted advisor to the King of Egypt, and finally, prime minister. In that capacity, he saved the lives of hundreds of thousands of people from starvation through good management. Then, 20 years after his brothers sold him into slavery, he had the opportunity to not only see them again, but save them from starvation when they came to Egypt looking for food. Think about it: None of that would have happened if God had answered his prayer at the bottom of that pit when he was seventeen. So, if you're wondering why God doesn't always produce miracles, the story of Joseph is a great reminder that He knows what He's doing. Sometimes, that means He does things we wouldn't pre-approve if God consulted with us, but they still turn out to be right.

Tim Keller had a great quote about this: "God answers every prayer we pray the way we would if we knew what He knows." So, when we are afraid, trying to view the world through the eyes of God, that "spiritual vision", tells us, "It's right to pray for a miracle. But even if that doesn't happen, even if my fears come true, I know God knows what this world needs and is STILL in control."

IF IF IF, if we allow Him to, IF we allow him to lead our lives in every aspect, then "we KNOW that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose" Romans 8:28. Whatever "all things" turns out to be...
